## THOUSANDS PROTEST CUTBACKS

Advanced Education Minister John Gogo met with thousands of angry students on the steps of the legislature last Friday afternoon.

The estimated 4000 students brought traffic around the high level bridge to a standstill as they marched from the U of A to the legislature in protest of government cuts to post-secondary institutions, chanting "Gogo must go," and "Reelect Gogo, NOT."

At the legislature, protesters heard brief speeches from student and union leaders condemning the government for its lack of commitment to post-

secondary funding.

The march organizer, Wade Deisman, said that "There is an educational doomsday in the foreseeable future if the government's policies do not change." He challenged Gogo to turn back the group's six foot "Doomsday Clock" from its two minutes to midnight position.

Deisman's demands included: restoring capital grants to 1986 levels, greater loan accessibility, higher living allowances and a return of the six month grace period for student loans.

Student's frustrations came to a boil when someone crushed an egg on Gogo's head moments before he was

to address the crowd.

At the speaker's podium, Gogo had no apologies for his government's record. Amid calls for his resignation and chants of "we want action," Gogo defended himself by

saying that Alberta has the lowest tuition fees of any province except Quebec.

"The future belongs to those who are educated. You know that better than I do," said Gogo.

The rally ended with the singing of *O Canada* and students pledging to "campaign for education" in the upcoming provincial election.

## Council Notes

The main focus of the General Council meeting on Tuesday, March 17th, was the proposal for the honorarium increase for NAITSA executive.

The amount of the increase is \$200.00 and if the motion is passed, it would take effect on the first day of the new budgetary year. This exempts the present NAITSA executive.

The motion being to change the NAITSA constitution, that all remunerations shall be increased by \$200.00, must be read three times as it deals with a change in the constitution.

There was a mixed response to this first reading and comments from General Council included using an increase in wage as an incentive to encourage more students to run for the executive.

However, it was also pointed out that the position looks good on a resume and it

is experience rather than wages which should be considered if running for any executive position.

The chart below shows the present breakdown of the wages and benefits received by NAITSA executive compared with other institutes in Alberta.

Other quick notes include congratulations to Carmen Wartjes and Dave Murray who won the position of Academic Council.

There is a blood donor clinic on March 19th and 20th. Last term's clinic was a great success and Dan Lachambre encourages students to help a worthy cause by donating blood.

There will be a fan bus to Calgary on Friday, March 19th. Shane Warawa asks you to come out and watch NAIT play SAIT.

The nominees introduced themselves to the council. Speeches will be next week. Chris Horne urges everyone to listen to speeches and familiarize yourself with candidates.

## Students Demand More Tutors

Some NAIT Engineering students are requesting NAIT to provide them with tutors. They feel there is a lack of help available to them at the NAIT tutoring center.

Students feel tutoring should be provided by NAIT and should not be their financial responsibility.

"It should be provided for us as it is for other students" exclaimed one student.

Presently, NAIT does offer tutorial services free of charge, yet they have been unable to keep up with the tutor demand for students outside the apprenticeship programs.

"The demand exists; why doesn't NAIT meet it?" said another.

This demand is what Kathy Pelletier, Mathematics instructor for Engineering Technologies is interested in. Pelletier told

*The Nugget* that instructors offer to help students on their own time but, unfortunately there can be timetable conflicts which do

not enable students to meet with the instructor for extra help.

This problem could be resolved via tutorials.

"One suggestion," says Pelletier, "is to set up a tutorial on a trial basis at lunch time to see how many students are interested." It would be a good way to start as it would show if there is enough interest to generate a regular tutorial session.

In terms of costs to NAIT, Pelletier feels it is cheaper than having students flunk out.

Presently Engineering students may seek help at the Tutorial Center located at A-135. The center was originally opened for apprentices. Now one third of the students they help are from other techs.

However, the Engineering students do not feel this help is enough.

They are then forced to seek outside help at the cost of \$10.00/hr. A cost they feel should not be theirs.

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## Eggs-actly Right

Last Friday, I had the dubious honor of being one of the very few NAIT students attending the protests against educational underfunding at the Legislature.

