"What made you decide to run for the position of Publications Director (1989/90)?"

The job sounded interesting and I knew it would be a good experience. I would be able to build on the knowledge I already had

"What do you feel are the qualities/characteristics needed to fulfill this position?"

Most importantly are good people skills as you are constantly dealing with not

only students but staff and the outside public. You also have to be organized and know about time management to be able to balance both being a member of NAITSA as well as carry a full course load. If you didn't know anything before about time management you'll learn fast. Communication skills are also important because the Publications Director deals with the staff of the newspaper and yearbook.

"What are the responsibilities of your position?"

To oversee the staff and overall running of the

yearbook (Northern Torch), newspaper (Nugget), photo department and be an active member of NAITSA executive. I am also responsible for the production of the student handbook and the calendar. I make sure that each department follows their budget and encourage performance of the staff. As a member of NAITSA I'm able to become involved with many of the different committee's around NAIT. I helped out with such NAITSA activities as Queen Week, Shinerama and the upcoming NAITSA elections.

"What have you gained from your year as Publications Director?"

A lot of what I have gained isn't tangible. I've learned the importance of team work, time management (how to get everything done and still have time for sleep), people skills - relating with different people and following the necessary communication channels to get things done. I've gained knowledge about the wheels of government, how to plan and organize events, and the responsibilities of being a committee member. What a better place to learn all this than in one close to a business environment. I've especially had fun meeting the students of NAIT and being an active NAITSA member.

"How much control does the Publications Director have over the newspaper (The Nugget) and the yearbook (Northern Torch)?"

Ultimately NAITSA is the publisher of both publications. NAITSA is responsible for anything/everything published as far as liability for all articles published. The only control I exert is to make sure that the yearbook gets completed on schedule and that there is a newspaper every week. Everything else is up to the individual editors. It is my responsibility to hire the editors of both the Nugget and the Northern Torch and make sure they are qualified for the job. I act as an advisor and liaison between NAITSA executive, General Council and the Nugget and Northern Torch. I basically make sure that both sides are fairly represented in an issue.

"What advice would you give next year's Publications Director?"

It is a great learning experience and that you will get out of the position what you put into it. It is a great opportunity to meet people and have fun while working with a group of people towards common goals to help the students. It's fun but there is a lot of work involved and once you're committed you have to be prepared to work to your maximum capacity and more. You represent not only the students of NAIT but NAIT as well as this is a highly recognized position so you have to set a good example. It's a great place to work and a subtle wake up for the real

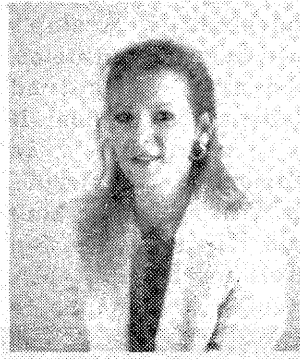

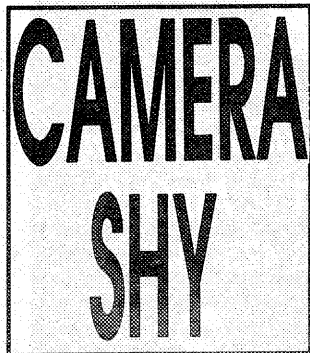

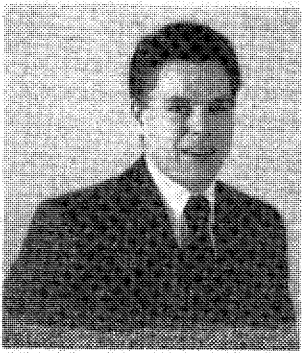

OPEN HOUSE A SUCCESS

Nait's 27th annual Open House was held March 16 and 17 with excellent participation and visitor turnout.

Officially, the events got underway on Friday morning. However, students and instructors spent much of Thursday afternoon and evening setting up displays that had been planned weeks in advance. There were also final adjustments to the 20 or so mascots present at Open House.

