

NAIT STUDENT ATTACKED

Early last week, a NAIT student was allegedly attacked on the way to a NAIT campus. This, along with a similar incident late last spring in the parkade, underlines the need for students, especially females, to exercise caution when walking alone.

Students who feel uncomfortable walking from the main campus to their car can call security (7477) or call information (0) to request an escort. Security guarantees someone will be there within 15 minutes, even if the student is at a satellite campus.

Other precautions are equally important. Walking in pairs and staying in well-lit, busy areas cuts down on the chances of an attack. Keys or similar items should

be carried in ones hand to be used as a weapon. If someone is attacked, he or she should not be scared to fight back. Scratching, gouging, screaming, and kicking are all excellent tactics.

Being prepared for an attack is the best defense. If someone feels threatened, he or she should take immediate action, even if it means knocking on a stranger's door to ask for help or to use their telephone. A little embarrassment is better than a physical or sexual attack.

Please be aware this alleged attack occurred in a well lit residential area at a reasonably busy time. No one has been arrested, so exercise caution, attacks can occur at any time of day.

JANUARY GRAD PLANNED

On November 6, NAIT's Board of Governors passed a motion giving students who graduate in December a full graduation ceremony. Plans are being made for a January 13, 1990 graduation in the Cafetorium at the north end of NAIT.

During the Board of Governor's meeting, President Stan Souch said it "may be time for the Institute to consider 2 graduations." Until now, December graduates have attended a banquet and dance, but this year's "pilot graduation" will change that. Because of the lack of time between now and January 13, the ceremonies will not be as large as the

April grad. According to Cathryn Wyatt, this is "not meant to be seen as a lesser function", but rather as a pilot to base future decisions on.

The motion passed with no opposition. It was originally proposed at the request of a group of students to align NAIT with other schools that already have two graduations a year. Wally Romanko of Public Affairs department is in charge of organizing the graduation. Despite not having the usual 4 months organizational period, Romanko is confident the ceremony will be a success, as long as he doesn't have to hire the usual 40 piece band.

DONOR CLINIC

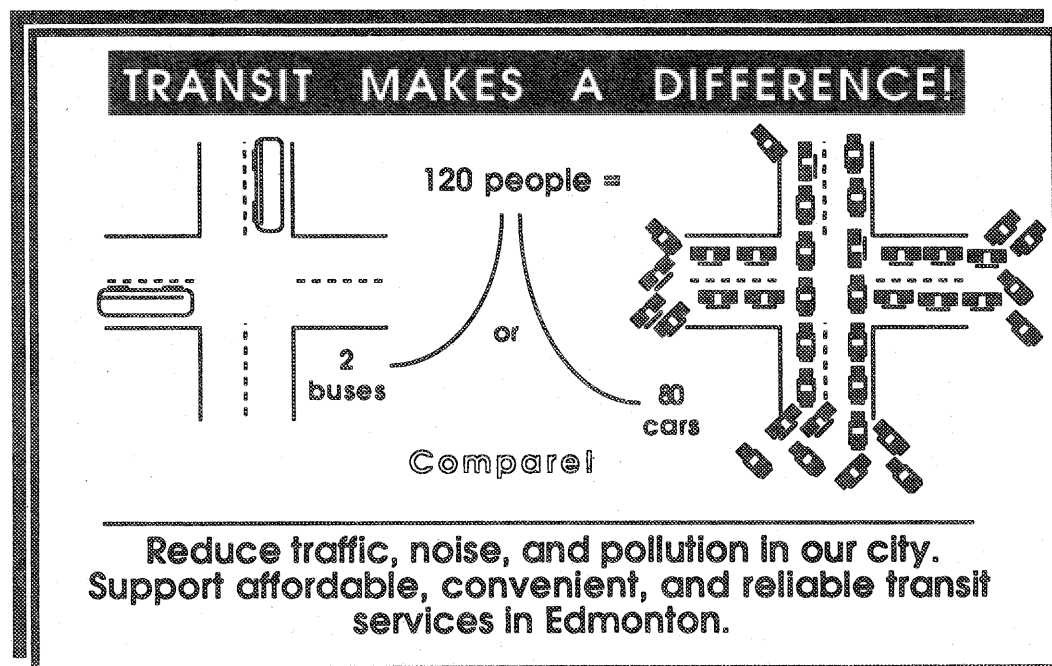
The Red Cross Society will be coming to NAIT for three days in November to conduct a Blood Donor Clinic. From 10:30 to 3:30 November 27 to 29, beds will be set up in the North Lobby to receive blood.

