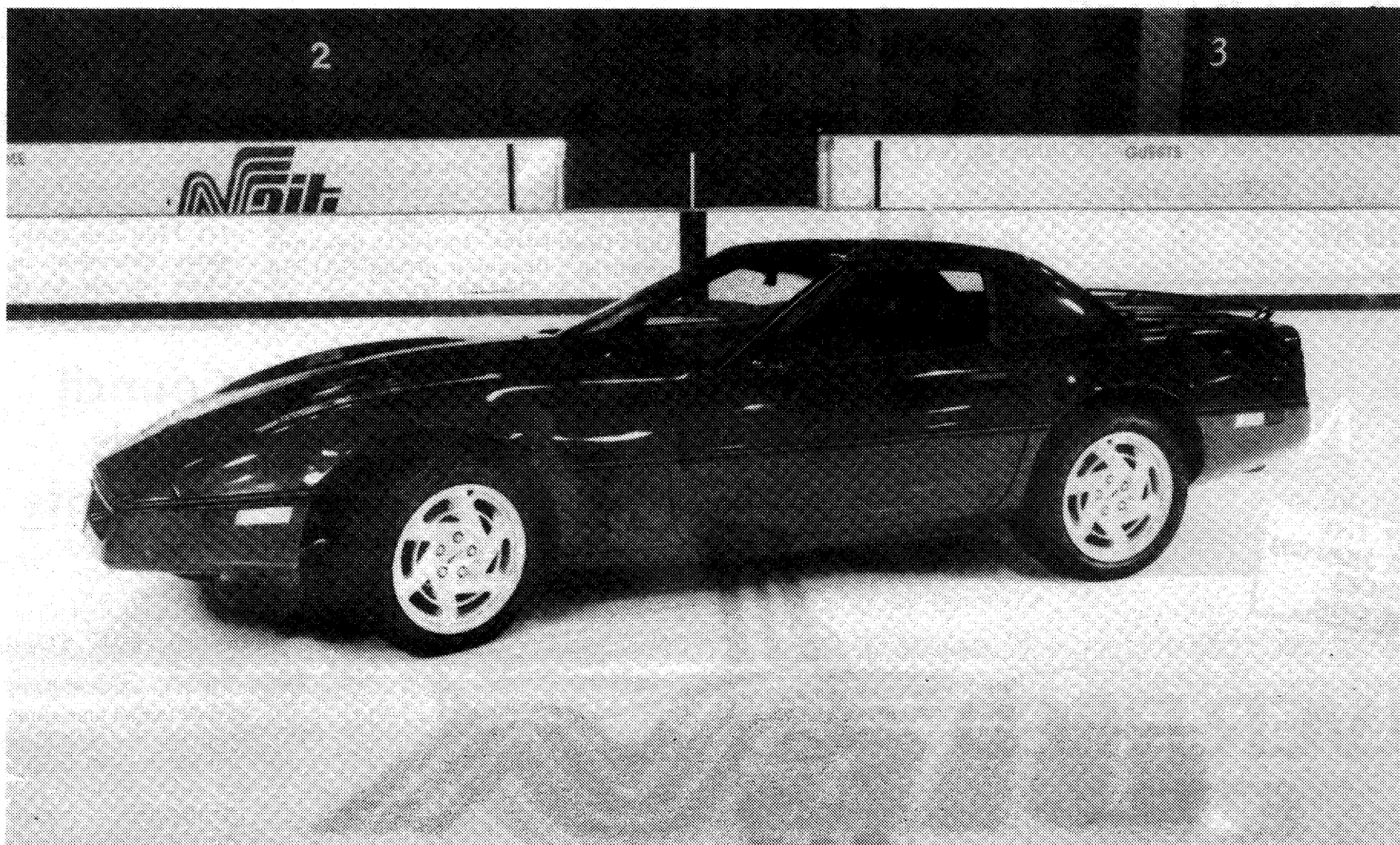

Preparations are well under way for this year's Queen and King Contest. 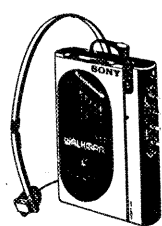

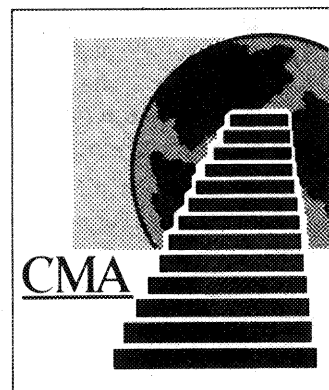

Biggest Sports Upset - The Saskatchewan Rough Riders taking the Grey Cup.

