Candidates Address Engineering Students

A moderately sized crowd at the Dock in the Engineering Annex played host last Tuesday to the candidates for next year's NAITSA executive elections in the first in a series of three speeches held around campus.

First up was Board of Governors candidate, Taras Kaznistry who will run on a yes/no ballot. Among other things, he pledged to oppose future tuition hikes that may

be proposed by the board.

Unfortunately, Athletics V.P. candidate Dale Ellice was injured over the weekend and could not attend, yet, his speech was read. He emphasized a desire to organize fan buses for Ooks away games and more activities before and after home games.

His opponent, Candace Visser, highlighted her plans to improve the participation and stature of intramurals and Challenge Cup on campus.

The final candidate for Athletics V.P., Kelly Terrabain, was unable to attend.

Activities V.P. candidate Karen Rolf expressed the importance of activities to relieve student stress. She said she would improve events, Rock 'N' Talks, and tech fundraising, making them more profitable.

Her opponent, Shane Warawa, stressed his executive experience and his desire to have more coordinated activities with other colleges in the Alberta Colleges and Technical Institute Student Executive Council.

The sole candidate for Administrative V.P. Leslie Parke promoted her campaign by emphasizing her enthusiasm and familiarity with NAITSA.

Academic V.P. candidate Brad Balkan promised to address student apathy, the biggest problem on campus as he sees it.

Balkan's opponent, Debbi Serafinchon, vowed to give the student grievance procedure at NAIT a higher profile with students that it needs to be effective.

Finally, the sole candidate for President, Dan Lachambre had more of a question and answer session than a prepared speech. Question topics ranged from student apathy to when the Dock will get its TV replaced.

Election day is tomorrow.

By-Election Update

Pasay Pulls Out

Tim Pasay, presidential candidate for NAITSA has withdrawn from the election.

Pasay cited personal reasons for this decision made on Friday, March 20th. Pasay told *The Nugget*, "I can't afford to live on \$600 or \$800 a month without getting a part time job." Pasay feels it would not be fair to students if he could not devote 100% to this position.

Pasay's decision makes Dan Lachambre the sole

candidate for president. This means a yes or no vote on the ballot.

Dan Lachambre has based his campaign on encouraging students to become informed on who they will vote for. He feels Pasay's withdrawal "reduces the students choice."

Election day is Friday, March 27th from 10:15 a.m. - 3:15 p.m.. Any full time student can vote at the business tower lounge, NAITSA offices, main kiosk, north cafetorium, Plaza II, and Westwood.

Shameless Popularity Contests

During the past week's onslaught of NAITSA executive campaigning, it has become clear that this year's election has succumbed to some of the regrettable tendencies characterizing student (and especially NAITSA) elections.

Firstly, school elections have a nasty habit of degenerating into shameless popularity contests. This campaign, for example, lacks any kind of debate over contentious issues that affect students. Is there anything that one candidate has said that his/her opponent would not agree with? Instead of trying to garner student support with ideas, most candidates prefer to follow the "whoever has the nicest posters wins" strategy. Unfortunately, this philosophy leaves the electorate with very little to base their vote, aside from the

way the candidate looks on their poster.

Secondly, the NAITSA executive is almost always dominated by, if not entirely, Business students. Of course there is nothing wrong with Business students being part of the executive, yet, the NAITSA executive should reflect the entire student body. An executive composed completely of members of one technology are less capable of knowing the attitudes in other technologies. A better cross-section gives, in my opinion, a better executive.

One reason for this situation is that it's more difficult for other non-Business students to participate in the NAITSA executive. Most technologies' schedules are much less flexible than Business'. Furthermore, a NAITSA reference on a resume generally looks less impressive to an Engineering Technologist than to a Business student.

Perhaps part of a solution to this problem is higher salaries for the executive. Even after this years expected \$200 per month raise, our executive is one of the lowest paid in the country. The SAIT president earns \$1,600 per month as compared to NAITSA president that will earn \$860 per month. Considering that NAIT has roughly double the full-time students, a raise does not seem unreasonable and could, if nothing else, entice more candidates out of the woodwork for next year's election.

