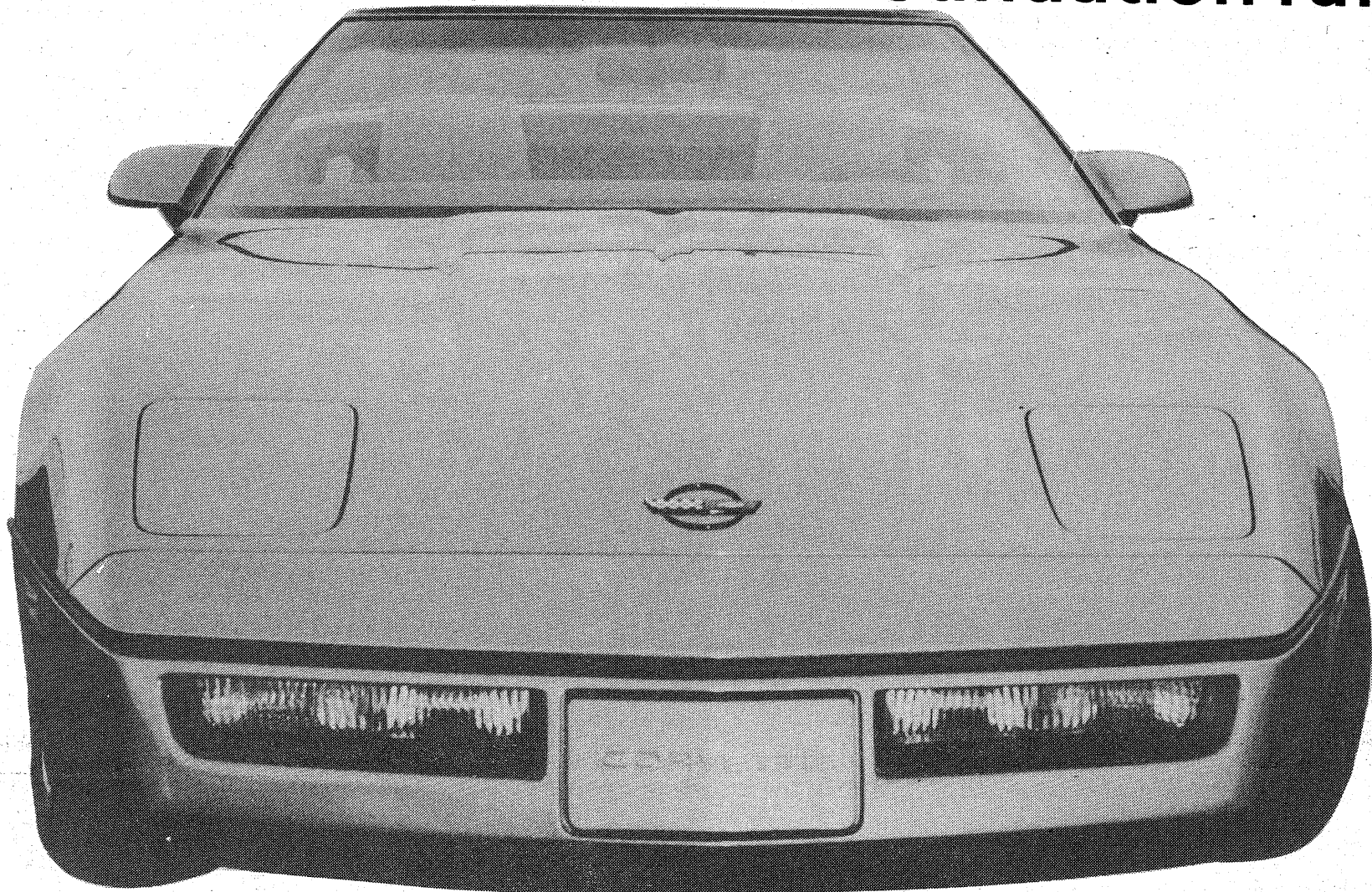

# Students involved in NAIT Foundation raffle



NAITSA results for student ticket sales for the NAIT Foundation's car raffle are beginning to filter in.