Thirteen of the mascots helped kick off Open House with Friday's Parade of Mascots. The mascots then patrolled the hallways and attracted the curious to their technologies' displays. Judges viewed the mascots at the parade and also at the displays. Nait's own Ookpick was also present, giving out balloons to youngsters.

Some of the technologies relied on visitors to spread word of their displays. Pre-Tech, for instance, was giving away paper hats with "Discover Pre-Tech" written on them. Engineer Science Technology went one better, giving away computer printout "photos" of visitors. The idea, which helped involve visitors in some of the technology at Nait, was extremely popular. Greg Padberg, one of the students manning the display, said there was a fairly strong general interest from visitors, especially the school kids. Although it was only the second year for the photos, there was never a shortage of customers.

A newcomer to Open House was the Westerra Institute of Technology. Although it isn't certain to operate in the future years and which will be transferred to Nait, Westerra decided to display all of the current programs. According to Al Davison, a Computer Engineering Instructor at Westerra, it looks like all programs will remain the same for at least one year before any changes occur. Mr. Davison said that although the booth had had many visitors, about half of them didn't know about Nait's upcoming take-over of the campus.

Students and visitors were not the only ones to

benefit from Open House. The Nait Foundation was also present raising funds for the school and increasing its community profile. According to Brian Bahry, the Foundation's main promotion at Open House was the Corvette Raffle. Open House is considered part of the Foundation's "Meet Us At The Mall" campaign. Mr. Bahry was pleased with ticket sales on Friday, but predicted that sales would be even better on Saturday, due to the older crowd. Mr. Bahry also mentioned that so far, ticket sales for the Corvette are about 30% higher than last year.

NAITSA was also out in force with a Student Store Sidewalk Sale plus Yearbook, Nugget, and NAITSA displays. With the upcoming elections, Open House provided an excellent opportunity for NAITSA to present itself to perspective students.

NAIT's Radio and Television Arts program, which broadcasts not just to NAIT but to the rest of the city, also helped visitors become involved in displays. At the booth in the main lobby, visitors participated in on-air interviews and give-aways. According to Mary Williams of NR92, many of the junior and senior high school students especially didn't really seem to grasp what Open House was all about.

Many of the visitors had nothing but praise for the organization that had gone into the displays. Jane and Robert Willy, for example, rated this year's display as excellent, even though they knew what to expect, having come to Open House "for years". The couple had only one suggestion, saying that some technologies could provide more brochures. Fred Lucht, a bartender who knows some of the NAIT students, said the displays in the gym were "quite good". Mr. Lucht said he was just seeing "what's here", but he wasn't looking for a new career. Donita Butler said she felt the best part of Open House was talking to the students and instructors. She claimed that was the only way to get a true feel for the programs.

Open House also went well for other groups within NAIT. Security had an easy time with no reports of any problems. The Disabled Student Services Office was busy though, providing interpreters for deaf visitors and operating service elevators. The NEST and Student Store also did brisk business.

ALUMNI SERVICE HELPFUL

With graduation only weeks away, a surprisingly large number of students are unaware of NAIT's Student Alumni service. The service is intended to help students stay in contact with NAIT and fellow Alumni after they leave school.

Judy Chichak, the Alumni Service Coordinator, says there are several benefits to the organization. All students are automatically registered with the service, and so may take advantage of several opportunities. For instance, alumni may purchase a Privilege card for \$50 a year (or \$75 a year for a family card). The card allows alumni to use all athletic facilities at NAIT complete with locker and travel service. The card also allows the use of the Library and Learning Resource Center (typewriters, photocopiers, etc.). Some Edmonton businesses will also give discounts to people presenting the card.

The Alumni Service also sends a newsletter three times a year. There is even a section in the newsletter for alumni to notify the service if they change their address. The newsletter is an excellent tool for planning reunions, etc.

Ms. Chichak is also optimistic about future plans for the service. NAIT is currently trying to arrange an "Affinity Card" with one of the major credit card companies (at this point Mastercard is the most likely).

