Minister Announces New Tuition Policy

EDMONTON

Advanced Education Minister John Gogo today announced a new tuition policy that sets out reasonable and predictable increases in fees for instruction. The maximum annual average increase for 1991-92 will be \$200 at the universities and hospital schools of nursing and \$100 at the public colleges and technical institutes.

"The new policy accomplishes two objectives - it asks students to pay fees that are more reflective of the benefits they receive

from their education and it allows institutions to raise additional revenues to help maintain program quality," said Mr. Gogo. "At the same time, changes to our student assistance program will ensure that fee increases do not prevent qualified students from attending our post-secondary institutions."

Over time, the share of an institution's net operating expenses paid by students through fees for instruction will be allowed to rise to a maximum of 20 per cent. It will take most institutions several years to reach this ceiling.

Within these two limits set out in the policy - the 20 per cent ceiling on fees for instruction as a percentage of net operating expenditures and the maximum average annual fee increase - boards of governors will have the authority to set individual program fees.

Visa students beginning their studies at Alberta institutions in September 1991 will be required to pay fees double those paid by Canadian students in the same program. Visa students currently enrolled in Alberta post-secondary institutions will continue to pay a 50% surcharge until the

end of the 1993-94 school year.

Adjustments will be made to student assistance programs available through the Students Finance Board. Loan limits will be raised beginning in 1991-92 to accommodate increases in fees for instruction.

"The new fees for instruction policy is a policy for the 1990's," stated the Minister. "It is the result of a year-long public consultation and review process. I would like to thank all those who participated - the students, boards of governors, administration and faculty at our post-secondary institutions and the public."

Response to Tuition Policy

EDMONTON - Student leaders from across Alberta met today with the Minister of Advanced Education, John Gogo, for an announcement of the new tuition policy. The new policy will allow tuition to be increased by a maximum average of \$200 annually at universities and \$100 at colleges and technical institutes. These increases will continue until tuition covers 20% of Net Operating Expenditures of the Institute.

The students are extremely disappointed by the consultation process used by the department. "Once again, it is being implied that our responses to this discussion paper actually had an impact on the final product. In reality, we were paid lip service and that's all" said Roxanne Beaubien, NAIT Student Association President.

"This government has no vision; it is destroying our post-secondary system at the expense of the taxpayers," said David Wyllie, President,

Mount Royal College Student Association. For example, the tuition fees at Grant MacEwen Community College will triple in the next 10 years from \$600 to over approximately \$1800. Even with this, the maximum level of 20%, as stated in the policy, of the net operating expenditures will not be reached for several years and in some institutions it will never be reached. Sally Chambers, Grant MacEwen Community College Student

Association President added, "this will make education in the next generation to be an elite system of education."

As citizens and taxpayers of Alberta students are not solely concerned about the \$100 increase per year in tuition but are angry about the obvious shift the government is making to a user pay system of education. This policy is a blatant contradiction to the philosophies that Canadians and Albertans hold; that Canadians treat their young as an investment and that they are the future of this country.

developed a series of successful programs to educate and raise awareness of responsible drinking, constantly striving to become more visible on campus. This year, the Committee changed their name to the NAIT S.U.D.S. Squad and developed a new ongoing project called the S.U.D.S. Squad Designated Driver Program, sponsored by Molson Breweries.

The Designated Driver program will be used in the student lounge (The NEST) and

So what was the entertainment? Females 18-27 years old parading around in bikinis (no larger than a postage stamp), and the only fireman there was a judge.

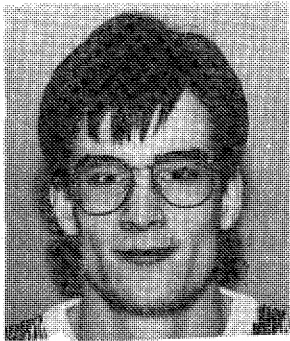
I commend any female who has the intestinal fortitude (and nerves of steel), to parade in front of strangers in a bar half clothed to win prizes.

