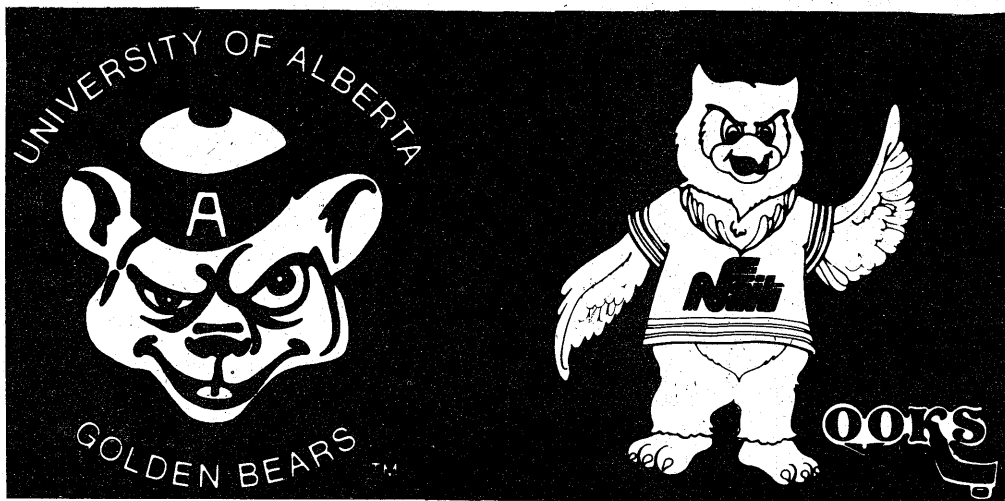
For the students of NAIT and the U of A, the game provides an opportunity to show pride in their educational institution.

## In Memoriam: William Sinnema (1937 - 1988)

Bill Sinnema, Program Development Officer in Electronics Engineering Technology, on leave this academic year in Victoria, B.C., went missing just before Christmas. He failed to return from a fishing trip on December 23, and was the subject of an extensive search lasting several days. Recent reports leave little hope of his being found alive.

A staff member since 1965, and for many of the intervening years a program head, Bill made significant contributions to NAIT's electronics programming. He was the author of two widely-

used textbooks on electronic communication. Bill was using his leave this year to study digital signal processing at Royal Roads Military College in Victoria.

A memorial service was held for him last Saturday at Trinity Christian Reformed Church. The Sinnema family requests that any donations be directed to the King's College, of which Bill was a director. ## Modernization Closes Elevator Doors in Tower

The elevators in the Tower have been the source of many conversations. Friday was no exception.

The south elevator which has carried the burden of the two lifts has recently been modernized. This technology was the cause of both elevators being out of service Friday, January 20, until noon Monday, January 23.

A specialized piece of computer hardware was needed to repair the damage incurred Friday. Nick Kalanza, Acting Power Chief, said it was a coincidence that it happened when it did. "The only place we could get the card," Nick said, "was in Toronto."

Even though clearly marked, Toronto did not treat it as an emergency order. The

card, needed to run this innovative new system, did not leave Toronto until Monday. "We were lucky to get the elevator fixed when we did," said Mr. Kalanza.

In the meantime, traffic on the stairs was intensified. The major problem was that handicapped students were left with no alternative.

Shirley Kabachia, Coordinator for Services to Disabled Students, said some students could not attend classes because of the unforeseeable breakdown. "There are some students," said Kabachia, "that have given up on the elevators for the time being."

According to Mr. Kalanza, both north and south elevators should be in operation in less than two weeks.

## Editorial:

**The Great White North, Strong and...free?**

When Canadians talk about how glad they are to live here because it is different from other parts of the world, the conversation inevitably turns to comparisons with the United States. "Aren't we lucky!" people say. "They have such terrible racism in the States. Just look at Mississippi!"

What a lie. And what hypocrisy.

Anyone who believes that we don't have racism in Canada is at best naive, and is at worst a hypocritical bigot. All anyone needs to do to see it is to open his or her eyes and mind and look around.

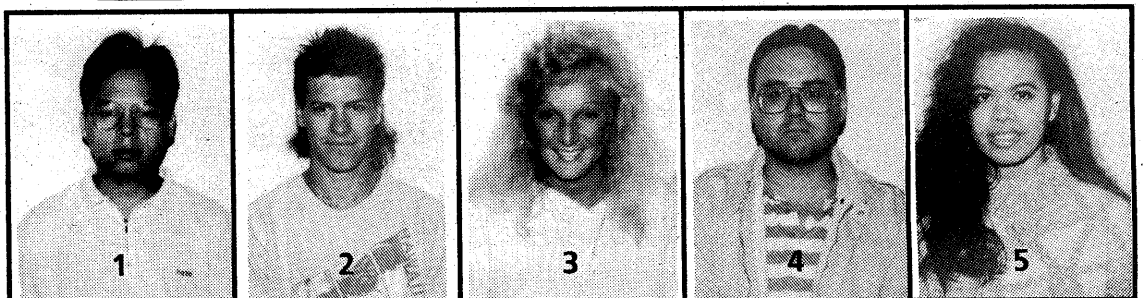
Racism is the belief that people of a particular race are less human than those of another race. This belief can be expressed in more than one form. It can be demonstrated by the murder of people because of their race, as in the film *Mississippi Burning*. More commonly it is shown in a hundred ordinary "harmless" little ways each day, like who we do not choose as friends or the words we use.

