## OOKS TAN BEARS' HIDE

The bragging rights were on the line at the Northlands Agricore as the NAIT Ooks downed the U of A Golden Bears 6-5 in Face Off '90 on Monday night in front of 2,456 fans.

Unlike NHL games at the Coliseum, this game had everything a hockey purist could ask for -- bonejarring body checks, stellar netminding, outstanding playmaking and boisterous fans. Acting NAIT captain Ivan Krook, who was definitely a candidate for Game MVP, summed up the views of the participants, "I think it was a great game. I'm sure that everyone left the game enjoying what they saw."

In the first period, the Ooks dominated and took the play to the Bears. The Ooks persistence paid off at 9:31 of the first when Ivan Krook burned Bears' captain Howie Draper and gave the Ooks a 1-0 lead. Mark Hilton and Greg Geldart assisted on the goal. The Ooks scored their second powerplay goal of the contest with 1:12 left in the frame when Murray Bokenfohr cashed in on a Mark Thiessen feed.

One of the keys to the early success was their mental preparation. "We talked about intensity coming into the game. We wanted to be more reserved than we were last year. Our

emotional state was typical of most games," revealed NAIT assistant captain and Game MVP Craig Sterzer.

In the second, the Ooks acquired a 3-0 advantage at 2:21 as Craig Sterzer connected with the man advantage from Ted Bradshaw and Mark Thiessen. The Bears could have rolled over and died but they did not. Brian Gerrits of the Bears broke the shutout bid of NAIT netminder Rob McKinley at 11:50 while the Ooks were killing off a penalty. The Bears cut the lead to 3-2 as Doug McCarthy scored with only 28 seconds left in the stanza.

The comeback was not unexpected. "Bouncing back in the clean, tough hitting game was a good example of our character," stated U of A head coach Billy Moores in the locker room after the contest.

In the third, the tide turned and turned. Brett Cox of the Bears tied the contest at 3-3 with 1:07 elapsed in the frame. A quick 52 seconds later, Craig Sterzer reinstated NAIT's one goal advantage with the help of Marty Volcan and Lonnie Spink. The lead lasted 15 seconds as Rob Glasgow pulled the Bears even. At the 9:14 mark, Ivan Krook netted his second of the contest to give NAIT a 5-4 lead. The Bears evened the score as Todd Gordon found the net at 12:00



The last eight minutes of the third was gut wrenching for fans, players, and coaches. The play went from end to end with Gavin Armstrong of the Bears and Rob McKinley of the Ooks coming up with big saves. With 26 seconds left in regulation, NAIT's Greg Geldart scored from an almost impossible angle to give the Ooks the lead for good. Mark Hilton and Ivan Krook were credited with assists on the game winning goal.

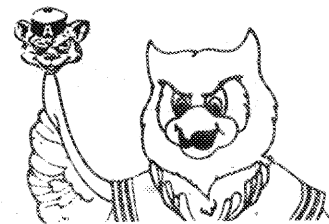
In the nets, NAIT's Rob

McKinley faced 24 shots, while the U of A's John Krill and Gavin Armstrong faced 33 drives.

The contest was a mix of joy and disappointment for the Ooks. On the ice, Marty Volcan came off the NAIT bench in the third and added a spark to the attack. Off the ice, sidelined NAIT captain Blaine Peerless wanted to be on the ice instead of in the stands.

NAIT head coach Perry Pearn was quick to the credit for the victory to his players.

"When you beat a solid hockey club like the Bears, it is a pretty good indication of our team's play. All four lines contributed to the victory. Our six defencemen also rose to the challenge. In goal, Rob McKinley came into the game prepared and ready to play," commented Pearn.



## Investigation of Allegations Beginning

The NAIT Ladies Basketball team is forming a letter of grievance to be submitted to NAIT. The grievance is in response to an alleged incident that occurred in the Ladies Team Room, Friday, January 12, 1990 at approximately 6:30 p.m.

This grievance has resulted from a lack of immediate response by Security to allegations of violations of privacy. It is alleged that two male students gained access to view the Ladies Team Room through the suspended ceiling from the adjoining Games Room. Although a Security Guard arrived minutes after the alleged incident, no investigation was pursued at that point.

NAIT President, Stan Souch, announced on Thursday, January 25th that a Disciplinary Board has been struck. It will be Chaired by Seeth Seethram, and will also include one student at large, one faculty member, one member of support staff. Out of this board will come recommendations of disciplinary actions. These will be taken to the President of NAIT, who will ultimately decide what actions, if any, will be taken.

