### A Future Star?

After almost two weeks of broadcasting, NAIT's "NR 92" cable FM radio station is settling into a comfortable routine. Apart from a few minor problems such as missed cues and poor timing, the Radio and Television Arts students seem happy with their results so far.

The future broadcasters, who are made up of 5 second semester and 7 third semester students, admit to being relatively inexperienced when it comes to actual airtime. Of the twelve, only one has worked for a regular radio station reading news on CKO. While the inexperience may seem like a handicap, it is a regular aspect at the station. In January, the third semester students will move on to a "work semester", while the current first semester students will move up to take their place.

Despite their status as "students", the broadcasters treat their work as any veteran would. Shows and features are prepared individually, usually a day in advance. Each student is his or her own programmer, although the basic format for music is kept constant. There is also the added element of instructors not having direct control over the broadcasts but instead critique the students after their shows. The students realize this however, and work to keep themselves in line. As can be expected, there is not much time for relaxation with classes every second day, and then 8 to 10 hours a day spent on production.

Unlike other stations, the duties at NR92 are rotated to give students experience in

various areas of broadcasting. This seems reasonable with career goals ranging from production to on air broadcasting. Each student is responsible for one hour of programming per day. Another difference is that there are no "commercials" on NR92, only public service announcements. That means that the station can not charge for advertisements, but they will announce upcoming events for NAIT students free of charge.

NR92 broadcasts specifically for and to the NAIT students population. With feeds to the tower lounge, pool, hairstyling, arena, cafeteria, and one planned for Westwood Campus, students have ample opportunity to listen to "their" radio station. More importantly though, is that they also have the opportunity to actively participate. The RTA students want as much student involvement as possible, including on air appearances. Live remotes can be done from the kiosk in the main lobby every weekday, and students can even make their own commercials to advertise such events as cabarets.

Students with any questions or requests can call the kiosk at 2300 on the internal phone line. Any NAIT related news can also be passed on to the station at 8822.

Although student participation at the kiosk has so far been mostly curiosity, the RTA students are confident they can quickly change that. The NUGGET wishes them luck.







## NAITSA SCANDAL

### Editorial

We're all aware of the parking problem at NAIT. There are close to 6,500 students enrolled and only 1,604 parking stalls available. That makes for a large number of less fortunate students who have to bus, car pool or drive and park at least a few blocks away.

However, each year a select few students, no matter how bad the parking problem is, don't have to worry about finding a space. NAITSA Executives, in conjunction with their position receive a parking space. As they should, considering the amount of extra time and effort NAITSA requires. These parking spaces are reserved for NAITSA Executives every year and remain the same every year.

The Naitsa President's spot is located in lot E. However, Brad Deimert forfeited that spot this year, in order for Leo Tanguay, Manager of the Games Room to have better access to the school, seeing as he is disabled. So the President's spot from September until last week was in Parking Lot D along with the rest of Naitsa Executives. Last week, however, this changed.

Dick Maertens - Poole from the Parking Department informed the Nugget that a handicapped spot was assigned to Mr. Tanguay, and Brad Deimert moved to the spot originally assigned to him. And that the left over spot is the property of Naitsa, to do with as they see fit. As of press time the Parking Department had not been notified of any change to this arrangement.

What happened to the spot? Brad recommended that it be given to a hapless, hard - working Tech Rep on campus, who gives a lot of time to many different NAIT related activities and committees. Like most students at NAIT who weren't lucky enough to receive a parking stall this student was grateful for it, I'm sure. And who wouldn't be? These are all the facts, as they were explained to me.

However, the issue isn't who received the stall, but rather that a NAITSA parking space is being used by someone not directly associated with NAITSA. And more importantly I can think of close to a dozen people who are equally deserving of this parking spot, and who are associated directly with NAITSA.

The head referee, who is employed by the Athletics Director, does not receive a parking stall, even though his duties keep him at the school until late at night or sometimes requires him to be here early in the morning. No member of the Northern Torch Yearbook, brought to you courtesy of your NAIT Student Association fees, has the use of a NAITSA parking stall. And no one on the NUGGET payroll receives a NAITSA stall either, despite the long hours we gladly put into our jobs.

NAITSA should be held accountable for its parking privilege policies (which aren't mentioned anywhere in NAITSA Bylaws), and hopefully will be required to give an explanation at the next General Council Meeting. I encourage all Tech Reps who are concerned to attend the meeting and to demand an explanation.



# SWAP STUDENT WORK ABROAD PROGRAMME



## These people lived and worked in London You can too!


Ah September! A month of renewal...to students across the country it would almost make sense to have New Year's Day in September. Seeing old friends again or meeting new ones, settling back into favourite haunts; and as it turns out, reading this copy of the *and you find that someone (me, actually) is already nattering away about what you could be doing next summer! And given that I work for the Student Work Abroad Programme (SWAP), you already know exactly what this article is about - another ho-hum story about a night in some charming old London pub or the joys of getting sunburned on an Australian beach.*

I often wonder what motivates students to sign up for the SWAP programme. In our brochures we push the idea of being able to extend your travel budget because you make enough money to look after yourself while you're working. Some folks get excited by that concept. It's absolutely true, but I don't think the idea of going to work in London for the summer so you can sustain yourself draws 900 students annually.

