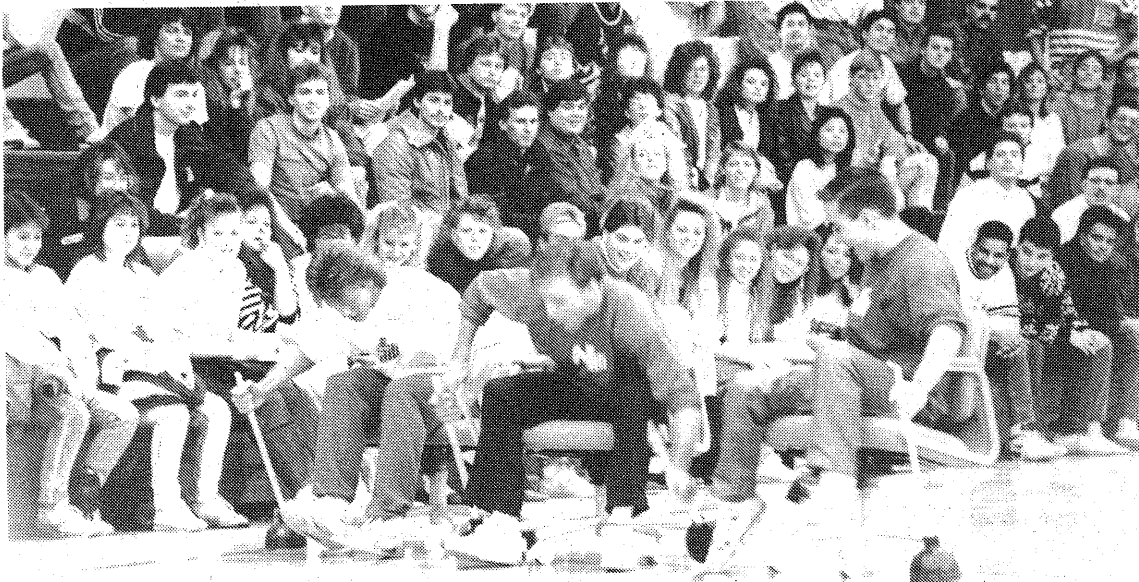


Queen week fun event pyramid building with NAIT Queen Deanne Ball and her Petroleum 'subjects'.

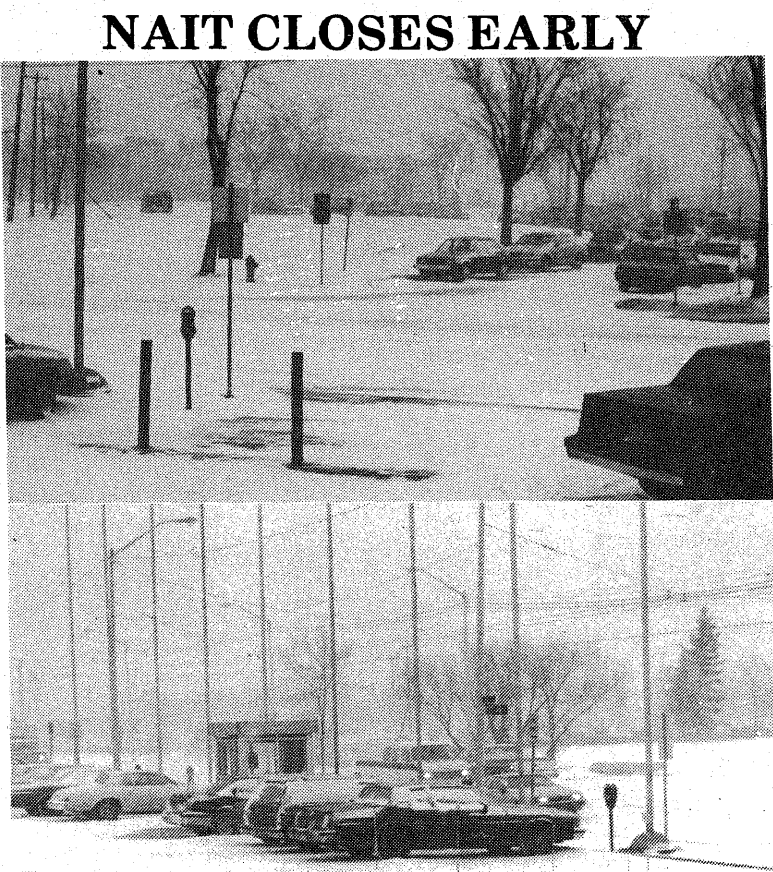

White Monday

The last time NAIT was closed due to an act of God was Black Friday in July of '87. The tornado flooded the campus and classes were forced to be closed. This was no where near black.

