FRED WILLIAMSON: A PROFILE

The man serving as President of NAIT for the next several months has a distinguished record in post-secondary education both at NAIT and in Alberta.

Fred Williamson's regular position, Executive Vice-President, Academic Affairs, is the last in a series of academic titles he has held since joining NAIT in 1963. Trained as an engineer, Fred was successively Instructor, Program Head, and Department Head in the engineering technologies. In 1971, he was appointed Director of Technical-Vocational Programs in Alberta Advanced Education, a position entailing system-wide responsibilities.

Fred returned to NAIT as Vice-President, Academic, in 1975. Educational leave interrupted his Institute tenure in 1980/81, when he pursued a doctorate in education at the University of Alberta. This study added to his B.Sc. in Mining Engineering (1959) and M.Sc. in Civil Engineering (1964) from the U. of A., a year of post-graduate engineering at Purdue University (1966-67), and M.Ed. from the U. of A. (1972). Completing his coursework, Fred returned to Advanced Education (on a secondment) to co-ordinate

the conversion of the Technical Institutes to board-governed status, 1981-82.

Then returning to NAIT in his former capacity, Fred took leading roles in a number significant initiatives: semester conversion; core programming; and developmental directions aimed at emphasizing NAIT's particular strengths, promoting expansion into emerging technologies, and supporting provincial economic priorities. Fred is well known for his vigorous advocacy of the view that the post-secondary system be rationalized to clarify programming mandates and reduce duplication and, in particular, that the Technical Institutes should offer education distinct from that of the colleges and universities. Fred's concern for standards and quality, though strong, is lightened by a witty and humorous approach to the spectrum of difficulties inherent in a large complex operation. He fully recognizes what a great challenge it is to convey practical knowledge from generation to generation, with effectiveness and efficiency.

- candidates under 18 must obtain written approval from parent or guardian.

These are the questions I have:

- 1 -why is the contestant called "Miss Nait" if it's Queen Week? or vice versa
- 2 -why must the Queen candidate be a "first year" student and Mr. Nait only be "returning"? This means in pre-technology only the men are eligible to take part in "Queen week"?

As I look into my crystal ball, I see that 1989 is going to be an interesting year at NAIT. Here is my list:

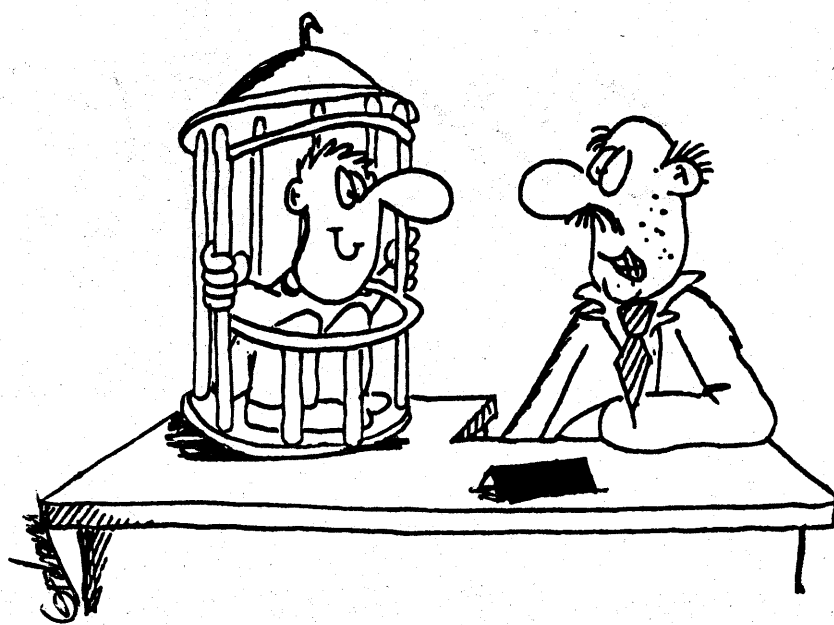
- Dr. Souch leaves NAIT to play oldtimers' hockey fulltime and Eddie Shack becomes President of NAIT