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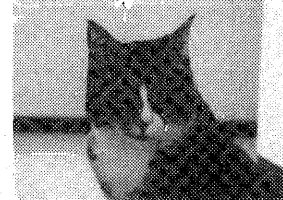

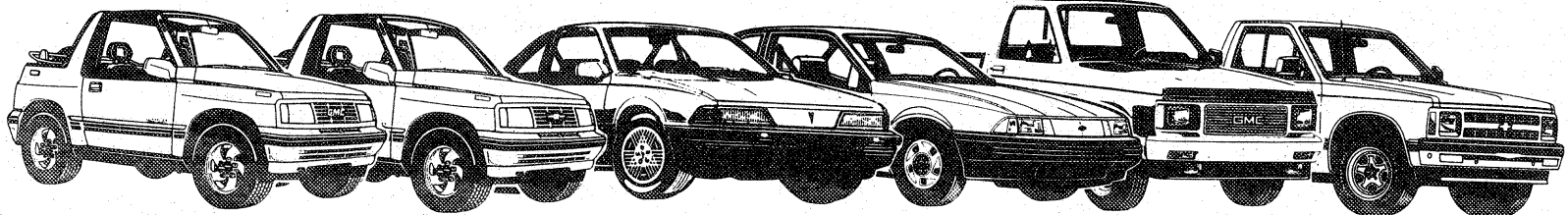
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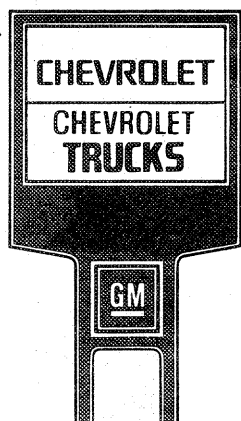
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NAIT'S ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE

Following the PACMORE (President's Advisory Committee Monitoring Our Responsibilities to the Environment) report, submitted to the President in the Spring of 1990, NAIT has taken a number of steps to improve the campus environment.

The Administration had, in the late 1980's, changed the smoking policy to making NAIT a smoke-free environment with some designated smoking areas. Recently, the Natrium, through NAITSA's actions, and the lobby in the U-building have become smoke free.

Since November 1990, the tower's garbage has been reduced by 1/3. This can be attributed to the paper recycling project that has removed much of the computer and photocopying paper from the garbage bins. Expansion to include the A-building, LRC, technical wings, and the Distribution Centre is in the works. The main focus will be on recycling computer paper and photocopying paper, although the distribution centre will be recycling cardboard. Also, single-sheet paper towels in all bathrooms are being replaced with roll-paper towels.

Pop can recycling, which has been the initiative of NAITSA, is also helping. NAITSA has given the individual technologies an opportunity to earn a little extra money. In return for being responsible for the cleaning and maintaining of the pop can recycle bins, the technologies can keep the money they get from the pop cans for themselves to use for their events.

With regard to heating systems, Facilities Management is installing a flue-gas analyzer in the Power Plant (Services Building). This installation, which carries a \$60,000 price tag, should result in more efficient combustion of the natural gas fired boiler that supplies steam heat to all Main Campus buildings west of 106 Street, from the Activities Centre in the south to V-building in the north. More efficient combustion will result in less consumption of fuel and cleaner emissions.

Cooling systems also sometimes contain substances of potential harm to the environment. Freon is the main culprit, more specifically "old Freon" which contains chlorofluorocarbons, a compound that depletes the ozone layer of the atmosphere. The Freon in NAIT's smaller refrigeration systems, such as in the ice arena, is periodically being replaced by the environmentally friendlier "new Freon". In the process, of course, the old gas is "captured" to prevent its escape into the atmosphere.

NAIT's main refrigeration system employs gas-fired absorption chillers, which do not use freon.

A program having a positive effect on NAIT generally is the Workplace Hazardous Materials Identification System (WHMIS). The name speaks for itself. This province-wide initiative has been implemented throughout the Institute, with both general and worksite-specific training of staff. Over 75 trainers have been schooled in the system to date, and all critical areas, such as Chemical Technology, Med Lab, Bio-Sciences, Auto-body, and Photography, have completed the specific training. WHMIS is an ongoing process though, which all new employees must be introduced to.

A recent action in compliance with WHMIS regulations was the shipment of PCB ballast, collected from old light fixtures here, to the Swan Hills Hazardous Waste Disposal Plan. The cost to NAIT was \$13,000. Bio-hazardous waste from some NAIT programs is regularly sent to the University of Alberta for disposal.

