NAITSA Executive Removed From Office

The latest installment of the "Life at NAIT" soap opera was played out at Tuesday's General Council meeting. NAITSA Activities Director Kevin Wimpney (formerly former-Activities Director, formerly Activities Director) once again became the former-Activities Director.

The whole series of events started in late January when a grievance was filed against Wimpney and then-NAITSA President Brad Diemert by the ladies' basketball team. During NAIT's investigation of the alleged incident, Wimpney resigned to "take pressure off the rest of the NAITSA executive." However, he maintained his resignation was not an admission of guilt. Wimpney's resignation, along with Diemert's and Athletics Director Justin Dahlen's (several weeks earlier), left three of the six NAITSA executive positions vacant. At the February 6 General Council meeting, NAITSA Vice-President Roxanne Beaubien explained that the three remaining NAITSA executives believed they could handle the extra work load, and so a motion was

passed to leave the NAITSA "as it is".

When NAIT finished its investigation of the original grievance, it declared there was no evidence to confirm one charge and said they could not conclusively decide if Diemert and Wimpney were guilty.

At the next General Council meeting on February 20, Wimpney asked to be reinstated. He cited the innocent verdict of the NAIT committee and the extra work load the NAITSA executive was handling. A motion for his reinstatement passed 16-11, thereby reappointing him to the NAITSA executive.

After the reinstatement became general knowledge, a petition was circulated to remove Wimpney from office again. The petition was based on a section of the NAITSA bylaws which deals with "extraordinary motions". According to the petition, the reinstatement had not been properly handled, and should therefore be rescinded.

At Tuesday's general council meeting, the conflict between the February 6th motion (leaving NAITSA "as it is") and the February 20 motion (reinstating Wimpney) was brought up.

Beaubien ruled the intent of the first motion did not conflict with the second motion. However, the ruling was challenged and eventually reversed after a vote. Because it was ruled a conflict did exist, the second motion was automatically nullified, thereby again removing Wimpney from office. A motion was then made to rescind the February 6th motion. If the motion passed, it would allow another motion to re-instate Wimpney to be made. However, the motion was defeated, making it impossible for him to be reinstated.

The petition which had been circulated had received well over the required 10% of NAITSA members' signatures to be considered by General Council. However, with the removal of Mr. Wimpney before the presentation of the petition, it became a non-issue.

Wimpney left the theatre after the failed motion. As he left, he pointed to the E.N.N. (NAIT TV Station) crew and said "I want to talk to you after the meeting."

He then later voiced his

displeasure in NAITSA offices. When asked if he had been treated fairly, he replied "No, I haven't been treated fairly. What is fair? This isn't fair." He continued by saying many of the people at the Tuesday meeting had not attended any meetings for a long time, if ever. According to Mr. Wimpney, the people who voted at the meeting had based their decisions on rumors and innuendoes rather than hard facts. "They knew nothing about the original charges."

Wimpney also mentioned the petition. He said it did not cause the decisions of the General Council, but it did affect them by spreading innuendoes.

Finally, Wimpney lashed out at the technology representatives at the meeting. "I've lost my faith in people. I'm not even sure I want to be a member of NAITSA anymore." He said he was mad at the tech. reps. because they had passed unfair judgment on him without reason.

However, he stopped short of criticizing the rest of the

NAITSA executive. "They did what they felt they had to do."

Of course, there were others who were pleased with the result of the meeting. Audrey Mirlach and Heather Stump, both members of the basketball team when the original grievance was made, said they were satisfied. "We're sad too, that the petition wasn't heard," said Mirlach. The reasons for the various motions at the meeting were a part of the reasons for the petition, but not the whole reason. Mirlach claimed there were several other NAITSA bylaws that had been broken which had not been mentioned, but she did not plan to bring them up unless Mr. Wimpney pursued reinstatement. Wimpney said he is not planning on trying to rejoin the NAITSA executive.

Stump denied the petition had influenced the General Council decision. "No one associates names (on the petition) with the (alleged) incident (the grievance)," she said. "That issue was put to rest a long time ago."

It is currently uncertain what will happen next.

Blaine encourages NAIT students to volunteer, especially for the Friday when thousands of high school students arrive at our doors.

Nominations for three new awards, the Alberta Science and Technology Leadership Awards (ASTech AWARDS 1990), were declared open today. The ASTech AWARDS have been initiated to honour businesses, institutions, and individuals that have made significant contributions to the science and technology community in Alberta. The winners and finalists of these awards will be honored at the ASTech AWARDS 1990 celebration hosted by the Edmonton Council for Advanced Technology on May 26 in Edmonton.