NAITSA is offering prizes for highest ticket sales by an individual, a large technology and a small technology.

NAITSA is offering 10% of total student sales as prizes. Based on \$35,000 of ticket sales, the prize for the greatest sales by a large technology would be \$2,000. The small technology winner would receive \$1,000 and our

According to NAITSA President Pat McEwen, almost \$4,200 worth of tickets have been sold to date. McEwen feels this may be the year for students to really get

## NAIT Cruising for Expansion

The Northern Alberta Institute of Technology (NAIT) announced it will begin an aggressive fund raising campaign this year. Money raised from various events and appeals will support a major campus expansion designed to alleviate overcrowding.

This first phase of this expansion will be a Health and Medical complex to be built on existing Institute land, across 106 Street from the main campus, at an estimated cost of \$36 million.

The complex will house NAIT's popular Health and Medical Technology programs, such as Dental Assisting, Medical Laboratory, Respiratory, and X-Ray Technologies, to name a few. These programs require state-of-the-art laboratories and equipment to provide the best possible training for students in these critical health care fields.

The building will also contain a lecture theatre, walk-in student bookstore and other necessary student amenities.

Initial fund raising plans are underway, starting with a gala "Cruise to Jamaica" dinner and benefit auction to be held on the NAIT campus on Friday, February 24, 1989.

With the help of the Architectural Technology students, the Institute's main lobby will be transformed into a cruise ship, the SS *Benefit NAIT*. A six-course gourmet dinner will be prepared by NAIT's graduating chefs, and Caribbean entertainment will be supplied by the Trin Can Steel Band, compliments of the Jamaican Consul in Edmonton, and the Jamaica Tourist Board in Toronto.

Four hundred guests are expected to attend this function at \$125 per ticket,

and bid on over 200 items that have been donated for the auction. Donations include restaurant dinners, holidays, accommodations, seminars, art, furs, appliances, and novelty items. A real Caribbean cruise has been donated by Wardair and Marlin Travel. Many of the other items were donated by NAIT students and staff members.

NAIT hopes that funds raised from the sale of dinner tickets and the auction of various goods and services will exceed \$150,000 and put it well on the way to realizing the goal of a new building.

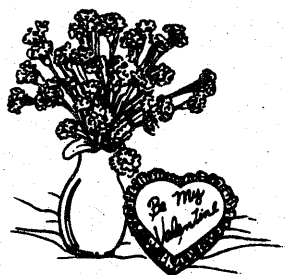

## Communications Breakdown

A problem in disseminating information simultaneously to all of NAIT's population was demonstrated last Thursday.

Instructors announced to their classes that if the fire alarm rang that students were to go home. Somehow more information ran through the student population. A bomb threat.

The hallway was buzzing with bad jokes and questions. Were they pulling my leg? Was it a real threat? Were we to attend our next class? Could we leave if we didn't want to stay?

What of those students who were not in class when the announcement was made? Although it didn't take long for the vast majority to be informed, I have talked to one student who was in attendance Thursday and did not know until the following day.

A public address system might have prevented much of the uncertainty and rumours that abounded.

The safety of staff and students is of top priority to the NAIT Administration. This is an isolated situation and may never arise again, but what if a student had not left the building because of the cold and thought it was only a fire drill?

Although a public address system is an expensive proposition and would not be used daily, perhaps its feasibility will be examined.

## Fence Sitting: Required Course for NAIT Administration?

Why weren't classes cancelled on Tuesday, January 31st, the day after White Monday? According to Fred Williamson, Acting President of NAIT, no decision was made on Monday about Tuesday's classes because administration wanted to "stay flexible" and reassess its position in the morning.

