There are some down points to the job, but not many. Occasionally you must work late one evening, and sometimes you find a story that just doesn't want to get written. Even so, it's a job worth trying.

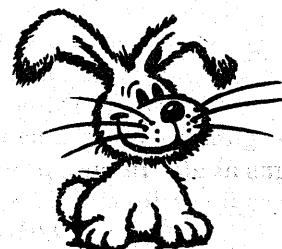
Not all the jobs here require writing skills either. The typesetter must just decipher other people's writing and type it, while production staff handle the paper's layout.

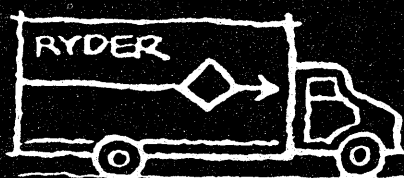

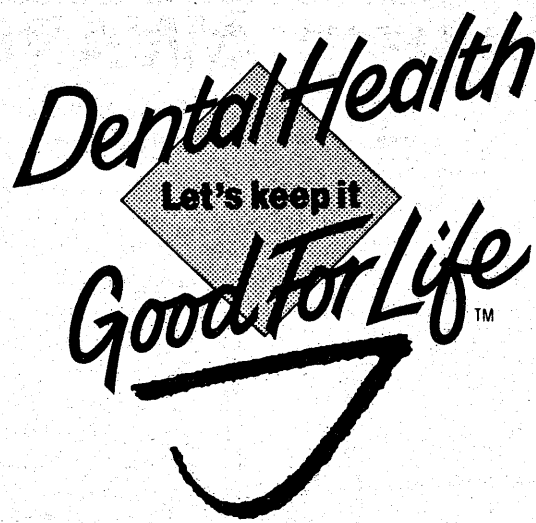
THE ENVIRONMENT NAITLINE

President Stan Souch this week released the final report of his Advisory Committee Monitoring Our Responsibilities to the Environment (PACMORE).

The committee was formed last October, with the responsibility of (a) examining how NAIT was affecting the environment and (b) determining how it might improve its treatment of the environment. The Final Report, dated March 27, 1990, includes an extensive list of issues, systems, and practices having possible effects on NAIT's environment, together with corresponding statements on their current status. The report also includes over 40 recommendations aimed at improving our practices.

Copies of the report have been made available to NASA, Local 38, NAITSA, The Naiture Club, and the senior administration. Additional copies may be obtained through the President's Office. Dr. Souch now seeks responses from various Institute stakeholders to the report's recommendations.

The President expresses his appreciation to Chairman Reg Hodgson and his committee members: Earl Dalton, Dana Fawcett, Ray Gilroy, Ray Heath, Ron Kachman, Bob Kerr, Mary Rehill, Ivor Richardson, and (from NAITSA) Scott Sugden. "The Final Report, especially when you realize that it is a summary of a thick, detailed earlier report, represents a great deal of commitment by PACMORE to the question of NAIT's environment," said Dr. Souch.

Gum disease. It's the major cause of adult tooth loss. Nine out of every ten Canadians will eventually get it in some form. And most adult Canadians don't know anything about it at all.

Nearly all adult Canadians have at least some inflammation of the gums. When the disease is caught in the early stages it's easy to treat, but if it's left to develop, the gums and bone waste away from the teeth - and the teeth, lacking support, fall out. Gum disease causes most adult tooth loss today.

HOW IT HAPPENS:

The villain is plaque, a clear, sticky film of bacteria that constantly forms on your teeth. Plaque produces irritants which cause swollen red, bleeding gums. Hardened plaque (called *calculus*) collects around the teeth and under the gumline, and the inflamed gums begin to shrink away from the teeth. Pockets form in the spaces between the teeth and gums, leaving room for plaque and its by-products to invade the deeper tissues and eventually the jawbone.

THE SIGNS:

Common early warning signs of gum disease may include gums that bleed during brushing or flossing; soft, tender, or swollen gums; persistent bad breath or bad taste in the mouth; a feeling of pressure between the teeth after eating. But gum disease can be present without any visible warning signs at all. In fact, in its early stages it is unlikely to cause any pain or discomfort.

HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR TEETH:

The key is controlling plaque. This means three things. One is to reduce your intake of sugary foods, since plaque thrives on sugar. The other is to clean the accumulated plaque out of your mouth every day, especially between your teeth and around your gumline. The third is to see a dentist at regular intervals to get rid of calculus deposits.

CLEANING TIPS:

- Your dentist or hygienist can review with you the best way to brush and floss. Meanwhile, here are some tricks to help you clean your gumline effectively.
- When you're brushing, think about holding the brush so that the bristles are tilted up at a 45 degree angle against the gumline. Move the brush back and forth in short strokes; then move on to the next group of teeth. Think about reaching the outside, inside, and chewing surfaces of each tooth.
- When you're flossing, think of your mouth in four sections: upper left, upper right, lower left and lower right. Develop the habit of flossing these sections in the same order every day so you don't inadvertently miss a tooth.

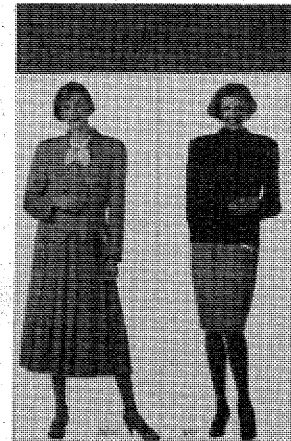

I'm a continuing-ed. student completing a fifth level accounting course through NAIT's Accelerated program on Tuesday evenings.

Because I hold a full-time job, and because the work load in these fifth level courses are pretty intense, most of my evenings and weekends are spend at the NAIT library, doing homework and basically just keeping up with the course.

I study at the library as opposed to studying at home simply because it provides a better "study environment."

At home there's always too many distractions (ie. family, television, etc.)

The course I'm taking (Advanced Financial Accounting) doesn't end until May 22nd. However, I've learned that the library's hours will be changing effective May 5th. Basically, the library will be closed by 5:00 p.m. weekdays and all day weekends. What this means basically is that my study plans are screwed in terms of using the library for the last month of the course.

Now I realize that the day program ends at the end of April and the library is just adjusting its hours to reflect this. MP RESPONDS TO LETTERS

Naitsa recently sent a form letter around Nait to collect signatures to protest recent federal cuts in transfer payments to the provinces. Approximately 400 of the letters were sent to Murray Dorin, the M.P. for Edmonton Northwest.

Mr. Dorin responded recently with letters to all the students and a telephone call to Nait. In his letter, Mr. Dorin mentioned the national debt and deficit the Conservatives inherited

when they came to power, and then reviewed how they had tried to control each of them. He said the federal government felt that capping the transfer payments for two years was a "prudent and responsible action" because a provincial tax dollar loses only 8 cents to the provincial debt while federal taxes lose 29 cents per dollar to debt. The letter continued "Overall, the cap on Established Program Financing (transfer) payments should not injure the provincial treasuries as EPF accounts for less than

one per cent of their revenues" Mr. Dorin agreed education was an investment in the future, and so encouraged business and post-secondary institutes to "seek out new ways of supporting the finest education system in Canada." He also pointed out that direct federal support to post-secondary education would not be affected.

Members of the Naitsa executive will be meeting with Mr. Dorin in the near future to discuss their concerns with him in person.

NAITIANS HONORED

NAITLINE

John Walker, Instructor in Denturist Technology, was made a Fellow of the Academy of Canadian Denturists late in February.

The fellowship candidate must, says the inscription from the Academy, "have demonstrated, with the acknowledgement of his professional peers, a record of achievement in the advancement of the profession of denturism." An instructor at NAIT for 11 years, John can now add "FACD" to his "RDT" (Registered Dental Technician) AND "CDM" (Certified Dental Mechanical) credentials.

A NAIT instructor and a NAIT program have also been selected for Honorable Mentions in the 1990 Awards Program of the Association of Canadian

Community Colleges.

