Face-Off '89 - Bears Broil Birds



The NAIT Hockey Ooks needed a strong defensive performance if they had any hope of upsetting the Bears in Face Off '89. Well, no upset took place. The Ooks could not contain the offensive punch of the Bears and lost 11-4.

The 6,700 fans who braved the cold on Thursday, February 16th at Northlands Coliseum witnessed a hockey game that was competitive for the first two periods before becoming one sided.

Another key to the score in the hockey game was the performance of the specialty teams. The Ooks were 0 for 6

on the powerplay and surrendered two goals while they had the man advantage. In contrast, the Bears were one for four on the powerplay.

The first period was probably the most entertaining of the affair. The Bears scored on their first two shots as Brett Cox tallied at 1:47 and Todd Gordon scored at 5:55. The Ooks then stormed back with two of their own. Lonnie Spink cut the Bears' lead to 2-1 with the help of Troy Arndt and Ivan Krook. Scott Melnyk pulled the Ooks even at 13:56 with an assist going to Bill Davidson. The Bears moved ahead to stay at the 16:00

mark as Al Tarasak found the mark. Former Ouk Sid Cranston gave the U of A a 4-2 advantage at 18:56.

The second period had its moments. The Bears widened the gap to 5-3 with Grant Couture's marker at 1:34. Marty Volcan of NAIT then finished off a nice individual effort with the Ooks' third goal at 9:16 on a breakaway set up by Ted Bradshaw and Trevor Semeniuk. The Bears closed out the period's scoring with a goal from Adam Morrison at 15:43.

The third period was dominated by the U of A as they outscored the Ooks five to one. The Bears scored four answered goals to start the frame's scoring. Howie Draper, Serge Lajoie, Guy Paradis and Doug McCarthy all found the park within the first 13 minutes of the period to give the Bears a 10-3 lead. Ivan Krook then scored the Ooks' fourth goal at 15:19 from Blaine Peerless to narrow the margin to six. The Bears ended up winning by a touchdown as Doug McCarthy scored his second of the game at 17:17 of the stanza.

The U of A outshot the Ooks 31 to 25. John Krill and Blair MacGregor shared the netminding duties for the Bears. Rob McKinley went all the way for NAIT.

U of A coach Clare Drake, who may be in his last season with the Bears, indicated that the specialty teams made the difference. "We controlled the play on the powerplay and our two shorthanded goals made things easier for us."

The U of A Golden Bears now take a 4-1 lead in the series which has become an annual affair on the Edmonton sports scene.

Proposed Bylaw Changes to NAITSA

A general meeting will be held on March 8 at a place and time to be announced. All students will valid I.D. cards will be asked to vote on the proposed bylaw changes.

The changes NAITSA Executive are seeking are:

A. To allow the Secretary Treasurer to be an elected official:

1. Omission of "(ex-officio, non-voting)" from section 18.1.c to read: "Secretary Treasurer;"

(This would increase the voting positions on Executive Council from 4 to 5. By doing do, the Chairman would be less likely to take sides, making it easier to stay completely unbiased on issued brought forth to the group.)

2. Omission of "non-voting, ex-officio" from section 23.b to read: "be a member of NAITSA Executive and General Councils;"

3. Change section 19.2 to read: "In addition to the requirements of 19 Subsection (1), a candidate for the position of Secretary Treasurer:

(a) should be able to type at a rate ...; and

(b) should have some knowledge of basic secretarial skills including...

(c) must be bondable."

B. To allow the Activities Director to be paid in the summer and to convert the \$6/hr for summer paid positions to a lump sum in August, at the end of the summer:

1. Change section 49.b from: "Each of the remaining elected officers shall receive \$290/month, payable the last day of each month from September to April inclusive,

plus tuition fees. As well, the position of Vice President and Publications Director shall be paid \$6/hr up to \$290 (total) for the period May to August." to read: "...As well the positions of Vice President Activities Director and Publications Director shall be paid \$290 for the month of August."

(This is a clean-up area. Numerous hours in the summer instead of having to justify the hours by logging them, these positions will just receive one month's pay at the end of the summer.)