Fred Stewart, minister, Alberta Technology, Research and Telecommunications said "I am delighted that the efforts and commitment of dedicated Albertans who have made and are making significant contributions to Alberta are being recognized."

The three ASTech AWARDS are: "Outstanding Commercial Achievement in Alberta Science and Technology" and Outstanding entrepreneurial achievement in science or technology business; "Outstanding Contribution to the Alberta Science and Technology Community" for tangible contribution in education, public awareness, ambassadorship, or facilitating the growth of Alberta's science and technology industries; and "Innovation in Alberta Science and Technology" for an innovation with major impact in a particular field.

Any business, institution, or individual nominated for the awards must be based in Alberta. While the science or technology need not have originated in the province, there must be some Alberta connection to its development, enhancement,

commercialization, or marketing. Nomination forms are available from the regional Alberta Economic Development and Trade, Chambers of Commerce throughout the province, the Public Affairs offices of the University of Alberta and the University of Calgary, the Edmonton Council for Advanced Technology, the Calgary Council for Advanced Technology, and the Alberta Research Council. Nominations close March 31.

The ASTech AWARDS 1990 celebration will be a premiere event for Alberta Science and Technology Week scheduled for May 26 - June 2, along with the second National Forum on Science and Technology Advisory Councils which will be held in Edmonton May 27 - May 29, 1990.

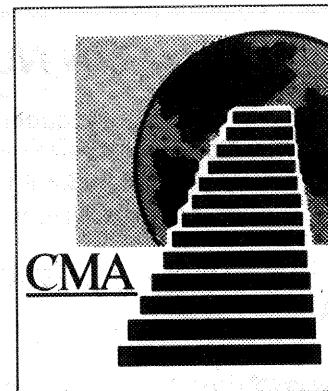

Library

Regarding a recent letter to the Editor,

A recent letter to the Editor complained about the background music in the Library around closing time, indicating that it distracts students from their studying time. The purpose of the audio tape is to inform students about the imminent closure of the Library and service desk, so that they will have sufficient time to retrieve and charge out books and prepare to leave.

Most of the thirty minute audio tape is silent. Three 7 second music clips introduce very brief announcements. The final music clip is 1 minute and 30 seconds in length, but since this occurs as the Library is closing, the music should not interfere with the students' studying time. I regret that the choice of music does not appeal to some of our users, but copyright legislation restricts our selection.

The letter to the Editor also requested extension of Library hours to at least 3 a.m. Library hours were extended past 10 p.m. last year as a pilot, but attendance was so low that these extended hours could not be justified. It should be noted that the NAIT Library is already open longer hours per week than any other public college or technical institute library in the province.

I think the "study animals" overreacted a bit, but I think turning off half the lights would be far more appropriate than that stupid music.

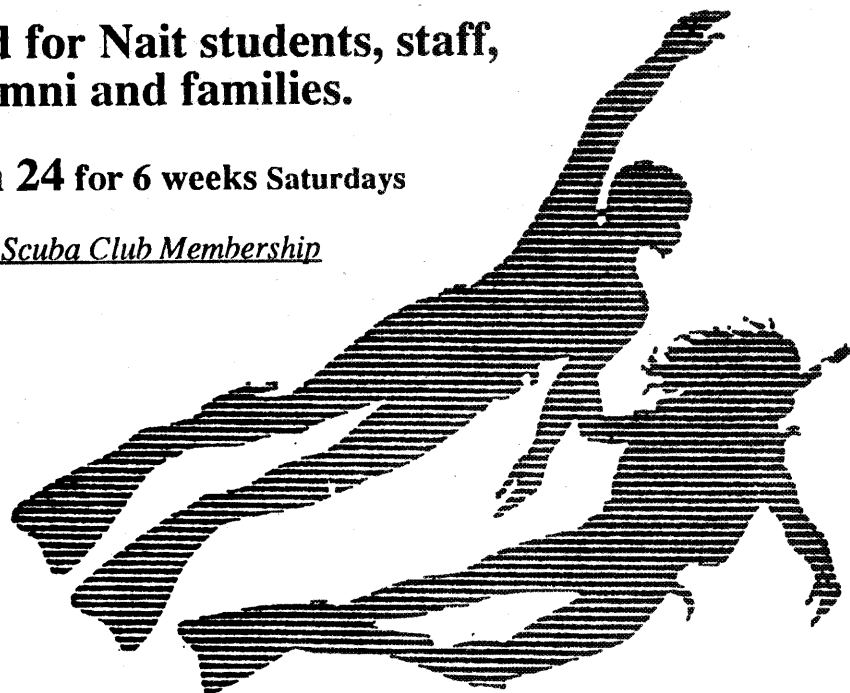

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Ooks Sweep Vikings

In 1984-85, the NAIT Ooks went undefeated in the regular season and were pushed to the limit in their semi-final series with the Camrose Lutheran College Vikings. In 1989-90, the Ooks also went undefeated and ran into a stubborn Vikings club.

