Baking Program

Follow the signs downstairs to the bakery and enter a world of delectable confections. It is in the bakery where the baking students have their display of mouthwatering baked goods, calculated to seduce the most confirmed of dieters.

Students will be on hand to show you around and inform you about the program.

The course is of a 32 week duration and is mainly designed to prepare students to work in small bakeries or in-store settings. The program emphasizes practical skills but also involves baking and food theory, safety and sanitation, trade mathematics, and operating a business.

Basic Banking and Business Program

The Basic Banking and Business program has a display set up on the south side of the main gym. The display includes an explanation of the course of study, examples of Bank Lab transactions, the Bank Lab terminal operation, and posters of the Bank Lab products and services developed by the students this year. The students have also prepared a video demonstrating effective customer service and cross-selling techniques. Watch for our mascot--the BB Piggy Bank. In addition to the display, two Open House information sessions are provided in T716 at 10:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. on March 10.

Business Administration Program

The participation of the Business Administration Program in Open House will involve students from Accounting, Finance, Management, and Marketing as well as from the first year program. Each area will have student representatives available to talk to people about the program and to answer any questions that they might have. Staff representatives will also be on hand to provide any assistance which might be needed. All intend to be very busy interacting with our visitors.

In addition to the information stations, there will be TV videos on a variety of business topics, interactive computer programs, and a "spinning" device designed to encourage the public's participation.

The Business Program's display will be in Room E115. Drop in and interact with us.

Ooks Win ACAC Men's Basketball

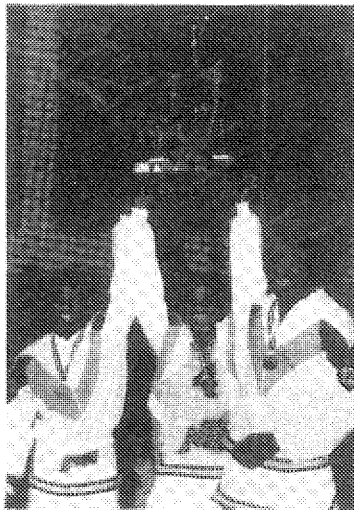

We Win

The Ooks did it the hard way last weekend when they captured NAIT's first ever ACAC Basketball Championship by defeating the Lethbridge Community College Kodiaks two games to one.

After losing game one of the best of three series 77-72, the Ooks rebounded in front of a packed house on Saturday night to win a hard fought 76-67 contest in game two and clearly dominated game three capturing the title 78-68.

Dominating the weekend series for NAIT were off-guard Dexter Amour (59 points) and "Big Man" Bryan Lazariuk (47 points). But the real story was the tremendous team defense the Ooks displayed in

holding the ACAC's top scoring Kodiaks (season average 97 points per game) to just an average of 70 points per game over the series. Defensive standouts for NAIT were Chris Mantley, Wayne Grant, and Adrian Toppin.

The Ooks now head into next week's CCAA National Championships, ranked number one in Canada. They play their opening round game against either Douglas College (New Westminster, B.C.) or Trinity Western University (Abbotsford, B.C.). Ooks Head Coach, Dave Hoy, believes that the team is peaking at the right time, and that NAIT has an excellent chance to win a National title on their own court.

Nationals Come to NAIT!!!

The upcoming week will be an exciting one here at NAIT and you should become a part of it. NAIT is playing host to the Canadian Colleges Athletic Association National Championships in men's basketball and hockey. The action will be fast paced and entertaining.

In men's basketball at the NAIT Gym, eight teams from six provinces will vy for the national title. Action begins on Wednesday, March 15th at 2:00 p.m. with the opening ceremonies scheduled for 6:00 p.m. NAIT's first action will be against either Douglas College or Trinity Western

from B.C. at 9:00 p.m. on the Wednesday night. On Thursday, the semi-finals on the championship side go at 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. Action continues on Friday with things wrapping up on Saturday with the championship game at 8:00 p.m. and the closing ceremonies scheduled for 10:00 p.m.

In hockey at the NAIT Arena, the opening ceremonies for the tournament are scheduled for 8:15 on Tuesday, March 14 with the Ooks slated to play Mount Royal at 8:30. The Ooks next action will then play Humber on

Thursday, the 16th at 8:30. The top two teams in each three team pool advance to the semi-finals on Friday, the 17th, at 5:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. The championship final is slated for 7:30 on Saturday, the 18th with the bronze medal game going at 3:30 p.m.

For more information on games, check the posters throughout the NAIT campus and plan to attend some of the action. Watch the Ooks in their quest for national titles in hockey and men's basketball.

People from all walks of life can be affected by the virus, not just members of high risk groups.

