Once again, the election campaigns for next year's Naitisa Executive are gearing up. The candidates, along with those running for the student positions on Academic Council and Board of Governors, are busy preparing for next week's activities.

The 16 candidates are scheduled to make speeches three times next week. Plaza II will host the speeches on Tuesday at 12:15. The candidates will then appear at the General Council meeting at 4:30 in H-005. On Wednesday, speeches will be delivered in the Naitrium at 12:15, and finally the candidates visit Westwood Campus on Thursday at

12:15.

Ooks Are ACAC Champs



NAIT's Ian McAmmond Scores

For the first time since the 1986-87 season, the NAIT Ooks are the ACAC hockey champions. The Ooks captured the league title as they swept the best of five series with the Red Deer College Kings in three games.

In game one on Wednesday, March 7, the NAIT Ooks netted a pair of goals in a 36 second span of the first en route to a 3-1 victory over Red Deer at the NAIT Arena.

In the first, Blaine Peerless lifted the Ooks into a 1-0 lead with a powerplay goal from Ian McAmmond and Todd Lorenz at the 15:17 mark. At 15:51, Greg Geldart gave the Ooks a 2-0 advantage with the assistance of Ivan Krook.

In the second, the teams exchanged unassisted goals as Lonnie Spink scored shorthanded for the Ooks at 2:44 and Steve Opp tallied an even strength marker for the Kings at 3:32.

First team ACAC all-star Rob McKinley redirected 19 of 20 shots in the NAIT net. Second team ACAC all-star Gordie Besse blocked 31 of 34 drives in the Red Deer crease.

In game two on Thursday, March 8, the Ooks held off the Kings for a 4-3 in

Red Deer.

In the first, the Ooks gained a 1-0 advantage on Todd Lorenz's goal from Greg Geldart and Ian McAmmond at 3:38. Lorenz doubled the Ooks advantage to 2-0 at the 5:58 mark with the assistance of Geldart and Ivan Krook. The Kings rebounded with a pair of goals before period's end as Todd Demchuk scored at 8:52 and Jeff Leyer tallied at 19:37.

In the second, the Ooks grabbed a 3-2 advantage on Jeff Wildeboer's marker from Lonnie Spink and Darren Perkins.

In the third, the Kings tied the contest at 3-3 on Jeff Leyer's goal 14:14 into the period. Thirty seconds later, NAIT's Mark Hilton poked in the game winner on a goalmouth scramble. Greg Geldart and Corey Hastman were credited with assists.

Both teams stayed with the same goaltenders for game two. Rob McKinley of NAIT stopped 37 of 40 shots while Gordie Besse of Red Deer turned away 34 of 38 drives.

In game three on Saturday, March 10th, the Ooks completed a three game sweep of the Kings with a 6-1 triumph.

In the first, the Ooks dominated the Kings outshooting them 24 to 2 and outscoring them 4 to 0.

Clark Polglase gave the Ooks a 1-0 lead at 6:41 from Craig Sterzer and Murray Bokenfohr. Ian McAmmond threaded the needle through the five hole for the Ooks second goal at 9:07. Todd Lorenz and Randy Wong assisted. Ivan Krook increased the Ooks advantage to 3-0 as he lifted the puck into the top corner at 17:04. Mark Hilton and Greg Geldart received assists on the play. Clark Polglase then faked Red Deer netminder out of position before pocketing his second goal of the night at 18:37 from Blaine Peerless and Ian McAmmond.

In the second, the Kings cut the Ooks lead to 4-1 on Murray Toews' marker at 6:13. Ivan Krook reinstated NAIT's four goal cushion at 14:26 with the help of Greg Geldart and Mark Hilton.

In the third, Todd Lorenz scored the Ooks sixth goal on the powerplay at 4:15. Ivan Krook and Randy Wong assisted on the play.

NAIT's Rob McKinley was tested on 18 occasions while Red Deer's Gordie Besse blocked 37 of 41 shots.

The Ooks will now play the winner of Saskatchewan in a best-of-three series this weekend in Saskatoon. The winner of the Saskatoon series will meet the Ontario champion for the national title during the week of March 20th-24th.

On Sunday the temperature was about -3°C. this made the track very icy because of the warm Saturday conditions. Vermilion was a very good host to the ACAC athletes and to some 200 other races that were there for Alberta Cup #7.

The men's team consisted of Willie Woods (11th), Hans Zerrath (13th), Fred Noddin (16th), and Dean Sproule (18th). The NAIT women were represented by one lone skier, Elaine Patchell, finishing 9th.

After receiving a bye in the Provincials for finishing 1st in the Northern Regionals, NAIT defeated MRC 8-3 and lost the "A" final to Red Deer 8-6 after trailing 8-1. In the "B" semi they crushed SAIT 9-3 and smacked MRC in the "B" qualifiers 11-5. In "C", NAIT beat LLC 8-4 and then edged MRC 7-6 to win the "C" qualifier.

The formula for Sunday was simple. Red Deer, the "A" qualifier, would have to beat NAIT, the "B & C" qualifier, twice. One win for NAIT and they would be the champions.

Hopefully, guarding against a disaster that occurred in the "A" final when they trailed by 7, NAIT promptly fell behind 5-1 after five ends. The ladies fought back, trailed 6-4 playing the tenth with the hammer and were lying two, guarded when the Red Deer Skip went to throw her last rock. She was a touch heavy on a freeze, rolled left, and was partially exposed. Needing a delicate come around tap back for 3 and the win, Brenda nicked the guard and bingo, we were

heading for a sudden death game to determine the ACAC Champion.

