



MAKE YOUR MARK

The 1989 Edmonton General Municipal Election will be held Monday, October 16, 1989 . . . "Make your Mark!"

A NEW SYSTEM FOR **VOTE COUNTING**

Votes will be counted using new electronic counting machines for the first time in this election. The system is very simple to use. One large ballot card lists all candidates for offices of Mayor; Alderman; and School Trustee.

To vote, simply mark an X or other legible mark next to the name of the candidate of your choice. Use only the special marking pen provided. OFFICES TO BE FILLED

(For a three-year period) Names of candidates for all offices will be published in Edmonton newspapers on October 14 and 15. Each voter may vote for one candidate for Mayor, two candidates for Alderman and one candidate for School Trustee. Voters will be asked to mark a ballot for either Separate or Public School Trustee, depending on the school system with which they are affiliated. Only one ballot will be issued to each eligible voter.