The card would be a three-way partnership between NAIT, the company, and the individual. Alumni could apply for a card through the Alumni Service. Any subsequent purchases made using the card would result in a percentage of the money coming back to NAIT to help fund new projects or to upgrade existing facilities. The percentage would be based on the amount of usage of the card. Ms. Chichak is fairly sure the Affinity Card will be in place by the end of the next school year. Anyone holding a card with whichever company is chosen will be able to reapply for an Affinity Card without a reduction in spending limit or rating.

There are also plans to establish a travel program for Alumni along with continuing education programs. The travel service could be used to plan everything from recreation vacations to group educational trips. The continuing education programs would probably vary greatly from existing programs in that they could rely more on guest speakers and not follow the traditional "technology" definitions. However, both ideas are currently only in the planning stages with restrictions in terms of finances. Ms. Chichak would like such a program to become self-sufficient.

The whole idea of the Alumni Service, according to Ms. Chichak, is to "keep the graduates involved in NAIT." However, she would like to get current NAIT students to think of themselves as Alumni "as soon as they walk in the door." That way, Ms. Chichak claims, there would be stronger interaction for such events as Open House.

PUBCRAWLING

Grant Heslop, a former NAIT business student, believes he has found a way of turning other people's drinking into a personal gold mine. Mr. Heslop is the inventor of the recently released boardgame

"Pubcrawl."

The game, which is marketed by Heslop's own Sylgra Innovations, recently received national distribution. It is available in Edmonton at Dufferin's in West Edmonton Mall and Kingsway Garden Mall for \$29.95. Mr. Heslop also hopes to

market the game in the U.S. and England in the near future.

The game is billed as "Our country's other national sport" and is designed to recreate a real evening of pubcrawling. Players start at their own homes, move around the board to six different

pubs, avoid winos and finally end up in the park.

The attractions of the game are twofold. Firstly, it is a responsible drinking game that is suitable for parties. Many of the rules such as the size or type of drink used are left up to the players. There can also be a "designated driver" role for any non-drinkers who wish to participate. The game even comes with an "Enjoy Pubcrawling but don't drink and drive" bumper sticker.

However, this game is meant for the drinker. Mr. Heslop says players will get drunk but not get sick, (if you're a real pubcrawler) a claim he supports by pointing to his many test-games of Pubcrawling. The game also imitates real life by never being the same twice. The actions of winos and number of drinks vary tremendously from game to game. Mr. Heslop claims the advantage of his game is that it is cheaper than a real pubcrawl.

Papers recommended for further consideration will be sent to a panel of one to three persons, expert in the field, which will have been established by the Association's board of Directors.

Mr. Heslop credits the marketing background he received at Nait for launching his career. Along with Pubcrawling and Sylgra Innovations, he is currently marketing two other games with the help of Northern Games Company Ltd. which is based in Edmonton. Northern Games also welcomes ideas and new games from independent entrepreneurs.

As part of his marketing strategy, Mr. Heslop has used the game to raise money for various causes. The U. of A. Hospital Burn Unit received over \$400, with more money going to Muscular Dystrophy research. The money was raised through raffles and auctions.

The Nugget hopes to review Pubcrawling in the coming weeks.

For the first time since 1985-86, the NAIT Ooks have the opportunity to win back-to-back national titles.

The Ooks advanced to the best-of-three CCAA Hockey National Championship Series against the Humber Hawks with a sweep of the Kelsey Amaruks in the Western CCAA semi-final series.

The Ooks acquired a 1-0 lead in the best-of five series with a 9-1 victory the Amaruks on Thursday, March 15th at Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.

Mark Thiessen spearheaded the Ooks attack with three goals and three assists. Craig Sterzer and Todd Lorenz each tallied twice for the Ooks while Murray Bokenfohr and Ian McAmmond added singles. Curtis Chamberlin netted the lone Kelsey goal.

The Ooks burst out of the gates quickly with a 4-0 lead after the first and a 6-0 advantage following the second.

Rob McKinley stopped 17 of 18 shots in the NAIT net. At the other end, Darryl Ruzesky stopped 50 of 59 blasts in the Kelsey crease.

The Ooks clinched the

series with a 5-3 victory over the Amaruks on Saturday, March 17th in Saskatoon.