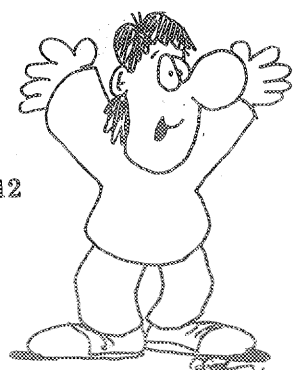
Until science finds a vaccine for this killer disease (which could be a while), people like you and me are just going to have to get used to the idea that promiscuity can kill.

Cooking Program

On behalf of the Cooking Program Open House Committee, we would like to personally invite everyone to see and sample some of our culinary delights. All of our students and instructors have been hard at work preparing the various food items. The first year cooking students will be presenting a number of food items in the south cafeteria. Items will range from a full course meal of juicy roast beef or crisp fried chicken, or maybe a hamburger or cheese deluxe with all the fixin's, or possibly even a hot pizza. Don't forget to check out fresh pastries and desserts.

The second year students will be displaying various food items in Rooms 122 G, K, and P (entrance north of the Cafeteria). Some of the items on display will be terrines, galantines, pates, various pastry displays, occasional and wedding cakes, and numerous restaurant platters and plates.

The Open House display is an example of some of the work that will be going to the "Taste of Canada" food salon. The salon will test the talents of our students against students from around the world. So come see and enjoy the Cooking Program Display!

Dental Assisting

Visitors will view the Dental X-ray units and see how students learn to take Dental X-rays. Visitors will view our 10 chair dental clinic and observe students practicing their skills on mannequins.

There will be displays depicting several courses such as nutrition, dental science, dental reception and bookkeeping.

Students in the dental therapeutics course will be taking blood pressure readings.

Students will be taking names of visitors interested in returning as patients for Dental X-rays or teeth cleaning and application of fluoride. Criteria and some restrictions will apply for prospective patients.

Students and staff will be available to answer questions about the program and explain opportunities available to graduates of the NAIT Dental Assisting Program.

We look forward to your visit at Open House.

The Dental Assisting Program will hold their Open House displays in the Dental Clinic Room F207. Space restrictions reduce traffic flow to one direction only. Enter by F207.

Dietary Technology

The display booth for Dietary Technology is located to the left side on entering the Main Gymnasium. The booth displays textbooks, student work and types of courses offered. Students will be available to answer questions. If more details are required, an information session will be held on Friday at 12:15 - 1:00 p.m. in Room T101, and on Saturday at 12:15 - 1:00 p.m. in Room T211.

Diesel Mechanics/Industrial Heavy Equipment Tech.

Our displays for open house will be as follows:

- (a) Mascot - Doctor Diesel
- (b) A101 - Hydraulic Display
- (c) A102 - Fuel Injection Display
- (d) A103 - Diesel Engine Display
- (e) A105 - Power Train Display
- (f) A107 - Electrical Display
- (g) A114 - Thermodynamics Display

All of the displays are intended to portray the type of environment our graduates might encounter in the heavy equipment industry upon graduation.

Denturist Technology

On display are techniques used in the selection and arrangement of artificial teeth, materials used in various phases of complete denture fabrication including relining and rebasing.

Instruments and techniques used to determine how teeth should "fit together" will also be displayed.

EMT - Paramedic

A display of emergency and resuscitation equipment used by paramedics in ambulances throughout Alberta will be presented.

A booth will be located in the north aisle of the gymnasium from 9 - 4 Friday and Saturday. Displays will be in Room E117. Demonstrations are set for 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. A simulation of procedures carried out by paramedics at a basic and advanced level will be performed. Also, a City of Edmonton ambulance will be parked outside just south of the doors between the E wing and the gym.

Electrical Engineering Program

Electrical Engineering Technology will have the following on display at E213:

1. An animated computer display featuring the content of the Engineering Sciences program.
2. The unbelievable right angle drive.
3. The high voltage electrostatic pen-dulum in a flash.
4. The electromagnetic break
5. A laser display

Electrical Programs

The Electrical Programs, consisting of Electrical Engineering Technology, Electrical Technology Accelerated, Power Systems Electricians, Power Linemen, and Electrical Apprenticeship, will be on display in Labs A184, A185, A186, and A187. Displays cover each of these programs, with particular emphasis on power systems, design, industrial controls, electronics, and electrical machinery, as well as basic electricity. This year the motto of the Electrical Programs is: "We Put Computers to Work." Computer applications in the Electrical Programs is featured with displays on Computer Managed Learning (CML), Electrical Estimating, Programmable Logic Controllers (PLC's), Computer Aided Drafting (CAD), Word Processing, Programming, Lighting Design, Power Systems, and so on.

