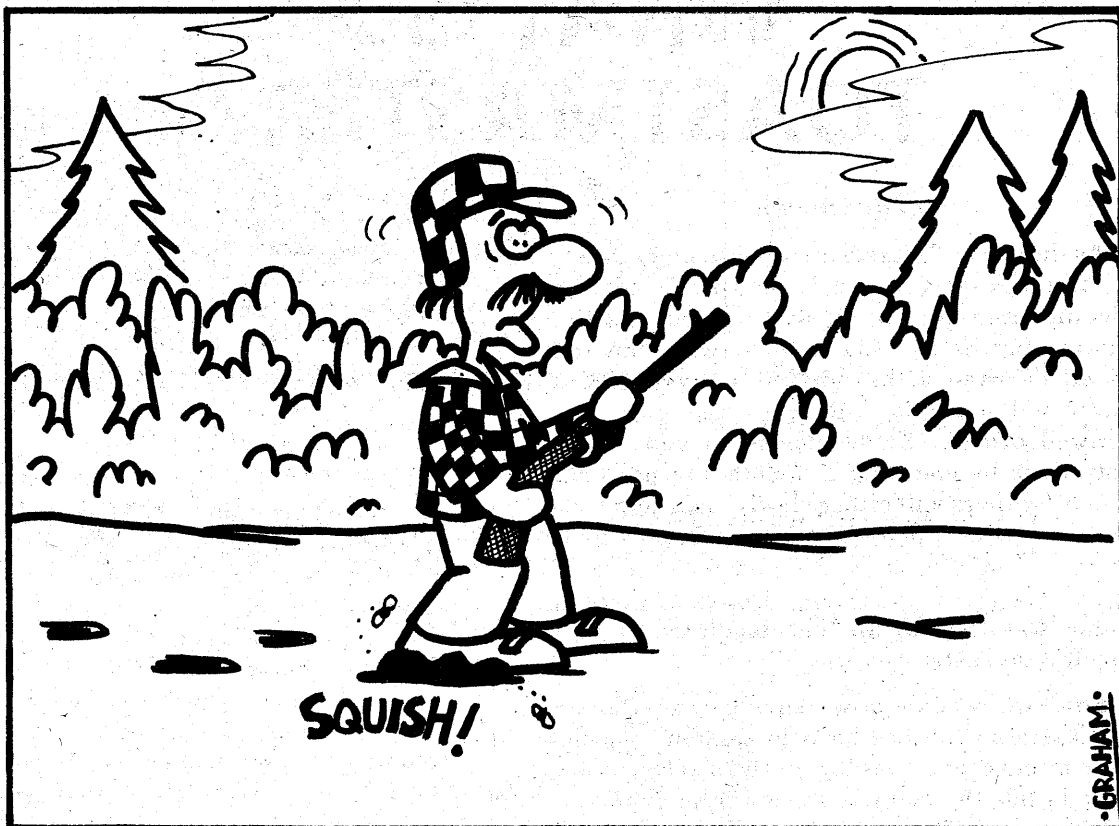

In the last few years I have read and seen a lot of negative publicity about pit bulls. It almost seems that every time I turn on the T.V., I see another news story about some unfortunate person getting 20 stitches because of a pit bull attack.

These news reports really catch my attention. Whenever I see one, I think of Penny, my pet dog when I was a child. She was a pit bull, and no one could hope for a more gentle and affectionate dog.

The publicity about pit bulls and their owners has been so negative that you may be wondering about what sort of person I am since I have just called a pit bull gentle. Perhaps you've already made a few assumptions, so I will set the record straight.

No, I've never been in jail and I don't have any tattoos. I don't ride a Harley-Davidson, either. I've never been to, nor do I want to go to, a cock fight, and I'll give \$20 to anyone who catches me talking with a toothpick hanging out of my mouth. I am, in fact, a mild-mannered accounting student and a responsible citizen who would be much more at home at the ballet than a dogfight.

My experience with pit bulls has been very different than the news reports, so I am puzzled by them. Why so many reports? Why only in the last few years? Have there actually been more pit bull attacks recently, or are we just hearing about it more?

Times change, and perhaps it is a fad right now among a certain group to teach their dogs to be mean. If someone wanted to create a mean dog, it might be true that a pit bull is the best raw material to work with, but I do not believe that they are naturally vicious.

However, what if there has just been more coverage of pit bull attacks? According to Rudy Berghuys, Chief Licensing Inspector with the City of Edmonton, there has not been a significant increase in the number of pit bull attacks reported in recent years.

The media have power, which is why an objective of journalism is to report the news, rather than create it, and to report it objectively. Complete objectivity isn't difficult to achieve; it is impossible. The very choice of what stories are covered indicates bias. Increased media coverage of a particular issue can shape public opinion. City politicians respond to what the electorate thinks, so now we have a vicious dog bylaw which classifies pit bulls as a restricted breed of dog. Is this reporting of news by the media, or creation of it?

As one of my teachers once told me, perhaps it is best to believe only half of what you see, and none of what you read or hear.

## TAKING STOCK

I worked in the investment industry from 1983 to 1988. Among the many things I learned, one of the most significant is that the majority of investors do not follow a "game plan".

