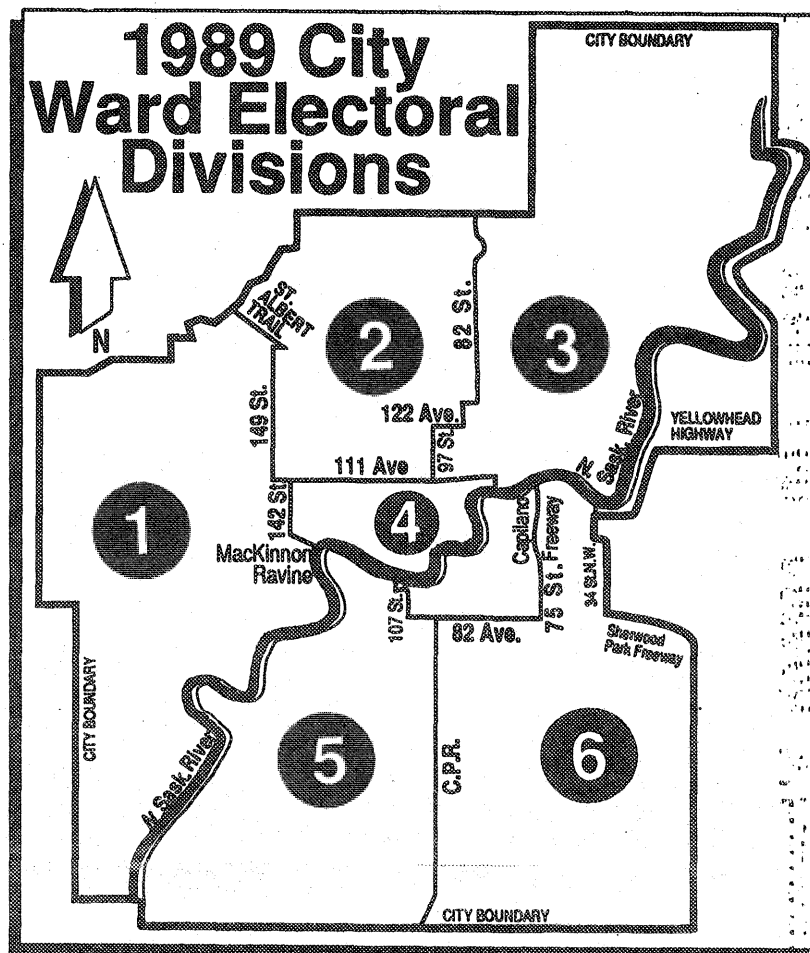

The 1989 Edmonton General Municipal Election will be held Monday, October 16, 1989 . . . "Make your Mark!"

A NEW SYSTEM FOR VOTE COUNTING

Votes will be counted using new electronic counting machines for the first time in this election. The system is very simple to use. One large ballot card lists all candidates for offices of Mayor; Alderman; and School Trustee.

To vote, simply mark an X or other legible mark next to the name of the candidate of your choice. Use only the special marking pen provided.

OFFICES TO BE FILLED

(For a three-year period)

Names of candidates for all offices will be published in Edmonton newspapers on October 14 and 15. Each voter may vote for one candidate for Mayor, two candidates for Alderman and one candidate for School Trustee. Voters will be asked to mark a ballot for either Separate or Public School Trustee, depending on the school system with which they are affiliated. Only one ballot will be issued to each eligible voter.

VOTING INFO

WHO IS QUALIFIED TO VOTE?

The Local Authorities Election Act defines an eligible voter as: (1) "A person is eligible to vote in an election held pursuant to this act if he: (a) is at least 18 years old, (b) is a Canadian citizen, and (c) has resided in Alberta for the six (6) consecutive months immediately preceding election day and is resident in the area* on election day."

* Edmonton residents are area residents for voting in the Edmonton Municipal Election.

ADVANCED VOTING STATIONS

Persons who are unable to attend on election day, or have physical disabilities, may vote at the advance voting stations on October 13 or 14. All advance voting locations are accessible by wheelchair.