Perhaps it's the idea of having greater contact with local people since you will right there in the work force. Again, truer words were never spoken but this concept alone doesn't account for 1800 students in 1989 working in six countries on SWAP. Personally I've always been intrigued by the idea that it's important for students in the late 20th Century to get as much first-hand overseas experience as possible since the technological advances in communication and the "global economy" will make daily international contact quite common in their 21st. Century careers. They need the experience. But that's just another good reason to think about SWAP, it's not a motivating factor.

Probably we are getting more on track when one considers such things as "escape" or "sense of adventure" or "Another summer working at the 7-11 in Moose Jaw will turn my brain into a quivering mass of psychic jelly!!" It's all true, I suppose. SWAPPERS are motivated to sign up because..

1. They can earn some money overseas.
2. They have more opportunity to meet and talk to local folks than do tourists;
3. They develop valuable international experience (even working in a bar or a shop) which will pay off for future career plans and;
4. They know that whatever happens while they're on SWAP, it won't be boring.



In 1990 SWAP is offering nine "country-destinations". SWAP Britain has been and will doubtless continue as the most popular programme. Most folks work in London where there is a fairly good job market and available accommodation. SWAP has a fairly active social calendar in London each summer with lots of dances, softball get togethers and even soccer matches. Most of the students in Britain this past summer qualified for SWAP's tax arrangement and worked tax-free. Sadly, SWAP staff had to deny British student tax forms to many other Canadian students who arranged visas, etc. on their own, by an agreement with the UK tax officials, forms can only be given to SWAP programme participants.

Over 400 Canadians went on SWAP Australia in 1989. SWAPPERS "Down under" tend far more to travel around the country and work as they go., Starting in September, the host organization in "Oz", Student Services Australia, is providing all SWAPPERS with Associate Memberships to their International Student Centres. These Centres are information booths in all major Australian cities. Canadian SWAPPERS will now have access to this important local information to help them get along in Australia.

New Zealand and Japan are the other Pacific destinations and about 100 SWAPPERS signed on for each. New Zealand is a lot more "more laid-back" than Australia. The scenery is most impressive and the people are a bit more

relaxed. Any comparison between Oz and N.Z. would closely parallel any comparison between Canada and our own much loved next door neighbor! Japan of course, speaks for itself. The world's most successful economy is awaiting your arrival! Think about teaching in Tokyo next summer and think about SWAP!

The SWAP programmes in Ireland and Finland are our smallest with 60 and 45 participants respectively. Ireland is a jewel...an emerald to be exact. Most SWAPPER's stay in Dublin sipping their Guinness amongst the ghosts of James Joyce and W.B. Yeats! Finland was our new programme in 1989 and returning SWAPPER's have been raving about the experience.

So what's new for 1990? Though not finally established by press-time, it appears SWAP will have access to 25 work permits in Belgium. Like Finland, jobs will be pre-established for the SWAP students and most jobs will be in Brussels or along the North Sea coast. The Travel Cuts offices will know more details on Belgium by Christmas. Keep in touch!

What has been confirmed is a country you heard quite a bit about over the summer of 1989. Seems that about 200 years ago last summer some of the citizens took a real dislike to an old prison and tore it down. Place was called the Bastille. Bienvenue a SWAP France! Two hundred students will be accepted pour assister a SWAP France pour l'ete de 1990. It faut parler la langue de Moliere to consider applying for this programme. SWAP will be working in France with Council for International Exchange (C.I.E.E.), a Paris-based American organization. Over 700 U.S. students participate annually in C.I.E.E.'s "Work in France" programme. In 1990, 200 Cannucks will be there too. "How we gonna get 'em back on the farm after they seen Parie!"

The other confirmed new SWAP country is...wait for the fanfare, the hands over the hearts, God, Mom, Apple pie, Hollywood, Miami Vice, MTV. Allow me to introduce SWAP USA! Imagine yourself bustling through Wall Street or "looking good" in Malibu. In 1990, 200 students can participate on SWAP USA. Armed with visas that we arrange, SWAPPER's may work anywhere in the States from the job-rich Cape Cod resorts to where the sun sets in Mendocino. Hey, all this and Alaska and Hawaii, too!

So run, don't walk into your nearest Travel Cuts office and demand your inalienable right to a SWAP brochure. Actually, you can walk since the brochures won't be available until early



The teams inexperience showed as they dropped three


straight games 97-35 to Red Deer College, 76-25 to SAIT and 66-43 to Medicine Hat College.

## NAIT ATHLETE OF THE WEEK CROSS COUNTRY RUNNING DENISE MITCHELL