C. To change wording of tuition fees to a bursary for personal tax purposes:

1. Change sections 49.b and 49.c to read "...April inclusive, plus a bursary equal to NAIT entrance fees..."

(Self-explanatory)

D. To increase student fees and the building fund's portion of those fees:

1. Change section 6.2.d to read "over 700...\$95" (up from \$75).

2. Change section 6.4 to read: "Of each student membership fee referred to under 6 (2) (d) Fifteen dollars (\$15.00) shall be applied to the Building Fund;"

(This is to take the Student Association Athletics a deficit situation. The student Association is currently running a \$16,000 deficit and had a \$10,000 deficit the year before. Student fees have not increased in seven years. The building fund would be increased from \$10. This would enable NAITSA to have adequate funds available to set up designated student areas in the new medical wing proposal.)

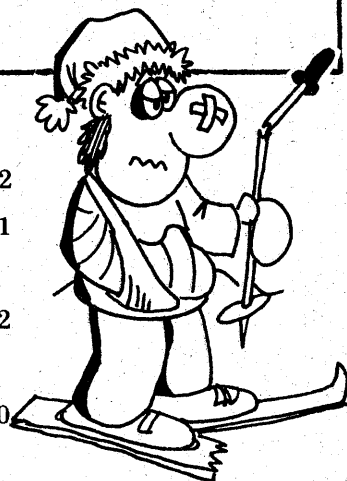

This year, this position will be an elected position which will give you (the incoming Secretary/Treasurer) the right to vote as a member of NAITSA executive and General Council. You may also be required to assist the auditor with the annual audit.

To successfully fulfill this position, it is recommended that you be able to type 45 w.p.m. with some knowledge of basic secretarial skills (e.g. transcribing minutes, word processing, correspondence). You must have basic knowledge of accounting, cash management experience, and you MUST BE BONDABLE.

If you become the successful candidate for the position of Secretary/Treasurer, you will be paid \$290 per month during the academic months. Other perks include tuition and a parking stall. You would officially take office at the beginning of April 1989 until the end of March 1990.

The positions on the NAIT Student Association will allow you the opportunity to build terrific contacts and gain invaluable experience with

NAITSA Executive

1) There shall be a NAITSA Executive consisting of the following officers:

- (a) President;
- (b) Vice President;
- (c) Secretary/Treasurer;
- (d) Activities Director;
- (e) Athletic Director; and
- (f) Publications Director

2) All candidates for the NAITSA Executive must:

- (a) be enrolled in a course or program of two years or more;
- (b) be in attendance at NAIT for the entire length of the term of office; and
- (c) be approved by the President of NAIT.

3) The term of office for each officer shall be one year.

4) The President-elect shall serve under the President from the date of the election until the last day of April. The President-elect shall become the President on May 1, 1989.

5) All other officers shall take office on the Monday following the elections.

6) The NAITSA Executive shall meet weekly except during the summer and holidays when it shall meet as required at the call of the President.

7) Three (3) voting members of the NAITSA Executive constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

8) The President shall vote only to break a tie.

9) There shall be no acclamations. In the event one person is nominated for a position, that candidate shall campaign normally and the position voted upon by a yes/no vote on the ballot. The candidate will take office if he/she received greater than 50 percent yes.

10) A candidate must be a member in good standing of NAITSA;

11) A candidate may not hold an executive position in any other technology club.

12) Candidates who are elected shall be reimbursed for their campaign costs by showing receipts to the Chief Returning Officer.

Members of the NAITSA ExecutivePresident

The President shall:

a) preside over all meetings of NAITSA, the General Council and the NAITSA Executive and all other board and committee meetings that he/she deems necessary;

b) represent the student body at all occasions where it is necessary by the General Council and/or where he/she deems necessary;

c) be responsible for maintaining due observations of the constitution and bylaws

NAITSA Executive Positions Available for 1989/90

and the correct administration of the same;

d) be registered in a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of fifteen (15) hours a week;

e) upon request, interpret the constitution and bylaws;

f) be responsible to the student association membership in so far as the activities of the student association are concerned;

g) have the power to break a tie;

h) be responsible for the revisions of the bylaws when necessary;

i) be responsible for presenting a budget for his/her division to the Secretary Treasurer;

j) be a member of activities and publications committees.

Vice President

The Vice President shall:

a) perform all duties and assume the responsibilities of the President in his/her absence;

b) be responsible for the public relations of NAITSA;

c) be responsible for all NAITSA elections and be the Chief Returning Officer and if running for re-election, shall appoint another Chief Returning Officer;

d) be a voting member of the Activities Committee;

e) provide support for special projects to be approved by the executive.

f) co-ordinate Shinerama, Queen Week, and NAITSA charities.

