NAIT STUDENTS TAKE OVER EDMONTON

This year the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology and the University of Alberta will again be organizing Shinerama to raise funds for Cystic Fibrosis research. More than 60 campuses across Canada, representing 20,000 students, intend to raise \$710,000 to support the Foundation's programs.

NAIT's goal is to raise \$14,000. Our goal for the City of Edmonton is to raise \$30,000.

FACTS ABOUT CYSTIC FIBROSIS

-Cystic Fibrosis takes the lives of more Canadian children than any other inherited disease; it attacks the lungs and the digestive system.

-One in 25 Canadians carries the gene for Cystic Fibrosis.

-There is no known cure or control for Cystic Fibrosis.

-Those living with Cystic Fibrosis must undergo rigorous therapy programs everyday just to stay alive.

Canadian CF researchers have achieved extraordinary advances particularly over the past three years, first with the discovery of the gene responsible for CF in August 1989, followed by the correction of the defect in CF under laboratory conditions, just over one year later. Researchers went on to reveal some of the fundamental properties of the CF gene protein and in October, 1991, identified precisely which cells in the body are affected by CF.

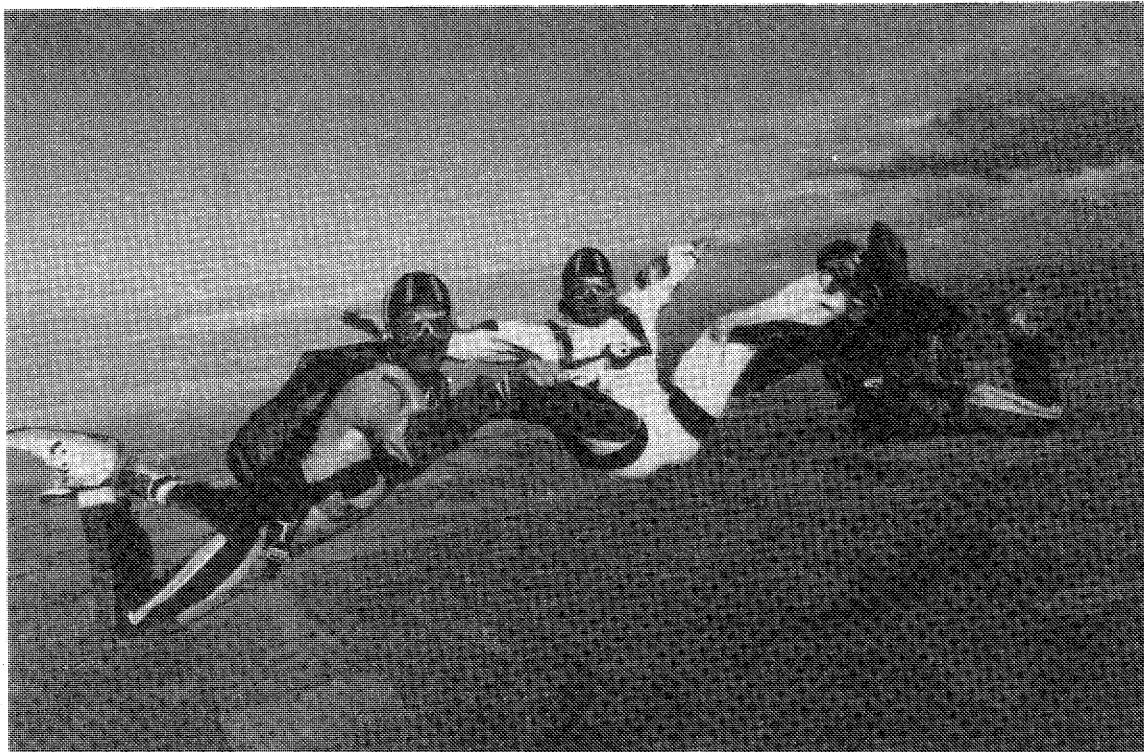
These incredible developments were followed by another exciting announcement; in early January, 1992, we learned that scientists in the United States and France, building on recent Canadian achievements, took a significant step towards gene therapy for CF. On another front, in February, 1992, Canadian researchers significantly advanced the prospect of treating CF through protein replacement.

Balada, Dancing and Romania

The Balada Romanian Folk Dancing Ensemble, a snappy, well trained troupe, is currently recruiting new members for the 1993 performing, touring season.

"We're a group of young Canadians who perform Romanian folk dance to keep Romanian culture alive in Canada," says Artistic Director Ann Smreciu.

Romanian dances are a mixture of movement and style that reflect the country's diversity whose repertoire is borrowed from Romania's five major regions.

With 2,000 years of evolution, the dances mirror many cultural influences - Latin, Greek, Hungarian,

Yugoslavian, Ukrainian, Bulgarian, Middle Eastern and Gypsy. The ethnic variety in the membership of the ensemble also reflects this influence.

Romanian folk dance, an expression of people's powerful passions, is characterized in the men's wild energy and the women's gentle sensuality.

The fast paced dances, a challenge for tireless performers, also express a wide range of human emotions - rage, sorrow, despair, love and joy.

The ensemble, formed in 1975 under the auspices of Saints Constantin and Elena Church in Edmonton, boasts of an active livelihood since

its inception. On an average, the group performs twenty times a year and usually highlights its activities with an international folk festival or workshop when the invitation, or instructor, and finances are available.

Right now Balada is in Romania studying dance under the direction of Viorel Vatamaniuc, Artistic Director of Ciprian Porumbescu, the State Folkloric Ensemble, which will be followed by a

scheduled visit to Costinesti, on the Black Sea, where they will compete in Festival Mondial, an international folk festival.

Upon returning to Canada in September, the ensemble will begin preparing for a competition in Puerto Rico and the fall registration of new members.

"Rehearsals are twice a week with a total of five hours," says Ann.

A dancer's annual fee is a modest \$21.00 with fund raising activities paying for major expenses.

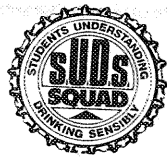
