Dining Room is sure to be pressure filled too.

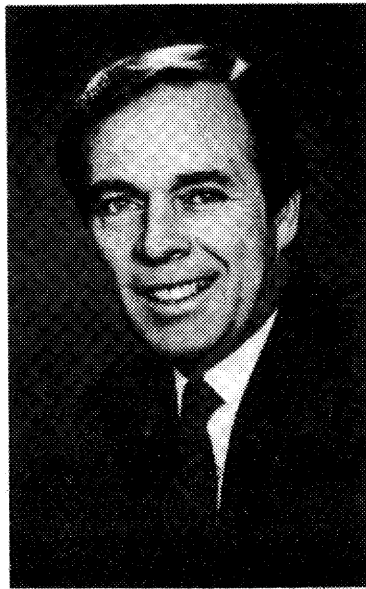

He also let it slip that when he isn't tied up at NAIT, he enjoys staying at home with

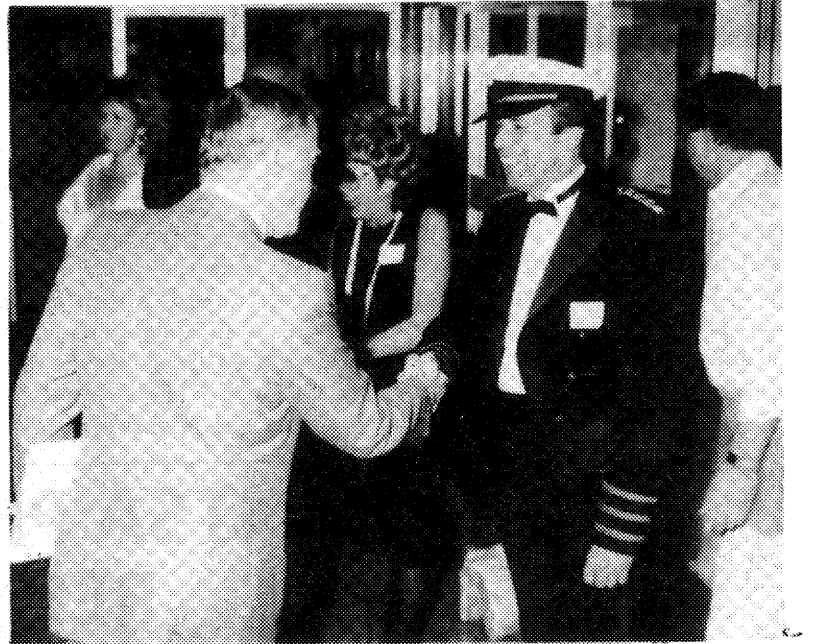

NAIT TO TAKE OVER WESTERRA

In a news release made public on February 1, 1990 it was announced that NAIT will assume the administrative responsibility for the Westerra Institute of Technology (W.I.T.) in Stony Plain. A deadline of July 1, 1990 has been set by Minister of Advanced Education John Gogo for the completion of the transition. Part of the reason for the merger is financial. It is estimated that \$2.8 million per year will be saved by combining the two institutes under one administration. Another

administration. Another consideration, according to Mr. Gogo, is that "this decision will maintain a strong and permanent post-secondary presence in the Stony Plain area."

Catherine Wyatt, Chairman of NAIT's Board of Governors, echoed Mr. Gogo's sentiments. "We know that Westerra has become an integral part of the Stony Plain community and we assure the people of Stony Plain that we will be sensitive to their needs. NAIT's long history of

providing high quality education programming will bring stability for the future."

Of course, there will be a downside to the takeover. Some jobs will be lost in the move. However, Mr. Gogo stated that "every effort will be made to minimize the loss of jobs by faculty and administrative staff". During the transition planning phase, both Westerra and NAIT will employ a variety of strategies--retirement

phase, both Westerra and NAIT will employ a variety of strategies--retirement incentives, employment counseling, redeployment, retraining, severance--to lessen the impact on these individuals affected

Other plans are also in place to make the transition easier for all at Westerra. Students currently enrolled there will be allowed to finish their courses without disruption. A "transition steering committee" has been set up consisting of Westerra Administrator Ted Langford, NAIT President Stan Souch,

and Advanced Education Deputy Minister Lynne Duncan. It has also been decided that the next opening on the NAIT Board of Governors will be awarded to someone from Westerra.