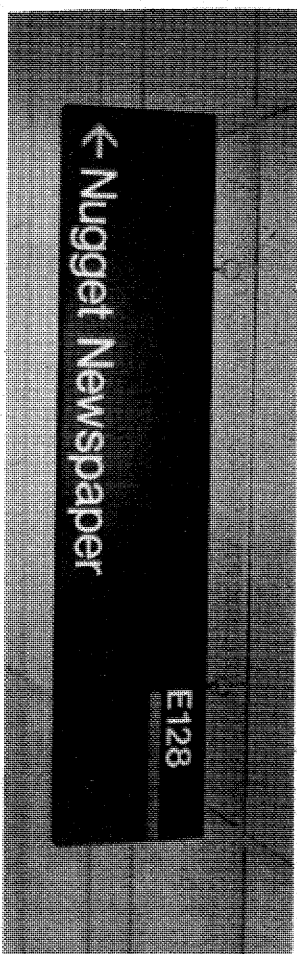

CHRETIEN TO VISIT U of C AS PART OF STUDENT'S UNION CANADIAN SPEAKER SERIES

CALGARY - Former Liberal Cabinet Minister Jean Chretien will visit the city in January as the third speaker in a new lecture series sponsored by The Students' Union of the University of Calgary.

Students' Union Vice President of Events Pam Kuryluk said that as part of The Canadian Speakers' Series, Mr. Chretien's presentation will take place at 8:00 p.m., January 25th in the MacEwan Hall Ballroom on the U of C campus.

Admission for the event will be \$2.00 per person. Seating is limited so people are encouraged to arrive early.

Accident Prevention

Accidents are the leading cause of death among Canadian children. Nine hundred children under 15 die needlessly in accidents each year. One hundred thousand are injured.

PARIS CONFERENCE ON CHEMICAL WEAPONS

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Right Honourable Joe Clark lead the Canadian Delegation at the Conference on chemical weapons in Paris, January 7-11. The Conference, hosted by the French government, focused international attention on the need to eliminate chemical warfare.

"Canada's interest in this subject is long-standing. Canadians have not forgotten that their soldiers in the First World War were among the first to suffer the terror and pain caused by the use of chemical weapons" said Mr. Clark.

The Paris Conference reinforced the authority and status of the 1925 Geneva Protocol for the prohibition of the use in war of asphyxiating, poisonous or other gases, and of bacteriological methods of warfare. In addition, the Paris meeting is intended to provide increased impetus to the Conference on Disarmament which is negotiating a total verifiable ban on the development,

production, stockpiling and use of chemical weapons.

Mr. Clark reaffirmed the long-established Canadian policy against chemical warfare and emphasized the need to conclude as soon as possible a treaty banning chemical weapons altogether. Under Canada's Verification Research Programme, extensive work has been done on verification of a future convention, including procedures which could be used to verify allegations of the use of chemical weapons. This work has already been shared with the international community. Canada does not produce chemical weapons.

Further, in informal co-ordination with other countries, Canada has placed certain chemicals under export controls with a view to ensuring that Canada does not contribute to the development of chemical weapons capabilities. The government has had the full support of the Canadian Chemical Producers' Association in this endeavour.

GOVERNMENT AWARDS \$1.1 MILLION IN ATHLETICS SCHOLARSHIPS

Minister of Advanced Education Dave Russell announced on December 14 that over \$1.1 million has been awarded in Jimmie Condon Athletic Scholarships to 1,141 post-secondary students in Alberta through the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund.

In making the announcement, Mr. Russell said: "These scholarships are awarded to those students enrolled in Alberta's universities, colleges and technical institutes who are involved in athletic competition. These awards recognize the sustained level of commitment that is required to pursue athletic excellence as well as undertake a post-secondary program of study. The recipients of these scholarships are dedicated individuals who value accomplishment both in the sports arena and the classroom."

The \$1,000 scholarships are awarded in two installments and are based on the recommendation of the institution. Students may qualify for the Jimmie Condon Athletic Scholarship in one of three ways: as a member of a designated team; as an individual athlete recognized under the Alberta Athlete Development Program; or as a disabled athlete on a provincial team.

Since its inception in 1980, the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund has awarded in excess of \$68 million to over 48,000 Albertans through 19 scholarship Programs. The Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund was established by the Government of Alberta through a \$100 million endowment from the Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund.