The Nugget will keep readers updated on any further developments.

# Student Charges NAITSA Executive With Sexism

Rika Mueller, a Denturist Technology student, presented a speech at Tuesday's General Council meeting charging Naitsa Activities Director Kevin Wimpney with allowing "sexist attitudes" to affect his hiring practices. Ms. Mueller's speech and Mr. Wimpney's explanation, along with questions from various technology representatives, occupied almost 45 minutes of the Council's time.

Ms. Mueller's complaint stems from a conversation she had with Mr. Wimpney regarding her application to be employed as a bouncer at Naitsa functions such as Rock 'n' Talks and Cabarets. She applied in September and, receiving no reply, assumed all positions had been filled. When it was advertised in December that positions as bouncers were again open, Ms. Mueller re-applied. Again she received no reply.

Mr. Wimpney claims that after he hired enough bouncers to fill the positions in September, he tossed the rest of the applications (about 30) in the garbage assuming everyone he hired would work for the whole year. When some students resigned in December, he was forced to hire more people to replace them. Hence, the second advertisement.

Ms. Mueller's complaint referred directly to a conversation she had with Mr. Wimpney at the January 19th Rock 'N' Talk. Ms. Mueller approached Mr. Wimpney to ask why she had not been hired and why there were no female bouncers. Mr. Wimpney replied that if Ms. Mueller wanted to re-apply, her application would be considered if a position came open. Ms. Mueller asked him two more times why there were no female bouncers and why she would have to re-apply. Finally, Mr. Wimpney told Ms. Mueller, "There is no place for it (female bouncers)."

In a prepared speech, Ms. Mueller said there was "a very serious problem" with Mr. Wimpney's attitude. Ms. Mueller continued by saying, "It was not clear that this was his personal opinion. It only seemed obvious that it affected his hiring policy--this is obvious, as the fact is, there are no female bouncers."

Ms. Mueller ended her speech with two requests. First, that "My application be re-evaluated by someone other than Mr. Wimpney," and "I would like it made clear how applications are evaluated. Is experience taken into consideration? Were the people hired more experienced? Has anyone

been hired since October?" Finally, Ms. Mueller asked for a motion from the floor stating that, "As a result of the previous points discussed, it is apparent that Mr. Wimpney's personal opinion has affected hiring policy and for Mr. Wimpney to continue to act as Activities Director while his personal opinions are well known seems inappropriate. Thus, I respectfully request that Mr. Wimpney be asked by Naitsa to resign due to his misconduct."

At the end of Ms. Mueller's speech, Mr. Wimpney addressed Rika and the Council. He admitted that he had said there was no place for women bouncers, but continued by saying "I never should have expressed my opinion in that context." He then apologized to Ms. Mueller for his actions and statements. He said throwing

out the applications in September was improper, and that allowing his emotions to get the better of him during their conversation was also poor conduct.

Ms. Mueller continued by saying the issue was more than just Mr. Wimpney's statement. She pointed out that there were no female bouncers employed by Naitsa, and claimed that Mr. Wimpney was responsible for that. Mr. Wimpney replied that he had thrown out approximately 30 applications with Ms. Mueller's, and so even if he had kept them there was no guarantee she would be hired. Since she had been the only female applicant, he continued, it was not surprising there were no female bouncers.

Mr. Wimpney also addressed Ms. Mueller's requests. He said he had no

qualms about instituting her first two requests. However, he said that while his statement was out of line, he felt it was a human error that many people would have made in his position. Mr. Wimpney did state very firmly, "I am not a sexist."

During the debate, Electronics Technology representative Ken Sparks, who is also the Assistant Head Bouncer, spoke to explain how hiring was done. At the start of the year, Mr. Wimpney went through last year's files to see which bouncers were still attending Nait. Those that wished to continue as bouncers were hired. Mr. Sparks and Bruce Duke, the Head Bouncer, then went through the applications to decide who else to hire. In other words, Mr. Wimpney "hired" people by accepting their applications, but it was Mr.

Sparks and Mr. Duke who decided if they would work. When Mr. Wimpney advertised for more bouncers in December, there were still enough people for Mr. Sparks and Mr. Duke to choose from. Mr. Sparks stated that to be hired, an applicant must have the "right attitude" and take the *Who's Responsible* course prescribed by Naitsa.