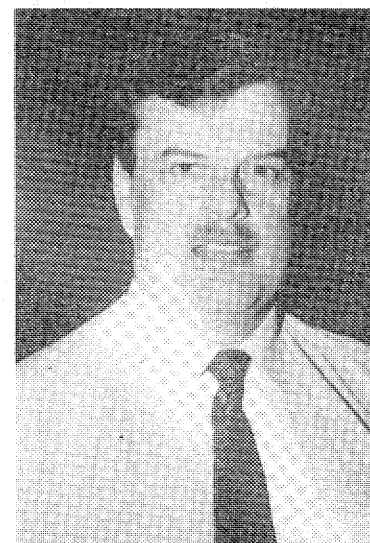

been preparing since last semester. The project involved preparing a \$30 million campaign to promote Labatt's Blue in the Ontario marketplace.

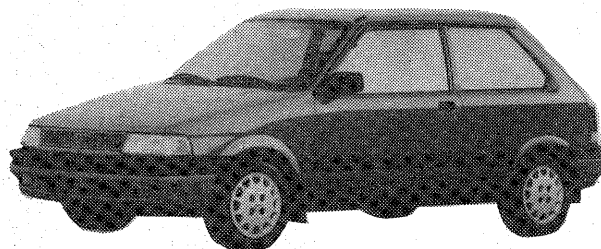

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Tips for Job Hunting

The "hidden job market" is alive and well: over 80% of all available jobs are never advertised! Studies show that the most effective method of finding hidden jobs is to apply directly to the employer. Of the more than two-thirds of all job seekers who use this method, more than half succeed in getting jobs this way.

To make contact with employers, you must make a list of potential employers, including the names, addresses and phone numbers of businesses that might have the job you want. Most people don't think of the local Yellow Pages as a gold mine of information on the job market, but it can be a terrific resource for starting a list of job prospects. You may also find job leads in the white pages of the phone book (not all employers list their businesses in the Yellow Pages). In addition, some phone books now have blue pages for government listings (combined, the various levels of government employ more people than any company or institution). Business-to-business directories are also excellent resources. They usually list companies within a wide area, rather than just one city.

Here's how to use the Yellow pages and other parts of the phone book to your best advantage.
STEP ONE - MAKE A LIST

The phone company has already done most of the work for you, by

grouping companies according to the kinds of products and services they provide. Read all the headings from A to Z and list any company that might have the kind of work you want. To make sure you don't miss anyone, there's an index in the front that tells you all the places you'll find listings for any given subject. For instance, if you love horses and know you want to work around them, turn to HORSES in the index. There are at least a dozen different categories of businesses scattered all over the Yellow Pages that have something to do with horses!

STEP TWO - CALL

Call each company on your list and ask to speak to the person who can do you the most good. This would be the supervisor, director or manager of the particular area where you'd be working. In other words, call the person who would hire you for the job you want - not the personnel department.

STEP THREE - REQUEST AN INTERVIEW

Explain briefly what position you seek, your skills and unique assets; request an interview. If the call doesn't lead to an interview, ask for more leads!

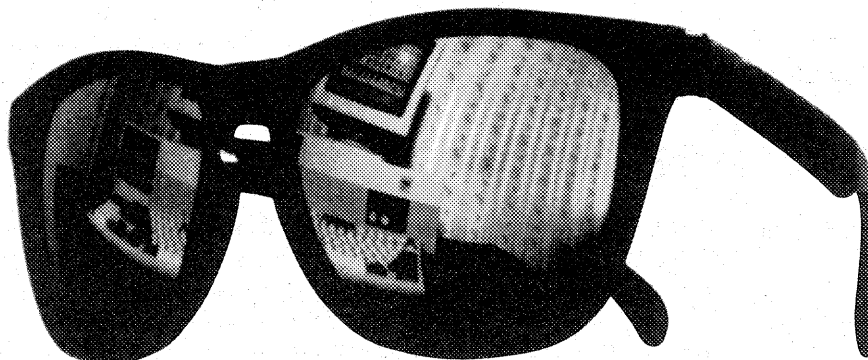
Using the phone book

has many advantages. First, it may give you new and different ideas for job leads. It also saves lots of time, energy and money. You can make 5 phone calls in 30 minutes, instead

of spending the whole day pounding the pavement. You don't even have to know if there's a job opening. It's not unheard of for employers to create a position when the right

person comes along. Best of all, the employer will be impressed with your initiative and you'll have the edge over all those who just filled out an application or sent a resume!