White Monday started at about 3:00 a.m., on the 30th of January. Bill Burton, Grounds Foreman, and his snow removal team have been working around the clock. "We will be working 16 hours a day for the next few days," said Bill. This is making it hard on his personnel. Coupled with the cold and drifting conditions, rotation of his staff has become necessary.


NAIT is equipped with a grater, a low profile bobcat, a Michigan loader, a small tractor which can be converted into a snowblower, and three sweepers. This was not enough. John French, operator of the front-end loader, was then brought to the scene. As of 3:00 p.m. Tuesday, he will have put in a 24 hour shift. Tuesday evening classes have been cancelled due to these unreasonable conditions.

According to Mr. Burton, major problems include cars that are left abandoned, and blocked access to parking stalls.

Bob Kerr, Director of Facilities Management, says, "it's the transportation to NAIT that seems to be the problem." Highways and main arteries were congested. The temperatures made it unsafe and impractical for some students to attend classes.

STUDENT FEEDBACK nee INSTRUCTOR EVALUATION

After years of development, in the spring of '88 a program of instructor evaluation was implemented. Instructor evaluation was a method for students to take part in the formal performance appraisal of an instructor. The evaluation would be viewed by a supervisor and would be recorded in the instructor's file.

The program however, was quickly revamped after instructors approached Academic Council to express concern. The Council struck a review committee to hold hearings to review the program.

Resulting from 18 formal presentations and 13 written submissions and 42 complaints from a Peer Consultant, the review committee's findings drastically revamped the plan.

No longer did the evaluation take part in the performance appraisal. No longer did the supervisor see the evaluation. No longer was there a random selection. No longer was there a standard form.

Now there was a purely formative document (nobody sees it but the instructor evaluated). The instructor can select the class and the questions on the form.

Students and staff seem to have lost the resolve to try and change the system to a better "instructor evaluation". I am included in this group. How can I say don't lose heart when I no longer feel that my voice as a student is respected or even sought. But I do say "don't lose heart"; how else can we make things better?

Whatever your stand on this issue please take the time to speak to the committee and make your position known. The committee is seeking our feedback and will formulate their recommendations from the feedback. Let's make it easier for them by all speaking our mind and not let the few change the way for the many.

The Classroom at NAIT: The bored leading the bored

In your first class tomorrow, take a look around. How many people do you see who look like they're falling asleep or are bored to tears? Classes are sometimes like a joke I once heard. What is the definition of the word 'instructor'? It is "a person who talks in other people's sleep."

Why is this? Isn't learning supposed to be fun? Isn't teaching supposed to be fun? I can think of a few possible reasons, most of them caused by the regimented nature of school.

1. Most classes are passive. The instructor talks, students listen.
2. Students are not interested in learning; they are interested in passing exams. It is a fact of life that grades are important to employers.
3. This is not the 'real world'. It is easy to forget that some of the dryer coursework might actually be useful someday. The real (working) world sometimes seems to have more purpose.
4. Lack of motivation and work by the student.
5. Less than spectacular performance by the instructor.

What is the solution? Get involved in your classes and you will enjoy them. When you do your assignments and readings, allow yourself the luxury of really learning, rather than just preparing to memory dump. You may not have this opportunity again.

If you would like to learn about real boredom, ask someone who did not finish their diploma and has been working full-time at 7-11 for a year. It might give you more incentive to study if you realize that, not only is this more interesting than the School of Hard Knocks, you might not even have to attend the School of Hard Knocks if you put in enough effort here.

As for Possible Reason number five, try talking to the instructor. If a class participates more, it may spark an apathetic instructor. If not, try tackling this chain of command: Assistant Program Head, Program Head, Associate Dean of the Program, Dean of the Program, Vice President of Student and Staff Affairs, Vice President of Instruction, and President of NAIT.

Or you just might want to speak up to the committee reviewing instructor evaluation. Look on the walls for yellow posters listing the time and place of the hearings.