The following schools are tentative locations to be used as voting stations for the Advance Vote for the October 16, 1989 General Election.

WARD 1 Jasper Place Composite High School, 8950 - 163 Street.

WARD 2 Kensington Elementary School, 13410 - 119 Street.

WARD 3 Eastglen Composite High School, 11430 - 68 Street.

WARD 4 Queen Mary Park Elementary School, 10935 - 113 Street.

WARD 5 Harry Ainlay Composite High School, 4350 - 111 Street.

WARD 6 Austin O'Brien High School, 6110 - 95 Avenue.

**Voting Stations Open
10 a.m. to 8 p.m.**

NAIT Students rely on Edmonton Transit to get to class, to the library, to part time jobs, to do what they need to do. A \$38 bus pass can take a chunk from a student's wallet. ETS offers a 'Student Pak': four month passes for \$137, at the beginning of each term. You can save \$15, but that \$137 is a big pocket drainer.

NAITSA thinks students deserve a better deal. A city wide campaign has been launched, involving students at Grant MacEwan Community College, NAIT, Concordia College, Alberta Vocational Centre, King's College, and the U of A. Working together, we plan to influence ETS and City Council - the people who can create a monthly student pass that would work for students.

The Civic Election on October 16th provides a forum to discuss student concerns about transportation.

We want students to know about the issues, who stands for what, and to get out and vote. Historically, civic elections have a very low voter turnout, so if the 60,000 plus students in Edmonton get out to vote it could make the

decisions that we want, so we should choose the people who represent our views. For students, this is a very important election.

Starting October 18th a campaign will focus on informing students and collecting support in the form of a postcard petition. The cards, from students and concerned citizens, will be presented to the new city council to back up the work being done with Edmonton Transit.

We want to get the word out and you can help.

We need to reach as many students as possible over the next month or so. We need help distributing materials and collecting postcards. Many hands make light work and this time you could make a difference.

HOGGIN' THE SPOT LIGHT

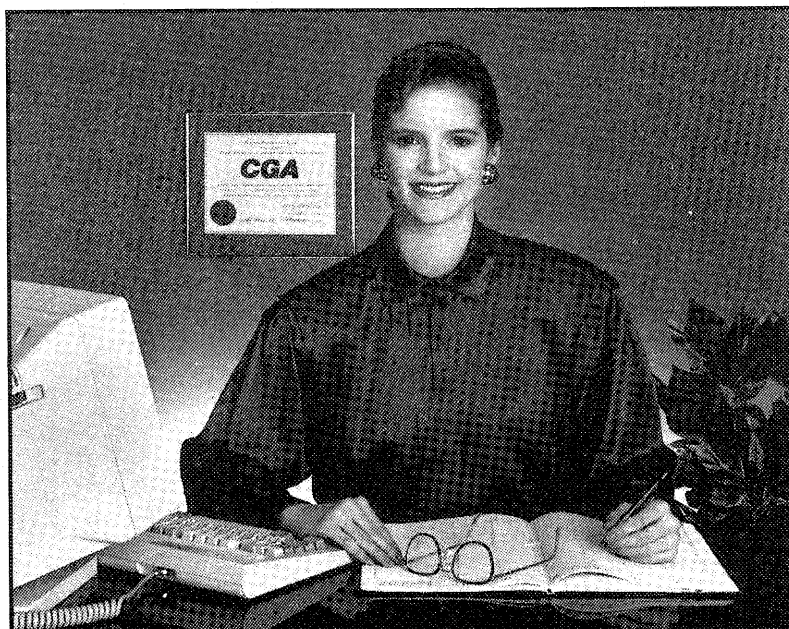

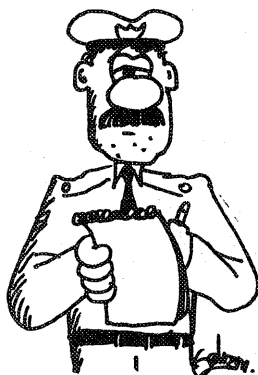

The environment is a very hot topic lately. In fact I would even say that it's quite fashionable to be "environmentally aware".

