

NAITSA PROFILE:

Financial Director/ Administrative Assistant

NUGGET: When you ran for election last spring, you chose the position of Financial Director/Administrative Assistant. Why was that?

Imre Bene: When I looked at the positions available, I decided I would rather work a bit more behind the scenes and do what I'm best at, which is organizing things. Also, I can't devote as much time to the job as some of the others due to my course load and other commitments. I would like it if I could do more, but I have to prioritize things. That's one thing this job is good for. It really improves my organization skills and makes me more punctual. I think that's the main reason I took this job.

N: As Financial Director, what are your duties?

I.B.: There are actually a lot of little things I'm responsible for. For instance, I have to organize and take minutes at all the General Council meetings. I also organize the weekly NAITSA executive meetings. Most of the things that pass across my desk have to do with money. I take care of NAITSA finances and sign all the paycheques, as well as keeping the other executives up-to-date on our financial situation. I also run the cash for Rock 'n' Talks, as well as organizing loans for different technologies to hold cabarets. All the accounting and investments are handled by Linda Hood though, who is a full-time NAITSA employee here. I also get appointed to several committees, such as Alcohol Awareness Committee.

N: After seeing your job description and working for a few months now, do you feel there are any changes that should be made to your position?

I.B.: I don't think there's any changes that need to be made to the job itself. I personally would like more say in the overall finances, but that would also take up a lot more time, so it's a bit of a tradeoff. I would like to see the job description altered though, to give the next person a better idea of what to expect. I had expected to do more work with the finances, and that may not be made clear in the job description.

N: Do you have any complaints about the job or are you enjoying it?

I.B.: I don't have any complaints at all really. It took a little while to get the hang of the job, maybe a month and a half, but now it's like clockwork. I'm much more comfortable now than when I started, and I've also found I have more initiative now. I love the experience I'm getting from the job too.

N: You said earlier that you can't devote as much time to your job as some of the other NAITSA executive. Do you find it difficult to fit your duties at NAITSA into your schedule?

I.B.: Actually, I don't. For the last five years I've had full course loads at university and here, and I also have part-

time jobs, so I've learned to be well organized. It's just that I have a lot of commitments, and there's only so much time I can give to this job.

N: You also said earlier that your work is more behind the scenes than the other executives. Does this mean you have less interaction with the student body?

I.B.: I do have some contact with the students, but no, not as much as the others. A lot of the contact I have is when students, such as General Council representatives, come to talk about an upcoming meeting. I don't go out and help as much with raffles or promotions and such. I wouldn't mind a little more contact with students though.

N: Currently you are in your second year of Finance at NAIT. What plans do you have for after you graduate?

I.B.: What I'd really like to have happen is to work for the federal government for a few years and then move to financial consulting. Eventually, I plan to open my own consulting firm, but that's 10 or 15 years down the road.

N: You aren't looking at other levels of government to start out in?

I.B.: Well, the provincial government isn't out of the question, but I feel the federal government has more to offer in terms of my eventual career goals.

N: So how do you feel your position with NAITSA will help you when you join the workforce?

I.B.: This position has really developed my organizational and leadership skills, which I feel will be very important later on. It's also given me the opportunity to improve on my public presentations, which wouldn't have happened in my regular classes. The other big advantage is that I now have some outside contacts in business that I wouldn't have had otherwise.

N: Thank you very much for your time.

I.B.: Thank you.

A DEADLY COMBINATION SMOKING AND THE BIRTH CONTROL PILL

Among the many serious health hazards from smoking are: cancer of the lungs, throat & mouth, high blood pressure and kidney, heart & blood vessel disease.

Cigarette smoking tends to increase the deposit of cholesterol within the artery walls gradually clogging the arteries to the heart. It also increases the likelihood of a blood clot forming which can then block an artery in a vital organ like the brain causing a stroke or the lungs causing Pulmonary Embolism.

For smokers the risk of sudden death from heart disease is 3 times that of a non smoker. The risk may go as high as 5 times for those who smoke more than a pack a day - the heart attacks are also more severe.

THE BIRTH CONTROL PILL alone has a relatively low incidence of side effects. However, combining the pill & smoking increases a female's risk of having a heart attack or stroke to 12 times that of non smoking women also taking the pill. The risk is even higher in your late 30's or 40's.

Young girls in their early 20's have died from heart attacks & strokes because they smoked & took the birth control pill.

If you smoke - give it up - there are many helpful programs & Health Services has lots of literature on the subject.

If you can't or won't stop smoking **DON'T TAKE THE PILL.**







ADVENTUROUS STUDENTS ONLY

A Canadian-based exchange program has recently been formed that provides young adults with a chance to travel mixed with an opportunity to put themselves to the test. Youth Challenge International has scheduled two international projects to Guyana and the Soviet and Canadian Arctic during 1990.

"Project Guyana" requires 40 Canadian venturers between the ages of 17 & 25 to join another 30 international volunteers from August to October. After training for life in the Guyana interior, volunteers will trek to remote villages to carry out such projects as, inoculations, renovating school facilities, and so on. The volunteers will be faced with tropical jungle conditions and infrequent shipments of supplies. This project lasts from August to October 1990.

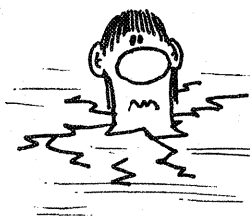
At the other end of the spectrum, ten Canadian volunteers will join ten

Soviets on May 25, 1990 to travel to the Northern Ural Mountains. The group will then collect environmental data as they hike across the mountains from Europe to Asia. By mid-July they will be in the village of Nantzy where they will construct a community centre. The entire group then comes to Canada to conduct wildlife surveys of migrating caribou, bears, and whales. Finally, the volunteers will work with Inuit villagers to complete the community centre.

