

## **Locker Thefts**

Since the last week in January, there has been a rash of locker thefts.

Five lockers in F-Wing were broken into between 12 noon and 2 p.m. Four of these were in the basement and one was on the main floor.

Lockers have also been vandalized over at Plaza II-Engineering Technologies, with personal property being the items taken.

Several students at Westwood Campus had contents from their purses taken, the purses were left unattended at the time of the thefts.

The Government of Canada recently announced its intention to organize and promote Canada's 125th anniversary as a nation and one of these events is a special circulation coin program.

The Royal Canadian Mint has extended an invitation to you to submit coin designs to be considered in recognition of this historic milestone.

The series of coins to be issued in 1992 will depict the beauty of Canada. The images you submit should be well known and recognized by the majority of Canadians.

Twelve designs will be selected (one for each of the provinces and territories). As well, a design will be selected to become the standard bearer of Canada.

All designs submitted must be original, not modern or stylized in their approach.

Three designs will be chosen for each category (a winner, first runner up and a second runner up). These selections will be made by a prestigious panel of Canadians and become the exclusive property of the Royal Canadian Mint.

Each winning originator will receive \$5,000, the first runner up \$2,000 and the second runner up \$1,000.

Non-selected submissions will be returned if your name and address is clearly printed on the back of each design submitted. Include your postal code as well as a telephone.

All designs should be in a 20.5 cm (8") diameter circle in accordance with the mock-up featured with this article.

of its financial planning 1991 - 92the academic year, the Board of Governor's of the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology (NAIT) has decided to discontinue Institute's Hairstyling Program as soon as practical.

Institute President Dr. Stan Souch stated that the decision was not made lightly. "It is an excellent program and the staff are highly regarded professionals.

EDMONTON: As part • He explained that the decision was based on major three considerations: the availability of similar training in the private sector in the Edmonton area; programming priorities of the Institute; and economies required to balance the budget.

> Dr. Souch extended assurance that the 49 students currently enrolled in the program will be able to complete their training. Seven full-time staff will be

affected. NAIT will employ a variety of strategies--employment counselling, redeployment retraining severance arrangements--to lessen impact individuals affected.

The decision is part of NAIT's ongoing 1991-92 financial planning effort which requires that the Institute realize a \$2.3 million operational saving at its main campus to balance the budget.

## Series of the Season This Weekend at the NAIT Arena



One point separates the Mount Royal College Cougars and the NAIT Ooks in the ACAC standings. Without a doubt, both teams know this weekend's series

between them could make or break the season.

In all likelihood, the team which comes away with the most points in the series will gain home advantage in the first round of the playoffs. The games are slated for 7:30 p.m. in

the NAIT Arena on Friday, the 8th, and Saturday, the 9th.

The Cougars moved into second place over the weekend with a pair of victories over the Grande Prairie Regional College Wolves in Calgary.

In contrast, the Ooks split a home-and -home series with Red Deer to fall into third place one point behind MRC.

On Thursday, January 31st, the Ooks fell behind early and dropped a 5-1 decision to the Kings in Red Deer.

In the first, Erin Ginnell pocketed a pair of powerplay goals to give the Kings a 2-0 lead at 5:54 and 8:04.

In the second, the Kings acquired a 3-0 lead on Mike Kadar's marker at the 11:46 mark.

In the third, the Ooks powerplay clicked with Todd Kinniburgh finding the mark with 6:31 gone in the frame. The Kings closed out the scoring with a pair of goals off the stick of Corey Belitski at 11:53

and 18:11.

Grod Besse blocked 38 of 39 shots in the Red Deer net. Rob McKinley stopped 28 of 33 shots in the NAIT crease.

On Friday, February 1st, the NAIT Ooks overcame an early deficit to skate away with a 6-3 win over the Kings at the NAIT Arena.

In the first, the Kings jumped out to a 2-0 lead with goals from Trevor Buchanan at 11:37 and Stu Jackson at 14:09.

In the second, the Ooks tallied four unanswered markers. Tim Murphy netted his second of the season at 4:43, Lonnie Spink notched his ninth of the campaign on the powerplay at the 7:48 mark, Mark Hilton accounted for a shorthanded tally at 14:31, and Greg Geldart scored his eighth of the year at the 18:40 mark.

In the third, the Ooks received powerplay goals from Todd Kinniburgh at 8:19 and at 10:42. Brett

Stephenson of the Kings closed out the night's scoring at 16:05.

The Kings outshot the Ooks 35 to 25. Lee Wiebe of RDC and Rob McKinley of NAIT went the distance in their respective creases.

ON THE BENCH: Approximately 50 former Ooks participated in the NAIT Hockey Alumni Tournament held on Saturday, the 2nd, at the NAIT Arena. A good time was had by all as a number of acquaintances were renewed. Perry Pearn, the man who coached the Ooks to five national titles, was unable to attend as he was on assignment for Canada in Team Minnesota.

## **Volleyball Ooks Split**




## "The Book Of Love"


## The Concerned Cupid's Column



# "The legal limit is .08 or 8.0 or something like that."

Actually, .08% is the legal blood alcohol limit for driving. The only thing at 8.0% is probably a pickled egg. But what does it all mean? Basically there are two considerations—the rate at which alcohol enters the bloodstream and the rate at which alcohol is taken out of the blood by the liver. The difference between the two determines the concentration of alcohol in your blood. And it is this blood alcohol concentration (BAC) that determines the effect on your brain and nervous system.

Twelve ounces of beer, four ounces of wine or one and a half ounces of spirits have about the same amount of alcohol—half an ounce. And your body can break down about half an ounce an hour or .02% (based on 150 lb. person).

Because alcohol is a depressant, it works by putting portions of the brain "to sleep" and the effects are cumulative.

Less than .03 to .05%. Feelings range from no effect to mild alterations of moods and feelings. Minor modification of control is happening but not discernible.

Between .05 and .10%. Increased feeling of relaxation, sedation and/or euphoria. Feelings of stimulation and increased confidence are illusions because alcohol has put the "attitude" compartment of the brain "to sleep". Your physical co-ordination is impaired and reaction time is longer.

**Between .10 and .20%.** Further deterioration of your motor control, judgment and reaction times. Speech may be slurred.


Over .20%. You're well sedated. Your brain is anaesthetized to the point that you have trouble knowing what's happening. Even standing or staying awake is difficult.

Over .40% -.60%. Usually fatal.
