Lachambre Wins

The winners of the NAITSA elections were announced at the Election Rock 'N' Talk.

All candidates running on a yes/no vote got more than 50% of the popular vote making Taras Kasnisty the new Board of Governors Student Representative, Leslie Parke the new Administrative V.P., and Dan Lachambre the new President. Lachambre was formerly the Academic V.P..

The new Academic V.P. is Brad Balkan, who defeated Debby Serafinchon. In the closest race of the election, Shane Warawa, the former Athletics V.P. edged out Karen Rolf by 63 votes. This makes Warawa the new

Activities V.P., taking over from Darren Stepanik.

Candace Visser got roughly half of the popular vote for the Athletics V.P. position, beating an injured Dale Ellice and a second-place Kelly Tarrabain.

These new executives took office on April 1, 1992 with the exception of the office of President. Chris Horne will remain President until April 30, during which time Lachambre will be President-Elect.

Since there were no candidates in running for Communications V.P. or the second Board of Governors position, these two offices will be vacant until the by-election to be held April 16,

1992.

692 students voted out of a total of approximately 6500 eligible voters. Roughly half of the votes were cast in the NAITSA office and the Main Kiosk. Westerra recorded eight ballots.

It was planned that the election results be announced at 5:30 p.m. at the Rock 'N' Talk, however the results were not available at that time.

Over an hour after the results were to be released, Annette Sarauer, the Chief Returning Officer, announced the winners to a less than capacity crowd. The delayed reporting of the results was to ensure the accuracy of the results.

Health Science Cutbacks

NAIT Health Science students are worried that funding they receive from the government will be stopped.

Presently, students in the second year of their program work in hospitals and receive a monthly wage of \$500.00. If the provincial government cuts this program, these payments would be discontinued.

The concern expressed by Dr. Bill Glandville, Dean of Health Sciences, is the financial difficulties this might cause some students

Glandville would also like to see that students who are presently involved in the program continue to receive this wage to fulfill the expectations set out when they started the program.

In response to this, students have mailed approximately 800 letters to the government to protest this possible budgetary cut.

Students are also planning to hold a rally in front of the Legislature building if they do not receive positive feedback from the government by the end of this week.

It's almost absurd to believe that the recent rebukes to official bilingualism and the even more recent intransigence on Senate reform comes from the man who was the country's biggest cheerleader for compromise and national reconciliation during the Meech Lake debacle.

This week, Getty stated that unless he gets a Triple E Senate (i.e. equal representation from all provinces) he will scuttle any new constitutional deal.

It's one thing to support Senate reform, or even abolition,

yet it's quite another to paint yourself into a political corner. If we learned anything from Meech it's that only compromise will bind a diverse nation like Canada. Getty's categorical demands only serve to restrict his ability to do this very thing.

So what caused Getty's drastic change of attitude? Clearly, he's taking his cues from the Reform Party. Reform supports unilingualism and a Triple E Senate and has unparalleled support in Alberta. Reform's leader, Preston Manning, has made these issues major planks in his campaign. Obviously, Getty is making a cheap attempt to hijack Reform's support and exploit Alberta's gripes, either real or imagined, with Ontario and Quebec for political support in the upcoming provincial election.

However, there is one difference between Manning and Getty; Getty is in power. Manning can rant and rave all he wants without any real political consequences. Yet, Getty's reckless "all or nothing" approach to constitutional dealing could very well mean one more "roll of the dice" that may split the country apart.

The name Marty Schumar does not exist at NAIT. I have also heard through the grapevine that this individual may be a person that has a personal vendetta against NAITSA due to a particular incident that happened this year. I want the students of NAIT to know that the student association is breaking its back to make education the best it can be.

students' stipend issue. With help from the government opposition and various media, we have obtained the needed acknowledgement of this problem. I believe the right steps are happening to continue the stipends for our students. Between the actions of our supporters and students (e.g. letter writing campaigns, media attention, etc.), the government should release the right decision.

that maybe Business students are willing to try and do something about the problems they see at NAIT, rather than just sit and whine about them in *The Nugget*?

