

NAIT UNVEILS NEW FLAG

On Monday afternoon, NAIT's new flag was unveiled in front of the main entrance along 106 Street. Many of NAIT's dignitaries, as well as several members of Edmonton's press corps, were on hand as Brad Diemert (NAITSA President), Catheryn Wyatt and Stan Souch (Board of Governors) raised the new flag for the first time.

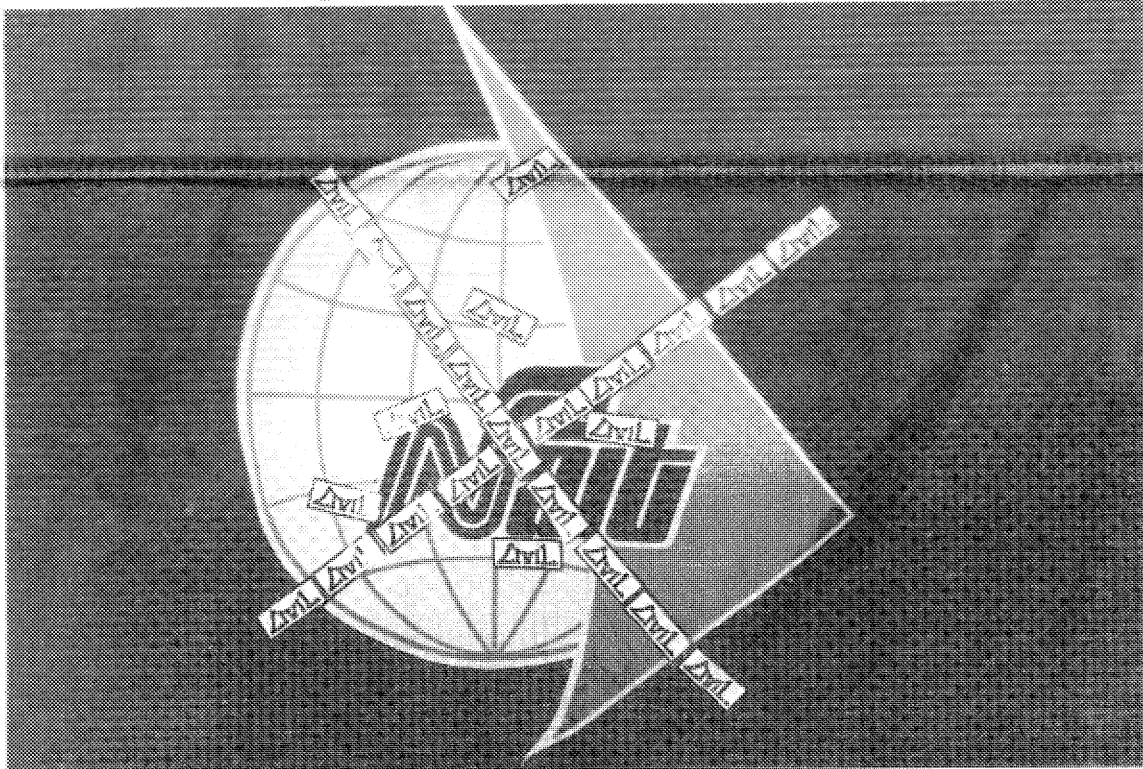
The idea of an official NAIT flag was proposed by the Campus Development Committee three years ago to coincide with NAIT's 25th anniversary. Unfortunately, the design was not finalized until the spring of 1989.

Wally Romanko, who worked on the flag with artist Dave Stephenson of the L.R.C., says no one person can claim credit for the design of the flag. Instead, he points to the evolution of the crest on the flag. The crest was originally designed in 1964 by Jack McMaster, a former electronics student.

The first modification was made when the Board of Governors was formed to run NAIT in place of the Minister of Education. At that time the Alberta crest was removed from the triangle. The other modification involved replacing the original block letters that spelled NAIT with the more modern lettering that currently decorates everything from NAIT binders to coffee mugs.

The reasons for sticking with the original design are many. The design, which shows NAIT's influence is worldwide, is still valid today. In fact, with over 40,000 graduates to NAIT's credit, the design is probably more valid today than ever. It also reflects NAIT's history and the strong input of the students in the direction that NAIT takes.

Spanning White Mud Creek and fulfilling all requirements in 11 minutes, 50 seconds, a team from Building Construction Engineering Technology garnered the trophy in the annual Bridge Building Challenge on September 23.

The team from Air-Conditioning Engineering Technology came in second and the U of A. Civil

Engineering team third, with times roughly two and three minutes longer respectively.

BCET Program Head Charlie Grant reports being impressed by the team from Secretarial and Office Administration, which came in sixth. "These young ladies built probably the tidest bridge at the contest and received only one penalty."

