


## Technology? It's Right Here

In the 1989-90 school year NAIT will have an estimated 11,000 full time students. Not all so these students will need to use a computer to further their career but a majority will. It's this majority that NAIT is concerned about.

**TOWER:** The major concentration of NAIT's computers is undoubtedly in the Tower. There are nine working processing labs and one lab on the third floor which is connected to the mainframe of NAIT's computer. Approximately 250 terminals, most of which are IBM compatible PS/2's, are located in the basement and on the 2nd, 3rd, & 5th floors of the tower building.

There's a lot of terminals but if you've tried to catch a elevator lately you will have noticed that there's a lot of students. Schedules for lab times are drawn up by Jane Berube, secretary for computer systems technology, "The demand is great for computers that's why we've hired students from CST to help us remain open on most weekends." The students are accessible and familiar with the machines and the longers hours created have been taken advantage of. Charles Coe, CST instructor feels that there could always be room for more computers. "The existing demand is just too great."

Computer Systems is one of

NAIT's fastest growing technologies. This coupled with the fact that they must share the Tower's computers with Business students (NAIT's largest technology), definitely poses some problems which cannot be answered overnight.

This demand has prompted the Tower to extend the lab hours as much as possible. Lab times are posted on the lab rooms and usually the 5th floor has an available terminal. Most of these labs are open to almost any NAIT student.

**WESTWOOD** is the home of both Secretarial Arts and the Micro Computer Institute. Because of some of the pressures from the students Secretarial Arts has hired a special lab supervisor so that the labs may be more accessible. Students may book time for computers from 4-6 Monday to Thursday. This should be of interest to students in R.T.A. and Dietary as well.

There are 215 students enrolled in Secretarial Arts and there are approximately 50 computers contained in 2 labs. Pat Drewery feels quite fortunate, "We are on a definite competitive edge. The students are well prepared when they go into the work setting." The only place Pat feels they lack is in the replacement of some old IBM electric typewriters, "there are very few left in the work place."

Two technologies remain. The students in Telecommunications have labs in rooms A-176 and A273. The Engineering Annex (Plaza II) completes our tour and has four C.A.D. (computer aided design) labs set up on the L-Wing.

With the availability of the labs in the Tower coupled with the fact the the library has a computer which is sparsely used, leads one to believe that a lack of available information exists. The NUGGET looked at this two weeks ago when it was apparent that some students felt NAIT might be sacrificing our educational dollar. NAIT seems to be committed to this issue, but how so. Effective and efficient use of present resource must be achieved before a cry for "more" may be warranted.

The Micro Computers Institute have four word processing labs equipped with IBM compatible PS/2's, XT's and Mac S.E.'s. Secretarial Arts labs are used by M.C.I. students to extend their time on the computers.

The industrial division of NAIT is not forgotten in this technological explosion. Students have access to 5 labs (J-Wing) two of which are word processing labs (micro-soft). For the past 5 years they have had these labs open from 8:15 a.m. - 10:00 p.m. and nothing shall change this year says Terry Cook.





We just entered into a trade war with a waking giant. Where's Jack and his high-tech beans when you need them.



1. I was in Toronto the last time the Jays won the east division; what a party!!! Go Jays Go!!