ABOUT JIMMIE CONDON

Born in Turkey in 1888, Jimmie Condon immigrated with his family to Canada in 1912. Settling in Calgary, he opened "Jimmie's Cafe" in 1934, an establishment that was to become one of the City's well-known landmarks in the decade that followed. He retired from the restaurant business in 1945 but not from his commitment to the development of amateur sports in the Calgary community. This interest in supporting, sponsoring and promoting amateur sports began with the first of the famous "Jimmie" teams in 1924. In 1963, the community honoured Jimmie Condon's vital contribution in this field by naming him "Calgary Sportsman of the Year". In 1980, the four Greek sculptures commissioned by him as a donation to the University of Calgary were formally dedicated at the campus. Jimmie Condon died in 1982.

Movie Review:

Mississippi Burning

If you'd like to view a slice of life in Mississippi during the race wars in 1964, go see *Mississippi Burning*. As you might expect, there are lots of scenes of violent, open racism, so think twice about going if you suspect that this might upset you.

If you do decide to go, you will see terrific performances by the actors who portray two FBI agents sent to a small town in Mississippi to investigate the suspected murders of three civil rights workers.

Willem Dafoe (*Platoon*, *Last Temptation of Christ*) is the well-intentioned, naive, button-down fool from the North who is in charge of the investigation. Gene Hackman is the street-smart former Southern sheriff turned FBI agent who should have been in charge of the investigation. The two track down the murderers and bring them to justice despite their personal differences. Sound like *In the Heat of the Night* on tv? It is similar. Don't expect *Cry Freedom*. It's not that uplifting.

For me, the most disturbing aspect of this film is its subject matter. Not because of its violent portrayal of racism, but because there is the hidden implication that perhaps that is the only way racism is expressed. As I left the theatre I wondered how many Canadians who will see this film will continue to believe the pleasant fiction that this is an American problem and that there is no racism in Canada.

This film held my attention throughout. It's worth watching.

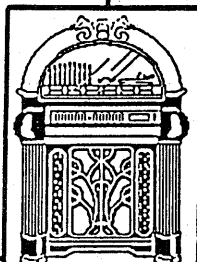

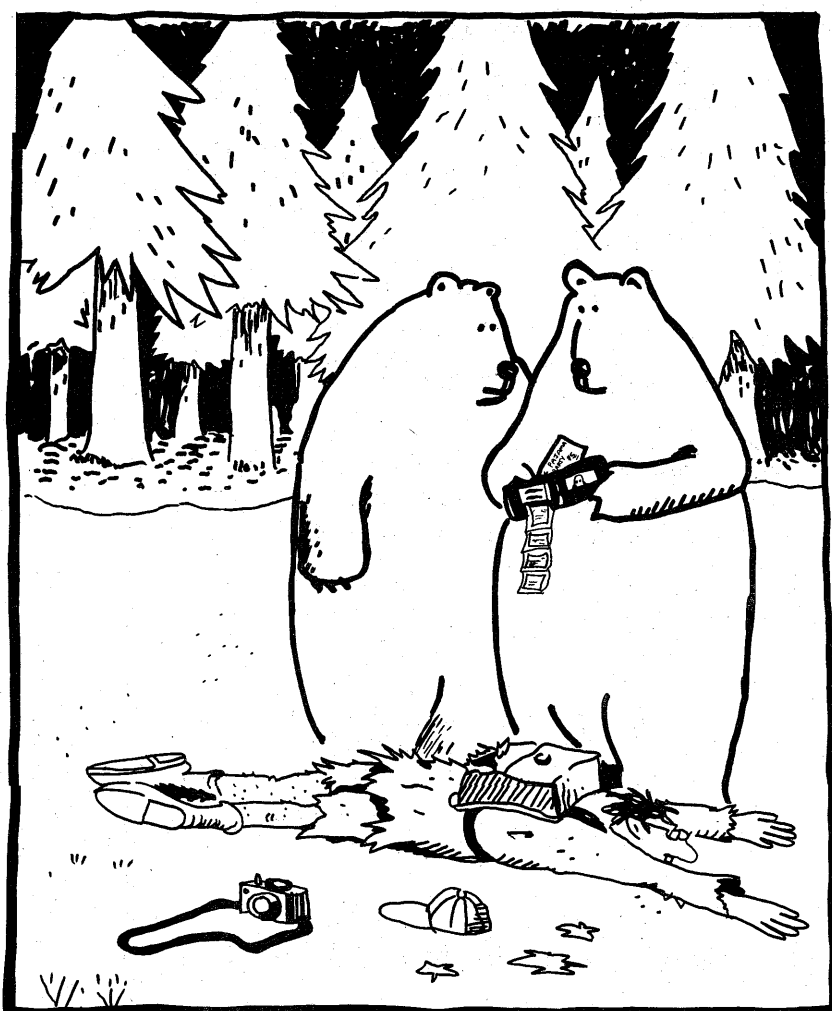

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Let me touch on some topics with the intention of passing on some food for thought.