Engineering Design and Drafting

E.D.D.T., as the name suggests, is both design and drafting. The student, as a technologist, is trained to develop a set of blueprints using basic engineering principles. As a result, most of the displays are engineering drawings from the areas of mechanical/electrical, civil/structural, and topographic/survey. Also on display are the reference manuals and texts standard throughout the industry that are necessary to complete these designs.

The main features are the drafting table and the computer drafting setup. Manual drafting is a primary skill and the main method by which these drawings are done. The other method is with the aid of a computer. This exhibit includes a computer drafting station using AutoCAD, currently the industry standard for microcomputers. However, this method relies on the designer's primary knowledge and skill of drafting to effectively utilize this system.

The Engineering Design and Drafting display is located in the North Lobby.

Lather/I.S.M. (Interior Systems Mechanic)

Lather/I.S.M. will display samples of interior/exterior framework and wall and ceiling finishes for buildings; specifically drywall finishes, acoustical ceilings, and vinylboard lrywall. Of special interest is a laser level, an electronic unit used to level ceilings.

Located in A164.

Machinist Certificate Program

The Machinist Certificate Program is a one-year program designed for students wishing to follow a career in the metal working industry. Employment for students in this program can be found in the Machinist, Millwright, and Tool & Diemaking trades, quality control in machine shops, and in the C.N.C. field.

The Open House displays are in two locations. One is a booth in the gym showing the development and progress of the machining field. Examples of the student projects are also on display.

The other location is in the industrial annex building. N110 has a live demonstration of the students producing unique miniature lathes using the latest in computer controlled machines. These lathes become part of a desk set, of which a limited quantity are available for sale during Open House.

Don't leave the NAIT Open House this year without a visit to this high-tech, state-of-the-art Machining lab.

Materials Engineering Technology

Visit the Materials Engineering Technology displays in the Main Gymnasium and in Room E122.

The displays feature career opportunities in Alberta for Materials Engineering Technologists.

Look into the world of engineering materials and the technologies of:

- processing and fabrication,
- nondestructive testing,
- mechanical testing,
- metallography,
- corrosion,
- welding,
- failure analysis,
- quality assurance.

By the way--don't miss the opportunity to arm-wrestle with Josephine in Room E122!!

Mechanical Engineering Program

Mechanical Engineering students study design, statics, dynamics, materials, friction and lubrication as they related to moving objects. As well, they study automation, management, estimating, quality control, and CAD/CAM, as they relate to manufacturing. In addition, the effect scheduling and economic factors have on production is also studied.

Our display contains:

- a cnc lathe
- a cnc mill
- a robot

in B116

- three lathes
- drill presses
- trace mill
- turret drill
- punch press

Millwright Certificate Program

The Millwright Certificate Program is designed to provide the graduate with appropriate training required for entry into positions in Millwright and Maintenance operations. The training will help students to develop an appreciation for the fundamentals of design, production and repair of industrial products.

The display booth which is located in the gymnasium will show various types of industrial equipment which are commonly worked on by the Millwright trades people. Some of the display pieces will be static, some dynamic. Some of these components include pumps, gearboxes, bearings, steam turbines, valves, and some specialty measuring equipment used in the millwright trade.

Medical Transcription/Health Records Administration

Will be located along the south wall of the main gym.

Painting and Decorating

On display will be practical examples of first, second, and third-year student projects - painted rooms, wallpaper and floor finishes.

Located in B108.

Pre-Technology

Come and visit us in the gymnasium. Our students and instructors will be glad to answer your questions.

Animal Health Technology

The Animal Health Tech. booth will have displays on surgical preparation. This includes a mock surgery, video tapes, and pictures. Pamphlets will be available on subjects taught in Animal Health. Balloons and other goodies will also be available for the youngsters as Animal Health goes to town at Open House '89. Room E210 and E211.

Taking Stock

Definition: RRSPs - Otherwise known as Registered Retirement Savings Plans. Brokers often call them RSPs. An RRSP is not an investment in itself. It is simply a special account through which you invest your funds. In other words, an RRSP is like a safety deposit box - it costs money (annual administration fee), and is itself worthless. The value is what you put into it.

An adult with earned income (income from investments is not considered earnings) may contribute the lesser of \$7,500, or 20 percent of earned income into an RRSP. Note: If you contributed to a DPSP (Deferred Profit Sharing Plan)

in 1987 or 1988, you may only place \$3,500 minus your contribution to the DPSP for the 1988 RRSP contribution.

So, you have an RRSP with cash in it. You can operate this account like any other, i.e. buy and sell investments with the following restrictions:

1) Investments must be a minimum 90 percent approved Canadian investments. The 90 percent is based on the market value of the RRSP investments at time of purchase;

2) Withdrawals cannot be made without due paperwork, i.e. you cannot receive income (interest, dividends, or capital gains) directly. They

accumulate within the RRSP.