No More Tar

Early this summer, C & M construction began work on a \$320,000 contract to re-roof most of the main campus buildings at NAIT. The roofs on campus have never been upgraded, so the repairs and re-roofing expenses for the job are justified. Bob Kerr, director of facilities management says, "For the past four years we've been concentrating on modernizing

and re-roofing the buildings." The job was to be completed in mid-August to avoid any inconveniences to the students and staff. Summer rains delayed C & M Construction and the completion date was pushed to October.

The South Cafeteria to Central Services are currently being upgraded and should be completed later this month.

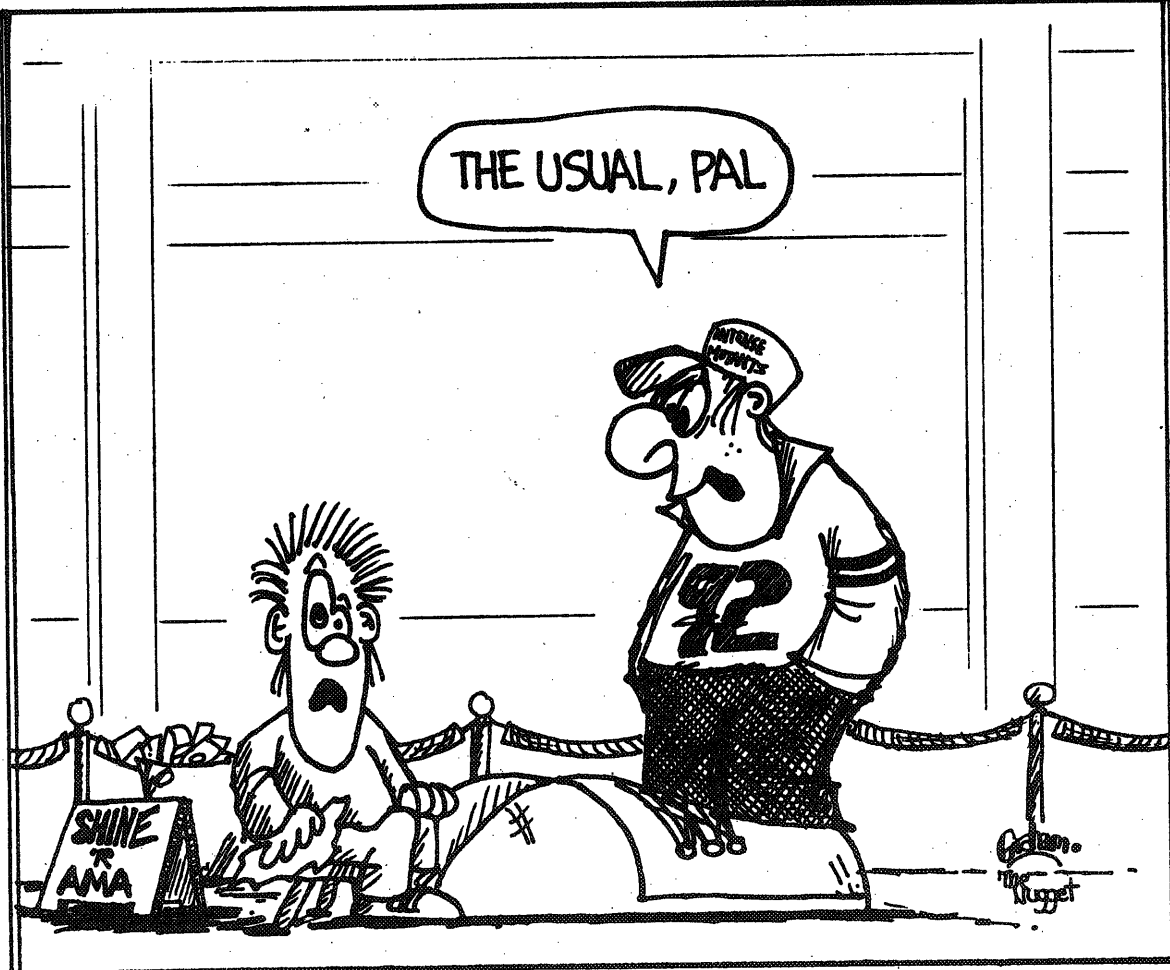

NAIT's, Kay Stoffer, a 1976 Electronics graduate of NAIT, is president of the Alberta Society of Engineering Technologists (ASET). She is the first woman to hold such a post in Canada. An electronics instructor at Lethbridge Community College, she has been a certified/registered technologist for six years.

As the head of her professional association, Stoffer is concerned with the possibility of serious shortages of skilled workers across Canada. "As technology

advances, technicians and technologists will become more and more important," Stoffer asserts. "New ideas are being introduced at an exponential rate. Technologists are the ones who will adapt and make work what the scientist, the architect, or the engineer conceptualizes. That process requires a tremendous amount of creativity, skill, and knowledge... more so than ever before," she says.