Now, I don't pretend to know every single student here at NAIT, nevertheless, it's clear by NAIT's lack of participation that NAIT students think that these rallies are either a waste of their time or beneath their collective dignity.

Unfortunately, these attitudes must change if education is to survive in the new political climate of the 90s. Gone are the days when post-secondary institutions were sheltered from government cutbacks by an underlying Canadian ideology when cutting educational funding meant future economic and social disaster.

Politics in the financially strapped 90s has definitely

changed for the worst. Politics is becoming dominated by special interest groups. It's losing what was left of its ideological base. Decisions are no longer made on the basis of what is the "right" thing to do but on the basis of what is the most politically expedient.

This environment is most detrimental to the politically weak like the poor and, yes, even students, who often become the political fodder of huge economic interests.

This is what makes rallies and demonstrations, like the one held last Friday, so crucial. If education is to be a priority with this, or any government, students must be able to demonstrate the political ramifications of the government's continued cost cutting attitude towards education.

The media coverage of the 4000 students strong demonstration, not to mention the well placed egg, graphically displayed to the general public students' frustrations with the quality and inaccessibility of our education. Hopefully, this momentum can be maintained and make education an issue in the next election.

These types of functions are too important to be left to U of A organizers. While I doubt that there were thousands of NAIT students who even gave a second thought about going to the Legislature, it would have been nice if NAITSA could have been a little better organized. A single bus load of NAIT students would have been at least symbolic.

Nevertheless, a lot was achieved last week, a lot more than a few congenial meetings with ministers. It's clear now, to both the government and opposition parties, that poor funding for education is not just a bad idea but it is no longer even politically expedient.



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

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# ACTISEC Chair Slams CFS

The question "Where was NAITSA?" regarding the federal budget posed by Sandeep Dhir, Mount Royal's President and Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) Alberta representative, raised a great deal of controversy surrounding alleged interference by Dhir into other campuses.

It also called attention to the role NAITSA is playing to benefit the welfare of students.

Although NAITSA is not involved in the Canadian Federation of Students, it is very actively involved in ACTISEC (Alberta College & Technical Institute Student Executive Council).

When questioned about the remarks made by Sandeep Dhir regarding NAITSA, Charlene Petroskey, ACTISEC Chair, speaking on her own behalf rather than the Chair, objected very strongly. She felt Dhir should not be interfering with other campuses.

Petroskey explained the role of ACTISEC is to provide a communication network for schools. It is through this network that

ACTISEC is able to represent students to the provincial government.

Petroskey claimed that this representation is well received by the provincial government who officially recognizes ACTISEC. The same does not hold for CFS which is not officially recognized by either the provincial or the federal government said Petroskey.

ACTISEC deals with the provincial government, not the federal government, since education is the responsibility of the provincial government. As stated by Charlene Petroskey, "it is more effective to deal with the government who is making the decisions."


Petroskey also discussed the differences in tactics between the two groups. ACTISEC uses a more conservative approach but one that is recognized by the provincial government. CFS is very vocal and this causes recognition from the media.

"ACTISEC aims to work within reality," said Petroskey. She explained that her group does not want to portray students as being "whiny and unwilling to compromise." Rather Petroskey feels ACTISEC is

proactive; it understands the reality of the economic situation and it works with what the government provides.

Petroskey, in closing, added that Chris Horne from NAITSA is "doing a great job and is serving NAIT students well." He is involved in helping ACTISEC remain focussed on post-secondary education. She also told *The Nugget* that although ACTISEC was not involved in the CFS rally, they are still working for the students, however, they are using a different approach.

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
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


25 at 12:15 in the Naitrium and Thursday March 26 at 12:15 in the Westwood Lounge.



**What qualifications do you bring to the office that you seek?**

Any student association representative will agree that one of the biggest problems with the Student Association organization is continuity. What I mean by this is it takes at least half of your term to become familiar with the organization; what strings that can and should be pulled and when to pull them, how to handle student concerns and much more. This leaves only half a term to be truly effective. If I were to be re-elected, my full term would be effective. As current Academic V.P., I have worked hand-in-hand with the president on all

The halfhearted reasons for NAITSA's action given to *The Nugget* are tantamount to intentional misdirection of the student body. Also, it is imperative that NAITSA's functions become profitable, namely the Rock'N'Talks and the Nest.

