Red Cross Asks For Help

The Red Cross was established in Alberta 75 years ago, and since that time most Albertans have become familiar with it through the blood donor clinics. But there's much more to the Red Cross than that. Each year the Red Cross helps 170,000 Albertans learn to swim. It provides courses in first aid and emergency home care. It loans out sickroom equipment to people recovering from accident or injury. In fact, the Red Cross is active in our community in ways you may not know about.

However, the area of helping for which they are famous, blood donations, is currently suffering a major shortage. And elective surgery in local hospitals will be cut back if the situation does not change quickly.

According to recent estimates, 500 donors per day, during one week, would be needed to bring the blood bank levels up to acceptable levels. The biggest need is for type O

blood, of which there was less than a one day supply as of Monday.

Anyone wishing to donate blood can do so at the Red Cross House (9931 - 106st) from 11:00 to 2:00 PM weekdays, or at the Blood Centre (8249 - 114st) 10:30 to 8:00 PM Tuesday to Thursday, 10:30 to 2:30 PM Friday, and 9:30 to 1:30 PM Saturday. There are also plans for a blood donor clinic later this semester, here at Nait.

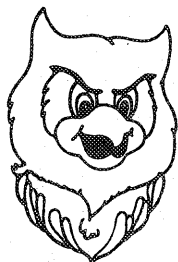

WRITE A TRIP TO JAPAN

C A B A R E T POSTER RULES

While cabarets have so far proven to be an excellent way for technologies to raise money this year, they may soon cost more money to put on. The reason is that NAITSA will be cracking down on violations of the NAIT poster policy.

The purpose of the policy is to insure adequate poster advertising for NAIT activities and for outside charitable activities. Although there are 11 points to the policy, the most important points are:

- poster can not be placed on painted surfaces or glass,

- each poster must have an expiry date from Student Services,

- cabaret posters must be approved by NAITSA two weeks before the event,
- references cannot be made to alcohol through writing or pictures,

- all cabaret posters must have a "If you're drinking, who's driving" stamp.

Fines of \$25 will be imposed for infractions of any of the rules in the policy. A copy of the complete policy and fines can be obtained from Kevin Wimpney in the NAITSA offices.

NAIT Helps United Way

The meaning behind the "U + ME = 43" posters that have recently appeared around NAIT has finally been revealed. The posters represent the 1989 slogan for NAIT's United Way Campaign.

According to Stan Souch, President of NAIT, "The slogan means that we as individuals, when making a concerted effort, can raise our contribution to \$43,000 this year, compared to \$38,456 in 1988." Dr. Souch also claims

NAIT has a "fine reputation" of responding to community needs. He feels the recent success of Shinerama supports his claims.

The campaign, which kicked off Monday, is chaired by Joan Finley, Dale Holland, and John Reeves. It will run until November 10. With NAIT having exceeded its goal in four of the last five years, and receiving two commendations in that time, the campaign has a strong heritage to live up to.

INSTANT TELLER ARRIVES

As most second year students will have noticed, an instant bank teller was installed in the south lobby during the summer. According to NAITSA Financial Director, Imre Bene, plans for the machine have been in the works since early 1988, but an agreement between NAIT and the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce was only recently reached.

Although other banks were contacted about installing an instant teller, CIBC was the obvious choice for NAIT. "We (NAITSA) have all our accounts with them, and we already had a contract with them." However, Bene points out, it was NAIT itself and not the Student Association that finalized the deal.

So far, there have been no complaints about the machine. Although it is not a full service teller and can only be used for deposits or withdrawals, it is apparently meeting the needs of NAIT students.

SENATE ELECTION

High voter response to the senate election is essential to senate reform. Oregon lead the United States to similar reform by holding a similar election years ago. Our provincial government and the six candidates have gone to considerable expense to provide similar leadership to Canada.

All six support the concept, but their effectiveness may differ. Bert Brown, the Tory candidate, has fought for change since 1983 and claims that one poll has him in the lead. A poll published by the Edmonton Journal shows Liber Bill Code on top. He has high visibility as a result of the Principal Inquiry. Stan Waters is the reform party candidate and wants spending cuts rather than new taxes.

The three independent candidates are well down on the polls but claim that party affiliation would make representing all Albertans difficult. Newspaper publisher and author Gladys Taylor is the only woman candidate. Dr. Ken Paproski and Tom Sindlinger were conservative MLA's.

A low turnout will hurt efforts for the triple E senate -- elected, equal and effective. Some may choose to send a message to Ottawa about the clawback of old age security and family allowances and the Goods and Services tax by voting against the conservative candidate. Use your franchise to vote for future improvements.