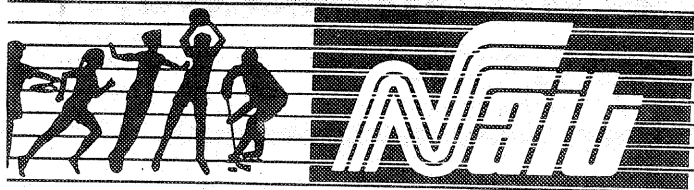

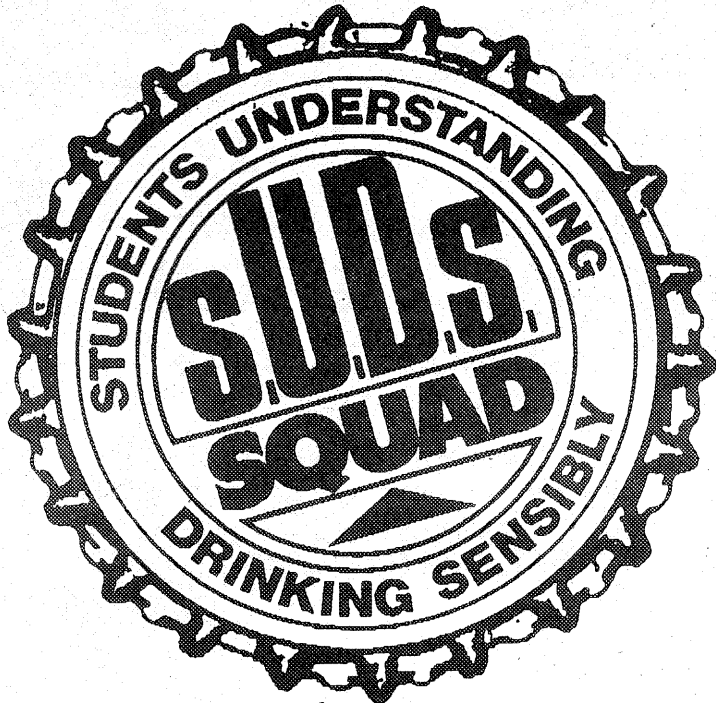
program is available. These buttons will also be used for promotional purposes during Alcohol Awareness Week and Registration.

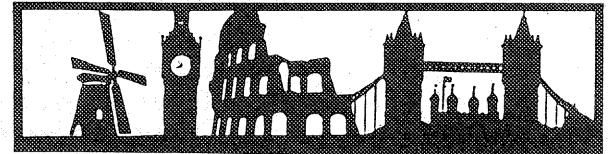

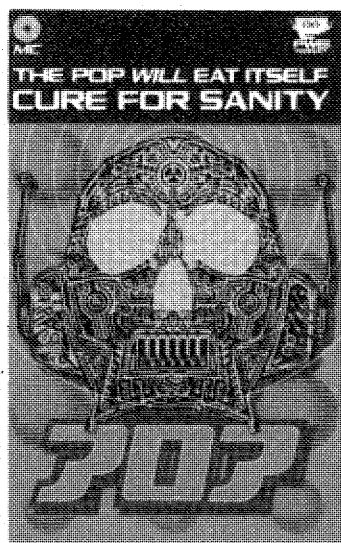
"The Marrying Man"

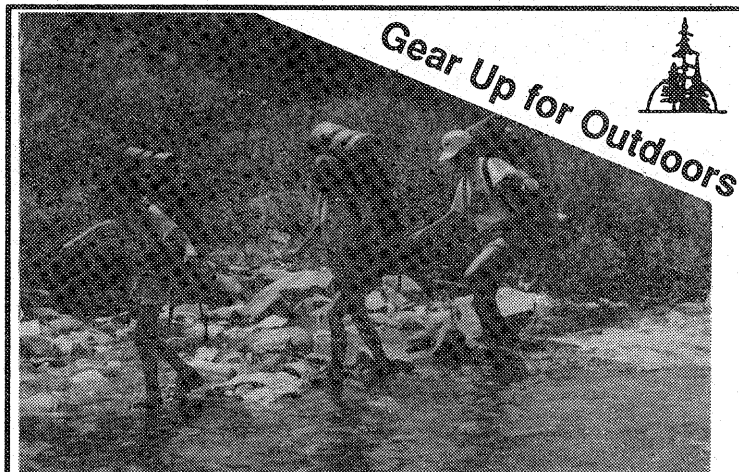

"Our objective is to achieve a priority for getting financial aid from the Foundation," says Randy Pack, Chairman of NAIT's Daycare Committee. It is hoped that the four members of the committee will agree to form NAIT's non-profit Daycare Society.

