AIDS AWARENESS

In a continuing effort to control the spread of AIDS, NAIT will be promoting awareness of the disease through a variety of programs. For the past several years, NAIT has had such programs in place, but will be trying some different methods this year.

The campaign was started during the November 7 General Council meeting, when Scott Graham of the Academic Council showed a film about a factual American university student who became HIV+ through a relationship with a bisexual boyfriend. The campaign will continue with presentations to individual classes about the disease. Anyone wishing to help with the campaign or wanting to know more about AIDS should go to the Health Services office in the South

NAIT Governers Want "Mission Statement" Revision

The Board of Governors recently asked the Academic Council to seek input from staff on revising NAIT's "Mission Statement". The current statement reads: "To design and deliver career training which meets the expectations of students and the manpower requirements industry, and government."

The institution is examining the current statement in light of "our policy statements an instructional programming and institute student relationships" and "the perceived social and economic shifts." Meetings

have been arranged for November 29 for staff, either in groups or as individuals, to be heard.

The two questions being asked by the council are whether or not it is "appropriate for us [the institute] to continue the directions we oppose in our statements of policy and guidelines" and if "our mission statement reflects what we do? Will it stand the test of continuing changes?"

BUS PASS CARDS GIVEN TO MAYOR

Last Thursday, representatives from various colleges and universities around Edmonton met with Mayor Jan Reimer to discuss a new student bus pass. At the meeting, Reimer was presented with 8000 postcards from students on all city campuses supporting the campaign for a new pass.

Earlier this year, the city's budget committee approved a monthly pass with a 10% discount. This pass, available each month from January to April, will

replace the current "Student Pak" of 4 monthly passes. The individual passes will be more suited to students who live on a month-to-month basis and can not affort to spend \$152 at one time. If ridership increases and ETS revenues are satisfactory the discount may be raised to 15% next September.

One thousand four hundred of the cards given to Reimer came from NAIT. The new passes could be sold at the Student Store in mid-December.

PLEDGE BANNERS FOR ALCOHOL AWARENESS

With "Alcohol Awareness Week" just around the corner, the Alcohol Awareness Committee has come up with a new promotional idea. "Pledge Banners" have been set up in the main and north cafeterias, as well as

Westwood Campus and the Dock in Plaza II. The idea is that people who want to pledge that they do not drink and drive can sign their names to express their opinions. Signatures can be any size. If you want people to know your position, SIGN YOUR NAME!

FUND RAINSING CAMPAIGN SET UP

A \$4.5 million dollar fund raising campaign involving staff students and Edmonton businesses has been set up to ease "space deficiencies" at NAIT. The program, called "Partners in Tomorrow", will finance a 15,700 square meter Health and Medical Sciences Technology Complex, a new 500-600 seat auditorium, update existing facilities, and various other projects.

A 1987-1988 study showed space shortfall of nearly 17000 square metres. This is about 10% of NAIT's current facilities, and with current projections predicting a student population increase

of two thirds in less than 10 years, the space shortage becomes even more worrying.

In order to encourage Edmonton businesses to contribute to the program, NAITSA has come up with a way of showing the student's commitment to the program. Over the next five years, NAIT students will donate a total of \$775,000 plus towards the cost of construction and renovation. Currently \$15 of each student's fees is put towards a general building fund. However, under the new system, the money will be put in a special fund earmarked specifically for the expansion. This money, totaling \$97,500 per year, plus the original \$100,000 NAITSA donation and compound interest, will fulfill NAITSA's commitment to the project.

According to NAITSA President Brad Diemert the new system will simply be a "relocation of funds into a separate account" as a goodwill gesture to local companies. In other words, the students are paying the same amount out of their student fees, however now it is being channeled into the future expansion of NAIT.



I recently had a conversation with the most wise and wonderful woman I've every known - my grandmother. She was discussing how impressed she was by the younger generations knowledge and mature attitudes towards drinking and driving. "Today there is such a large amount of information available on the facts about alcohol and the influence it has on every activity a person attempts."

The public has become aware, and along with this has come more responsible actions. Going out and having a good time involves more than peeling back bills and tipping back bottles; it means asking questions like "If I'm drinking whose driving?" And the responsibility doesn't end with ourselves, we have to encourage smart drinking among our friends and families as well. A good place to start is by making up an agreement, written or oral, which might state that each person will be willing to pick up the other anytime they aren't in a state to drive - no matter how late or how far away.

Another good idea is to always have an emergency stash of money, enough to get you a cab home from the party. And something everyone should do is always agree beforehand who is the designated driver (take turns) and informing the waiter, bartender or whoever else might be compelled to offer you a drink that you are driving.

Being responsible and not mixing drinking with driving is the mature intelligent thing to do. And with this week being Alcohol Awareness Week there are banners up outside both cafeterias, and also at Westwood and Plaza II which students are being asked to autograph to show their support of responsible drinking.

Have We Forgotten?

This past weekend saw Remembrance Day come and go for another year. Like most Canadians, I have nothing to "remember" as such, having been born about 25 years after Japan surrendered. Wars were always something on TV and movie screens. Because of this, Remembrance Day doesn't have much personal significance for me.

Unfortunately, this attitude seems common. Most stores stayed open on Saturday and TV specials were scarce. NAIT didn't take a break, although this was due to contracts with employees and instructors. The problem is that over the years, November 11 has become a holiday rather than a day of mourning. Its human nature to lose compassion for other's suffering over time. The numbers of people killed on both sides of the fight are just that ... numbers. Large numbers, but numbers just the same. The photos and films of the Holocaust victims, and the testimonies of the survivors, are disturbing, but not meaningful. At least not to us.

