# Still Hope for Stipends

NAIT President Stan Souch met last Thursday with Advanced Education Deputy Minister Lynne Duncan to express his strong concern over Alberta Health's proposal to end stipends to medical technology students.

Same 340 NAIT stuare paid approximately \$500 per month for their 40 hours of work each week at Edmonton's hospitals.

The suggested ending of these stipends has outraged many students who work continuously through their 24 month programs and are dependent solely upon these stipends for income.

Souch backed the students saying that, "to make such changes consultation or sufficient notice is unfair to students who have planned on the basis of support being available."

Cream your "favorite" instructor!!


This was the theme on Wednesday, March 18th. The Computer Systems Technology Graduation Committee held a pie throw to raise money for their graduation banquet.



(UNTIL they do something wrong that is.) Maybe the upcoming byelections are a sign of hope, with 10 nominees for 2 from positions, technologies.

It's those who feel they have to complain when they don't have the motivation to do anything about it. Stating that you feel that the executive is underpaid is not whining. If you were sitting



problems facing students?



the band came when guitarist "steamin" Steve Clark died of a drug overdose after years of abuse:


Adrenalize is check full of the rockers and ballads which are full of Def Leppard's trademark riffs and musical arrangements.