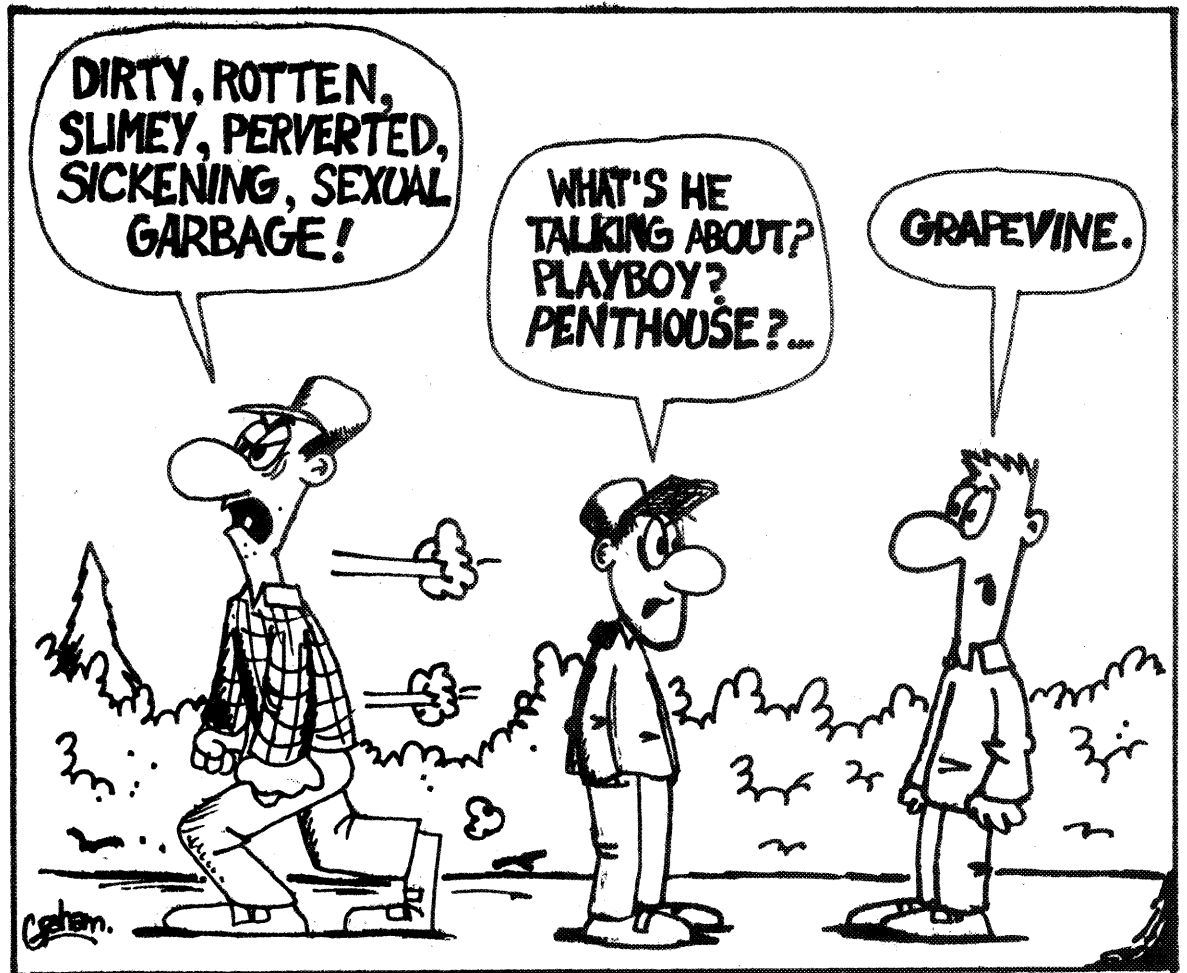
Best put-down - The Globe and Mail's multiple choice question and answer: 54-40 is ... (b) Bill VanderZalm and Don Getty comparing IQ's.

