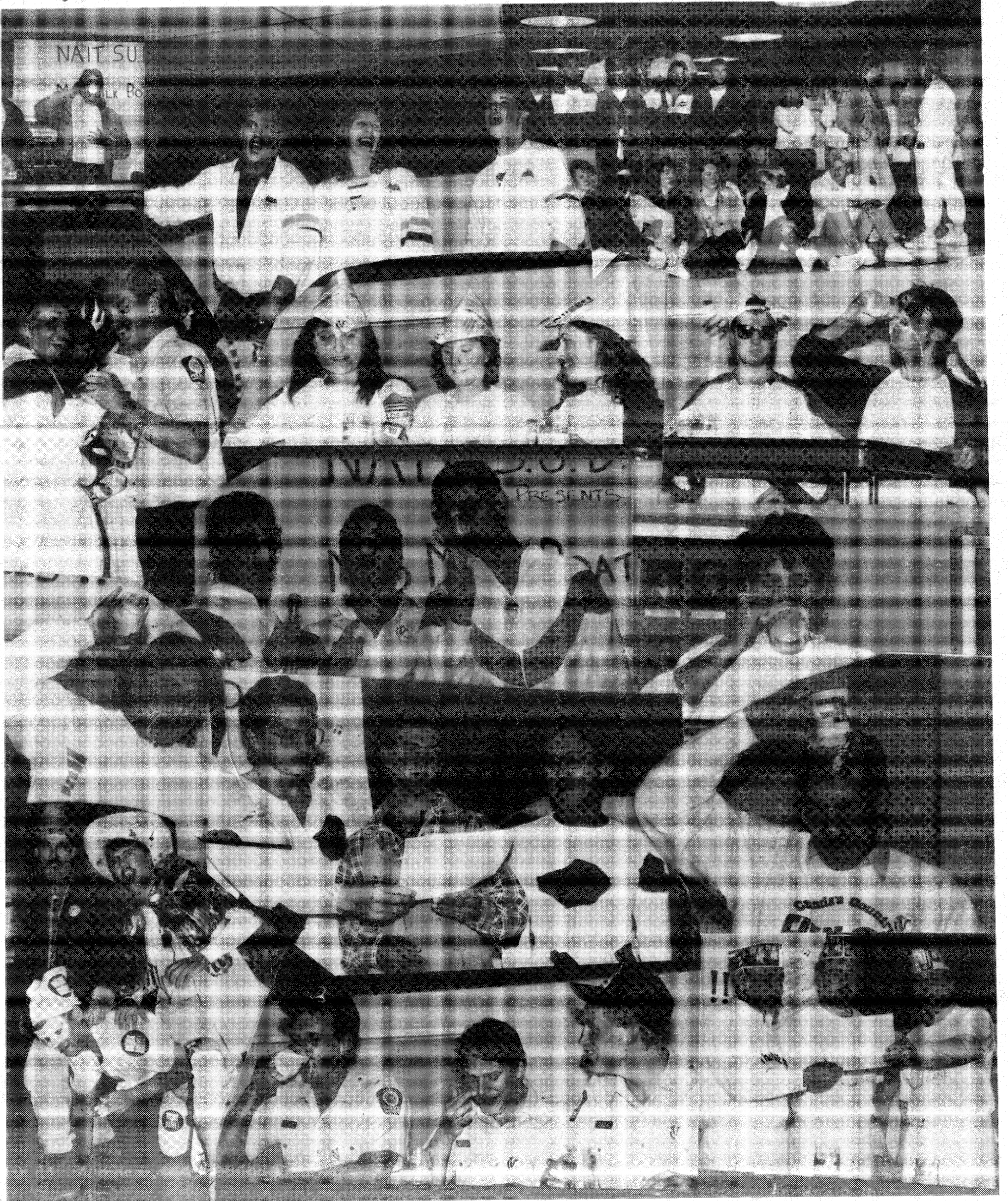

## ALCOHOL AWARENESS WEEK PROMOTES GREATER AWARENESS

During October 1 - 5, NAIT hosted Alcohol Awareness Week. This special activity was sponsored by NAIT's own "SUDS Squad" (Students Understanding Drinking Sensibly) Its aim is to educate students on the responsibilities of alcohol use.

There were two ways which the student body was made aware of the problems of drinking irresponsibly. On a somber note, Const. Meads from the Edmonton City Police Force, set up a display in the south lobby. The pictures depicted some gruesome tragedies of impaired drivers and their victims.

Available at the display were pamphlets describing the Designated Driver Program which is in effect even at The Nest. The program helps to make sure at least one member of a party stays sober in order to see the rest of the party animals safely home. Pamphlets describing the missions of P.A.I.D. (People Against Impaired Drivers), and R.E.I.D. (Research and Education on Impaired Driving) as well as brochures outlining

government legislation targeting persons charged and convicted with impaired driving were also available.

The Alberta Motor Vehicle Administration Amendment Act of 1988 is noted to have increased driver licence suspension periods for

The prizes were supplied by The Nest, the Student Store and Alberta Dairy Products.

Impaired drivers kill 2,500 people nation-wide every year, notes P.A.I.D. and R.E.I.D. in a brochure. Let's face it: everybody is going to die, but tragic deaths as a result of alcohol abuse and driving under its influence do not have to occur. These kinds of accidents are avoidable. This is the real tragedy.