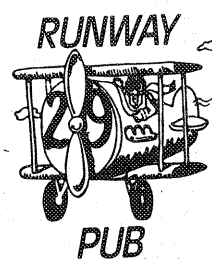

If you are an engineering technology or applied science technology student eligible for ASET membership and are about to graduate (see eligible program list below), there are two important things for you to remember:

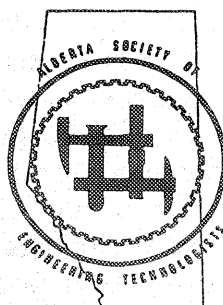

(2) If you are **not** an ASET Student Member, you may still obtain T.T. membership **at no cost** by sending in a T.T. membership application. Application forms are available from your program head, the Students' Association Office or the Employment Referral Office. Applications must be sent to the Registrar's Office before June 30 to avoid application fees and 1992 membership dues. Applicants for T.T. membership after June 30 will be invoiced for these costs, so apply now!

Membership in the Alberta Society of Engineering Technologists gives you a wide range of fringe benefits, publications, discount programs, meetings, etc.. The most important benefit, however, is the "running start" towards achieving a professional credential. at home; cleaning and application of preventive fluoride products in dental offices; applying dental sealants to minimize the possibility of decay; and the seeking of regular dental checkups.

Adults:

- Ensuring early diagnosis, treatment and future prevention of gum disease, through the promotion of good oral health programs. People over 40 lose more teeth due to gum disease than to tooth decay.

Dental health promotion material outlines how changes have been made both in surroundings and procedures in order to promote comfort. Pain is a late indicator of dental problems, and as emphasized, early detection of problems, from cavities, to gum disease, to oral cancer will permit the most effective treatment, with the best possible outcome.

Older Adults and Seniors:

- Ensuring effective chewing ability through proper fitting of complete and partial dentures. Recognizing that the underlying bone shrinks over time and dentures need relining or replacing at regular intervals. Also ensuring prevention of gum disease that could result in future tooth loss.

Distribution of dental health information will be relayed to targeted age groups through the dental office, the Health Units of Alberta, educational displays, school visits, other health professions' publications and the media. The Annual School Poster Contest, K-7, is also held to heighten dental awareness amongst school-aged children. (Refer to Poster Contest Feature enclosed).

The April 1992 Dental Health Campaign also emphasizes the importance of a total health approach, as dental professionals encourage the public to look at Good Dental Health as a Step to Total Health.

"Dental Health cannot be looked at in isolation," says Dr. Stone. Whether it be overall nutritional intake, and the need for good chewing ability; or the question of hygiene and reducing the risk of infection through gum disease or dental caries; or the screening for oral cancer; or the psychological impact of improving self-image, the bottom line is dental health's impact on the individual's total health."

The Ooks controlled the third outshooting the Trojans 20 to 2, but could not beat SAIT's Eric Badzgon.

NAIT's Alec Sheflo, the all tournament goaltender, recorded the shutout and faced a total of 11 shots. SAIT's Eric Badzgon turned away 38 of 43 blasts.

NAIT coach Perry Pearn was elated with the victory. "You're always excited going into a game of the caliber, and from a coaching standpoint I was really pleased with the team's performance. We've been a strong defensive club all year and to hold SAIT, which is not a bad club offensively, to 11 shots is a sign that we were on top of our game."

With the win, the Ooks have defeated the eventual CIAU champion and won the CCAA title in the same season for the third time. 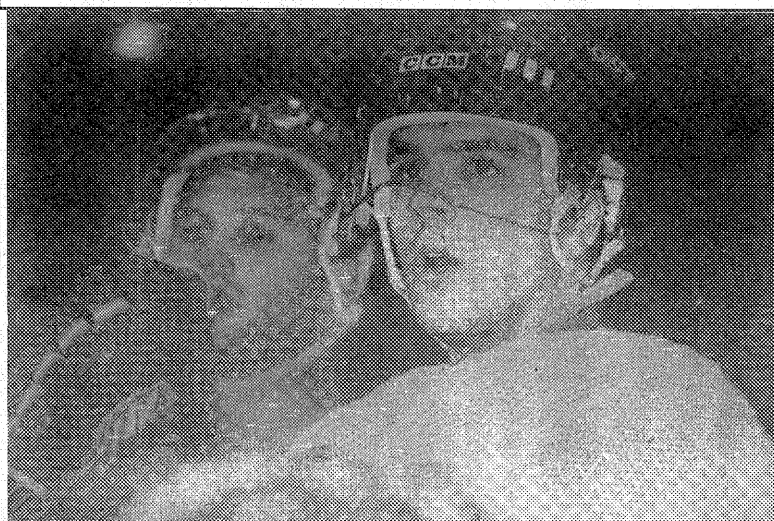