The people it is meaningful to are the veterans. They are a dying breed who are our strongest link to the past. In their yearly ceremonies and reunions, they do more than relive memories; they stir our imaginations and take us back forty-odd years. Without them, the victims of war would simply be a nameless mass. With them, however, we are reminded of how blind mankind can be. We are shown what true courage is, as well as true cowardice. The violence in Central America and the Middle East suddenly seem foolish and futile in light of past lessons that are apparently being ignored. The United States, once a reluctant participant in other's conflicts, now appears set on a heavy-handed policy of intervention, despite it's enormous casualties in the World Wars, Korea, and Vietnam to name a few.

The point is, if we forget the past, we have no basis for planning the future. Next time you see a poppy, remember why it's there.

From September 30, 1951 through August 29, 1971. Red Skelton was a fixture on network television in North America. On Tuesday, November 7, the legendary entertainer from 5. CRIMES AND MISDEMEANORS Vincennes, Indiana took the stage at the Jubilee Auditorium in an outstanding performance delivered with warmth and sincerity.

> Red began the performance at the Jubilee with an opening monologue that touched upon life, marriage, religion, and entertainment. material was cutting but not offensive. Unlike many of the comedians today, Red uses his talent and not four letter expletives. The opening two lines of the monologue illustrated this point--"I slept like a log last night. This morning, I woke up in the fireplace."

Red is a great pantomimist in the class of Marcel Marceau. Some of the gems in the show included, "Fathers in the Maternity Ward", "The First Honeymoon and the Second Honeymoon Fifty Years Later", "The Old Man and the Squeaky Door", and "The Old Man at the Parade".

One of the special guests on stage was the befuddled rustic Clem Kadiddlehopper. Clem described his wife and his relatives among other things. About his mother-inlaw, Clem stated, "She calls me son, but never finishes the sentence."

Besides starring in 48 motion pictures, Red has penned nearly 5000 musical selections. A couple of gems were in the show including his signature song that brought back memories of days gone by and "If I Were King of the Birdies" which gave the audience an opportunity to join in on the



THE (MARKET: Smooth System or Controlled Chaos?

by J. Michael Farr & Pamela Smith

To market to market to buy a fat pig Home again, home again, jiggidy jig.

"Job market." It has a nice ring to it. The words give a sense of a place (or at least an organized system) where one can go to find a job — sort of like buying a fat pig. Unfortunately, it just isn't so. In fact, our job market is more akin to the disorganized chaos of a food riot than the orderly rows of produce in a grocery store.

Most people do a very poor job of job finding. After an extended period (currently 17 weeks) of intense confusion. discouragement. and deep frustration, most applicants accept a job — more or less by chance.

Is there any help, you ask, in approaching this disorganized process? Yes. Help is on its way in the form of certain revelations which are useful in finding your way through the maze of job-seeking confusion:

Revelation One: Everyone will be a job seeker eventually. Average Americans will change jobs about fifteen times before reaching age 35 and change careers 3 to 5 times in their lifetime. Half of all present jobs won't exist in 10 to 15 years. Job seeking is not just the "other guy's" problem or a skill that will be needed just this once. Every year, 20 to 30 million Americans suffer extended unemployment.

Because some jobs come easily, and because situations demanding that a person find a new job come only irregularly... many people undertake a job search lacking both critical information and essential communications and interviewing techniques. -- Robert Wegmann, "Job Search Assistance: A Review"

Revelation Two: The jobs are almost always there, but employers have a hard time finding qualified applicants. Even in relatively bad times, it is estimated that at least one million job openings exist at any one time and sometimes considerably more. About 42% of all unemployment is "frictional," where a job opening exists but a qualified job seeker has not located it.

Revelation Three: Only 15 to 30% of all jobs are obtained by conventional job-seeking methods and about 85% are never advertised (the famous hidden job market). Richard Bolles' book What Color Is Your Parachute? does a nice job of analyzing this.

"...you must beware of traditional job finding systems and people who endorse them. The old systems are primarily responsible for over 20% unemployment rate among younger men and women.

Revelation Four: Over 90% of all job seekers have had no training in how to find jobs and consequently conduct it poorly. It may well be true that job-seeking ability is more important in getting hired than ability to do the job.

While all this paints a pretty bleak picture of the job market, it's a dark cloud with a silver lining. If you can discover the mysteries of our job market, you have a distinct edge.

The people who were getting the best job offers were not necessarily the best qualified in the work, but actually were those who were best qualified in the techniques of job changing (finding).



It is a sad week for Canadians as we mourn the death of gold medal swimmer Victor Davis. Davis was hit by a car early last Saturday morning in a very mysterious incident.

There are several conflicting reports, but the one that stands out is Davis's girlfriend Donna Clavel's allegations that he was purposely hit by three drunks. Clavel claims that they turned around and then accelerated towards Davis before striking him. These allegations leave a lot of people wondering why a breathalyzer wasn't taken the day of the accident? Or why no charges have been laid yet? Or even why nobody knows what really happened four days after the incident? Hopefully by the time this paper comes out these and many other r questions will be answered.

Davis will be remembered

as a champion who hated losing and would never give up. He won gold and solver medals for Canada in the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles and held a world record in the 200 metre breast stroke for seven years. Not many Canadians have achieved this type of recognition.

This does not mean that just because he was a celebrity the penalty be unusually harsh. But because he was so well known, a harsh penalty would make news ad act as a deterrent to others.

Victor Davis was a true Canadian champion, and his memory can only serve as a model for future Canadian athletes.