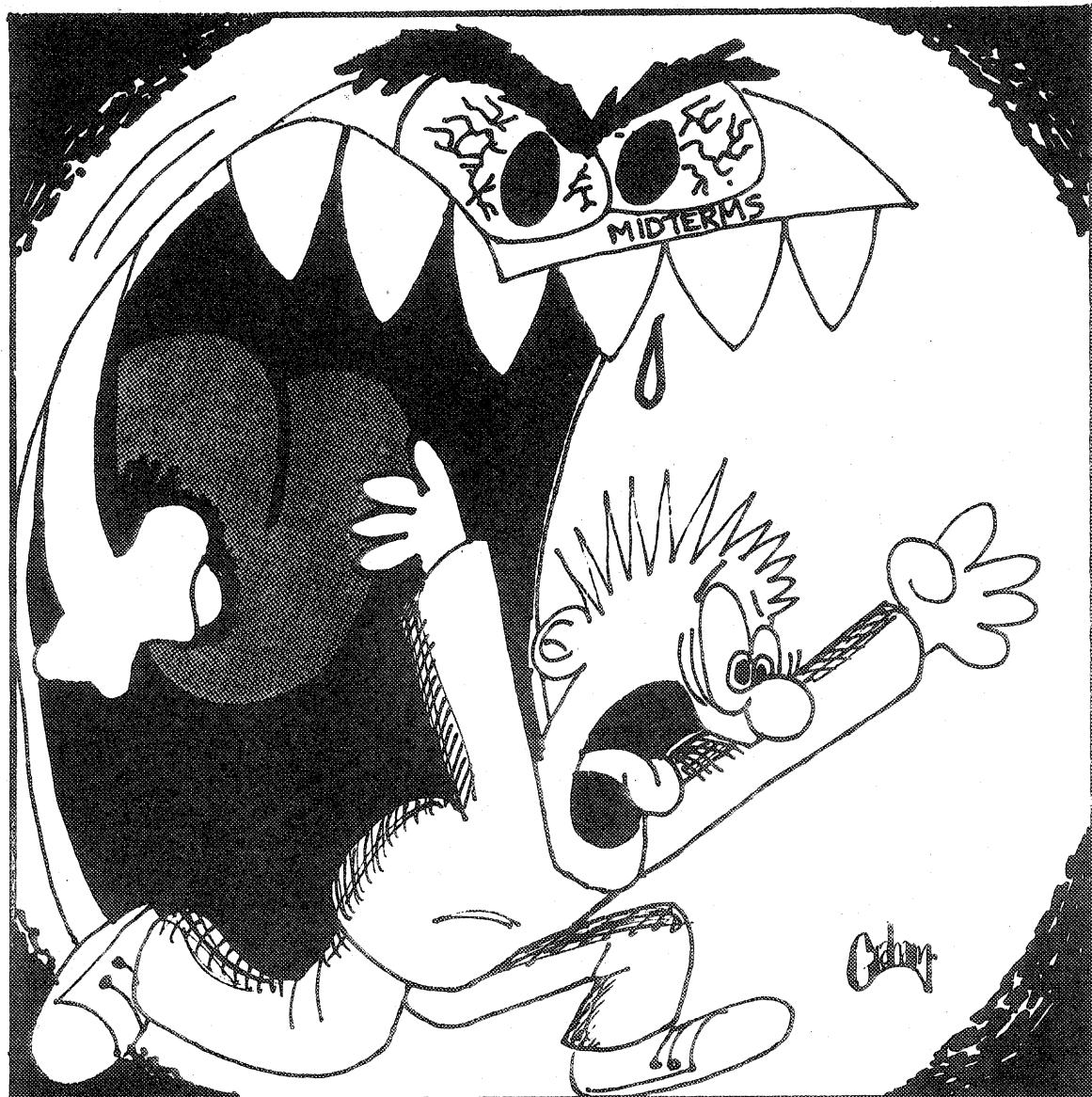

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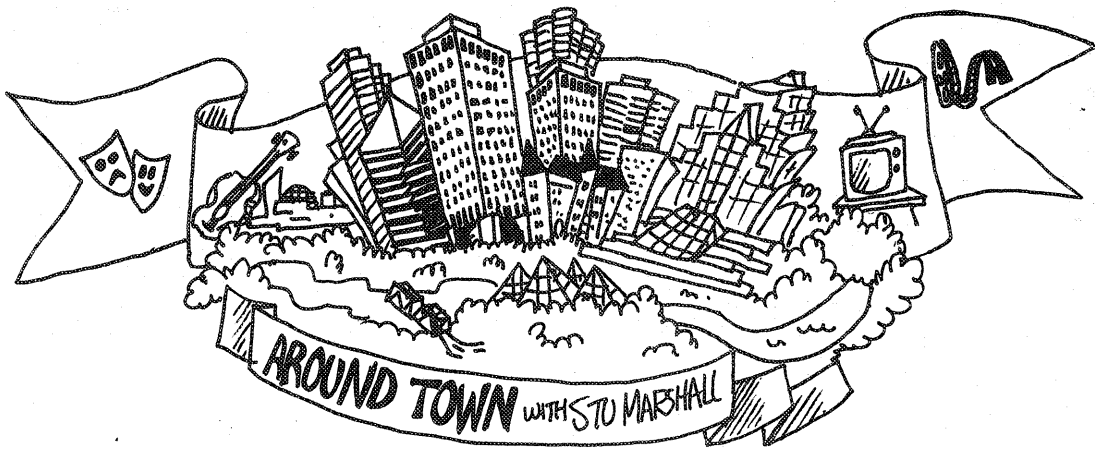

Persons entering the job market tend to focus upon the obvious employers first: Big Business & Industry. These institutions are most prominent by virtue of size and general familiarity. Typically, small businesses have no personnel office screening, and a minimum of other "gate keepers," if any. This makes it easier for you to get to the person who will do the hiring — a primary goal for every job seeker!