In the end, the Ooks came out victorious winning the best of three ACAC semi final series two games to none.

In game one of the semis, the Ooks edged the Vikings 3-2 on Thursday, March 1st at the NAIT Arena.

In the first, the Ooks gained a 1-0 advantage on Marty Volcan's first of the playoffs on a feed from Greg

Geldart at 14:58.

In the second, the Ooks increased their lead to 2-0 as Mark Hilton found the mark at 8:24 from Jeff Wildeboer. The Vikings then cut the gap to 2-1 as Kevin Harder scored on the powerplay with 19:00 elapsed in the stanza.

In the third, the Vikings tied the contest on Pat Findlay's goal with the man advantage at 5:28. Former Viking Mark Thiessen netted the game winner for the Ooks at 7:55 with the help of Todd Lorenz.

Chad Bannister of Camrose stopped 38 of 41 shots including 14 in the first period when the Vikes were outshot 15 to 1. Rob McKinley of NAIT blocked 16 of 18 shots.

In game two of the semis, the Ooks won the series with

an 8-1 triumph over the Vikings at Camrose.

Following a scoreless first period, the goals came fast and furious in the second. Marty Volcan of the Ooks opened the scoring at 2:14. Rick Jarrett of the Vikings tied the contest at the 3:00 mark. The Ooks then built a 5-1 lead before period's end on goals by Clark Polglase at 4:14, Greg Geldart at 15:16, Mark Thiessen at 15:50 and Randy Wong at 19:41.

In the third, the Ooks completed the series with three goals. Greg Geldart netted a shorthanded marker at 3:21 before Ted Bradshaw pocketed goals at 4:58 and 7:37.

The Ooks outshot the Vikings 41-22 in the series finale.

Something is happening to collegiate sports and it isn't good. It is a lack of female involvement, and it has become a top concern in Canada. Not enough women are going for - or getting - sports related positions. Be it players, coaches, trainers, etc., there is just not enough female participation, and it is hurting the reputation of Canadian sports.

Some astounding statistics include: 46 coaches at the Commonwealth Games - 3 women, 82 co-ed sports teams coaching positions in the ACAC - 8 female coaches. 11 out of 12 athletic director positions in colleges in Alberta are filled by men. Out of 2200 female athletes, it is difficult to get 60 applicants for scholarships. There are probably many other types of these statistics, but due to limited accessibility, this sports editor doesn't have them.

But what is going on here? Could it be the masculine reputation that is being imposed on sports? Could it

On Saturday, February 24th, the Ooks capped off an undefeated season with a 6-3 triumph over the Cougars in Calgary.

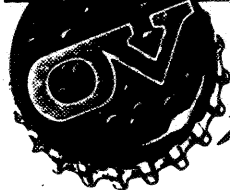
This is what they are going to have to call this year's ACAC All-Conference hockey team.

Review: Madhouse

Is it Academy Awards time or is it time to plan next-years tax write offs? If you see Madhouse the answer is obvious.

Television retreads, Kirstie Alley (Cheers) and John Larroquette (Nightcourt) try, once more, to make that Quantum Leap to big, big bucks and perhaps finish that guest house by the pool. Alley had a moderate hit last year with Look Who's Talking and showed marked improvement since her premiering feature role--a vulgar vulcan (I'm logical, therefore I'm anal retentive). Characterization in Star Trek II: The Wrath Of Khan. It has been much longer for Larroquette whose last role was in Blind Date opposite Bruce Willis. Just between us I believe Ol' Rubber Face, Larroquette, is better suited to the tube. His visage gets a little scary for comedy when it's dimensions are increased to square meters.