The deadlines for applications is December 13, 1989, so interested students must act quickly. 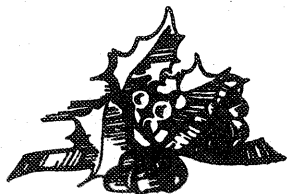

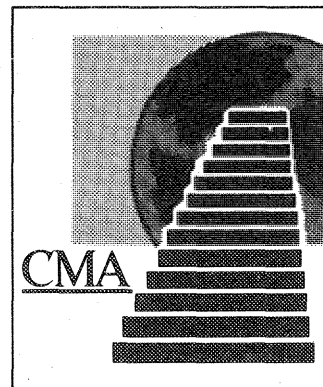

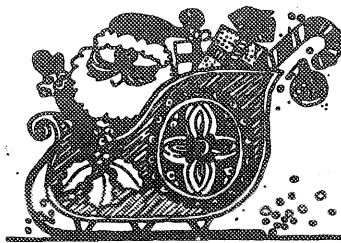

Satellites Hit Town

The year was 1986, and it looked like plastic dance sounds and poseur pop would conquer the charts in a musical remake of Invasion Of The Bodysnatchers. But just as rock and roll was born in the South, it was reborn when **THE GEORGIA SATELLITES** burst upon the scene. The platinum success of their self-titled debut album, fired by the hit single "Keep Your Hands To Yourself", brought American rock and roll back to its primal, three-chord, blues 'n' country roots.

This triumph was no fluke, and for conclusive proof they released a scorching second album Open All Night (1988), featuring the single with the same name.

While their first two records were basically bludgeon-oriented, their latest release, In The Land of Salvation and Sin, represents a major leap forward for **THE SATELLITES** as it successfully stakes out fresh new stylistic territory while retaining the crunch that originally endeared the rough-and-ready combo to its

fans. They have definitely retained their momentum but can no longer be pegged simply as reckless rock animals.

WEBB WILDER, who will be opening for **THE SATELLITES**, is a quartet from Mississippi that defies categories: "interplanetary southern roots-rock", "sci-fi psycho-rockabilly", "detective rock", "swampadelic uneasy listening", "service station attendant music". Decide for yourself.

From scorching blues to chugging roadhouse rockers,

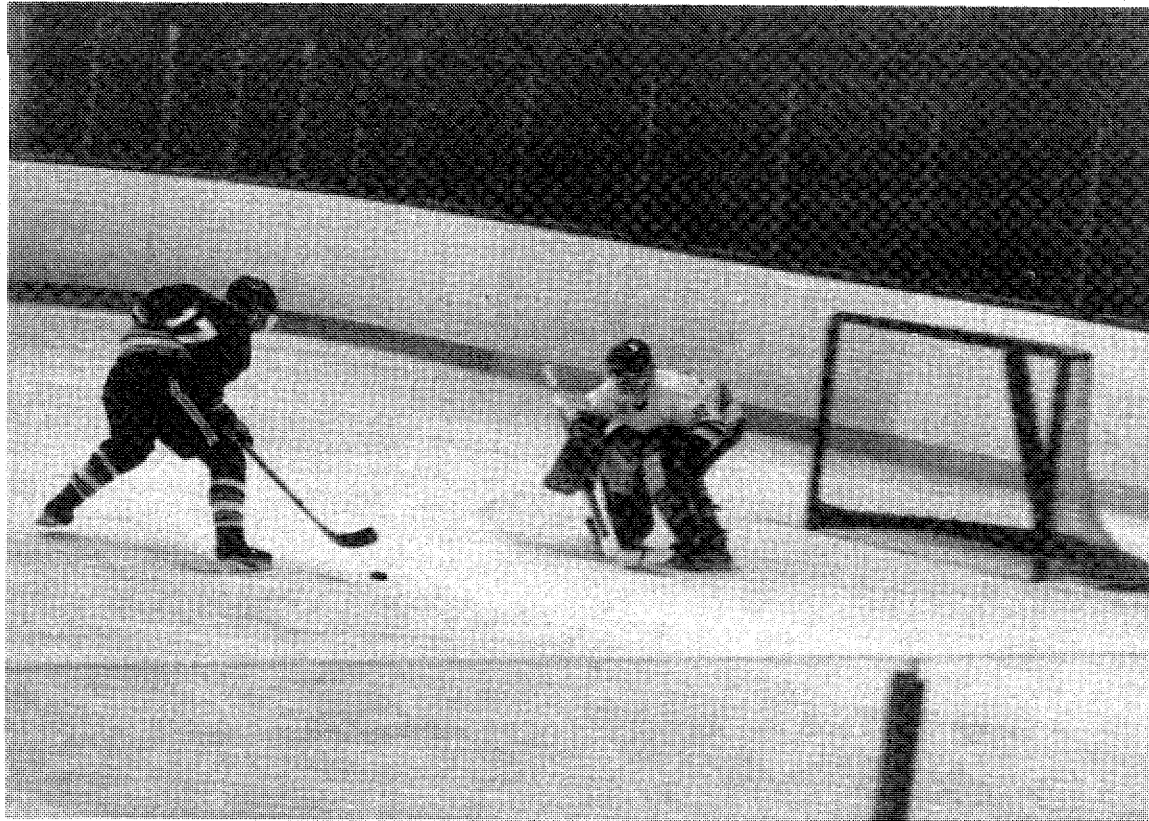
