

Wyatt Wins P.C. Candidacy

Catherine Wyatt, NAIT Board of Governors Chairman, was elected Tory candidate for Edmonton Gold Bar on Thursday, Feb. 9, at the Capilano Motor Inn.

If Mrs. Wyatt is successful in her bid for a legislative seat in the upcoming Provincial election, she will be forced to give up her position on the Board of Governors. "I will remain as Madam Chairman," said Wyatt, "until such time as I must resign."

Mrs. Wyatt was appointed Chairman by Dave Russell, Deputy Premier and Minister of Advanced Education, July 1st, 1988. She began her term on the Board in the summer of

1986 and served on the Campus Development Committee and as Chairman of the Public Affairs Committee.

Mrs. Wyatt has been instrumental in promoting NAIT as a post-secondary educational institute. "It's become evident that there is a very real need for practical education," says Mrs. Wyatt.

Wyatt was nominated by former U of A Chancellor, Peter Savaryn, and ran against Jan Kryer. President of Edmonton Gold Bar PC Association, Nick Porozni, was on hand at the riding elections. "The turnout was excellent," said Porozni, "with over 300 attending the nomination."

Mrs. Wyatt was P.C. Regional Director for Avonmore, Millwoods, and Edmonton Goldbar and is presently the Business Manager for Edmonton Catholic Schools.

When asked if the election would be called for this spring Mrs. Wyatt said, "There is only one person in this province who can honestly answer that question right now and the rest of us are unfortunately not privileged to that information."

"Instructor Evaluation" Meetings Ending

Students and NAIT staff will have the opportunity to voice their opinions on Student Feedback (formerly called Instructor Evaluation) to the Review Committee at the final three open meetings on Feb. 21, 22 and 28.

Student Feedback allows students to comment on their instructor's performance by questionnaire. It was first introduced at NAIT during the 1987/88 academic year, and was called Instructor Evaluation at that time. The following changes were made effective last fall.

- Results of questionnaires are for instructors' information only and are no longer included on their performance appraisals.
- Student Feedback is the revised system's name. Instructor Evaluation was the name of the original system.
- Each instructor must give

two questionnaires per year.

- The student may sign the questionnaire if he or she wishes.
- Instructors are encouraged, but not required, to share results of the questionnaire with their supervisors and their classes.
- All raw data and electronic records are destroyed after 30 days.
- Student Feedback is given publicity so that students and staff are aware of it.
- "Current grievance appeal mechanisms should be made more visible. Staff should pay greater attention to the needs and expectations of students. Additional avenues should be created for students to express their views."
- Feedback is "limited to those elements of the

instructional activity on which the students can competently provide feedback."

- The wording and structure of the questionnaire was clarified.
- The instructor determines when to give the questionnaire to students. A student or third party collects the completed forms. Computer and Systems Services Division summarizes the responses and gives the summary to the instructor.
- The Review Committee educates, monitors, implements and conducts organized reviews of Student Feedback.

Charles S. Noble Award for Student Leadership

The Charles S. Noble Award for Student Leadership is intended to recognize post-secondary students demonstrating outstanding dedication and leadership to fellow students and to their community.

Nominees for this Award must be Alberta residents and be currently enrolled in a minimum of three full-time

courses. Nominees should display commitment in one or more of the following areas:

- student government at the local, provincial or national level
- student societies, clubs, organizations or in non-profit community organizations

Commemorative plaques will be presented to recipients upon recommendation of the Selection Committee at each institution.

Nomination Deadline: March 1

Nomination forms and further information may be obtained from your Student Union offices.

Proposed Policy on A.I.D.S

NAITSA will be voting at the next General Council meeting (Feb. 21) on a proposed ACTISEC (Alberta Colleges and Technologies Institutes Student Executives) policy on AIDS.

Three of the five proposed statements in the policy accepted by General Council on Feb. 7, 1989 are:

1. ACTISEC supports the education of students on matters pertaining to AIDS and AIDS education.
2. BIRT () member institutions also be encourages to execute long-term AIDS Educational Policies (ie. condom machines, condom wallets, brochures, displays, peer support groups, posters, etc).
3. BIRFT principles of confidentiality and non-

discrimination be affirmed in any AIDS education and/or policy developed by ACTISEC.

The other two statements were tabled for the next meeting for further discussion.

4. BIRT ACTISEC explicitly support policy statements that post-secondary students can not be denied access to post-secondary institutions on their facilities for reason of carrying the HIV virus.
5. BIRT member locals be encouraged to lobby their civic governments for the inclusion of sexual orientation as prohibited grounds for discrimination as part of provincial Human Rights Code.

Students who have an opinion on these statements should contact their tech reps.

Editorial:

**"Instructor Evaluation":
Speak up NOW!**

What if they held a meeting and nobody came?

The hallways are covered in bright yellow posters announcing meetings for the NAIT public to let THEIR elected Academic Council know what its electorate wants.

The response so far has been pathetic. Twelve meetings were announced. As of Tuesday, only one presentation had been made to the committee and only a few people had talked privately to some of the review committee members. How is the review committee ever going to come up with a solution that will satisfy both students and instructors if neither students nor instructors tell them what they want?

Why such a poor response?

1. The problem no longer exists. The current Student Feedback is a perfect solution
(Who believes this is true?)
2. No one looked at the yellow posters in the halls.
(The drab yellow posters are not very dramatic compared to the cab posters of penguins waddling out of the refrigerator, but someone must have looked at them.)
3. People feel their input will not make a difference.
 - a) No one will listen to them.
(Let me assure you, the review committee members are very good listeners.)
 - b) There will be too many people with too many opinions for one more to make any difference.
(This is not the case. Hardly anyone is speaking up.)
 - c) Somebody else will do it.
(No one can speak your mind as well as you. Don't let anyone else do your thinking for you.)
4. It won't make any difference to me.
(It's true that these things take time, but a good system of student comment on instructor performance has the potential to improve the quality of education here. A bad system could decrease the quality.
(What if the quality of instruction at NAIT and therefore the quality of NAIT graduates deteriorates in a few years? How would you like to try to get a job with a company whose last experience with a NAIT graduate was unsatisfactory? Your diploma could become worth next to nothing.)
5. It's too much trouble.
(It would take just a little bit of thought and a ten minute phone call.)

Do it now. Whether you are a student or an instructor, and whatever your opinion is, take the time to talk to the review committee. You might just be the missing piece in the puzzle that will get students and instructors working together to make this Institute the best it can be.

The reason for this failure was probably due more to the fact that the average fan could not afford to attend the event rather than that they did not know about the event. After all, very few working people can afford to spend the original \$250 price let alone rent a tuxedo and limo so they will not look out of place.

Hopefully organizers will learn from these errors and will aim their audience aspirations more towards the average fan instead of the elite few. This should create more excitement for the event itself and subdue the inclinations towards apathy that some fans have because they feel left out.


On the women's side, the ladies won three out of 4 games. They lost the first game 11-15 and then won the