For instance, have you ever heard the phrase 'reverse discrimination'? The word 'discrimination' in everyday English means to use race as a basis for deciding who enjoys rights in a society. It does NOT mean that the persecutors are always white and the victims are always non-white. Not only is the phrase 'reverse discrimination' redundant, it is in itself a revoltingly racist remark. The reasoning behind the use of this phrase goes like this: "Normal' discrimination is by whites against non-whites. Therefore discrimination against whites by non-whites is 'reverse'." Wrong. Discrimination is discrimination. What the phrase 'reverse discrimination' really implies is that racism is an innately white characteristic, not a human characteristic.

Human beings come in a variety of shapes and colours. We have very different customs and beliefs. Different, but still valid and still human. That's why I am suspicious when I hear someone say, "I don't even notice whether or not a person is black." Why not notice? It shouldn't be like a fault you must ignore or tolerate in order to accept someone. A person's race is part of what he or she is. Noticing and enjoying differences is not racism. There is a difference between a) being proud of what you are and like yourself and b) expecting 'nice' people to all be of the same race as you. Why not enjoy the full diversity of human experience?

If the world ever becomes non-racist, it will require that people go beyond tolerance of differences, beyond acceptance, to the love of the many faces of humanity.

## Canadian Rock History Challenge

As the son of a Canadian diplomat, this artist lived in various countries throughout the world before settling in Vancouver, British Columbia.

In 1980, he cut a demo tape for which he received a record contract. Shortly after he released his first album which was titled "B\_y \_ \_ \_ d \_ \_ \_ s". In 1981, a second album was released, this one called "You Want It, You Got It" and was followed by a North American tour. The next album, entitled "Cuts Like A \_ n \_ \_ e" (Feb, 1983) did very well in Canada, the U.S. and Europe partly due to a world tour which was launched that same year to promote the album. The title track from the album was a smash hit, as well as the single "Straight from the Heart", both of which went gold in Canada with the album itself going double platinum.

In late November, 1984, he released a fourth album which was a monumental success. This album is the only album by a Canadian ever to reach No. 1 on the American Billboard album charts for two consecutive weeks. Some of the hit singles which were released from the album were: "Run to You", "Heaven", "Summer of '69", "Somebody", and "One Night Love Affair" the first three of which were gold sellers in Canada. The title of the album - "Reckless". A year after this album's release he set a record for Juno Awards, receiving seven nominations and winning four including: Best Album, Best Songwriter, Best Male Vocalist, and Best Producer. As of September of 1985 he had sold over 750,000 albums in Canada alone which was more than any other artist in Canadian Musical History.

His latest album was released in 1987 and was called "Into the Fire". This album also went platinum and boasted the hit singles "Heat of the Night", "Hearts on Fire", and "Victim of Love".

