In a couple of days, the Red Cross will be here at NAIT with needles poised, ready to suck NAIT students dry. Like most people, the students won't give up their blood without a fight. they will have to be dragged kicking and screaming to the 'medical chamber' before a drop is shed.

Now, so far this should be sounding like a B-grade horror movie because, it's not very realistic. True, the Red Cross will be here to collect as much blood as possible, and true, some students won't be persuaded to give. However, many will give, either for the first time or for a return visit.

Those who have given before realize how little time and pain is involved in the process. From the initial blood test to the time you are allowed to leave is about 40 minutes. During that time, you get to lie down to give blood, and then eat free biscuits and drink free pop while you recover. Apart from a quick stab of pain when the initial sample is taken, the whole process is painless.



The clinic will be an excellent chance for students to support a worthy cause (maybe even save a life) without taking too much time out of their busy schedules. Show up next week, and "join the lifeline be a blood donor."


MOO DAZE A SUCCESS



He went on to say,"It's not all glory, sometimes you think 'What am I doing here?' Determination, confidence, and self-esteem helped lieutenant Neumann stick with the program. He is now considering joining the full-time forces, through RESO he has access to Regular Forces, and he will hold the same rank. However, he said a job with the government is a distinct possibility, and his background with RESO increases his opportunities that much more.

A person deciding to apply for the program will be referred to the downtown Recruiting Centre for an interview and physical. The application then goes to Winnipeg and the final decision comes back in March.

Brian Denness, Assistant District Recruiting Officer, told the NUGGET that, "Since 1983 no recruits have been turned down which have been sent from CFB Edmonton."

This event was a great place to do some personal networking, exchange cards, and find out valuable information about various companies in and around Edmonton.