Publications Director

The Publications Director shall:

a) preside over all meetings of the Publications Board;

b) be responsible for all publications of NAITSA;

c) be responsible for hiring the necessary staff for publications;

d) act as liaison, carrying recommendations to and from the Executive, General Council, and Publications Board;

e) be responsible for presenting the Publications Board budget to the Secretary/Treasurer.

Athletic Director

The Athletic Director shall:

a) preside over all meetings of the Intramural council;

b) be a member of the Athletic Board;

c) be responsible for hiring and supervision of a head

referee and assist the Coordinator of Intramural and Intercollegiate Athletics;

d) be responsible for presenting the Athletic Board budget to the Secretary/Treasurer;

e) act as a liaison, carrying recommendations to and from the Executive, General Council, and Athletic Board.

f) work with the student newspaper, when needed, to ensure coverage of intramurals and athletics.

g) be responsible for coordinating all OoK Mascot and Challenge Cup Activities.

h) work with any Athletic Promotions person hired by the Athletic board to promote athletic programs.

Activities Director

The Activities Director shall:

a) be responsible for the coordination of all social and cultural activities of NAITSA;

b) be responsible to the Secretary Treasurer for the maintenance of the financial records of all social and cultural activities;

c) be a member of the Athletic Board and Activities Committee;

d) carry recommendations to and from the:

- Activities Board
- Executive Council
- General Council

concerning social and cultural activities on campus.

e) be responsible for ensuring the necessary staff are hired for the social and cultural activities for NAITSA;

f) be responsible for preparing budget for his/her division to the Secretary Treasurer;

g) preside over all meetings of the Intertech Activities Council.

Secretary Treasurer

The Secretary Treasurer shall:

a) be the Chief Financial officer of NAITSA;

b) be a member of NAITSA Executive and General Council;

c) take and maintain minutes of all meetings of the NAITSA Executive, General Council and any other committees for which minutes are deemed necessary by the NAITSA Executive;

d) be responsible for assisting in the administration of the office functions of NAITSA;

e) be responsible for cash management of social functions and other events;

f) authorize all NAITSA payments;

g) prepare and maintain budgets;

h) assist the auditor in the annual audit and present the budget to Executive and General Council;

i) assist the incoming Secretary Treasurer for the remainder of the Academic year.

Other Elected PositionsAcademic Council

a) pursuant to Section 13 of the Technical Institutes Act, there shall be four students elected to sit on the Academic Council.

b) The election referred to in 54 Subsection (1) shall take place at the time and in the same manner as the election of the NAITSA Executive.

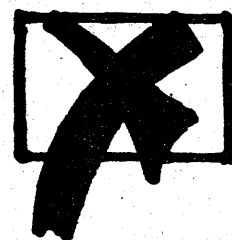
c) Student members of Academic Council shall be non-voting ex-officio members of the General Council and shall not concurrently hold office as a member of the NAITSA Executive, or any Technology Club on campus.

Board of Governors

a) pursuant to Section 5 of the Technical Institutes Act, the General Council shall nominate two (2) students to sit on the Board of Governors.

b) the General Council shall nominate those two (2) students who have been elected by the students at the same time and in the same manner as the election of the NAITSA Executive.

c) The student members of the Board of Governors shall be non-voting ex-officio members of the General Council and shall not concurrently hold office as a member of the NAITSA Executive, or any Technology Club on campus.

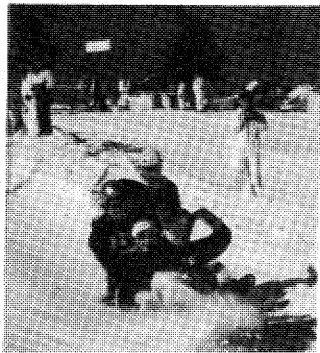
Sledders Run Amok

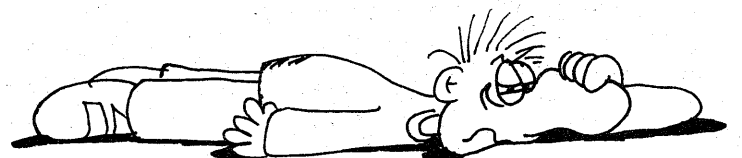
And now the time that you all have waited so patiently for. Even though you probably just skipped over most of it, I'll give you permission to read the juicy stuff that follows.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Recognition of academic excellence is regarded as essential to the development and maintenance of high standards at the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology. The large number of awards provided by government, individuals, private business and industry attest to the academic excellence of our students and the top quality of our academic staff.