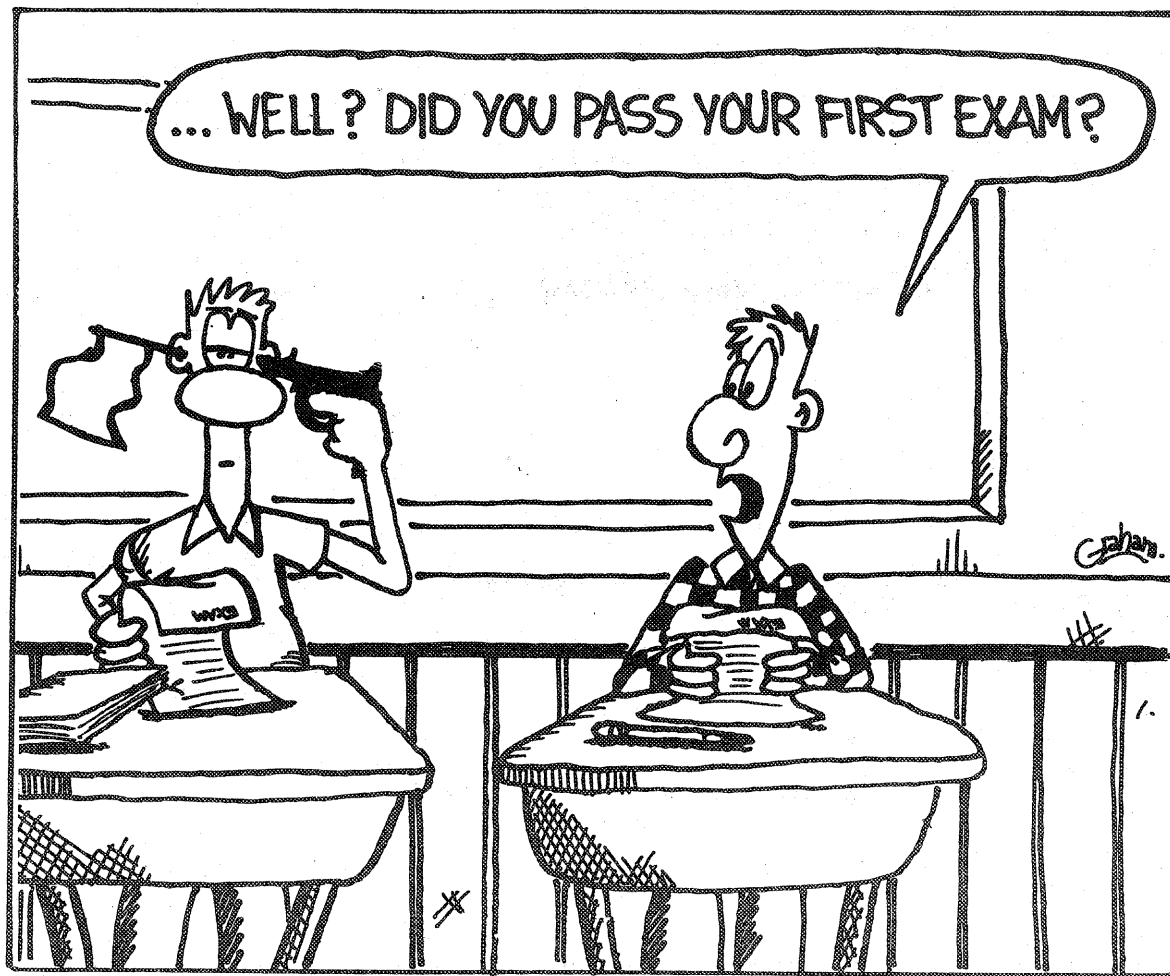