Mr. Gogo summed up his feelings by saying "I am confident this decision will maintain a strong and permanent post-secondary presence in the Stony Plain area and that NAIT's well-established reputation will ensure the on-going delivery of high quality educational services."

SO HERE'S MY STORY...

For the last few weeks, the Nugget has been advertising that we need a news writer. Now, however, the ad has been changed to news editor. The reason for the change is simple. I have quit.

As you may or may not know, I have been writing for the paper since September. When the assistant editor Barry Gabruch resigned in November, I was left as the only regular news writer for the Nugget. Since then I have written between six and ten articles a week including editorials. I even started using the name Simon Dopf on some articles just so readers wouldn't get sick of seeing my name.

As you may have guessed,

my resignation stems from the recent "censorship" of the Nugget and the ensuing incidents. It would take a long time to outline everything that has happened, so I'll just mention the main incidents.

When the article was originally pulled at about 6:00 p.m., we weren't given any strong reason why. Naitsa didn't feel there was enough time to get the article written and proof-read before the printer's deadline. We had informed NAITSA Publications Director, Scott Sugden, that the lawyer we had contacted about the article was expecting to receive it as late as seven or eight o'clock. However, that message was apparently lost

somewhere. Naitsa did inform editor Audrey Mirlach (who has also resigned) that if an article was written for the next week's edition it would be printed. However, that message also got lost somewhere.

Since we had not actually written the article when it was pulled, Audrey and I considered the action to be censorship. As we didn't have enough time to find and research enough news to fill the space we had left for the article, we decided to leave it blank except for a small note reading "Censored". Scott Sugden proceeded to remove the tags and replace them with Public Service Ads.

Audrey then proceeded to remove the ads and replace the tags. This happened a couple of times before Scott left. Audrey took the paper to the printers with the censored tags, but when it came back it had the ads.

Audrey's editorial in last week's paper referred to all that I've just written. On the Thursday that Audrey's editorial came out, a Publications Board meeting was held involving NAITSA Vice-President Roxanne Beaubien, Scott Sugden, Audrey, Greg Kinloch (Yearbook editor), Sonja Scharf (photo Co-ordinator), and advisors from NAIT. As Roxanne pointed out, the General Council meeting where I announced my resignation, no details of the Publications Board meetings are supposed to be made public. I have heard what happened at part of the meeting from two sources, but since I only know part of what happened I can not be sure of the circumstances surrounding this next bit of information. I do know a motion was made asking Audrey to resign as editor of the Nugget. The motion was withdrawn and replaced by a motion to place Audrey on probation for one month.

That motion passed, even though Audrey had broken no rules or guidelines set out by NAIT or NAITSA.

Scott Sugden also sent a memo telling Audrey to correct some "errors" in her editorial. I have no problem with such a memo if it involves facts in a news story. However, I feel it is improper to ask someone to correct his or her opinions in an editorial.

Finally, Audrey handed in her resignation today (Tuesday), effective next week to allow her to help the new editor with one edition of the Nugget. However, NAITSA made her resignation immediate, saying they would choose the new editor.

I announced my resignation today at the General Council meeting. I did it there so both sides could have a fair saying and questions could be asked openly. No matter how hard I may try to keep this editorial impartial, it's bound to have a bias (probably a large one). Obviously NAITSA doesn't have the same chance to respond here as they did at the meeting, so if you want the full story either talk to them or to your tech. rep who was at the meeting.

Letter to the Editor:

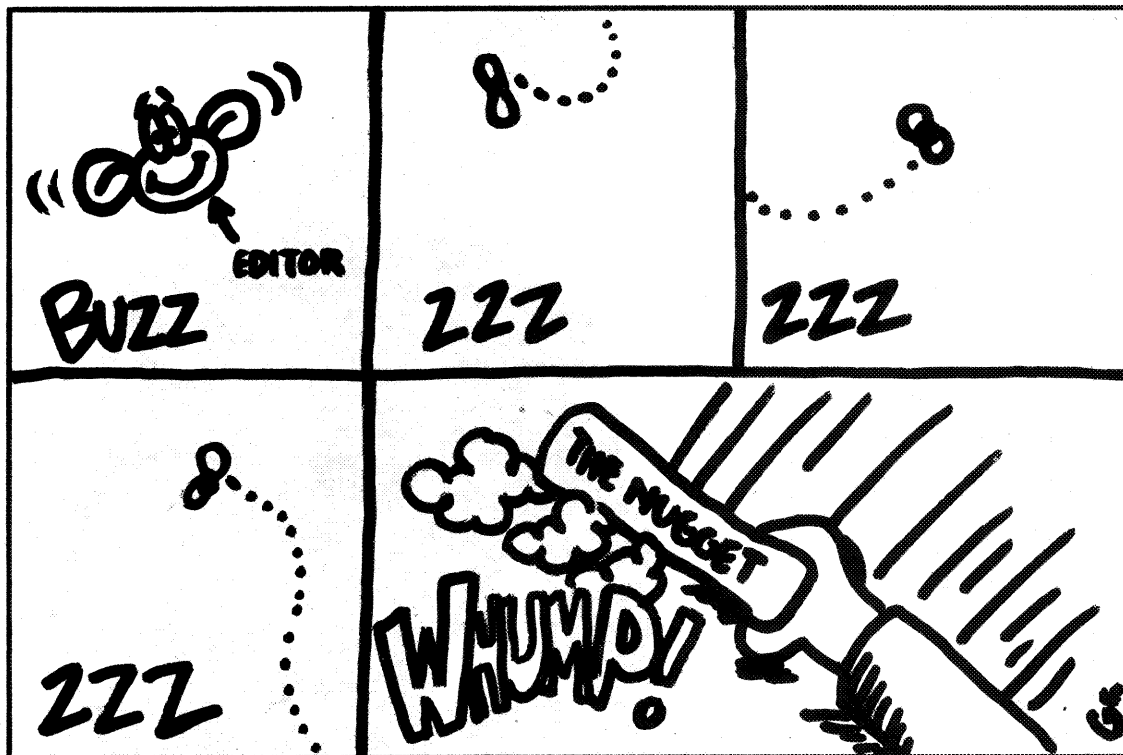

although a number of media outlets have also been guilty.

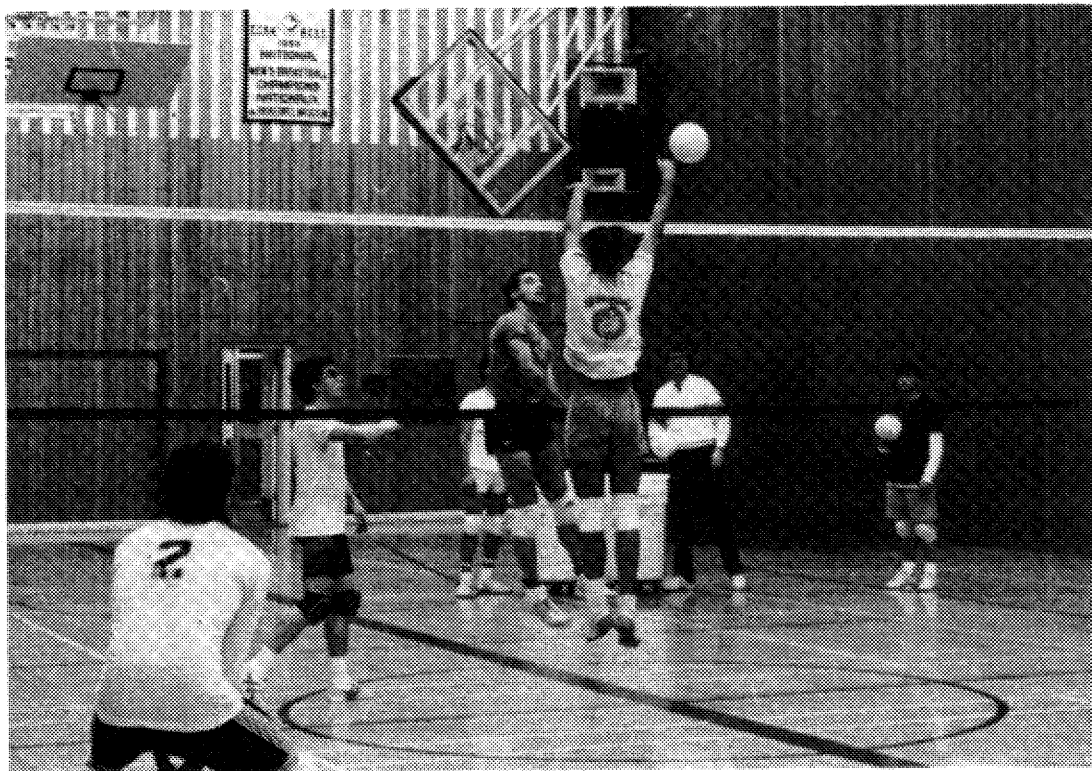
The Oaks are the best hockey team from a post secondary institution in this city and it is time they get the recognition they deserve.