In the first, the Ooks fell behind 2-0 as Kelsey received goals from Darcey Klscar at 1:48 and Darren Hunter at 2:43. Todd Lorenz pulled the Ooks to within one at the 7:36 mark, with the help of Greg Geldhart and Ivan Krook.

In the second, the Ooks bounced back with three goals to take a 4-3 lead. Todd Lorenz chipped in his second of the night at 1:01 from Murray Bokenfohr. The Ooks then gained the lead on Mark Thiessen's marker at 2:50. Craig Sterzer and Bill Davidson assisted on the play. At 6:55, Greg Geldart gave the Ooks a 4-2 lead with the assistance of Blaine Peerless. Kelsey's Curtis Chamberlin narrowed the lead to 4-3 at 18:47.

In the third, Ivan Krook of NAIT sealed the win as he scored with 6:09 elapsed in the stanza on a play with Blaine Peerless and Greg Geldart.

The Ooks outshot the Amaruks 47 to 26. Rob McKinley was between the pipes for the Ooks while Darryl Ruzesky was tending goal for Kelsey.

With the victory, the Ooks improve their record to 29 wins, no losses, and two ties in the regular season and playoffs.

MEN SWIM TO GOLD

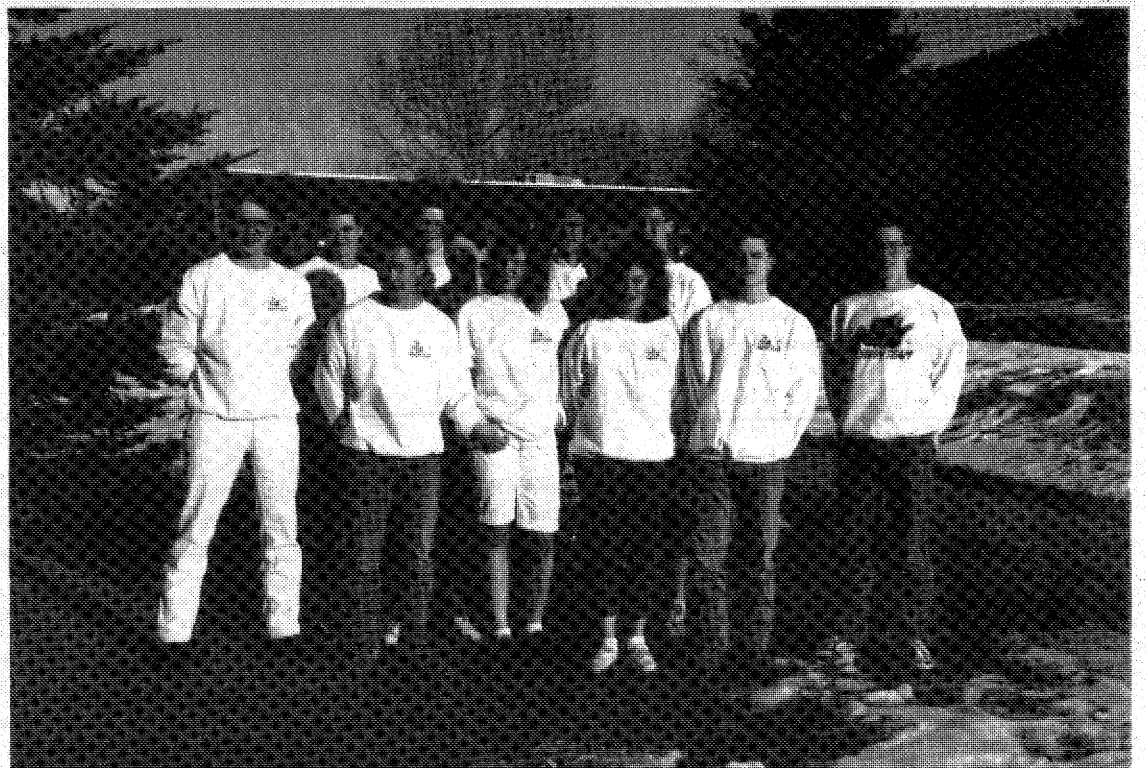