Successful investing depends largely on (a) knowing which products are available, (b) which are appropriate for you and (c) developing a customized portfolio.

### DEFINITION: Pyramid Portfolio

A portfolio is, simply, a collection of investments which you expect to increase in value.

Every investment carries a certain element of risk, from negligible (as in Canada Savings Bonds), to very high, (as in Index Options). A pyramid portfolio is especially suited to people just getting started on their careers, although anyone can apply the basic strategy.

Basically, build your investment portfolio by starting with no-risk products, and expanding to the point where it

includes a full range of investments.

### ADVANTAGES VS DISADVANTAGES:

This strategy offers manageable risk...you can predetermine and limit the number and type of investments according to your personal financial situation, and your "comfort level" regarding the potential risks.

On the other hand, some individuals would find it difficult to stick to this type of strategy. Such people are likely those who are looking to get rich overnight, and may consider a long term investment to be anything held more than two weeks!

### RULE OF THUMB

**BE PATIENT!** Portfolio management will not make you a millionaire by this Christmas. Rather, it will ensure that you invest appropriately, and that your asset base increases at sometimes astounding rates over the years...and you will avoid many losses which result from lack of foresight.

### What is the Board of Governors?

The Board of Governors is the corporation that runs NAIT. It reviews institute policy, has the authority to sign contracts, and sets the course of the Institute. Legally, it is NAIT.

Campus development is the Board's focus this year. Here are the Board's priorities:

1. A walk-in bookstore
2. An auditorium
3. A Health and Medical Sciences Building

### Has NAIT Always Been Board Governed?

Not all colleges and technical institutes are Board governed.

Prior to April, 1982, NAIT was operated directly by Alberta Advanced Education.

In the U.S., all public and private colleges are controlled by individual Boards of Governors. Saskatchewan is changing their system so that all educational institutes are controlled by a single Board.

One advantage to NAIT's system is that NAIT is the first and only priority of our

Board.

### Who is on the Board of Governors?

The Board has 16 members. Members are paid an honorarium.

The President of NAIT is automatically a member. The student representatives serve a one year term after being elected by the student body. If you want to get in touch with either of the student representatives, leave a message in their box at Student Services (E134) or call the NAITSA office at 471-8855.

The other members are appointed to three year terms, and may be reappointed.

The board is comprised as follows:

2 student members

2 academic staff members (nominated by NASA, NAIT Academic Staff Association)

1 Non-Academic staff member who is not an administrator (usually support staff)

(The above members are appointed by Dave Russell, Minister of

Advanced Education)

the President of NAIT

10 members of the public who are appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

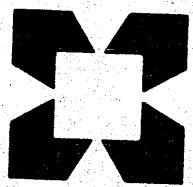

The Syncrude seminar was a success. The room was filled to capacity and though students were coming and going, there were never less than 175 students present.



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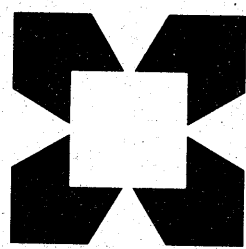

The U of A wins the tournament with a record of three wins and no losses, while NAIT completes the tourney with two wins and one loss.

In the first, the U of A's Adam Morrison opened the scoring at 7:36 on a play with Wes Craig and Al Tarasuk. Stacey Wakabayashi widened the lead to 2-0 at 9:13 with help from ex-Ook Sid Cranston and Guy Paradis. R.J. Dundas of the Bears closed out the first period scoring at 12:59 from Rob Glasgow. The Bears dominated the first outshooting the Ooks 20 to 4.

In the second, the Bears widened their lead to 4-0 on Rob Glasgow's goal off a Grant Couture set-up at 5:23. The Ooks then stormed back with four goals in under two minutes. At 5:59, Craig Sterzer of the Ooks broke John Krill's shutout bid. Randy Wong and Bill Davidson assisted on the play. Twelve seconds later Randy Wong of the Ooks cut the difference to two goals as he completed a play with Craig Sterzer and Lonnie Spink.

### Soccer Ooks No Longer Undefeated

The NAIT Soccer Ooks dropped from the ranks of the undefeated in the ACAC dropping a 5-1 decision to the SAIT Trojans at the NAIT field on Sunday, September 25th. On Wednesday, September 21st, the Ooks had won their second straight—a 5-1 victory over the Red Deer College Kings in Red Deer.

In Wednesday's contest, Charles O'Toole led the Ooks with two goals. The Ooks led 3-1 at the half before adding two goals in the final 45 minutes.

In Sunday's upset, the Trojans acquired a 1-0 lead at the half before outscoring the Ooks by a two-to-one margin in the second half. Charles O'Toole managed to get the lone NAIT marker.

Sterzer then narrowed the margin to one goal at the 6:33 mark with the Ooks third straight powerplay goal on a match penalty assessed to the Bears. The Ooks then tied the game with 7:02 gone in the second on Myron Feser's goal from Blaine Peerless and Troy Ardnt. The Bears regained the lead at 9:42 as Rob Glasgow netted his second of the game at 9:42. Sid Cranston and Stacey Wakabayashi collected the assists.