Certain products, especially bonds and preferred shares (NOTE: preferred shares will be introduced in a later issue), may have special features which allow the owner special privileges. The three most common are: 1) Redemption, 2) Retraction; and 3) Conversion.

Definition: Redemption: A redemption clause means that the issuer of the stock has the right to buy the stock back at

a certain date(s) at a preset price - usually at par. (\$1,000 for most bonds, \$25 for most preferred shares.)

Definition: Retraction: A retraction clause gives the owner of the stock the right to sell the stock back to the issuer at a certain date(s) at a preset price.

Points to Remember: Whoever owns the privilege (not the stock) can force the transaction. For example, if

you hold a \$1,000 par bond which is trading at \$120 (thus worth \$1,200 on the open market), on the effective date, the issuer can "call" the bond - i.e. the issuer generally publicizes a list of serial numbers of the bonds they want to buy. The issuer is only required to pay the preset redemption price -- say \$100. If your bond is one on the list, you have no choice but to surrender it at \$100 -- not the \$120 market price. Thus, the market price of redeemable stock tends to move toward the redemption price as the redemption date approaches.

With retraction, you have the right to force the issuer to buy back the stock. Thus, unless the company dissolves, you are guaranteed a preset price -- no matter what you paid for the stock, and no matter what the stock is currently worth. Obviously, you would not exercise the right unless the retraction price was higher than the market price.

In both cases, "downside" is limited. In other words, the most you can lose on the investment is the difference between purchase price and the redemption or retraction price, assuming the purchase price was higher. Thus, much of the risk in trading bonds or preferreds is greatly reduced.

Note: Due to space constraints, conversion will be introduced next week.

CD-ROM Search Stations

Two computers that serve up information on a platter. Yes, hold on to your future shock absorbers as you discover the potential of CD-ROM. CD-ROM (Compact Disc Read Only Memory) has been called the "new papyrus". Each palm-sized, wafer-thin platter can hold a staggering 550 megabytes of digital data ... that's 257,000 pages of text!

The Library's CD-ROM databases are impressive. With just a few keystrokes and a few minutes of instruction from library staff you can search:

five years of 339 science and technology magazines using the Applied Science and Technology Index

six years of 200 business magazines, 300 popular magazines and 10 newspapers using Canadian Business and Current Affairs

five years of news and current events articles in 182 magazines using Reader's Guide, or

two years of 3,200 biomedical journals using Medline

and print a list of articles on a high speed printer.

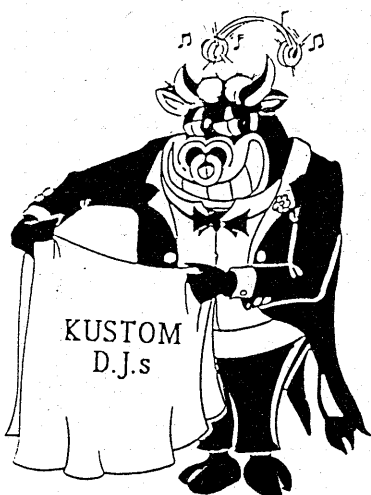

WINTER DEFROSTER: Plastics and Court Reporting

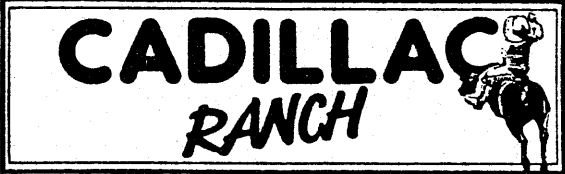

Outshooting the Trojans 46 to 34, the Ooks gained a 5-1 lead after two, even though the two teams were tied at 1-1 after the first.

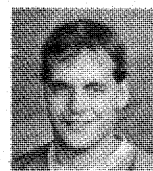
On Sunday, January 29th, the Ooks trounced the Trojans 13-4 at the SAIT Arena to complete the sweep.

I have now played "Lucky" for two years. Let me tell you, this kid has a lot of heart and character.

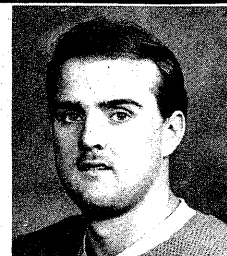
In his first year in the ACAC with NAIT, "Miles" found himself struggling on the fourth line trying to learn the system and also adjusting to the fast paced action of college hockey.