When Naitsa President Brad Diemert finally asked if

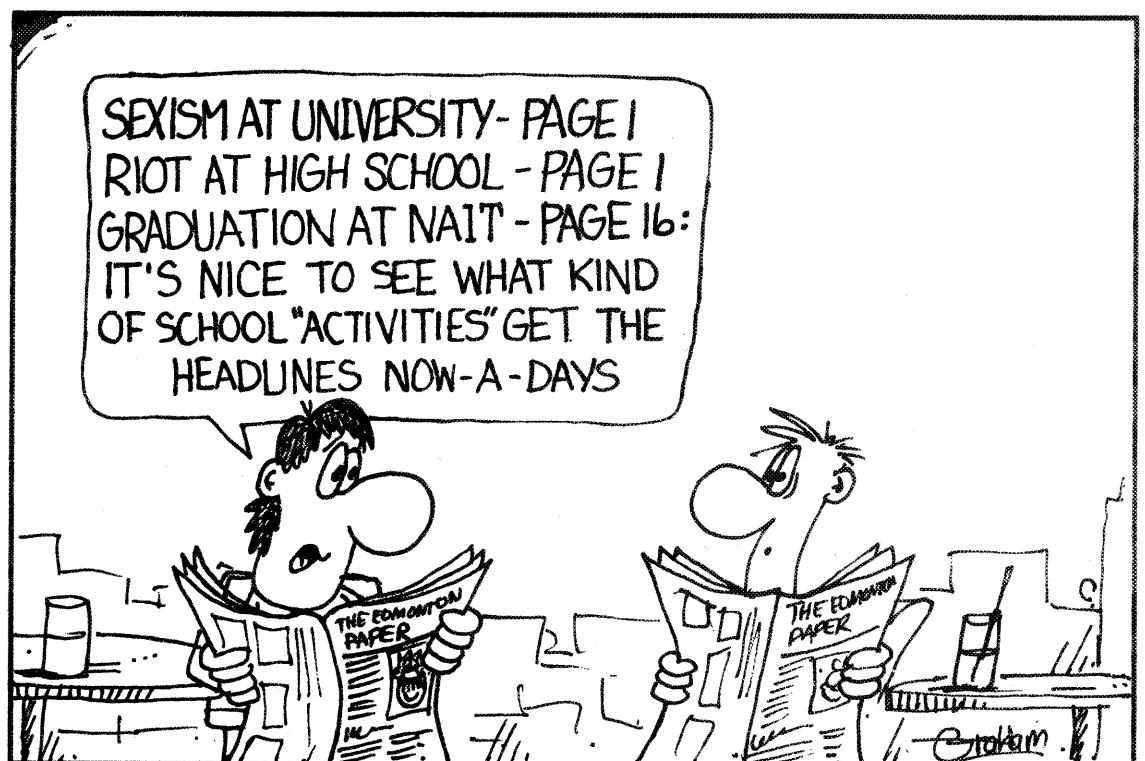

worked as a bouncer it seemed only logical to apply for such a position to work at Rock 'n' Talks and the cabarets. I applied in September of this school year. I got no response. This did not surprise me, since I assumed many students would apply for these positions in order to make a little extra cash. I simply assumed I had applied too late, or there were more qualified people applying than were needed.

Since I am familiar with the entertainment business, I know such positions usually have a high turnover rate, so when school started again in January I re-applied. Again, no response. This past Friday, January 19, I had an opportunity to talk to Mr. Kevin Wimpney, Activities Director for NAITSA. During the course of our conversation, the concept of women bouncers was raised (Yes, I'm female!). Mr. Wimpney expressed the opinion that "I feel there is no place for women bouncers at NAIT." This intrigued me and so I pursued the subject further. As I understand it, Mr. Wimpney's "personal opinion" is women are incapable of functioning as bouncers. These quotation marks are included to make it very clear where Mr. Wimpney is being quoted since at a later point in the evening the words lawsuit, lawyer and slander somehow drifted into the conversation.

Far be it for me to defame

Mr. Wimpney (that's what it's called in print), but it appears that I am not the only person who believes this to be a fair representation of Mr. Wimpney's hiring policy.

Brad Diemert, President of NAITSA, was very careful to inform me that "Kevin Wimpney's opinion does not reflect that of NAITSA." Since this is not NAITSA's opinion, and NAITSA is obviously aware that it is Mr. Wimpney's opinion (why else deny it's NAITSA's) this raises the question - Why has he not been instructed to leave his sexist attitudes in the dark ages where they belong. (Please note section B.7 of the Student Responsibilities which states *Students shall conduct themselves in a manner which reflects a positive image of NAIT when representing NAIT in official and co-curricular activities*).