On Tuesday bedraggled students and instructors trickled in to find half empty classrooms. As on Monday, classes were cancelled at 2:15 p.m. Why? Why not sooner? It seemed clear to me on Tuesday morning that the population of Edmonton was having great difficulty getting where it wanted to go.

I can think of a few possible reasons for staying open. First, the weather might have improved. (Does anyone *really* believe this?) Second, some students are very dedicated and would sooner have all their teeth pulled out than miss class. In my experience Continuing Education students are often like this. They see education as a means to escape dead-end jobs or avoid them altogether. Some full-time day students are also like this, though. Some programs here at NAIT are brutally difficult and require a maximum effort just to pass. Chem Tech, for instance. According to Ted Ondrus, Chem Tech's Program Head, 50% of students take two years to graduate from Chem Tech. The rest either fail or take the program in three years. With statistics like that, I could understand it if the rumour I heard about one Chem Tech instructor continuing to teach on Monday after classes were cancelled was true.

But what about the argument for closing? My view is that it was simply a waste of time to be here on Tuesday. Most people did not show up, so, even before classes were officially cancelled, they were simply not held.

When NAIT administration did not cancel Tuesday's classes on Tuesday morning, it was sitting on the fence. Perhaps hindsight is 20/20, but I think Tuesday was an avoidable waste of time.

## Taking Stock

### Definition: Conversion:

This is another feature commonly attached to bonds, preferreds, and warrants. Basically, it allows the holder of the stock to "convert" (exchange) the stock into a predetermined number of common shares. This privilege usually has a deadline and must meet certain other requirements. The common shares may be referred to as the "underlying stock."

The requirements are many and varied, but one is that the common shares must trade at or above a preset level for 60 consecutive trading days.

### Advantages and

**Disadvantages:** The main advantage of a convertible stock is that it allows the holder the opportunity to receive a regular income (interest or dividends) while participating in capital gains. For example, an 8 percent convertible preferred may trade at \$20/share and be convertible into four common shares, which may be trading at \$5/share. Thus, the total value of the common and the preferred are equal.

If however, the common share jumps to \$10/share, the holder may convert his preferred (at \$20) into four common shares at a total value of \$40. Obviously a wise move. For this reason, the preferred tends to not only rise in price in direct proportion to the underlying stock, but usually trades at a "premium". Thus, with the common valued at \$40 the preferred will likely trade slightly higher - usually to account for a higher income (the 8 percent dividend).

Of course, the opposite may occur, and the preferred lose a portion of its value. The loss will generally not be as great as the potential gain, again, because the dividend will support the price of the preferred.

I recommend that a person investing in convertible preferreds do so with preferreds, which also have a retraction clause. (Bonds automatically pay par at maturity - in effect, bonds carry a redemption clause which protect the investor from loss.)

The Registrar's office took the two calls. The first call was taken at approximately

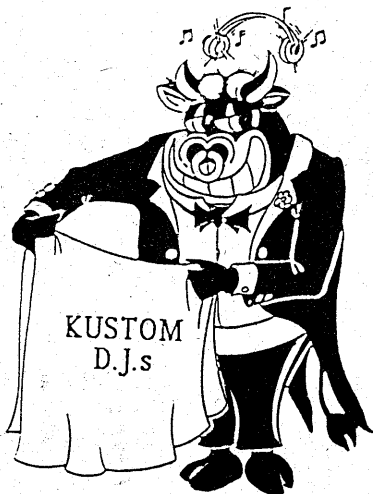

#### Publishing/Posting Deadlines

Positions advertised in Thursday's edition of *The Nugget* are those which have been received by the Friday prior to the week of publication. The Placement Centre's main bulletin boards—located across from the Main Cafeteria, on the 2nd floor of the Tower Building, in the hospitality area of Plaza II, and across from the cafeteria at Westwood Campus—are updated daily and have the most recent postings available. The Placement Centre also maintains a list of all current postings for full-time, summer, and part-time job opportunities.