Marcus Aurelius, the great Roman emperor, said "We are the sum total of our thoughts." Mahatma Gandhi reiterated the above sentiment as follows: "I am the result of all the thoughts I have thought from birth." The wise King Solomon said, "We are what our thoughts make us to be." The eminent Ralph Waldo Emerson said, "We are what we think all day." The great essayist James Allen in one of his classical essays quotes as follows, "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he." Einstein said, "Our thoughts are the preview of life's coming attractions." Prof. William James, the Harvard psychologist and philosopher at the turn of the twentieth century, who is considered the father of Applied Psychology in North America, said, "The greatest finding in my generation is that man can change his life by changing his attitude and thinking." I emphasize, this is not necessarily the greatest finding of his generation but of all generations.

The great thinkers, philosophers, writers, sages and the grand masters of all ages agree, without a shadow of doubt, that our thoughts control the life we lead. I agree, this is a tall order; a difficult medicine to swallow; a novel concept to accept. All these great men of all ages can't all be wrong all the time. As the poet Henley put it "I am the Master of my fate, I am

the captain of my soul".

The premise that can be stated from these great teachings is:

"Our present position in life in the future, is the result of all the thoughts we have thought in the past; all the words we have spoken in the past; all the actions we have performed in the past."

If one accepts this premise, the deduction that follows from this premise is: Our position in life in the future, say five years from now, will be the result of the thoughts we are thinking today and will be thinking over the next five years; all the words we are speaking today and will be speaking over the next five years."

The above premise and deduction in no way implies that we absolutely control all the happenings in our life. It implies that usually or most of the time we can design our life rather than live our life by default. Mark Twain said, "I am an old man now. I have had many worries. None of them came true." There are definite scientific findings that of all the worries, fears, doubts and anxieties that a human being has - ninety percent never happen. Of the balance ten per cent - by making choices; by making decisions; by acting on them - we can overcome five percent of the anxieties and despairs in our lives. In reality, we have no control over the balance five percent. They will happen no matter what - whether we worry or not. Interestingly, of this five

percent over which we have no control, when two to three percent of these happen, we can stomach it; we can tolerate it. The balance two to three percent are the catastrophic ones - death of a loved one, accidents, incurable health problems, financial failure, loss of job etc. Only two to three percent of our worries are catastrophic and the balance 95 percent could be overcome by our proper thinking pattern.

Also, it is scientifically proven that in our lives, 90 percent of the experiences are pleasant and 10 percent of the experiences are unpleasant. It is up to us whether we want to think about the 90 percent of the pleasant experiences and lead a peaceful and happy life; or think about the 10 percent of the unpleasant experiences and have stomach ulcers and mental depression.

We usually, not always, control most of our life's experiences by the thoughts we think all day.

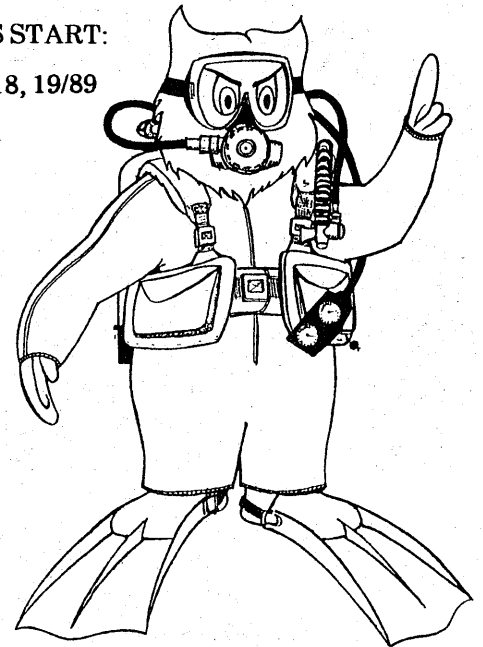

The NAIT Hockey Ooks' success in Czechoslovakia is history. The team's success overseas did not mean a thing when they faced ACAC competition over the weekend as the Ooks suffered a pair of losses and salvaged a tie.