In the third, Wakabayashi increased the Bears lead to two goals at 6:49. One minute later, Mike Pawlenchuk, an ex-Baltimore Skipjack, pulled the Ooks to within on. Rick Chauvette and Blaine Peerless were credited with helpers. The Bears' Stacy Wakabayashi completed the night's scoring with an empty net goal from Darwin Bozek and Rob Glasgow at 19:19.

The NAIT tandem of Rob McKinley and Jim Swan turned away 47 of 53 Bear shots. At the other end, John Krill blocked 27 of 32 Ook drives.

Both teams were in the same position as they reached the final. NAIT and the U of A knew the winner of their contest would win the tourney as both teams won their previous contests.

On Friday, night, the University of Alberta Golden

Bears started the tournament with a 10-5 win over the Camrose Lutheran College Vikings at Varsity Arena. The Bears jumped out to a quick 5-0 lead in the first period and never looked back.

On Saturday afternoon, the U of A Golden Bears scored a 6-3 come-from-behind victory over the Red Deer College Kings. Darwin Bozek scored three goals against his former teammates to lead the way for the green and gold.

On Friday night, the NAIT Ooks gained revenge on the Red College Kings with a 7-1 triumph at the NAIT Arena.

Craig Sterzer netted three goals and Brad Fenton chipped in a pair to pace NAIT. Bill Moody and Blaine Peerless rounded out the Ooks scoring. Dan Baker replied with the lone Red Deer marker.

The Ooks held period leads of 2-1 and 5-1 before scoring two goals in the final frame.

On Saturday evening, the Ooks recorded a 6-1 win over the Camrose Vikings at the NAIT Arena.

Bill Mitchell tallied twice to lead the Ooks. Craig Cripps, Cory Siernachesky, Jeff Stuparyk, and Bill Moody completed the NAIT scoring. Kevin McGill answered for Camrose.

## NAIT Wins ACAC Golf Title

The NAIT Ooks Golf Team hosted and won the Alberta Colleges Athletic Golf Championship at the Highlands. The victory marked the first time NAIT has won the tourney since 1984.

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

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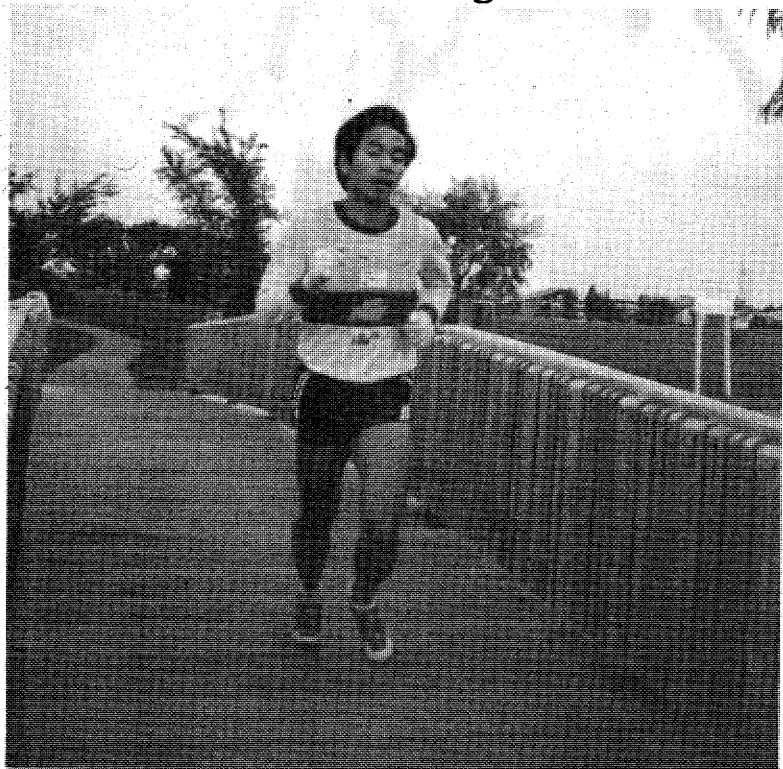

Today, many athletes look for that competitive edge and find it in the form of substances, legal or illegal. Responsibility takes a back seat to level of performance.

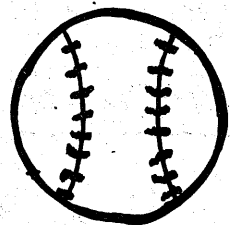
The reaction to the Johnson incident was predictable. However, Canadians must not ignore the issue.

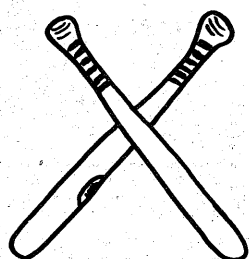

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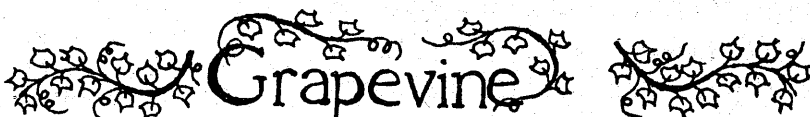