Judy Simonsen-Paterson, Instructor in Business Administration, was recognized in the "Teaching excellence" category for her development of student learning materials for the study of Business Law. She took a complex, difficult body of documents and rendered it into a form that students can readily understand.

The Residential Adaptation Program, a joint project among NAIT, the Handicapped Housing Society of Alberta, and the Canada Employment Centre (Edmonton South), received an Honorable Mention in the "Partnership" category of the ACCC Awards Program. The project involved the renovation of houses for the physically handicapped.

During the program's duration, several houses

were renovated to accommodate wheelchair users. The additional of ramps and lifts, the widening of halls and doorways, and the relocation of cabinets and appliances, among other modifications, greatly facilitate the handicapped person's functioning and independence.

Carpentry Instructor Aris Smits took a leading role in training students to do the work. They were for the most part drawn from the ranks of the long-term unemployed, and so the project included an important training dimension beyond the benefit to the handicapped. The skills learned by the trainees ranged across the construction trades: carpentry, dry walling, painting, sheet-metal mechanics, and plumbing.

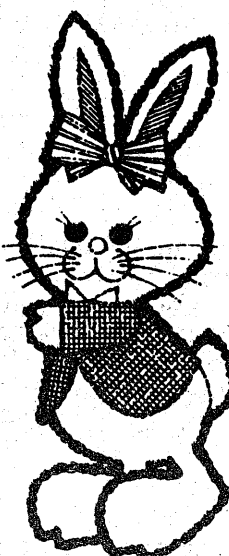

Pub Cards are placed next to the individual pubs to tell the player how many drinks to take in any given pub.

Numbers range from 1 to 10.

While making their way around the board, trying to avoid Winos, the players collect the letters P, U, and B. A player hit by a Wino moves their token to any home start area of their choice and then takes three drinks. Spelling the word "PUB" makes you immune to a wino the next time you get hit.

There are also spaces on the board marked by a beer mug (take one drink), a cocktail (take two drinks), and a waitress (and hopefully in the near future a waiter) everyone takes a drink.

Quotes from those at the party: Great Game. Better than the real act of Pubcrawling. Don't have to worry about line ups at the Pubs and how you are going

to get home (we played with a designated driver).

This is the first game I've played with a designated driver, and it doesn't take away from the game.

The game is available at Dufferin's in West Edmonton Mall, Kingsway Garden Mall; Level 10 in Heritage Mall; Games A Lot in

Kingsway Garden Mall and Edmonton Center; and We Are Games in Sherwood Park.

The game was invented by Grant Heslop, a Marketing Graduate, of Sylgra Innovations (his own company) and manufactured by Northern Games Co. of Edmonton.

RENOVATIONS

NAITLINE

The Business Centre, known until last year as the Tower Building, is about to undergo its first major renovation since it was built in 1965.

Construction, scheduled to begin the first week of May, will address two main problems with the building: insufficient elevator capacity and deteriorating window frames on the north side. The contract for the whole project was awarded to the Ellis-Don Management Services Ltd. by the Board of Governors at its meeting on April 2.

Four new elevator shafts will be erected on the south face of the building, straddling (two on each side) the 2nd-floor skywalk that connects the Business Centre to E-Wing. These will more than double the present elevator service, by extending from the basement to the 8th-floor lounge, the latter of which must now be reached by stairs. When two of the new elevators are operating, the old ones will be pulled out and the shafts converted to ventilation ducts. The old elevator cars will be outfitted with new machinery and rigging, and re-employed in the other two new shafts.

Each pair of elevators will

be shafts separated by a glassed-in section extending to the top of the building. Each floor will thereby gain a foyer having considerable natural light. The first two floors will be further enhanced by a glassed-in projection that incorporates the north end of the skywalk.

Also, the washrooms adjacent to the new elevators will be improved and provided with more "fixtures." The elevator additions and related work are expected to be completed by December 1990.

As for the windows on the north face of the building, their wooden frames are rotting, and the whole lot will be replaced with double-glazed aluminum-framed windows.