#### Weekly Postings

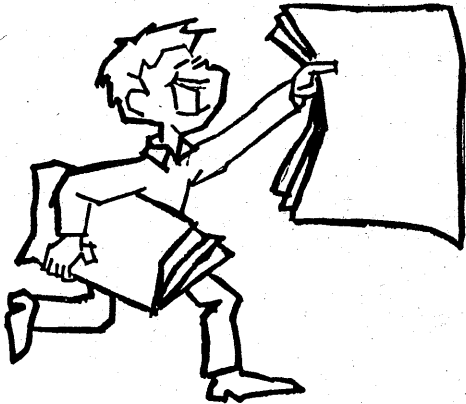

## What Employers Want

Seventeen attitudinal factors were listed, and 108 employers rated these on a five-point scale ranging from very important to not important. Rates as the five most important factors were:

#### 1. Ability to Communicate

This quality is probably the easiest one to evaluate since the interview is a face-to-face encounter in verbal and non-verbal communication. Many recruiters will try to help the communication process by asking questions such as:

"Would you tell me a little about the jobs you have held, how they were obtained and why you left."

Others will test your "ability to communicate" by more challenging questions such as, "What is your major weakness?"

#### 2. Willingness to Take Initiative

This trait is an important one for any person who wishes to prove himself/herself on the job. In an interview it can be demonstrated if you answer: "How do you spend your spare time, or what have you done in your life which demonstrates initiative?" - in a satisfactory manner.

#### 3. Willingness To Accept Responsibility

A good manager must be responsible not only for his/her own work projects but for the functioning of a whole department which may involve a number of employees. Questions such as the following are asked during an interview to determine whether the individual has managerial potential: "How old were you when you became self-supporting? Describe the work environment which best suits your work style. What kind of boss would you ideally like to work for? What is your attitude to overtime work?"

#### 4. Leadership Potential

Many employers believe that leaders are born not made. Regardless of whether or not you agree with this opinion, there is evidence to prove that people

who generally get top management positions demonstrated their leadership potential quite early in life. If, during the interview, you were able to prove by examples that you had served on the executive of students' clubs or outside organizations, the recruiter would most likely assume that you possess this trait.

#### 5. Ambitious/Motivated

One way of determining motivation is to test whether or not the candidate has plans for his/her future. *What do you hope to be doing five years from now? If employed by this company, which department would interest you most in the long term and what salary do you expect?* Help the recruiter assess your ambition.

Listed below are other factors in order of importance along with questions an interviewer might pose to determine their presence in a potential candidate.

#### 6. Intelligent

What have you learned from some of the jobs you have held? What were your grades in high school, at college?

#### 7. High Energy Level

What do you do when you're not working or studying?

#### 8. Self-Confident

Why should I hire you for the job? What qualifications do you have that make you feel you will be successful in your field?

#### 9. Sociable/Gets Along Well With Others

Define co-operation. What type of people rub you the wrong way? How do you feel about team work?

#### 10. Imagination

What do you have to contribute to our company? What in particular, interests you about our products, or service?

#### 11. Flexibility

Describe some changes you've made in your life? Can you give me some examples of how you adapted

to changes in your life?

#### 12. Outgoing/Friendly

Often this trait is easily recognized in an interview situation by the way you respond to the interviewer's questions.

#### 13. Persistent

Would you describe some obstacles you have overcome in your life?

#### 14. Aggressive

If you were not pleased with one of your employee's work, how would you handle it?

#### 15. Orderly

Describe your work habits.

#### 16. Independent

How much supervision do you wish in a work situation? What kind of work do you prefer and why? (Research or a more routine kind of day-to-day work?)

#### 17. Seeks Help and Advice

Should you encounter a difficult problem at work would you prefer to grapple with it for a number of hours on your own or would you consult with a colleague or supervisor first?