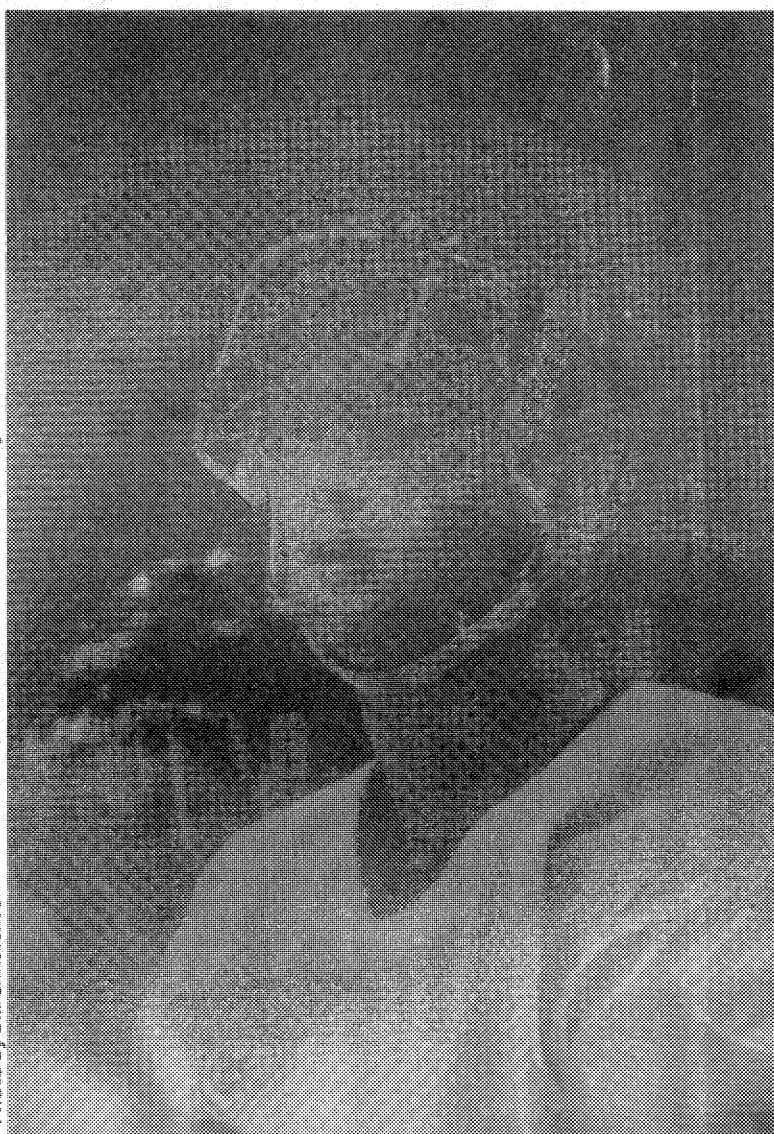

A very confident and determined NAIT ladies team, skipped by Terry Peterson, lived up to early season expectations by edging Grande Prairie 8 - 6 in the Provincial final, March 1, 1992. This marked NAIT's 19th Provincial curling title and the third consecutive gold for the NAIT ladies.

Curling superbly now, NAIT forced Grande Prairie to take one on the 9th and controlled the tenth for a 6 - 5 victory.

The men's division had parity all year and everyone knew the Provincials would be a toss-up. The boys were sharp in the round robin, edging Lakeland 6 - 5, SAIT 6 - 5, and Augustana 5 - 3 to finish first. Tim Schneider and his team of John Mulyk, Paul Sorensen and Kevin Marks looked poised to win the semi-final game. The score was 3 - 3 after eight, but a steal of 1 on 9 and 10 gave Augustana a 5 - 3 victory. Disheartened by their tough loss they curled poorly in the bronze game losing 8 - 1 to SAIT.

The mixed, who finished 2nd in the regionals, were the cinderella team as no less than ten players were forced in and out of the line-up due to injuries and graduation. The magic that was theirs all year deserted skip Paul

Briske and his team of Sharon Bowman, Dave Zubot and Kim Pringle as they lost all three games in the round robin, 5 - 4 to Grant MacEwan, 8 - 1 to Grande Prairie and 7 - 6 to Lakeland. Their fortunes didn't change in the medal rounds. Grant MacEwan sparked them 8 - 2 and in the bronze game, Grande Prairie beat them 9 - 5.

NAIT curlers finished the competition with an 8 - 7 record and one gold medal. Combined with the regionals, they won 27 games and lost 17.