Cuts Squeeze Students

University and college students were big losers Thursday as the province chopped nearly \$8.5 million from financial assistance it provides students.

Post-secondary students also learned Advanced Education Minister John Gogo plans a "new tuition fee policy", thought by many to mean substantial financial increases are on the horizon.

Gogo has said he wants Alberta tuition fees, among the lowest in the country, increased to approach national averages.

"He's given clear signs his policy is that fees must rise and rise to the national average," said Ken Ross, president of the University of Alberta Graduate Students

Association.

The increase won't come immediately, however, since Gogo has promised tuition fees will not rise more than 15 per cent in one year.


Ross said the cuts to fellowships, scholarships and loan remissions, the portion of students loans forgiven by the province, means many students will lose their protection from increased fees.


"Those who would have a hard time getting in are less likely now to be supported," he said.

Treasurer Dick Johnston announced Thursday that total spending for post-secondary education in the 1991-92 budget year will be slightly more than \$1 billion.

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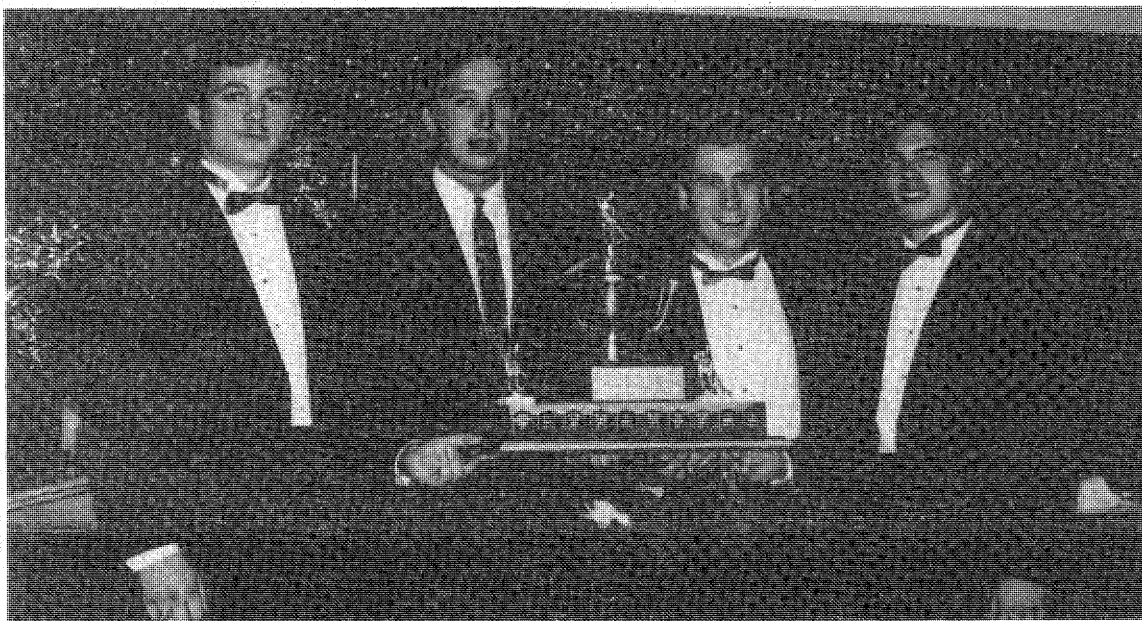

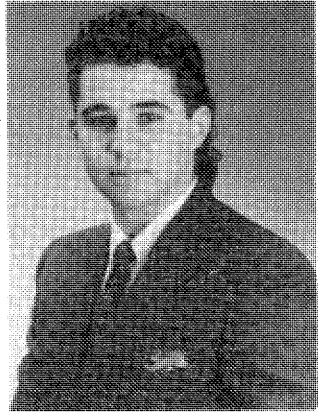
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NAITSA Academic VP Candidates
