The annual NAIT Athletic Awards Banquet was held April 3rd in the NAIT Cafetorium. The event highlighted the outstanding achievements in the field of athletics for 1991-92.

The President's Award for Top Female Athlete of the year was awarded to veteran volleyball captain Daina Koska. Daina's in her second year with the Oaks women's volleyball team. The Basic Banking Student was chosen CCAA All-Canadian and was a unanimous selection for ACAC 1st team all-star during the 1991-92 season.

Daina will be returning to NAIT next season to continue her success with the Oaks.

The NAIT Male Athlete of the Year honors went to Basketball's Rob Hansuk. Rob is in his third year at NAIT having graduated with a Finance Diploma and is currently enrolled in Business Management. This year, Hansuk was named second ACAC All Star and was named Silver Torch winner for his team, which is the highest recognized

Still Hope for Stipends

NAIT President Stan Souch met last Thursday with Advanced Education Deputy Minister Lynne Duncan to express his strong concern over Alberta Health's proposal to end stipends to medical technology students.

Some 340 NAIT students are paid approximately \$500 per month for their 40 hours of work each week at Edmonton's hospitals.

The suggested ending of these stipends has outraged many students who work continuously through their 24 month programs and are dependent solely upon these stipends for income.

Souch backed the students saying that, "to make such changes without consultation or sufficient notice is unfair to students who have planned on the basis of support being available."

Souch said that he hopes Duncan will express NAIT's concerns to Alberta Health.

After the meeting, Dean of Health Sciences Bill Glanville wanted to make it clear that Alberta Health has not made its final decision.

He said that the wording of the proposal to end stipends was very ambiguous and the earliest medical students can expect a clear decision is after the budget is released next week.

I don't think it's the different technologies that we are in that causes these problems at NAIT and with the NAITSA Executive, but rather the individuals we are. Being in an Engineering technology, you still find time to devote to *The Nugget* (which at times is most likely a less than thankless job). You have obviously made it a priority, where someone else might not.

The fact remains that the majority of the students at NAIT are an apathetic group. Their extent of participation in the NAITSA elections is drawing "extra graphics" on the campaign posters. Only 692 out of an approximate 6500 students voted. (An overwhelming 10%!!) My basic point was that most of the students that attend NAIT must not feel that the 2 years that they spend here are worth the 15 seconds it takes to vote. Maybe some of the

graduating students especially feel it isn't worth their time to vote for an executive that will be in power after they are long gone?

We ask a lot of these students who act as our executive, our "collective student voice." How are they going to know what the general student body wants when no one will say anything? (UNTIL they do something wrong that is.) Maybe the upcoming by-elections are a sign of hope, with 10 nominees for 2 positions, from 5 technologies.

The "whining and crying" that appears in *The Nugget* is obviously not just from one person. If it were, there wouldn't be much of a problem. It's those who feel they have to complain when they don't have the motivation to do anything about it. Stating that you feel that the executive is underpaid is not whining. Saying "they get paid tons and they don't do anything" when the individual didn't even vote, is. I believe the executive raise was approved at the last general council meeting (?). I guess we'll have to wait and see what effect his announcement has.



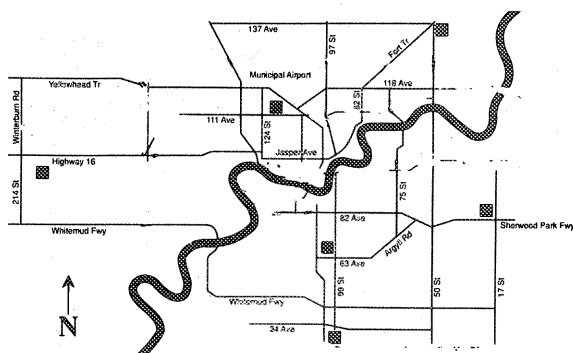
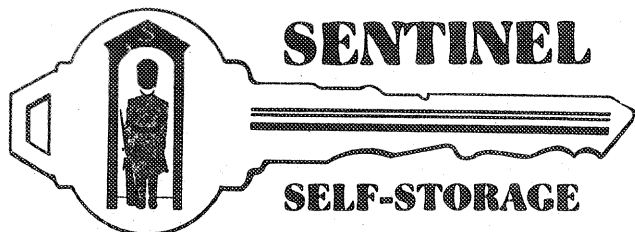