It is not as if this issue has not been raised before. Ms. B. Eaton, an instructor of gourmet meal preparation has suggested that a female security person is a desirable and logical development. Discussion with members of security staff suggest that not only has this been discussed in the past, but it is also heartily endorsed by several of the male bouncers. This is not hard to understand, since I am sure that very few male bouncers really look forward to the opportunity to go wading into the womens washroom to: a) break up a fight, b) handle a drug crazed lunatic, or c) convince a student whose exams finally got to them that its not that bad. All of these sorts of tasks are routine parts to a security staff's function although we hope that these particular scenarios will happen rarely.

Now I'm not a placard waving feminist. (Though I do admire them). I never burned my bra, and I rather like men, thank you very much. I have however been deluded into thinking that advances in civil rights such as the Alberta Human Rights Act: the National Charter of Rights and Freedoms, and the changes in many men I've met meant that in a free, just and equal society we do not discriminate on the basis of sex. I am disappointed to discover that a representative of NAITSA, well known for his liberal attitudes, should insist on maintaining an attitude that properly belongs happily and thankfully ensconced in the time of our grandparents where it can be a fond memory of a quaint but deluded custom, and not a slap in the face of every female paying tuition fees at this institution.

Thank you for the opportunity to speak my piece.

# COUNCIL MEETING CAUSES STIR

Tuesday's General Council meeting proved to be one of the most important, if not enjoyable, in recent memory. NAITSA President Brad Diemert started the meeting by announcing the resignation of Athletics Director Justin Dahlen. Brad read out the three line letter that Justin had given him two days earlier. Justin cited "scholastic and personal reasons" in his decision to resign.

NAITSA has decided not to hold a by-election to fill the Athletics post. Justin's duties will be shared by the five remaining NAITSA executives, Irwin Streifler (Coordinator of Athletics), and Modey Amery (Head Intramural Referee).

Also during Tuesday's meeting, the two vacant

positions on the Academic Council were filled in a yes/no vote. Two candidates gave quick speeches as to why they wanted to work as part of the council. James Brazean, who is in the Accounting program, and Crystal Mechor, of the Marketing program, both passed the vote with no opposition.

The Academic Council reviews policies and decisions that will effect NAIT. The council, which works closely with the Board of Governors, is made up of four students, four instructors, and four administrative executives.

The vacancies were due to two of the students graduating at the end of December.

Finally, in response to a situation at a post-secondary institution in Alberta, NAITSA Vice-President Roxanne Beaubien moved to

amend the NAITSA Constitution to place tighter controls on the executive. At the institute in question, a member of the student executive was convicted of selling drugs, but could not be removed from office because he managed to get a quorum of student signatures on a petition to retain his position.

Roxanne's additions to the constitution ran into trouble when it appeared she had not followed procedure to introduce the motion. However, after a quick check, it turned out everything was in order. The additions state that if a NAITSA executive is charged with an indictable offense, he or she is suspended from all duties with pay. However, if the executive is found guilty, he or she would be relieved of all duties. Several questions followed, such as what would happen to

money paid to an executive between being charged and being found guilty. However, since it was just a first-reading, many questions were put off until the next meeting when all technology representatives would have had a chance to read over the current constitution.

To be approved, the amendments would need a 75% yes vote at three consecutive meetings. Electronics made the motion to approve the changes, with Secretarial seconding. The vote passed with only five votes against. The additions need two more yes votes to be approved.

any of the technology representatives were willing to make a motion requesting Mr. Wimpney to step down, no one responded. However, Vice-President Roxanne Beaubien put forward a motion that Naitsa always have at least one qualified female and one qualified male bouncer on staff. The motion was seconded by Building Construction and passed unanimously. Ms. Beaubien said her motion was made partly to demonstrate that Naitsa is an equal opportunity employer, and partly to avoid the problem of a male bouncer having to enter a ladies washroom to break up a fight.

After the meeting, Ms. Mueller and Mr. Wimpney spoke for a couple of minutes before shaking hands. Later that evening, Mr. Wimpney said he was sorry the incident had gone as far as it had, while Ms. Mueller said, "This issue is not dead!"

# Tuition Hikes Questioned

The recent announcement of this year's post-secondary funding grants, handed down from the Department of Advanced Education, has generated much concern from members of ACTISEC (Alberta College and Technical Institute Student Executive Council) over the government's ability to maintain quality and accessible education in Alberta.