**What changes would you like to bring to this position?**

I intend to bring two

major changes to the Student Association.

1. NAITSA must furnish all details of their decision making process to the General Council, and to *The Nugget*. Only then can we expect to end student apathy and effect real change.

2. Provide leadership. For years, the executive council have made policy to provide safety for themselves in the political arena. Students deserve better.

**Other Comments?**

This year, more than ever, NAIT students find themselves at a crossroads. They must decide the next Student Association that will speak for them, and spend their money, in a way that will improve their lives, or a Student Association that will bury them.

**What do you think are the biggest problems facing students?**



Other Comments?



My goal is to enhance NAIT's out-of-class atmosphere and help relieve student stress by coordinating the kind of quality events and activities that make great memories possible.


The past NAITSA executive council has done a fantastic job keeping the lines of communication open between students and administration. It will be my

# Ooks, Trojans Split

The SAIT Trojans did what no other ACAC hockey team could do this season - they beat the Ooks in the NAIT arena. The Trojans took a 1-0 lead in the best of five final series last Friday when they topped the Ooks 3-2. NAIT rebounded the following night, coming out on the right side of a thrilling 6-5 overtime win.

On Friday, the Ooks built up a 2-0 lead and outshot the Trojans 18-0 in the first period of Game One, but SAIT counted two in the second to pull even with their northern rivals. Then, with 2:19 left in the game, Dean Hansen of the Trojans hit teammate Randy Keller with a breakaway pass. Keller made a nifty move and went five-hole on goaltender Alec Sheffo, giving SAIT an upset victory over the favored Ooks.

On Saturday the Ooks didn't just get mad, they got even. Captain Greg Geldart scored once and set up another before assisting on Trevor McCallion's game winning goal. McCallion checked a SAIT player off the puck and Geldart picked it up and fired it toward the net. McCallion recovered his own rebound and knocked in the winner.

"We knew that our backs were against the wall this afternoon," said league scoring champ Geldart. "That's why we didn't run out of steam in overtime. - if they score we're down 2-0 (in the series) and they'd only have to win one in their own building and the series is over."

McCallion teamed up with Ooks linemate Kevin Lovig earlier in the period for an excellent scoring opportunity. Lovig batted down an errant clearing attempt by a SAIT player and whipped a good shot on net. McCallion tried to slap in the rebound but Badzgon came up with the save.

SAIT had a tremendous opportunity to win three minutes into overtime. Troy McIvor tipped a Jeff Perlinger feed but All-Conference goalie Don Davidge made a good glove grab to preserve the tie.

"We came up here looking for a split," said Trojan, Scott Blakeman. "Of course we would have liked to have won both but we're happy where we are."

Rookie blueliner Sean Hebert had a solid game for the Ooks, delivering several crushing bodychecks to Trojan players. He absolutely leveled Perlinger in overtime, getting a loud burst of applause from the 700 plus crowd on hand.

"We knew we couldn't lose this (Game 2)," said Hebert. "This afternoon was a do or

die situation for us, but there are a lot of guys on this team with a lot of heart and dedication."

NAIT had a 5-3 lead in Game 2 when SAIT's Calvin Knibbs ran through the home teams' crease and put himself, Davidge and the puck in the net. Knibbs was interfering with the goalie and the net came off its moorings before the puck crossed the line but referee George McCorry allowed the goal.

Perlinger sent the game into overtime with a rocket from the point that blew by Davidge. Both teams had opportunities to score before overtime but the puck stayed out of the net until McCallion's goal.

Geldart was cautiously optimistic about the rest of the series.

"We got caught on a few bad changes but overall we played well. We got some great individual efforts from some of the young guys."

"We're going to need a lot of effort and hard work going into Calgary (this Friday and Saturday) but if we display the same emotion that we did in overtime we'll be successful."


The fellas who wrote this could have been more original in developing the

But, if you are looking for an original science fiction film, you might be a little disappointed.