It takes about 45 minutes to give blood. Soft drinks and snacks will be provided for donors, although it is asked that donors have a meal

before giving blood. The Red Cross is asking for a large turnout following last month's serious blood shortage in Edmonton.

People not eligible to donate include people on medication, those who have donated in the last 3 months, anyone who suffers from blood disorders, those at risk from AIDS, and so on.

NEW STUDENT BUS PASS POSSIBLE



Edmonton's post-secondary education students are banding together to persuade city council to adopt a new student bus pass policy. The student's committee has met with aldermen to discuss a new pass, and "favorable support" has been shown.

The plan put forward by

the students calls for the elimination of the present student pack. The pack would be replaced by a monthly student bus pass with a 15% discount (\$32 instead of the regular \$38).

According to NAIT's representative Scott Sugden, student support is needed to make the new pass a reality. To that end, special postcards

have been printed to help students voice their opinions. The cards compare amounts of traffic, noise, and pollution between buses and cars.

All the students need to do it pick up a card from Scott Sugden in the NAITSA offices (E133), sign his or her name and address, and return the card to Scott.

MOO DAYS RETURNS

"Alcohol Awareness Days", which is an annual event at NAIT, will be held November 15-17 this year. As can be guessed from the title, the object of the program is to raise student's awareness of the effects and dangers of alcohol.

However, instead of pelting students with facts and figures, NAIT has taken a more light-hearted approach. For example, the motto of the days is "Get ABSURD", standing for Get A Better Understanding of Responsible Drinking. There will also be a "Bottle Cap Contest" for two Oilers tickets, and the "Moo Milk Contest". This pits teams of 3 against each other in categories of best costumes, best version of the Moo Milk song, best time for chugging glasses of milk, and best overall team.

The competition is being sponsored by Dairyworld and Numaid Dairies, who are supplying Amereto and Irish Creme flavored milk.

It has been shown that students who begin their job search during the school year are more likely to find training related employments, and also earn higher salaries, than those who wait until they have graduated. This trend becomes increasingly magnified if several months are taken off after graduation before the job search begins. Thus, it is important to begin considering the job market and actively planning your job search NOW. An excellent place to start this is at the annual Career Fair.

The Career Fair provides an opportunity for employees and student to meet and exchange information on careers within their company. This benefits students by allowing them to become

familiar with companies which recruit from their programs. Employers also benefit from the Career Fair by raising their companies' profile with NAIT's students. This can translate into a wider range of responses

when they being recruiting. As well, the Career Fair provides a screening mechanism where students may find they are not suited to a position in the company, or that they just don't "fit" the companies' corporate culture.

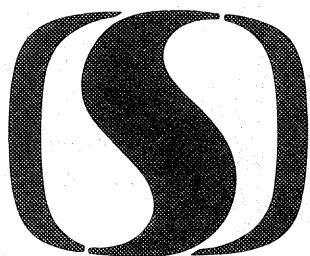

A number of student representatives are participating in an Edmonton Post-Secondary School Lobby Campaign. Representatives from the Alberta Vocational Centre, Kings College, U of A, Concordia, Grant MacEwan Community College, and NAIT are lobbying the newly elected city council for a NEW monthly Student Bus Pass.

Even if you drive to school, please realize that many other students rely on public transportation. And other contributing factors such as part-time jobs, increasing rents and declining vacancy rates (which are forcing many students to live further away from the campus they attend), make affordability and flexibility of a public transit system essential for a large number of post-secondary students.

Committee members have been meeting with aldermen to discuss the new pass, 10% discount available monthly, as opposed to buying the present Student Pak which offers students a 10% saving, when a student purchases a four month pass. This will cost \$137.00 in order to receive a \$15.00 savings. Students who live on a month to month budget would probably find it very hard to pay this lump sum, and so are forced to buy at the full price adult pass, or pay cash fares.

Right now, the lobby group is trying to get a pass with the same amount of savings, available monthly. And for the future, hopefully by next May, to have an increase from the current 10% to 15% available to Students of Edmonton.

The lobby group feels it is important to build relations between the ETS, as well as City Council. The first step in this process is to show City Council the amount of students who are concerned by this issue. To do this your Student Association has been circulating postcards, for you to sign, these will be taken to city council to demonstrate the numbers of voters who want to see a change. If you are interested in having a voice, and making a change, please pick up one of these postcards, or cut it out from this page of the NUGGET and return it to NAITSA offices or boxes in the main kiosk and the NAITRIUM on main campus. (pass would be \$32 instead of \$38)