The Government of Alberta has established the Alberta Education Endowment and Incentive Fund, whereby donations made to a post-secondary educational institution are matched by Government. Through the matching grant program, the student awards budget has reached \$210,000 in endowments. Interest generated by the investment of these endowments is given in the form of awards. This year additional matching grants were available and the NAIT Foundation, the fund raising arm of NAIT, transferred \$35,000 to the Student Awards Program. Fifty NAIT Foundation Scholarships of \$500 and twenty NAIT Foundation Bursaries of \$500 were awarded. To the award winners of 1988 in excess of \$375,000 was awarded to over 800 students.

I am sure that the entire student body at NAIT as well as our academic staff join me in congratulating the academic award winners for their achievements.

STUDENT AWARDS PROGRAM

The purpose of the Student Awards Program is to encourage academic achievement and provide financial assistance to students who are in financial need.

Various types of awards, such as scholarships, bursaries, and prizes are available to full-time NAIT students. The majority of awards are available to students who have completed their first year of study and are enrolled in their second year. Some awards may be available to the NAIT graduate as well as to the student entering NAIT. Normally, a student must be taking ninety per cent (90%) or more of the course load or its equivalent in the qualifying year. If you are granted an advance credit but are taking ninety per cent (90%) or more course load or its equivalent in the qualifying year, you would be eligible to apply for awards.

LOUISE MCKINNEY SCHOLARSHIP

NAIT receives forty-six (46) scholarships of \$3,000 each. These scholarships are provided by the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Trust Fund, and selection is based on outstanding academic achievement. The Louise McKinney scholarships are available to students who are continuing into second year at NAIT or are continuing their studies beyond NAIT at another post-secondary institution. Normally, the top student of each two year program who is entering second year with an average of no less than eighty per cent (80%) is nominated, providing the candidate is an Alberta resident, and is carrying a full course load of no less than ninety per cent (90%) or its equivalent with no failures or incompletes. Second year students who are eligible, will receive an application form during the month of July. Students who plan to continue their studies at another post-secondary institution and are top students, should contact the Student Awards and Financial Aid Office before August 15, 1989.

APPLICATION FOR AWARDS

The majority of awards do not require an application form. Candidates are selected upon recommendation of the Program Head. Selection of award winners usually takes place during the month of September and students normally receive their award by December 15.

Some awards are administered outside of NAIT and require a special application form. Generally, selection is performed by the individual donors, and each award has a different application deadline. A list of these awards is published in the Student Awards Handbook which will be available in April.

There are awards which are administered by NAIT and require an application form. These awards are awarded on a competitive basis, and interested candidates must submit an application form. Application forms are available after August 1, 1989, and the deadline for submitting a completed application is October 31, 1989.

Students who will be continuing their studies in the Fall of 1989 and wish to apply for awards may obtain a copy of the Student Awards Handbook after April 15, 1989, at the Office of Student Awards and Financial Aid.



Canadian Rock History Challenge by Labatt's

Growing up in Spain and Mexico this Canadian born musician began his songwriting career at age 17. He spent a year in New York City and one also in England, and then returned home to Canada in 1983 to land his first recording contract.

In 1984, he released his debut album, "First Offence", which spent more than seventy weeks on the Canadian charts and sold over 300,000 copies in Canada alone. The hit single "Sunglasses at Night" was featured on the album and helped spark a world tour which included North America, Europe, Japan and Australia.

In June 1985, he released his next work entitled "Boy in the Box", an album which also hit the double platinum mark and which boasted four hit singles. The first three; "Never Surrender", "Boy in the Box" and "Everything in My Heart" all struck gold, with the fourth, a song entitled "Eurasian Eyes" as part of the soundtrack in the hit movie "9 1/2 Weeks". This successful effort also prompted a second and quite extensive world tour which lasted the remainder of that year.

In the early fall of 1986, he released a third album, this one called "Fields of Fire". This album quickly hit the platinum mark and featured the singles; "I Am By Your Side", "Dancing With My Mirror", and his gold single "I Can't Help Falling In Love", a remake of Elvis's hit song from 1961.

