

On Monday, January 29, Constable Paul Olmstead of the Edmonton Police Force gave 2, one hour seminars about protecting oneself from an attack. The seminars were arranged by NAITSA after a NAIT student was allegedly attacked during the first semester.

Constable Olmstead spoke to approximately thirty people during the two hours. He was not disappointed by the turnout, as he has made presentations to groups as small as three people. Scott Sugden of NAITSA, who attended both meetings, was also pleased. Sugden commented "I'd say it was worthwhile", because many "good questions" were asked.

The seminars focused

more on ways to avoid unfavorable situations than actual self-defense. The goal of the meetings were to teach people ways of protecting themselves that they normally wouldn't think of. In other words, the focus was more on attitudes than actions.

The entire presentation was taped by members of the Radio and Television Arts Technology, along with the interview with Constable Olmstead. The Counseling Center may also eventually stock printed material supplied by the E.P.D.



Firearm Petition

A petition calling for new laws controlling ownership of firearms in Canada is currently posted in the NAITSA offices. As of Monday evening, there were about 30 signatures.

The petition is a direct result of the shooting of 14 women in Montreal last December. It was put out by the Comité Conjoint Pour Le Contrôle Des Armes, Association Des Etudiants De Polytechnique (Coalition Committee For Arms Control, Polytechnique Student Association).

The exact wording of the petition reads: "The undersigned call for the enactment of new laws forbidding the private possession/ownership of any automatic, semi-automatic or modified fire arms in Canada." The petition, which is on the table just inside the NAITSA office door, can be signed during office hours.



NAIT PRAVDA

Last week there was an abundance of news articles to report on. This doesn't happen very often in this quiet little institute. Between Face - Off, our sexism story, and another article which the staff put an enormous amount of time on, priorities had to be made.

It is general practice (not to mention good common sense) to put your most readable material at the front of the paper, to insure page turning by readers. This contradicts the fact there was absolutely no news stories on pages 2 and 5 of last weeks Nugget. Believe me this was not planned by the editor.

The Nugget staff was busy putting together a story to go into this space, late Thursday night when we were informed by Scott Sugden, Publications Director, that an emergency meeting of NAITSA reached the decision of pulling the article So our as yet unwritten story had to be withdrawn:


Now according to NAITSA Constitution they are within their rights to do so - they are the publisher.

Hard as it was, we accepted this. But now what to do with the space? Well, I still wanted students to know that there had been an article planned, so I decided to leave the entire space on page 2 (except for the Nait Mate) blank, with nothing but a small tag indicating the word "CENSORED". The same goes for the space on page 5. This is how the paper was delivered to the printers that same night. You may be thinking. "Why didn't I see this in the paper?" Well the answer is simple really. Somewhere between my dropping it off at the printers and it going to print the Nugget was tampered with.

This means that the people who proudly put their names in the credit box are not the people who have the final control over what reaches the eyes of the students of NAIT. That honor belongs to the Student Government, NAITSA Executive Council. Not only was I informed that NAITSA has the right to censor any article they feel, but they can also put any article, ad, etc. in they want.

Somewhat strange bedfellows, wouldn't you say? Ahh, but don't think twice about it. Like Art Hook, Associate Dean of Student Services, was kind to inform me, that's the way it's always been at NAIT. And that's the way it's going to stay.

Well, with NAITSA handling it why worry?



What's The Issue?

"My resignation is by no means an admission of guilt. I've been treated well by NAITSA and I wanted to return the favor. I don't think it's fair of me to keep my position there because of the extra pressure it puts on the other NAITSA executives."

Kevin Wimpney made that statement to me on Tuesday, January 30 of his own volition. I had heard rumors, but I wasn't sure what was happening until Kevin spoke to me.

As soon as the charges against him were made, Kevin was placed in a position where he almost certainly would have to resign. His resignation should not be taken as an admission of guilt. Anytime a person in a position of authority is accused of unbecoming behavior it's bound to undermine their credibility, even before innocence or guilt is proven.

That point I feel should be made about the resignation. Despite all that has been said and written, very few people know more than rumors. Until NAIT completes its own investigation, many of the facts will not be widely known.

Along with the resignation, I would also like to point out another issue raised during the last few days. During the NUGGET's investigations, we found a problem with the communication between various departments of NAIT. This became apparent when I talked with Dick Martens-Poole, Head of Security, who took the original complaint. At the time, he had not been informed that NAIT President, Stan Souch was looking into the alleged incident. In addition, some of the information published in the Edmonton Sun and Journal, which was supplied by NAIT's Public Affairs Department, contained incorrect or misleading statements.

I' would suggest that NAIT could use this opportunity to decide on procedures for handling future and similar situations. At the outset, NAIT wasn't sure which set of guidelines to follow (eg. sexual harassment, criminal activity).

Security procedures could also be reviewed. The methods NAIT Security uses to investigate future incidents could be looked at, and perhaps improved. Which incidents Security is supposed to inform the NAIT directors about could also be clearly set out in guidelines.

Certainly, no one at NAIT can be proud of the allegations made recently. However, by using the situation to show itself as a truly concerned Institute, NAIT could improve the image that it has worked so hard to cultivate.




NAITSA Activities Director Kevin Wimpney officially submitted his resignation to the Executive members on Sunday, January 28, 1990.

















































Salaries Scandal



Ir. 1985, the NAIT Ooks and the University of Alberta Golden Bears rallied around the need for a Ronald McDonald House and met in the Face Off format for the first time. Face off '90 will mark the sixth time the two teams will have met to battle for the Ronald McDonald Cup and raise funds for Ronald McDonald House.

Although the Ooks have won eight Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference (ACAC) titles and four Canadian Colleges Athletic Association (CCAA) national championships, they are not resting on their laurels. In the 1989-90 ACAC regular season, the Ooks stand atop the standings with a record of 11 wins, no losses, and one tie. In fact, the last time the Ooks lost to a college with a CCAA affiliation was in March of 1989 in the ACAC league finals against the Red Deer College Kings.

In the 1980's, the Ooks were the most successful team in the CCAA capturing four national championships 11981-82, 1984-85, 1985-86, and 1988-89. NAIT head coach Perry Pearn, who was an assistant coach with the Canadian National Junior Team at the recent World Championships in Helsinki, has been behind the bench for all four national titles. In addition, twelve members of the 1989-90 NAIT Ooks played on last year's national championship team.