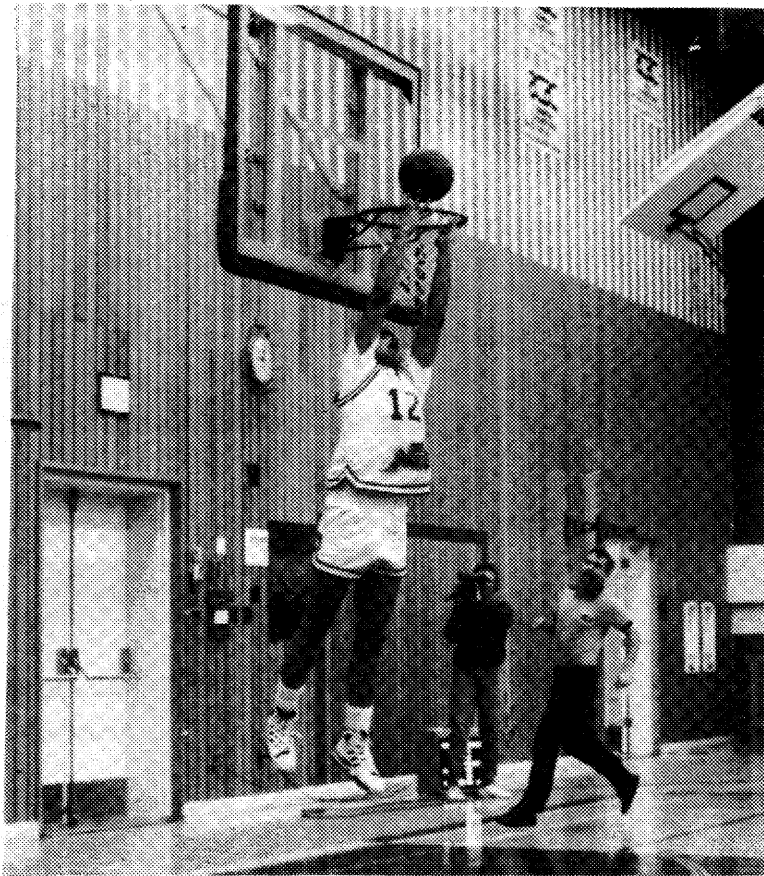
MEN'S BASKETBALL OOKS PLAY TO POTENTIAL

Although Coach Greg Meropoulos is disappointed with the season as a whole he is still proud of the perseverance the girls have displayed throughout the season. The team could have just as easily thrown in the towel early in the season but they struck out game after game, humiliation after humiliation.

If this was an experimental season for the women's basketball program, the future of the program looks bleak. But not to be pessimistic, maybe some girls with previous basketball or related athletic experience will save the team next season.

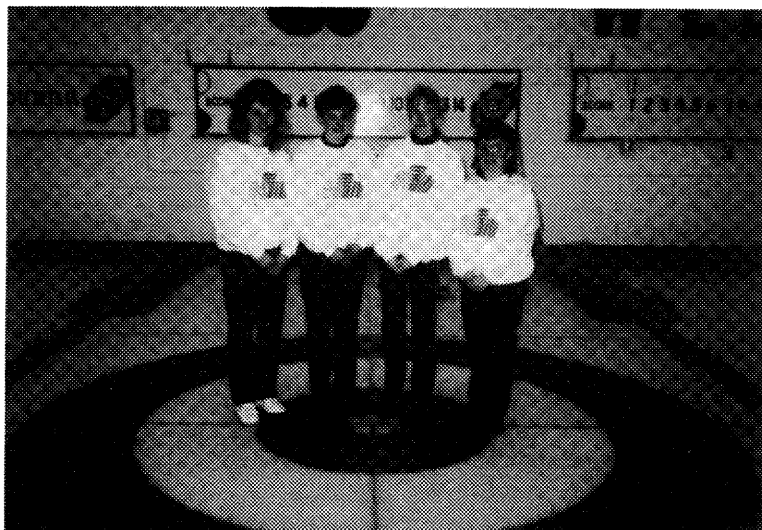