MOBILITY of candidates was mentioned by a number of employers as being an additional factor important to them when making selections. It is important to note that recruiters have different expectations when asked "mobility" questions.

If you are asked "Do you prefer any specific location? Why?" the interviewer usually wants to know if you are familiar with the company's various office locations and also what ties (familiar or otherwise) bind you to one location or another.

Are you willing to go anywhere the company sends you? is a wide open question which may throw candidates off because they usually imagine being sent to an undesirable place. However, it may mean only would you work at any one of our company locations?

Over 50 Ooks from past years attended the affair

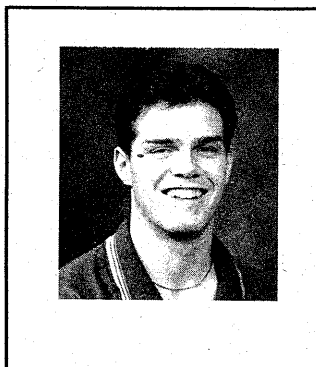
which started early Saturday morning on the ice and lasted well into Sunday morning off the ice.

Rick Kosowan was the hero of the weekend by not losing a match. Kosowan advances to the medal play down at SAIT in singles, in doubles with Bruce Clarkson and in mixed with Kris Chapman.

Other players who advanced to play at SAIT to represent Alberta at the CCAA Championships in Quebec City were Bruce Clarkson and Chris Dunbury in mixed.

"What a great improvement. The whole team should be proud of themselves," stated coach Eileen Harle.

## Hoop Chicks Win First of 1989

While the NAIT Women's Basketball Team has dropped out of conference play, they are still competing in a series of exhibition games throughout the season with the hope of rejoining the ACAC next season.

On January 27th, the NAIT squad squared off against the ladies from Concordia College and won a convincing 74-35 decision. The Chicks dominated all aspects of this affair. NAIT's Marge Antonio led all scorers with 22 points. Shannon Keiser with 14 points and Janine Auch with 13 points were the other Chicks in double digits.

The win was the first of 1989 after dropping decisions to Camrose Lutheran College (83-51) and to Lethbridge Community College (56-34).

Between now and then coach Gregg Meropoulos is faced with the task of identifying players for next year's squad and trying to ensure that if they are recruited by NAIT, they do show up to play.