Advantages and **disadvantages:** The funds you contribute can be deducted from your taxable income. The RRSP is a tax-shelter, i.e. no income tax is assessed on any income for any investments inside the RRSP. While you can withdraw funds, it is a long, complex process, and the withdrawn funds are taxed at time of withdrawal. An RRSP is considered long-term.

You should probably not open or contribute to one unless you will not require the funds in the foreseeable future.

The NAIT Foundation's major fund-raising event for the year--the Cruise Dinner and Auction, aboard the "S.S. Benefit NAIT," on February 24--was decidedly a success.

It accomplished three important objectives. First, the dinner receipts and auction proceeds grossed an estimated \$195,000, a substantial sum toward funding preliminary work on the Campus Development Plan.

Second, the event drew to the Institute numerous leading citizens, whose appearance confirmed that we have many important friends in the community. Among the 328 guests piped aboard the S.S. Benefit NAIT and welcomed by "Captain" Stan Souch were Premier and Mrs. Don Getty, Mayor and Mrs. Terry Cavanaugh, and Minister of Health Nancy Betkowski.

And third, it brought together a great many staff and students--over 200 volunteers--in a common pursuit. As the Foundation's Bill McCallum put it, "In my 25 years at NAIT, I've never seen such a spirit of co-operative, heartfelt effort focussed on a single objective. When we were pulling everything together on the two days before the Cruise, I felt that we were really accomplishing something. And we certainly were."

The big-ticket item at the auction--a 1954 Mercury Sun Valley, thoroughly restored by NAIT's automotive programs--was sold for \$18,000 to Fred Laudentklos, owner of Convertible Pools (1954) Ltd. This post-war classic was featured at the recent Edmonton International Auto and Truck show.

The lucky winners of the Cruise to Jamaica were, jointly, Jennifer Bahry and Carrol McCallum.

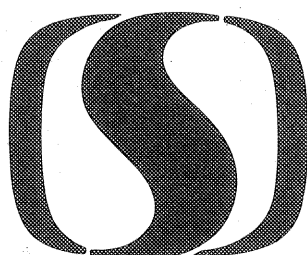

Last week nominations opened for the March 31st student election. Up for grabs are positions at NAITSA and the opportunity to represent students on Academic Council or the Board of Governors. One of the candidates could be you.

Who me? I could never do that. I'm not knowledgeable enough.

Yes, you could do it. The people who are elected are not superman or superwoman. I can't say for sure, but I'd be willing to bet that not one of the current incumbents hides a large S underneath his or her clothing or has a mortal susceptibility to kryptonite. 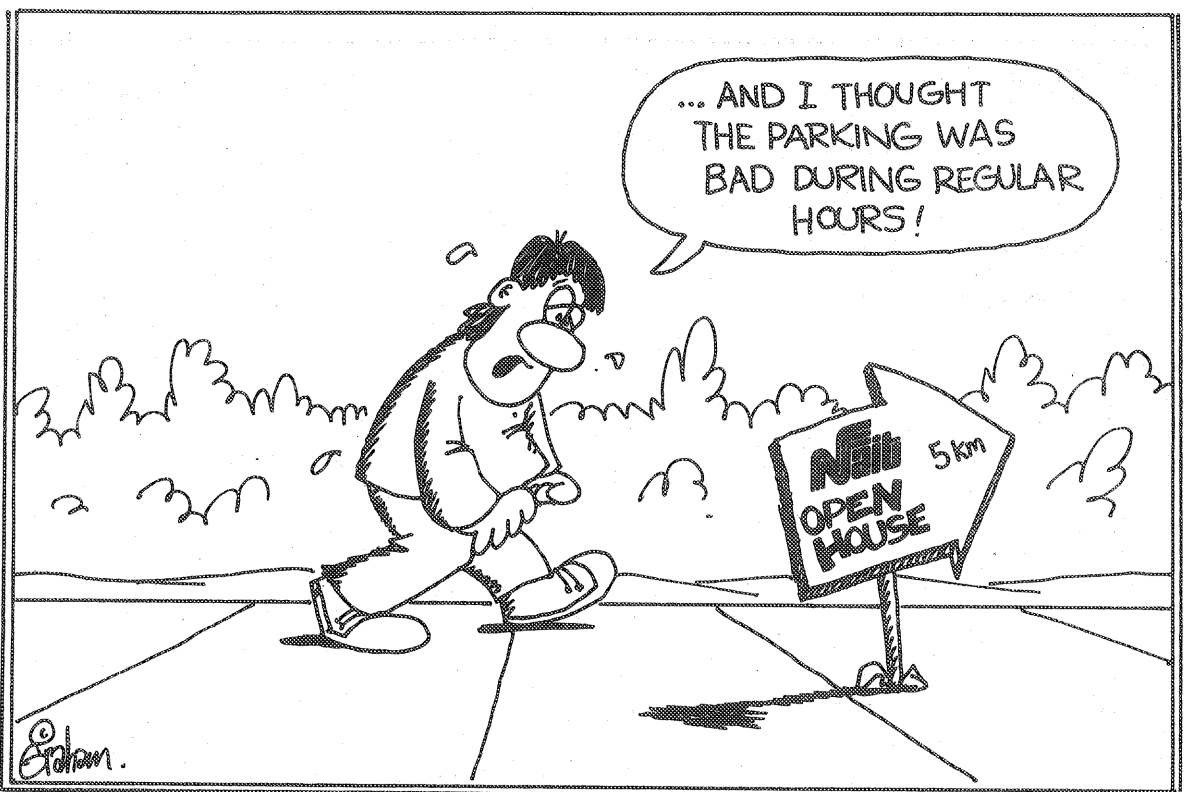