On Friday, January 13th, the Ooks dropped an 8-4 decision to the Red Deer College Kings in Red Deer. On Saturday, January 14th, the Ooks barely hung on for a 1-1 overtime tie with the Mount Royal College Cougars at the NAIT Arena. On Sunday, January 15th, the Ooks were soundly beaten by the SAIT Trojans 5-1 at the NAIT Arena. The Ooks' disappointing record is now seven wins, six losses and two ties.

In Friday's match, the Kings took an early lead and never looked back scoring an 8-4 win in Red Deer.

In the first, Murray Toews of Red Deer opened the scoring at 7:44 on the powerplay. Robin Dube brought the Ooks even at 12:39 with the help of Blaine Peerless while NAIT was killing a penalty. The Kings then stormed back with goals from Darren Cota on the powerplay at 15:14, Murray Toews at 15:50 and Dale Jackson at 19:41 to take a 4-1 lead at the end of the first period.

In the second, Murray Toews of RDC extended the lead to 5-1 with 4:38 elapsed in the frame. Myron Feser of the Ooks cut the margin to three goals at 9:13. Lonnie Spink and Blaine Peerless assisted on the play. NAIT's Robin Dube netted his second of the game at 11:21 on the powerplay from J.C. McEwan and Trevor Semeniuk to make the score 5-3. Bill Peters of the Kings reinstated the three

goal advantage at 13:40. Fifty three seconds later, Randy Wong replied with the fourth NAIT goal. Red Deer's Bill Hardy ended the period scoring at 17:58.

In the third, Bob Duchak made the score 8-4 with 69 seconds gone in the period.

NAIT outshot Red Deer 41 to 34.

In Saturday's contest, the scoring was limited to the first period. At 5:12, Ivan Krook gave the Ooks a 1-0 lead with the help of Robin Dube and J.C. McEwan. One minute and seven seconds later, Matt Kabayama of MRC tied the contest. There was no scoring in the second, third, and overtime periods.

Buddy Brazier of Mount Royal turned away 37 of 38 Ooks shots. At the other end, Rob McKinley of NAIT blocked 29 of 30 Cougar drives.

In Sunday's game, the Ooks capped off an uninspired weekend performance with a 5-1 loss to the SAIT Trojans.

In the first, the SAIT Trojans gained a 2-0 lead on goals by Terry Gardiner at 2:05 and Wally Fizer at 13:15.

In the second, the Ooks cut the lead to one when Ted Bradshaw scored on the powerplay from Lonnie Spink at the 3:45 mark.

In the third, the Trojans sealed the victory with goals from Todd Oliphant at 4:56, Cody Gundlock at 7:21, and Kent Paterson at 14:52.

SAIT goaltender Jeff Stayko stopped 38 of 39 NAIT shots. NAIT goalie Don Davidge redirected 24 of 29 SAIT drives.

The performance of the Ooks at home over the weekend was one of the worst

in the 80s. The Ooks lacked leadership and desire. Both SAIT and MRC controlled the play most of the time. Many of the NAIT players were content to shoot their mouths off instead of shooting the puck in the net. The penalties taken by the team indicated a team lacking in discipline and character.

It is obvious that without change the 1988-89 edition of the NAIT Hockey Ooks is going nowhere fast. The Ooks, if they do not get their act together and work hard as a team each and every shift, will be humiliated at the Nationals and at Faceoff '89.

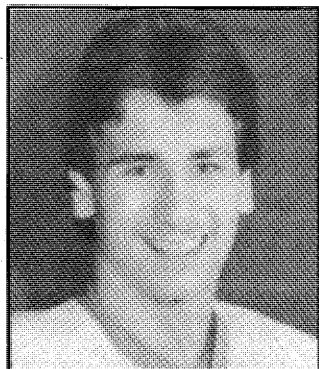

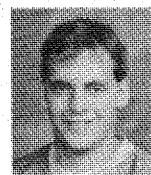
