





#### In Defense of Pit Bulls

#### TAKING STOCK

I worked in investment industry from 1983 to 1988. Among the many things I learned, one of the most significant is that the majority of investors do not follow a "game plan".

Successful investing depends largely on (a) knowing which products are available, (b) which are appropriate for you and (c) developing a customized portfolio.

#### DEFINITION: Pyramid Portfolio

A portfolio is, simply, a collection of investments which you expect to increase in value.

Every investment carries a certain element of risk, from negligible (as in Canada Savings Bonds), to very high, (as in Index Options). A pyramid portfolio is especially suited to people just getting started on their careers. although anyone can apply the basic strategy.

Basically, build your investment portfolio by starting with no-risk products, and expanding to NEXT WEEK: Your first point where

includes a full range of investments.

#### **ADVANTAGES DISADVANTAGES:**

This strategy offers manageable risk...you can predetermine and limit the number and type of investments according to your personal financial situation, and your "comfort level" regarding the potential risks.

On the other hand, some individuals would find it difficult to stick to this type of strategy. Such people are likely those who are looking to get rich overnight, and may consider a long term investment to be anything held more than two weeks!

#### **RULE OF THUMB**

BE PATIENT! Portfolio management will not make you a millionaire by this Christmas. Rather, it will ensure that you invest appropriately, and that your asset base increases at sometimes astounding rates over the years...and you will avoid many losses which result from lack of foresight.



Apprehension changed to enthusiasm after the first heat. Team members began to realize the fun in the contest and soon forgot about the cold



#### Has NAIT Always **Been Board Governed?**

Not all colleges and technical institutes are Board governed.

Prior to April, 1982, NAIT was operated directly by Alberta Advanced Education.

In the U.S., all public and private colleges are controlled by individual Boards of Governors. Saskatchewan is changing their system so that all educational institutes are controlled by a single Board.

One advantage to NAIT's system is that NAIT is the first and only priority of our

The Board has 16 members. Members are paid an honorarium.

The President of NAIT is automatically a member. The student representatives serve a one year term after being elected by the student body. If you want to get in touch with either of the student representatives, leave a message in their box at Student Services (E134) or call the NAITSA office at 471-8855.

The other members are appointed to three year terms. and may be reappointed.

Lucy mentioned to me that she thought that the NAITIAN men were very friendly and fair-looking too. Half way through the night I lost her but I had to get more stills before I could look for


I was getting a little careless and decided that no one would notice if I got a picture of the babe I had been eyeing. I was wrong, polluted as these people were, one