Dear Editor:

At the NAIT Open House this weekend, something will be missing from the Photographic Technology display. Each student, save one, will be displaying his or her best photos. That one student is withholding his photos in order to protest a policy of the department.

The policy states that any photo which is "tastefully done", including nudes, may be displayed openly during Open House. The decision of

what is acceptable is left with the instructors and program head. The student is protesting on the basis that many people, including children, may come to the exhibit not expecting to see nudes, and may be offended that prior notice was not given or that nude photos are on display.

The three parties caught in this situation are the student, the instructors and the student's classmates. The student is arguing not for censorship, but for respect for his and other people's views. The instructors are following a policy that has been in place for several years without serious complaint and are also trying to recognize nude photography as an accepted art form. The rest of the class faces the possibility of some of their better prints being pulled from the display if their classmate's action is successful. The problems raised by this situation are equally complex.

The questions raised by this situation are not strictly to do with NAIT, but relate to a larger sphere. For instance, how many people must be offended before something becomes "obscene"? Who should be the judge? If the policy was changed to exclude nudes from display, is it protecting public morals or censorship, and where do we draw the line? Would prior warning of the subject matter of the display alleviate the problem? Should warning be given, and if so, how?

Of courses, there are no solid answers to these questions. However, although the answers are not solid, the opportunity to think about the questions is. Let's not waste it.

Politicians Must Respond to Decline in Quality of Education at U of C.

Calgary--The University of Calgary Students' Union believes that the politicians campaigning for the provincial election must recognize and formulate policy regarding the declining quality of education in Alberta.

"If Alberta is to compete in the world economy, especially in context of Canadian-American free trade, we will have to improve the quality of education at our universities. We have to stop the regression that has taken place since 1980," said Don Kozak, President of The Students' Union, in reference to the 30 percent increase in class sizes at the University of Calgary since 1978-79.

The Students' Union President believes that the fault lies with the government, not the administration of the U of C. "When you consider that the province has decreased funding per full-time student by 25 percent since 1979-80, one has to believe that the University has responded to the best of its ability in a time of crisis."

The Students' Union wants the question of quality addressed during the provincial election. "The issue has to be debated now and corrective policies formulated for the next government, before this decline in quality is so severe that it cannot be corrected," concluded Kozak.