With a grant increase of 3 percent and an institutional inflation rate of 5.5 per cent,

schools throughout the province are now threatened with even more cutbacks and enrollment caps. Equally burdened by fiscal restraint are students who are being delivered a 15% increase in tuition fees.

During a recent provincial teleconference, 13 participants of the 16 member ACTISEC agreed unanimously that, although there is a need to keep up with the rate of inflation, a 15% increase is unacceptable.

"What the members of ACTISEC will be demanding is a steadfast and solid tuition fee policy that is consistently

maintained where the Minister of Education cannot sporadically change the policy from year to year" says Lee Dreger, Chairperson of ACTISEC.

"The existing formula dictating the current tuition fee policy has far too often been ignored", says Mount Royal College Students' Association President, Mark Corbett. "Why have it if it's never adhered to?"

Now more than ever, ACTISEC will be taking a strong stand on the issue of tuition fee policy. This will be done in order to ensure that the provincial government

looks for alternate ways to maintain a quality and accessible education besides putting an unbearable financial strain on the students of this province.

"In many other ways, the real and perceived barriers to a quality education have been mounting," says Corbett.

"The provincial government can only put the squeeze on students for so long without seriously jeopardizing its investment in a well educated populace."

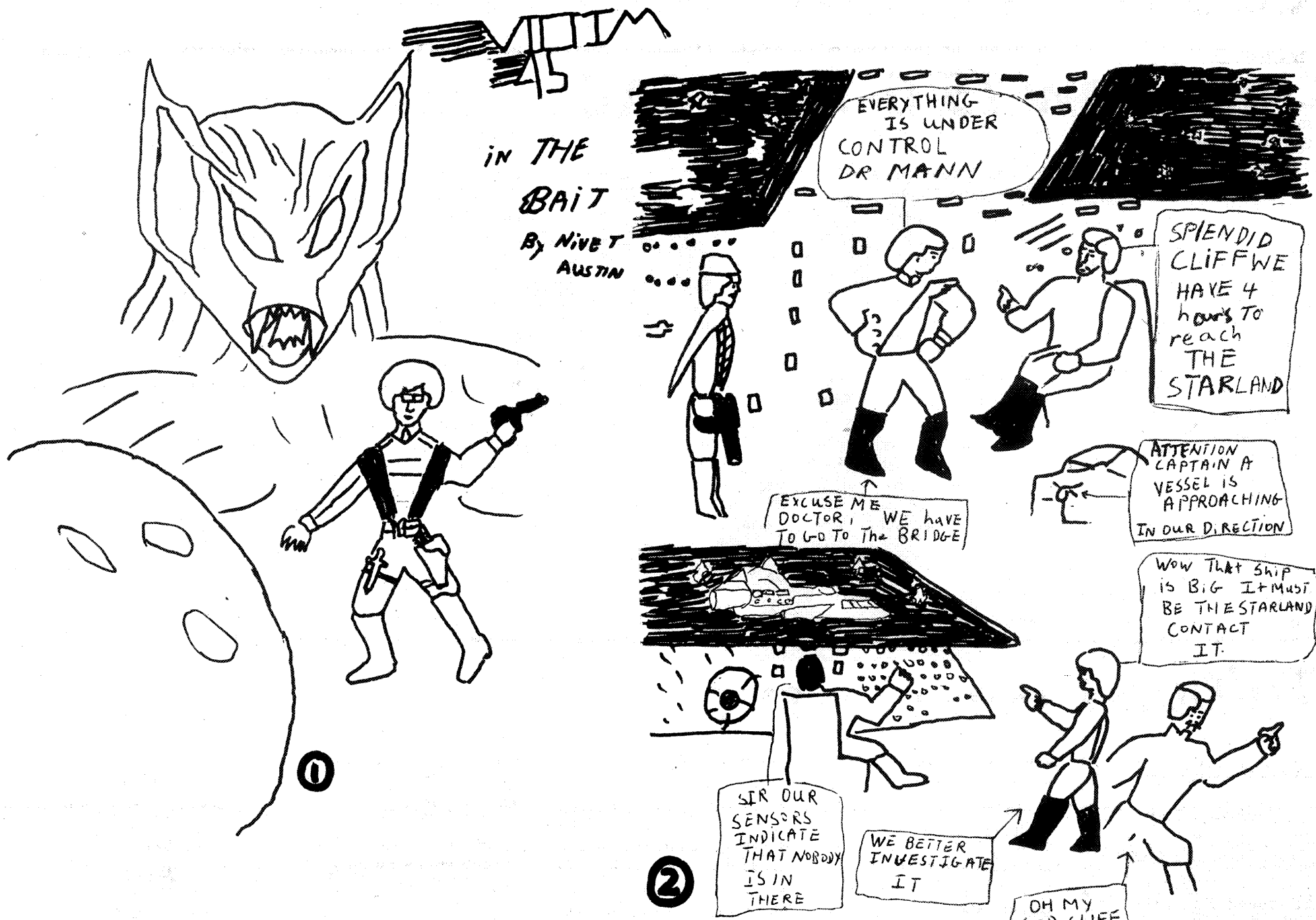

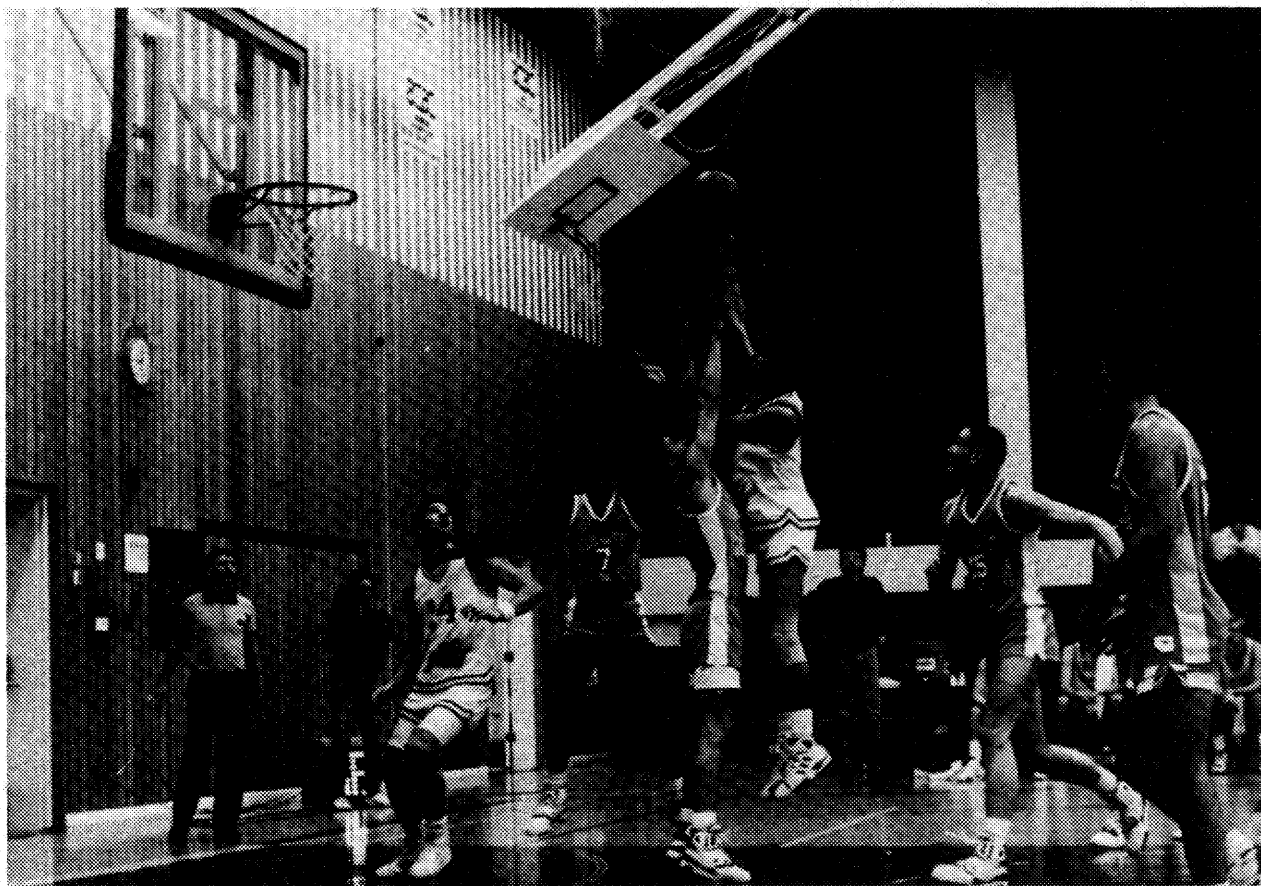
# Basketball Ooks Lose in Heartbreaker

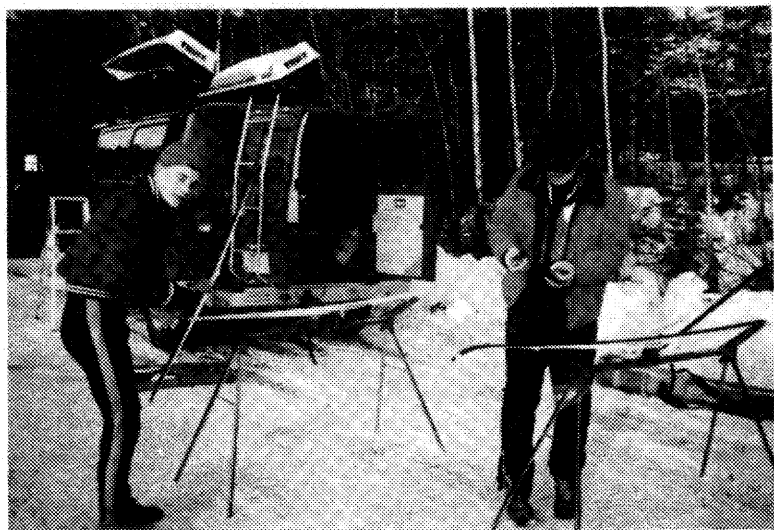

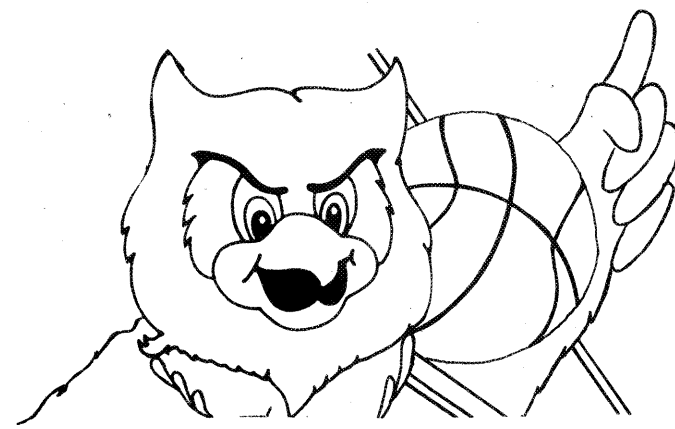

Darlene is an honor student and is presently completing her 2nd yr. of the Business Administration program. NAIT athletics wishes her all the best in her future endeavors.