Jack Menduk, Manager of Facilities Planning, says that steps will be taken to minimize disruptions to regular operations. For instance, the windows will be replaced before fall 1990 classes begin. For another, throughout construction, at least two elevators will be in service at all times. Some noise and dust are, of course, unavoidable.

Staff and students affected will doubtless understand that the inconvenience will be more than compensated for by a vastly enhanced facility when construction is complete.

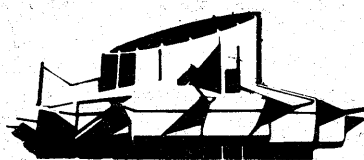

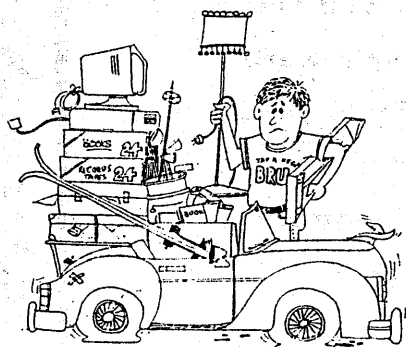

- Presentation of the diplomas (You will receive your actual diploma in the mail but the President of NAIT will present you with a diploma holder as a gift from the Institute.)

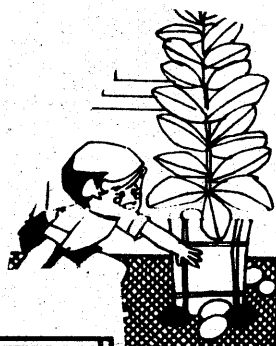

Earlier this year, Rob was named All-Canadian and a first team ACAC all-star.

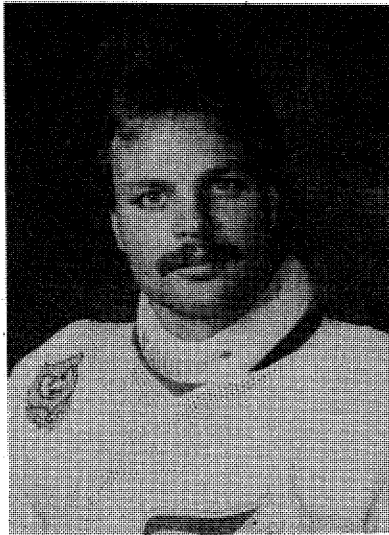

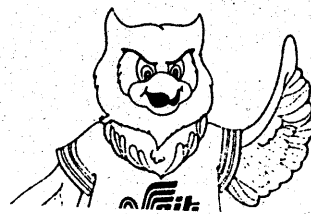

After winning an unprecedented fifth CCAA Hockey National Championship for NAIT, Oaks' head coach Perry Pearn indicated that he would like to continue his studies at the University of Calgary in the Masters of Coaching program and would probably not be behind the Oaks' bench next season.

During his twelve years as head coach of the NAIT Hockey Oaks, Pearn, with the assistance of his coaches and support staff and the effort of his players, has brought five national titles home as well as five ACAC championships.

In the past decade, the Oaks have become to the CCAA what the Montreal Canadiens are to the NHL and what the Boston Celtics are to the NBA -- an organization with pride and tradition. Despite great odds, the Oaks vaulted themselves to the pinnacle of success and the vault would not have been possible without Pearn.

Whether Pearn returns to the Oaks in the future is a question that will be answered in due time. The legacy that Pearn has written for the NAIT Hockey Program will be remembered for years to come across the nation.

When Pearn is replaced behind the Oaks' bench, it would be a mistake to expect another coach like Perry as there is none. However, there are capable individuals with the Oaks' organization who have the ability and talent to take the program to greater heights.

An important thing to remember is that when the Boston Red Sox replaced Hall of Famer Ted Williams, many fans were hoping for a player who was a carbon copy to take his place. Well, the Red Sox never got a second Ted Williams, but they got a second Hall of Famer in Carl Yastrzemski.