His most recent album "Young Man Running" (1988) was produced entirely by himself and has sold over 100,000 copies so far. The singles released from this album were "In Your Soul", "Spot You In a Coalmine" (backing vocals by England's Ruby Turner) and "Still In Love". This was also the year he graduated from international hit singles to an international hit album, which ended up 52nd in Canada's top 100 count down of 1988

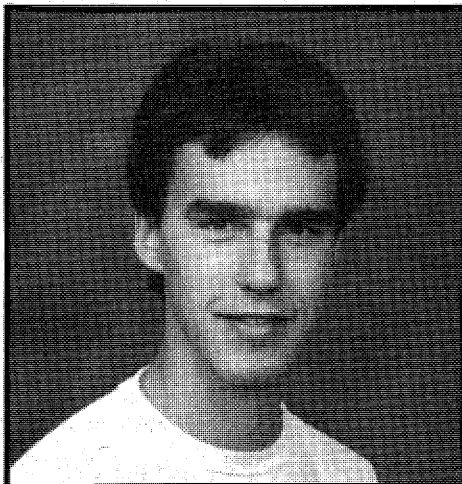

5. The January intake students will also elect a representative. Current third semester students will elect this representative. This Officer will serve a term from January to December. An election for this office will take place every January.
6. The remaining Officers will serve a term from September to April with elections occurring in April.

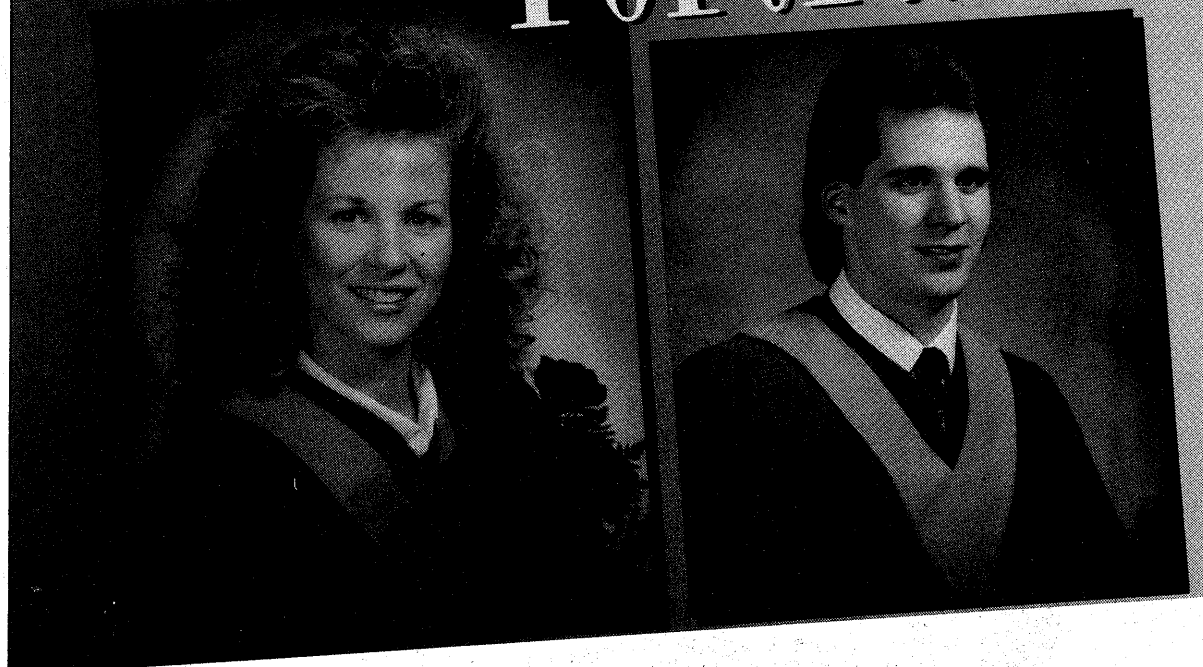

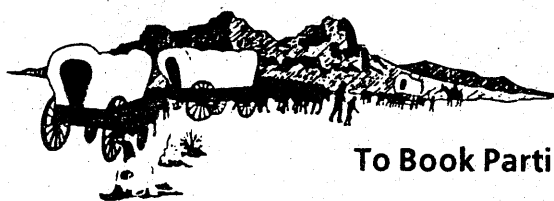