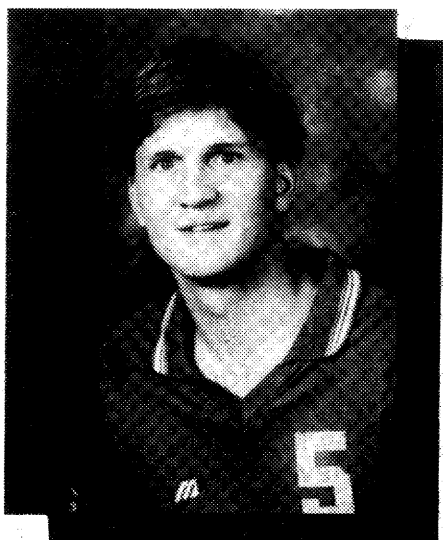

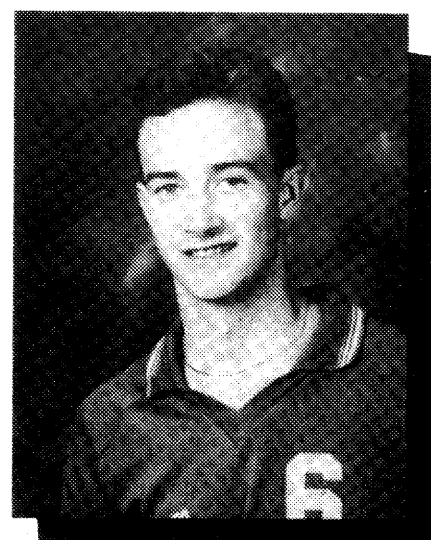

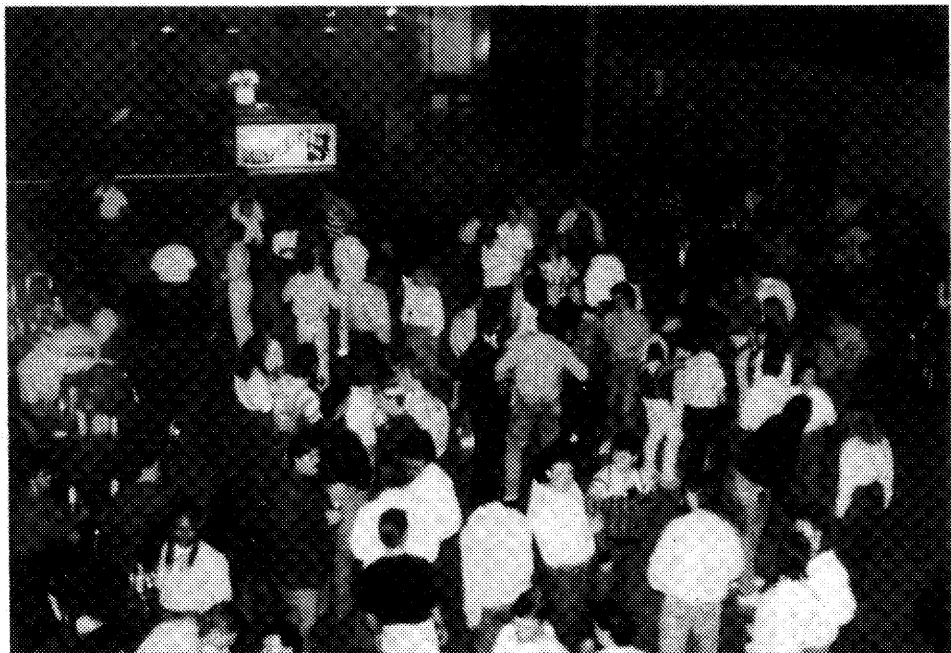

The crowd? Two hundred fifty activities coordinators from campuses across Canada. The event? The annual Canadian Organization of Campus

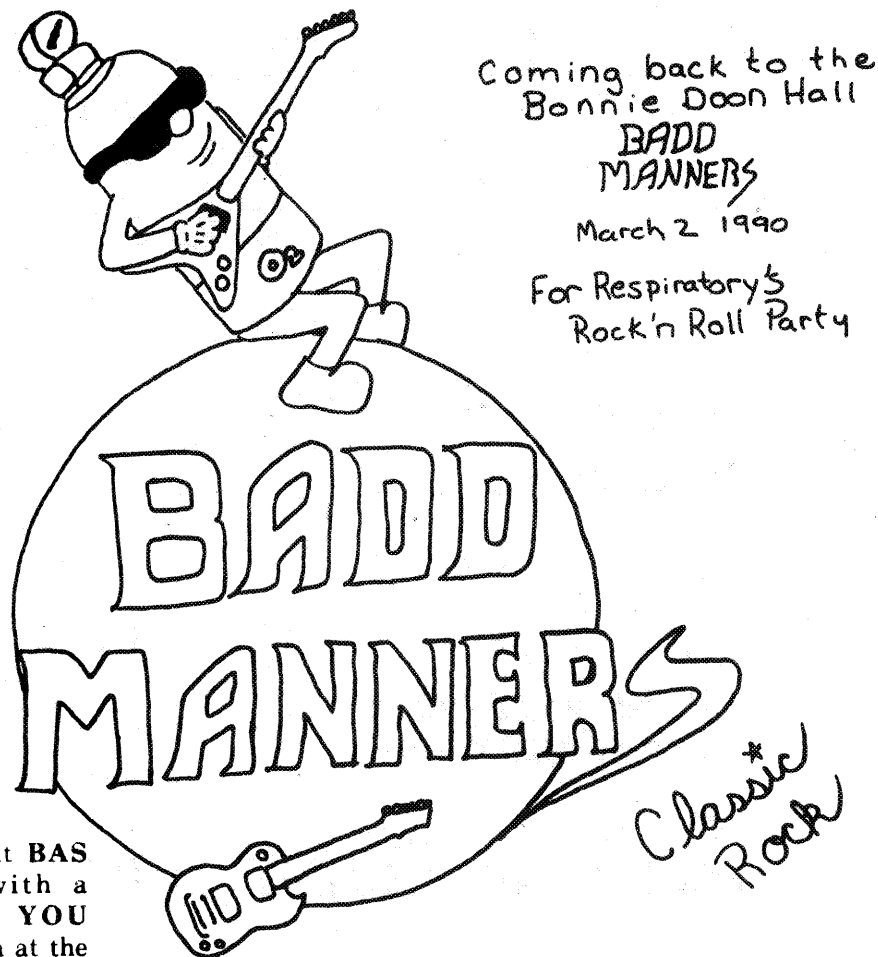