Roxanne Beaubien, President of the Student Association says the most

important message of the week was to realize that an enjoyable time can be had by all with the responsible use of alcohol.

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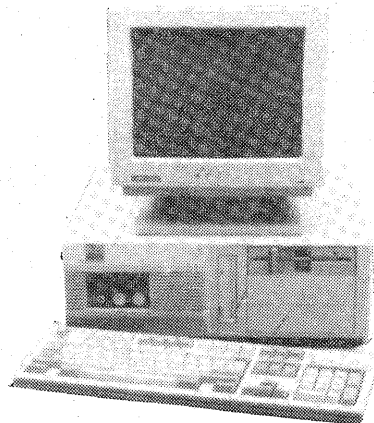
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## Ooks Wrap Up Preseason This Weekend

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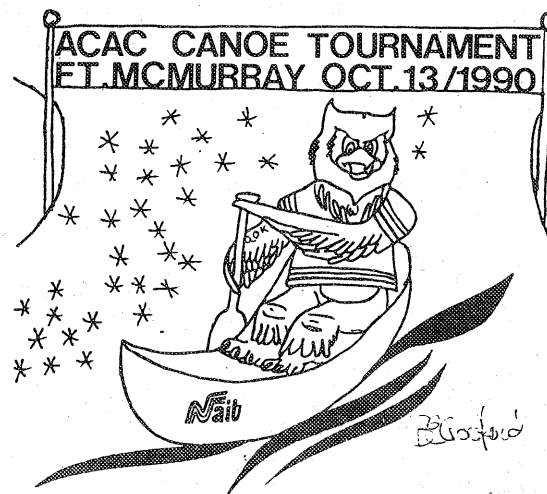

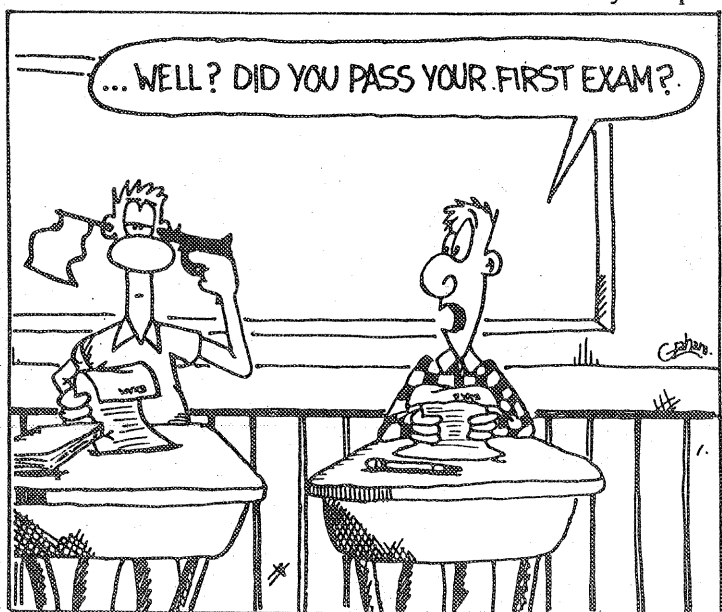

## Wyche Has a Point

The coach of the Cincinnati Bengals, Sam Wyche, has been in the headlines recently for his stand on women reporters in the locker room.

By taking the action that he did, Wyche was fined \$30,000 or 1/17 of his salary by the commissioner of the NFL. Ironically, the NFL has virtually done

nothing when the likes of Al Davis and Robert Irsey have moved franchises out of Oakland and Baltimore.

The NFL feels that the media exposure is one of the avenues used to increase its revenue, and wants the media to have full access to players. What has been neglected is the player's right to privacy for a brief period of time.

Wyche proposed that his players stay in uniform for 20 minutes after a contest so that the reporters (male and female) could have equal access to players in the locker room in a professional atmosphere. However, the NFL has decreed that this is not appropriate.

The NFL is caving

into the interests of dollars and special interest groups by not endorsing the Wyche proposal.

The press, by demanding access to the locker room, has failed to come to the conclusion that the best interviews come outside of its doors and that speed may not bring the best story.

The players have their privacy violated by press who want the story now, and not in five minutes.

Currently, there is an uproar over a female reporter's right to enter a men's locker room. What would the uproar be if a male reporter demanded access to enter a women's locker room?

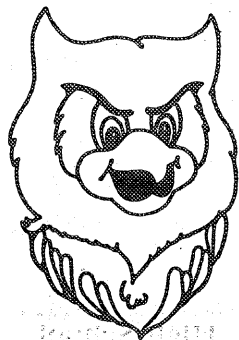

Definitely yes, because I don't smoke.



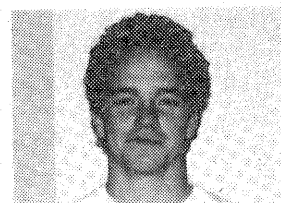

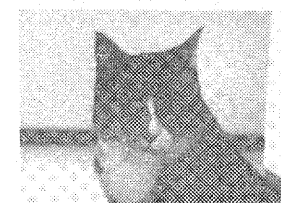