Other applicants are concentrating on the obvious employers and "visible" openings. You will be investigating an area of the market where openings tend to be "hidden" — not listed in want-ads or with employment and placement agencies. 85% of all available jobs are hidden!

A Course For Action

1. Make a list of potential employers, using the following resources:

- Yellow & White Pages of the Telephone Directory
- Public Library (for telephone directories, newspapers, business directories, professional & trade journals & many other materials)
- Associations and Local Organizations of people who work in fields in which you are seeking a job.
- Friends, Relatives & Acquaintances who may know people or businesses who use your skills.

2. After prospective employers have been identified, establish direct contact by phone, introduce yourself, present your qualifications and ask for an interview.

3. Don't be surprised when you get a job offer.... It's your BIG reward for thinking "small!"

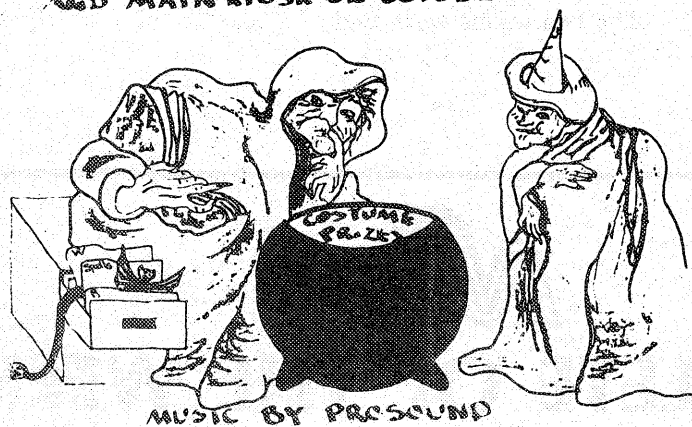

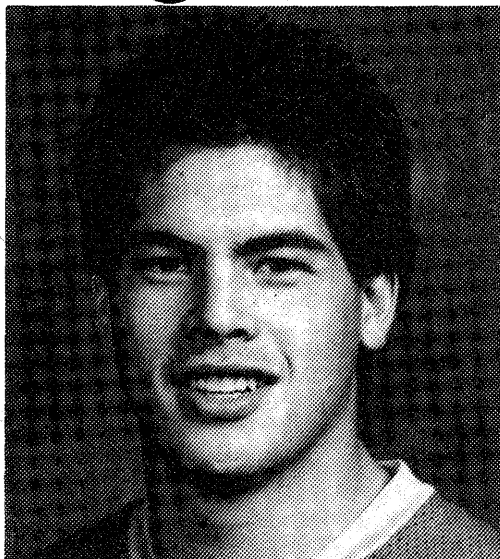

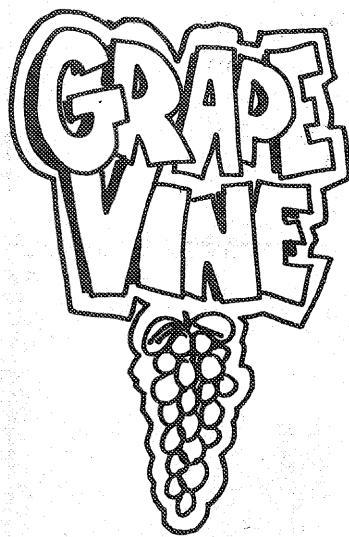
are no females in this technology.

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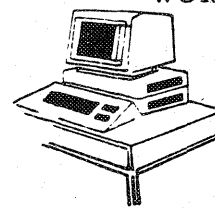

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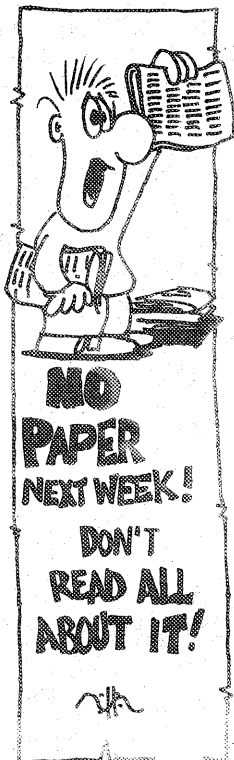
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