6. The remaining Officers will serve a term from September to April with elections occurring in April.

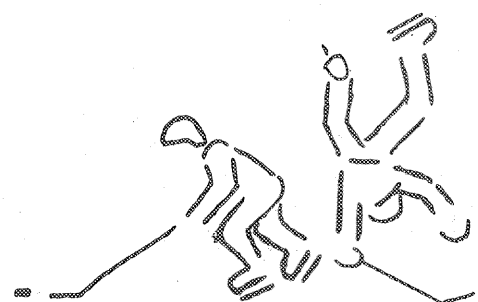

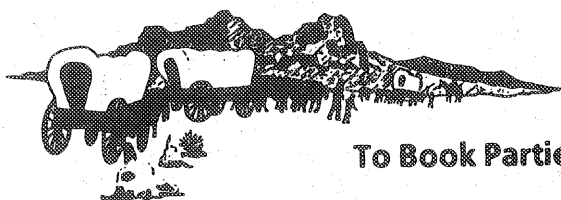

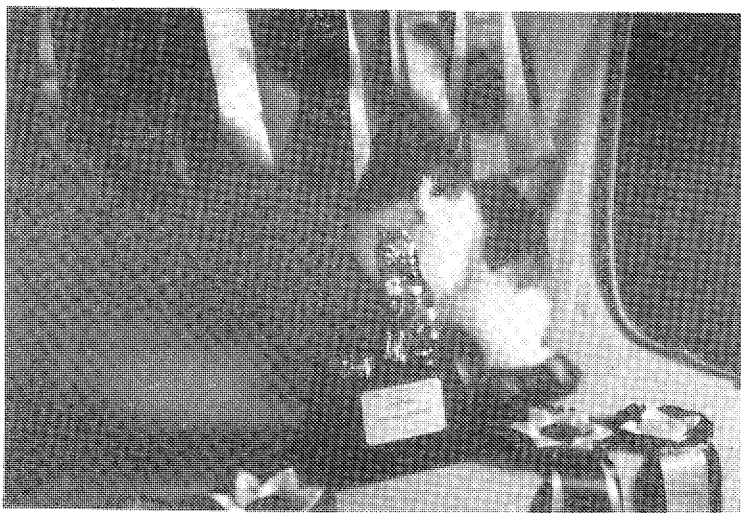

Mi-Ke was originally a stray. Her first owner rescued her from unfortunate circumstances. "Two boys had caught her and were throwing her back and forth like a baseball," said Peter Shea, Mi-Ke's present owner.

Her first owner initially had a great deal of success

with her at cat shows, but Mi-Ke did not make a perfect adjustment to domesticity. "She began hissing at judges during cat shows," said Shea. Mi-Ke was given to Shea, who allowed her the freedom she had learned to love as a stray. Eventually she regained the patience necessary for a show cat.

9 Lives is paying airfare and accommodation for two (one owner, one cat) at the Beverly Hills Hotel. Usually animals who fly travel in the cargo compartment, but Mi-Ke will have her own seat in the passenger section. As befits a potential "Morris", she will even be served her own meal on the plane. The event will take place on April 11th, unfortunately close to Shea's finals. "I hope my instructors will be forgiving," said Shea. "I believe that this is a once in a lifetime event."

Supreme show champions from 500 cat shows were invited to compete for the National Morris Award. The nine finalists are the cream of approximately 400,000 to 500,000 show cats.

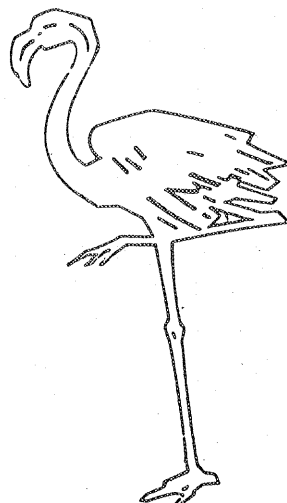

Program Information Sessions Proving Popular With Prospective Students

There are new signs that a lot of people out there want to know more about what NAIT has to offer in career training. Several information sessions, both general and specific, have been held since last October, and the turnouts have generally surpassed the expectations of staff involved. The sessions are an important part of the Institute's current marketing effort.

Three general evening sessions, each two hours long, have been held in the Plaza I Seminar Centre. They covered NAIT's range of programs, admission requirements, financial assistance, and student support services. Jerry Cossitt, Manager of Student Placement and Liaison, reports that on October 18, 170 people attended; on November 21, 160 people; and January 17, 190. A fourth session is scheduled for March 6.

Specific sessions, designed to describe and promote

clusters of programs that are not over subscribed, have also been held. The Civil and Architectural Technology group (including Building Construction, Engineering Design and Drafting, Surveying, and Pre-technology) drew a modest 29 people on November 17, but saw that number almost triple at the repeat session on February 9, when 80 showed up.

Similarly, a session on the Mechanical Engineering Technology cluster (including Air Conditioning, Materials, Plastics, Power Engineering) drew only 24 on December 6, but the repeat on February 14 drew more than double that number, 57 people. It was noted that these sessions on engineering technologies attracted a number of interested young women as well as men. The latest session, February 20, on Electrical and related engineering technologies,

drew 120 people, including 24 women.

Paul Strohschein, Associate Dean (Programming) of Engineering Technologies, who co-ordinates this aspect of NAIT's current marketing effort, says that all attendees have stayed till the end of the two-hour sessions, including subsequent tours of facilities. He credits the high level of interest chiefly to the Program Heads, each of whom enthusiastically described his program. Members of the Counselling Unit have also provided information on application and registration, financing, counselling, and job placement.

Questionnaires have been administered to all attendees, to assess the effect of the sessions, and the response has been most favorable.

Further sessions: Chemical and Geosciences cluster, March 14; Pre-technology, March 20; and Electrical Engineering Technology cluster, April 18.

NAIT and Keyano "twin" with Indonesia on Curriculum Project

Just one year ago, a group of South East Asian educators visited NAIT and other institutions across Canada. As a result, the Department of Technical and Vocational Education (D.T.V.E.) in Indonesia requested that NAIT and Keyano college work together in a twinned relationship with the Technology Teacher Upgrading Centre in Medan, a city about the size of Edmonton.