## Playoff Chances Slim For V ballers

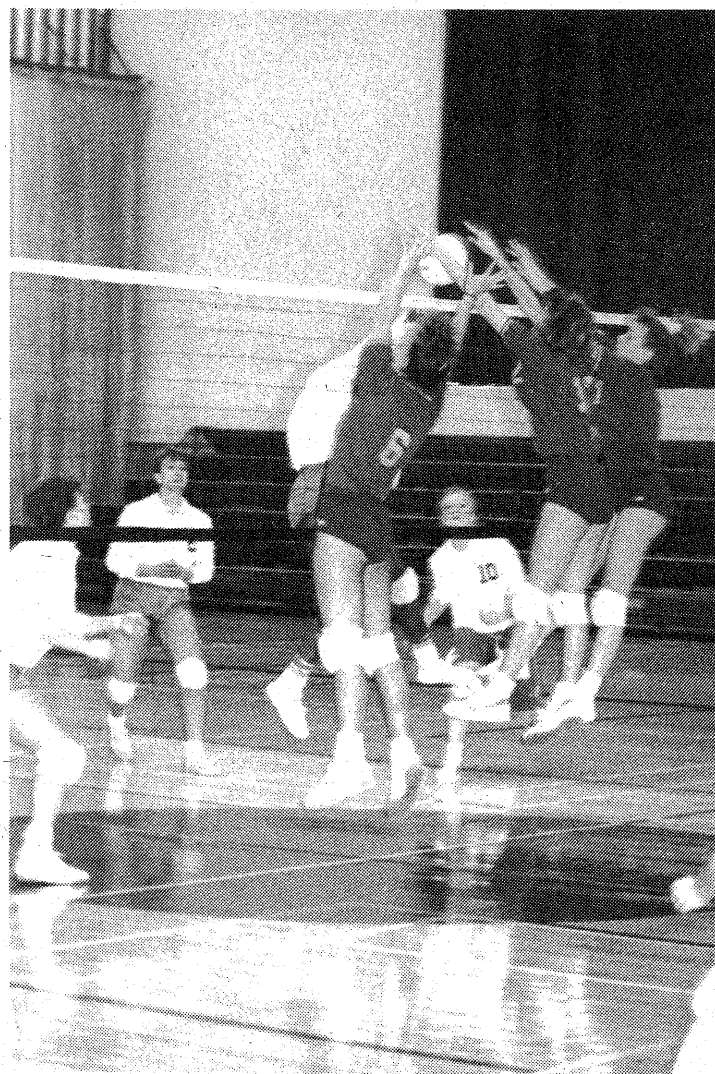

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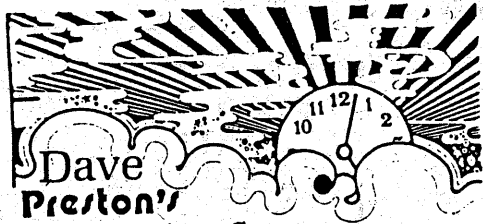

Newton Grey, a second year Electronics Engineering student, won a silver medal in the provincial finals on February 4th at the U of A Butterdome.

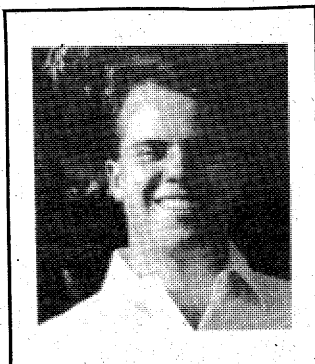
In doing so, Newton Grey tied the old provincial record of 6.89 seconds in the Senior Men's 60 meter sprint.

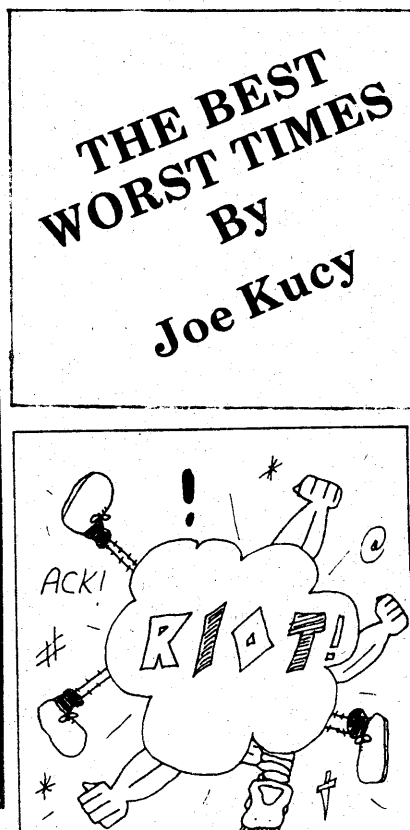
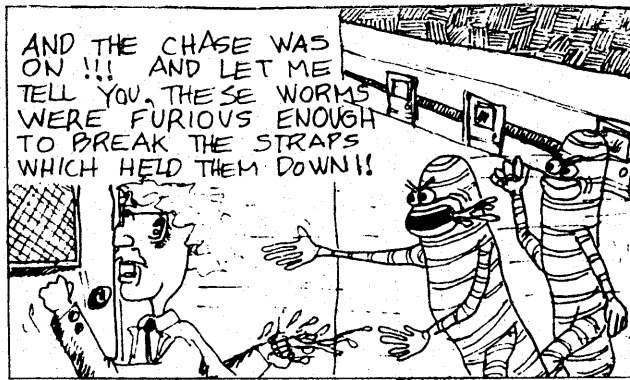