Face Off '90 Slated for January 22nd

On Thursday, January 4th, the organizers of Face Off '90 formally announced that the annual charity event between the hockey teams of NAIT and the U of A would take place on Thursday, January 22nd at the Northlands Agricom.

Once again, the Northern Alberta Ronald McDonald House in Edmonton will be one of the chief benefactors. Fifty cents of each ticket sold will be going to Ronald McDonald House. The five previous games have raised over \$30,000 for this worthy cause which provides a home away from home for the families of children who need to come to Edmonton for medical treatment of critical illnesses.

In the past, the game has been a stepping stone for both teams in their quest of national titles. In the brief five year span of the game, the Oaks have won three national titles while the Bears have captured one. However, the Bears have won four of the five previous encounters at Face Off.

The NAIT Oaks look particularly strong heading into the contest.

Although the Oaks have won eight Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference (ACAC) titles and four Canadian Colleges Athletic Association (CCAA) national championships, they are not resting on their laurels. In the 1989-90 ACAC regular season, the Oaks stand atop the standings with a record of 11 wins, no losses, and one tie. In fact, the last time the Oaks lost to a college with a CCAA affiliation was in March of 1989 in the ACAC league finals against the Red Deer College Kings.

In the 1980's, the Oaks were the most successful

team in the CCAA capturing four national championships (1981-82, 1984-85, 1985-86, and 1988-89). NAIT head coach Perry Pearn, who was an assistant coach with the Canadian National Junior Team at the recent World Championships in Helsinki, has been behind the bench for all four national titles. In addition, twelve members of the 1989-90 NAIT Oaks played on last year's national championship team.

The Oaks currently dominate the team statistics. The Oaks lead the league with the most goals scored (70 - 5.83 per game) and with the fewest goals allowed (34 - 2.83 per game).

The Oaks also have a number of talented players on their roster.

Captain Blaine Peerless, a former member of the Spokane Chiefs (WHL) and the Milwaukee Admirals (IHL) was selected All-Canadian last season and is once again providing leadership on and off the ice.

The NAIT goaltending duo of Rob McKinley, formerly of the Kamloops Blazers (WHL), and Deryk Shybunka, formerly of the Fort Saskatchewan Traders, are the only netminders in the ACAC with a goals against average under 3.00.

Former Lethbridge Bronco (WHL) Ivan Krook is currently leading the league scoring race with 25 points (nine goals, 16 assists).

Of the top 15 in the ACAC scoring race, seven are NAIT Oaks - Ivan Krook (1st - 25 points), Murray Bokenfohr (2nd - 22 points), Ian McAmmond (8th - 17 points), Todd Lorenz (9th - 16 points), Blaine Peerless (10th - 16 points), Mark Thiessen (11th - 15 points), and Craig Sterzer (15th - 14 points).

Bears Taking Oaks Lightly

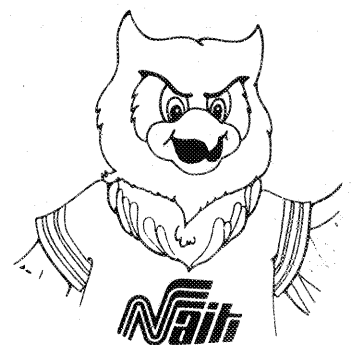
The OOKS' first league

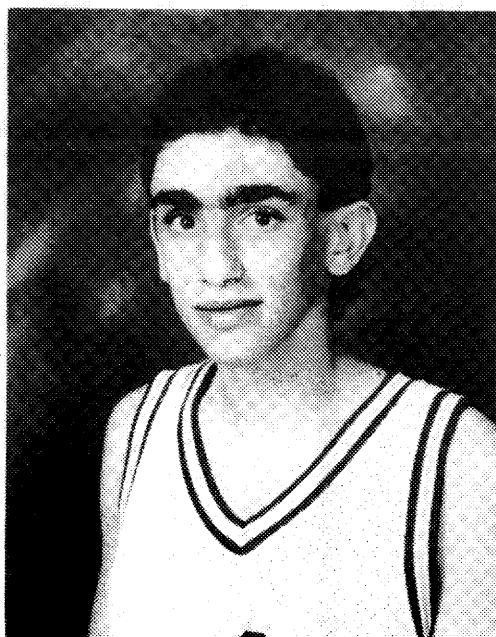


ATHLETES OF THE WEEK