The purpose of the twinning was to allow NAIT's expertise to assist in solving curriculum problems that were keeping graduates of

Indonesian vocational high schools from being hired by area industries. The Canadian International Development Agency has funded a three-year co-operative activity that will see Canadian instructors spend up to three months each year at Medan, and Indonesian teacher-trainers spend a similar period at NAIT and Keyano.

Florin Bergh (Dean of the Industrial Division) and Bruce Basaraba (Instructor, Millwright Program) left February 13, for Jakarta and Medan to work with the D.T.V.E. administration to plan activities for the remainder of the project.

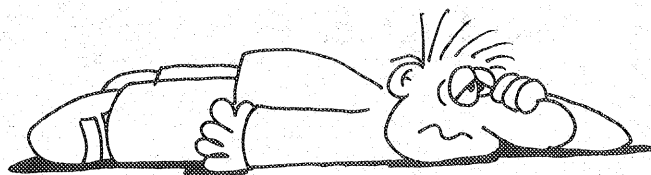

Well that's it for me. I've got no more for you now that I've told you what to doo. Boy, I'm battin' 1000. Till when next we meet again. Ciao.

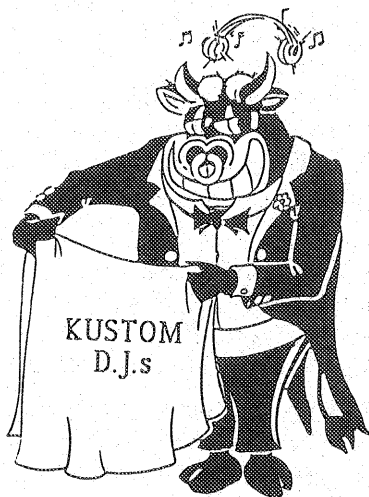

The George Robert Quartet

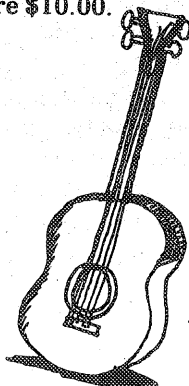

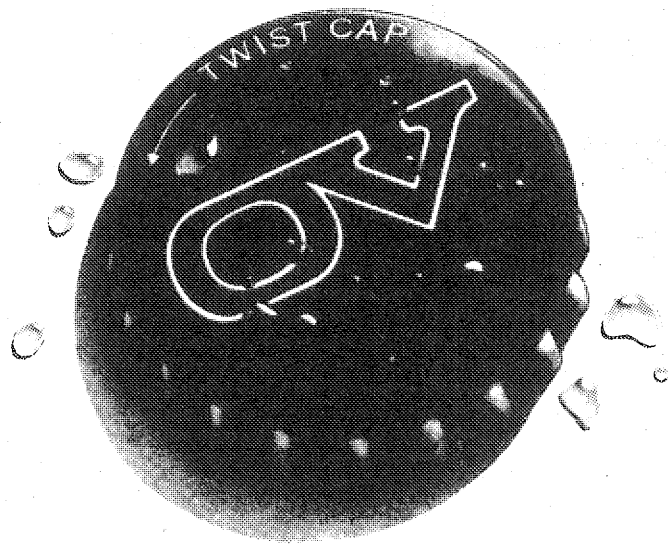
Men's Basketball

One display will show the process of recycling a plastic 2-litre pop bottle. Some lab equipment will be in operation producing items made from recycled plastic and given out to the general public - containers and lids, bus pass holders, and dice. Other displays will show testing methods, bio-degradable and photo-degradable plastics.

Chemical Technology

Many people ask, "What do chemical technologists do?" Chemical technology covers a very wide range of fields. Chemical technologists are employed in environmental study and research, chemical production and quality control, food industries, oil and hydrocarbon study and research, chemical sales, general chemical research, and other fields too numerous to mention.

Training of chemical technologists is concentrated in the areas of inorganic chemistry, organic chemistry, and instrumental analysis.

Inorganic chemistry involves qualitative tests for commonly occurring substances and quantitative tests by gravimetric, general volumetric, redox, and precipitative analysis. Physical testing of materials and chemicals is studied

Students are also trained in the set-up, operation, and analysis of bench scale models of selected industrial processes of chemical related industries.

Instrumental analysis is a field of chemistry related to the analysis of substances. Students are trained in the operation and understanding of instruments involved in gas and liquid chromatography, ultraviolet/visible and infrared spectroscopy, nuclear magnetic resonance, and electrochemical analysis. This field is used for both qualitative and quantitative analysis of substances.

Other areas of instruction include safety and first aid procedures, physics of light, physical chemistry, coal and heavy oil, biochemistry, basic electronics, and BASIC computer programming.