In the final, NAIT stayed close, trailed 1-0 after two, but a big 3 on the third was the lift that everyone thought the ladies needed. But Red Deer then proceeded to count 1 and steal 1 on the next two ends to lead 4-3 after six. NAIT counted 1 on seven and then got their big break when they stole two on eight when the Red Deer skip was light on a draw. The ladies then curled two perfect ends to

preserve the 6-4 victory.

The mixed team of Guy Lorrain, Dawn Arklie, Tim Schneider and Heather Torrence were so close to giving NAIT two gold medals. Camrose, the "A" winners, defeated NAIT, the "B & C" winner, twice on Sunday, 6-4 and 8-5 to capture the gold. In "A", NAIT, lost 12-4 to MRC, then beat LLC 9-5, edged CLC 8-7 and SAIT 7-6 to win the "B" qualifier. In the "C" qualifier, NAIT beat LLC 4-2 and CLC again 8-4. There wasn't much to choose between CLC and NAIT all year. They battled in the regionals, finishing first and second, and then split their four games in the Provincials with CLC winning the big one - the last one!

For the men's team, who finished second in the regionals and had two returnees from last year's CCAA Silver medalist team - Skip, Hugh Clark and Second Neil Odegard - things did not go well. With new Third, Warren Letendre and Lead, Greg Leniuk, the team looked poised in easily handling MRC 8-3 in game one. But then the big shot, the lucky rub deserted them. They lost 5-3 to RDC in "A", 4-3 to SAIT in "B" and were eliminated from competition losing 9-3 to MRC in "C".

NAIT curlers finished the competition with a 12-8

record, winning a gold and silver medal. Combined with the Regionals, they won 31 games and lost 13. Congratulations to all three teams for their fine showing.

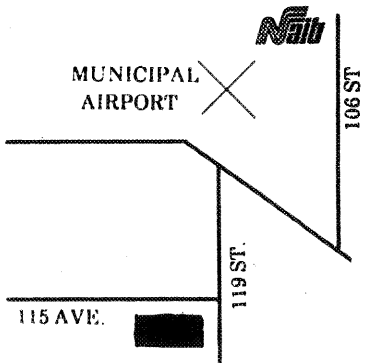

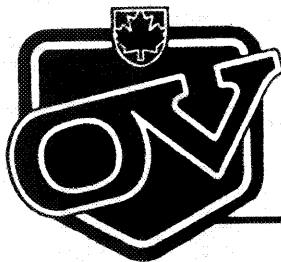
In addition, the Edmonton Metro public leagues will be announcing the Most Valuable Player award

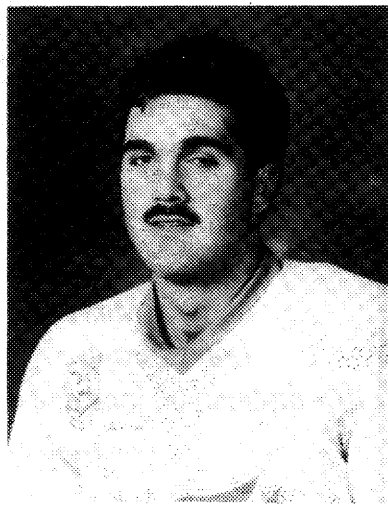

STUDENT AWARDS PROGRAM

The purpose of the Student Awards Program is to encourage academic achievement and provide financial assistance to students who are in financial need.

Various types of awards, such as scholarships, bursaries and prizes are available to full-time students. The majority of awards are available to students who have completed their first year of study and are enrolled in their second year. Some awards may be available to the NAIT graduate as well as to the student entering NAIT. Normally, a student must be taking ninety percent (90%) or more of a course load or its equivalent in the qualifying year. If you are granted an advance credit but are taking ninety percent (90%) or more course load or its equivalent in the qualifying year, you would be eligible to apply for awards.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The majority of awards do not require an application form. Candidates are selected upon recommendation of the Program Head. Selection of award winners usually takes place during the month of September and students normally receive their award by December 15.

Some awards are administered outside of NAIT and require a special application form. Generally, selection is performed by the individual donors, and each award has a different application deadline. A list of these awards is published in the Student Awards Handbook which will be available in April.

There are awards which are administered by NAIT and require an application form. These awards are awarded on a competitive basis. Interested candidates must submit an application form, and application forms are available after August 1st, 1990. The deadline for submitting a completed application is October 31, 1990.

Students who will be continuing their studies in the Fall of 1990 and wish to apply for awards may obtain a copy of the Student Awards Handbook after April 15, 1990, at the Office of Student Awards and Financial Aid.

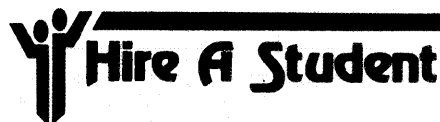

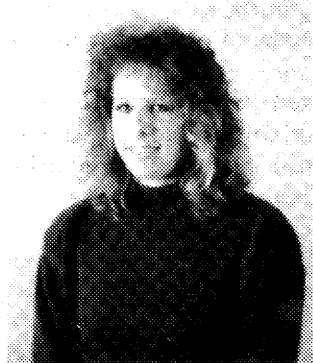
MICHELLE HAYLOW