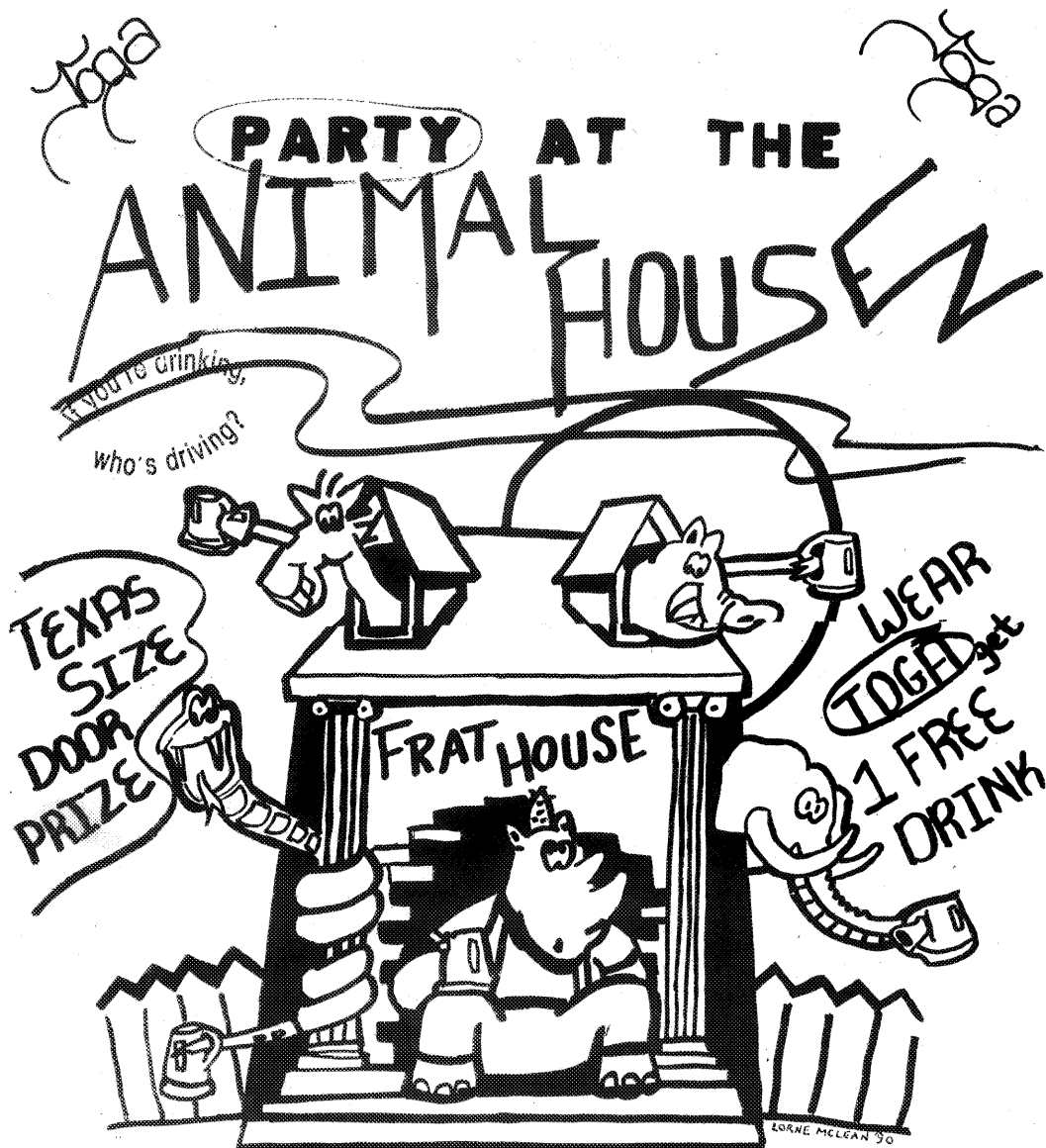

Indeed. If you find that hard to believe,

Scruffy gets to "Exorcise" his feline mortal rights by getting polished off five times before this movie is through.

Days later, the bannisters manage to bribe their guests out of the house for a few hours so they can get some private nookey (best scene: Jessie's erotic, yet unrevealing, striptease). Unfortunately, enter Claudia, Jessie's gold-digging, dirty divorcing sister. Then, Claudia's coke smuggling son moves in, and then the next-door neighbours (who are burned out of their own home). And then Fred returns with a baby elephant. The Bannisters consider murder as an option just before the house gets requisitely totaled in the process of the drug bust.

Don't fret, I won't give away the ending. To this sooo predictable and sooo cliched film, let me just say it's the cherry on the cake of unbelievability. Madhouse flashes you back to the epic calamity pictures of the seventies; Poseidon Adventure, Airport, Towering Inferno... Now rookie producer Leslie Dixon (writer of Outrageous Fortune and Overboard) teams up with her husband, feature film rookie writer slash director, Tom Ropelewski to bring you a new twist to As The World Degenerates. A disaster of a disaster comedy, destined to make many worst ten lists of 1990.