Students are also eligible to enroll in the Bio-Technology program, thereby getting two certificates ensuring a better chance of getting a job.

The Chemistry display is located in G109 and G110.

Welding Program

The Welding Program is featuring a Hobart Motoman Welding Robot for Open House 1989. The robot will be operational in the Welding Building ("C" Building) from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. March 10 and 11. There will also be a display booth in the gym featuring trade information on Welding programs such as apprenticeship, welding certificate program, pre-employment and updating/upgrading for the journeyman and pressure welder. Numerous Weld samples and some of the latest equipment will also be exhibited.

The Millwork and Carpentry Program will display projects and machines used in construction of wood products. Some items will be available for sale to the public in A163.

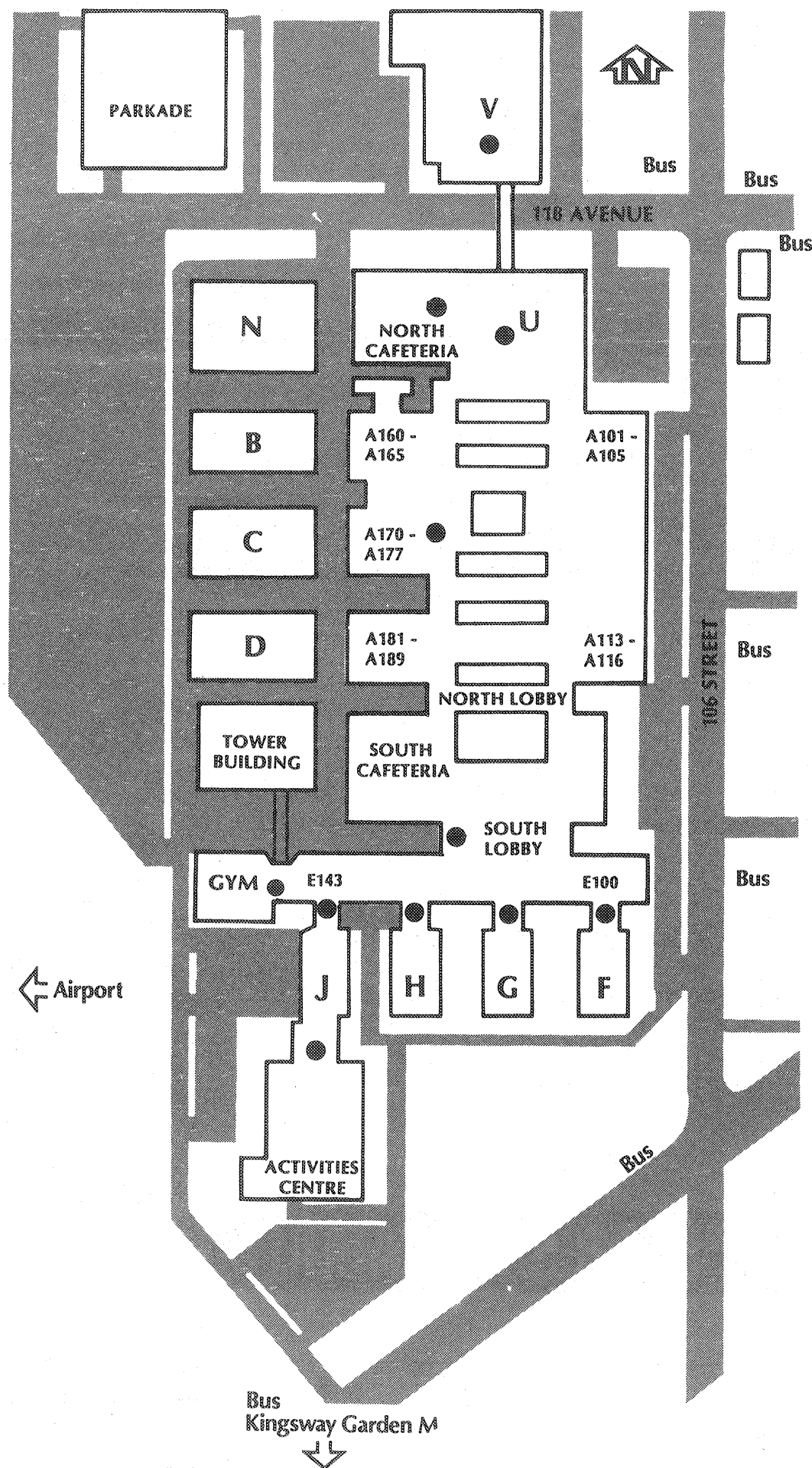
Medical X-ray Technology

Map of NAIT

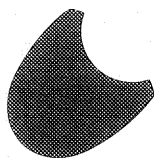