In the interest of generating a meaningful debate on the issues in the upcoming NAITSA executive by-elections, *The Nugget* has asked the

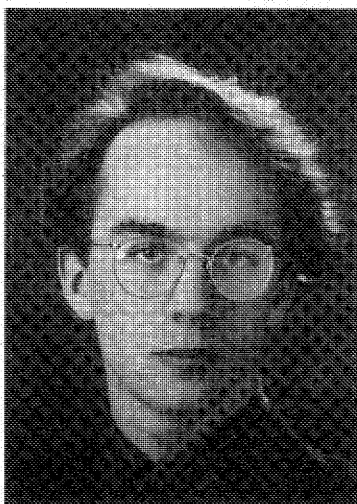
candidates to answer a few questions. Their responses are printed here. Speeches will be held Wednesday,

"Our team played very well together this year and that was the key to our success. We only had two veterans on the team this year - myself and Corry Bespoyasny - but everything really came together for us."

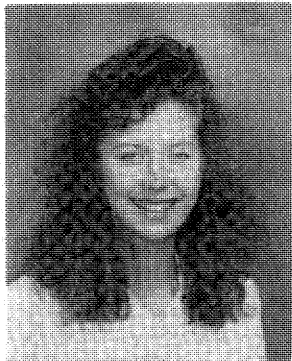
Koska was named captain of the squad and admits that helped her rise to the challenges put forth by NAIT head coach Glen Farmer. "I learned a lot this year, being

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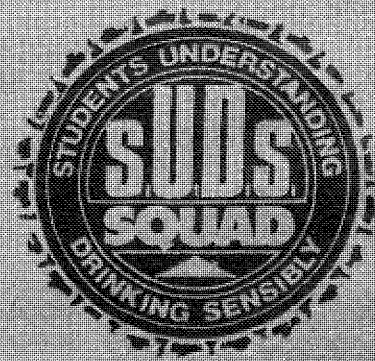
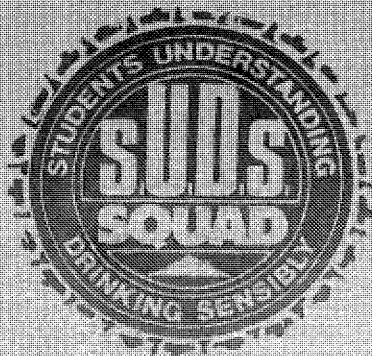

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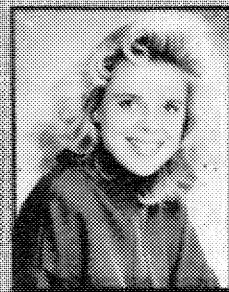
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Strike Leaves Fans Empty-Handed

Now we can only sit back and think back to what life was like before hockey died.

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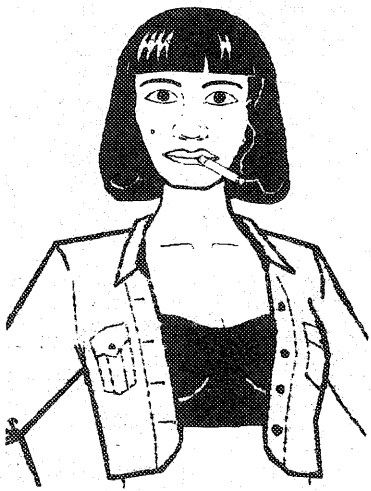