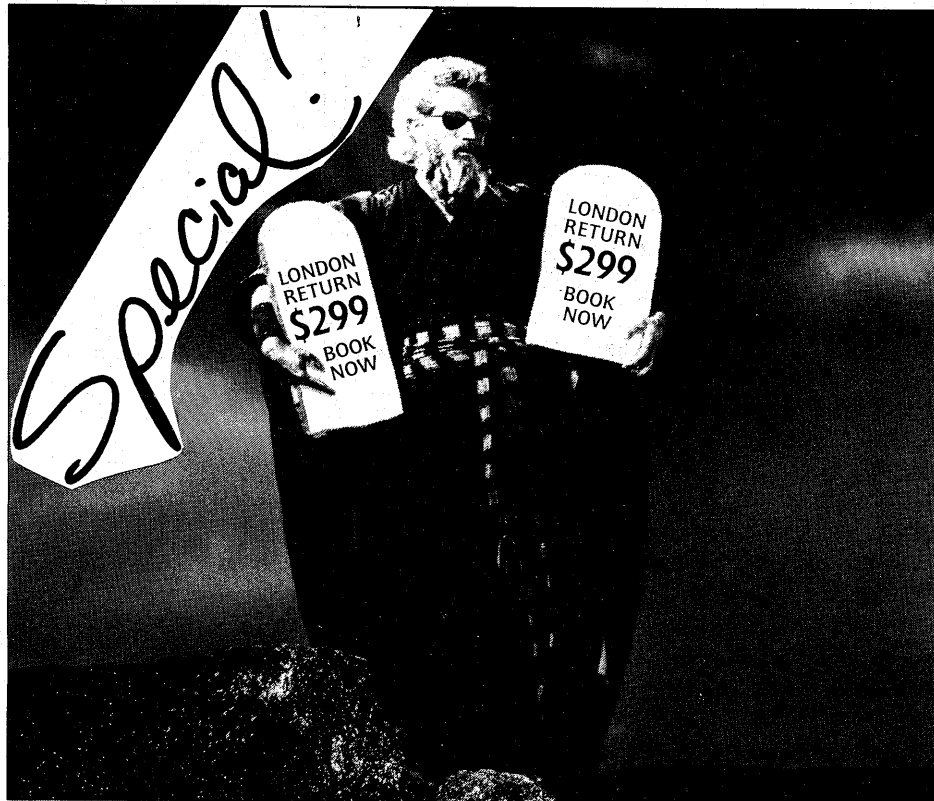

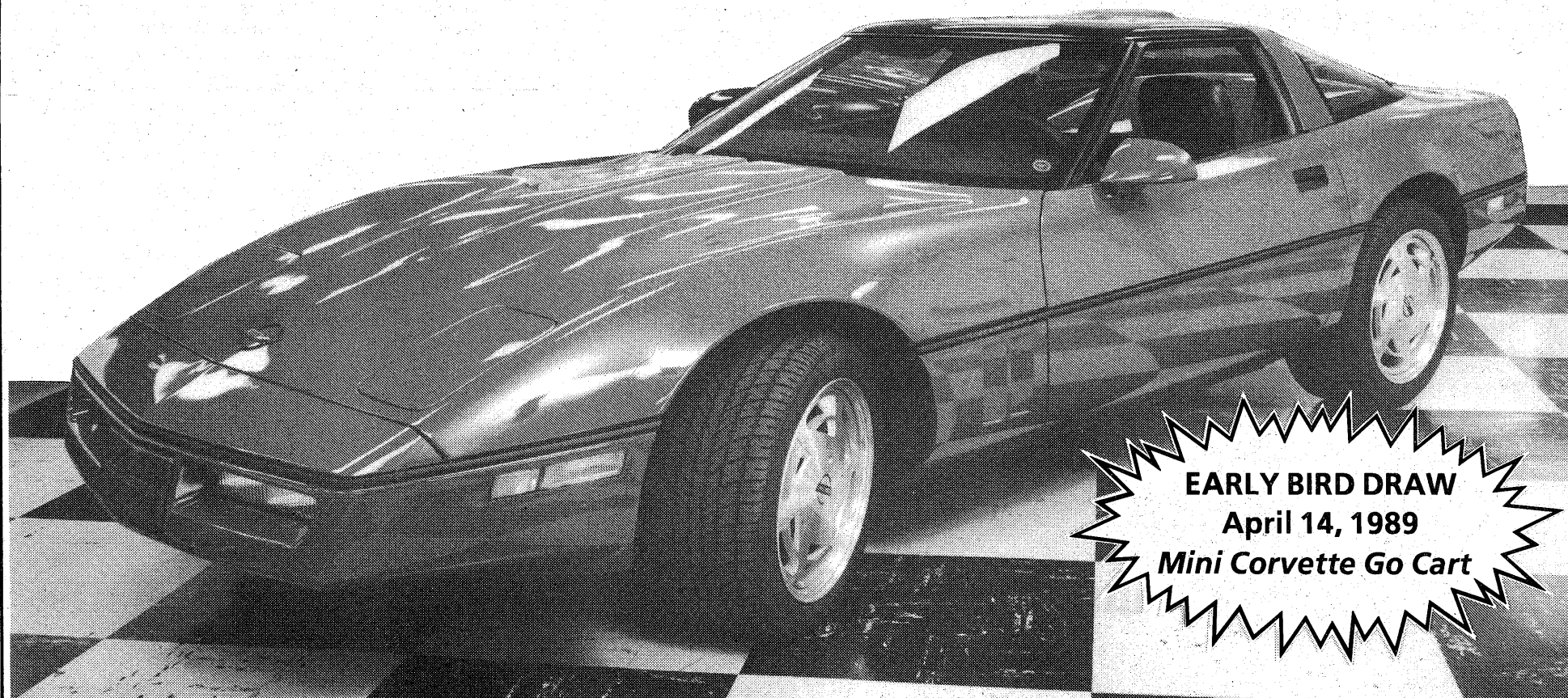