Animal Position Found Contradictory

Dear Editor:

I am writing this in response to the "... bringing much needed tourist dollars. ...", and the "... clear-cut in Canada ..." letters that were recently published in this paper. Mr. or Ms. Animal, I find your positions on clear-cutting and ski hill expansion to be contradictory. I am not exactly sure what you mean by expanding and modernizing, but I will fathom a guess. Expansion would no doubt involve an increase in the total skiable terrain, more lifts, and more accommodation. Modernization would probably mean bigger and faster lifts, and upgraded food services. The increase in total skiable terrain would push many animals out of their present habitats, possibly causing irreparable damage to populations of certain species of animals. More lifts would involve a great deal of construction activity in the areas. Have you thought about how to get the parts and components needed to build these lifts into the area? Trucking it in would be the most logical choice, as helicopters are too expensive. New roads would

have to be built to allow the trucks to deliver the equipment. This would result in clearing large numbers of trees, possibly driving animals from habitats, and thereby having an untold effect on the ecosystem and food chain. I would suggest that more accommodations would require similar activity, and have similar consequences. Faster chair lifts would require more energy to run them, either from fossil fuels or electricity, both choices having negative effects on the ecological system. Modernized and expanded food services would likely mean more waste, creating disposal problems. In your letter about clear cutting, you seemed very concerned with the ecology and conservation of wilderness areas. Yet three weeks later, you seem to think that commercial development in our National Parks is more important.

Apparently you do not realize that people from all over the world come to Jasper and Banff because they are two of the most natural and undeveloped areas in the world. When you compare them to big

resorts, such as Whistler or Aspen, they are low priced, have short lift lines, and great snow. There is a large market of people who don't want to pay \$45 for a lift ticket so that they can stand in lift lines that are twenty minutes long. They don't want to ski in the rain with ten thousand other skiers, and then battle traffic to get back to crowded accommodation areas. Why not market Sunshine Village, Lake Louise, Mt. Norquay, and Marmot Basin to this group of people, instead of trying to compete in an already saturated market? I am sure that operators can fill resorts to capacity levels if they changed their marketing strategies. As a skier, conservationist, and future businessman who hopes to make millions of dollars, I leave you with one question: Why would we want ski areas in our National Parks to expand and modernize when they can develop new marketing strategies for a lot less money, run their hills at capacity levels, and have less impact on the National Park ecosystem?

to remain operating. Doesn't he realize the government is refusing to invest in its most valuable resource, its people?



The 1992 Nait Open House Mascot prize goes to Biological Sciences for the Spider.

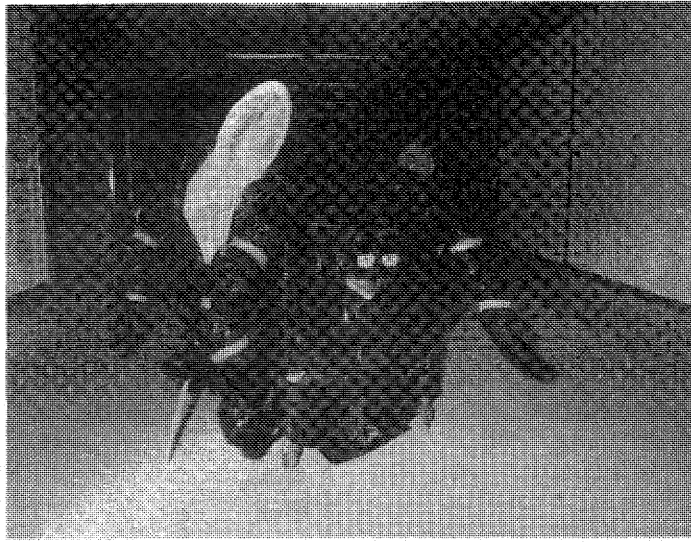

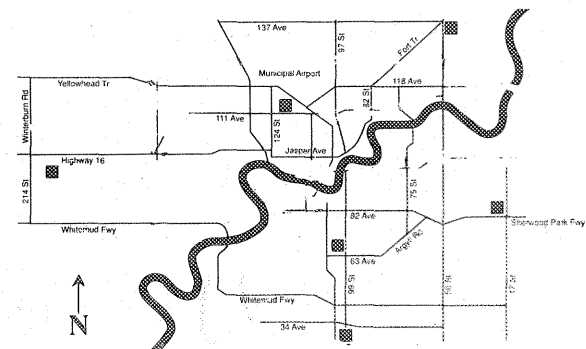
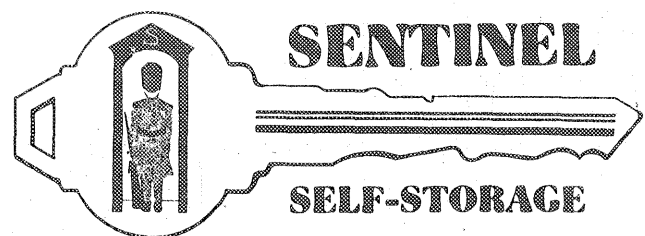

How to Get a Job ...

With summer just around the corner most NAIT students will be looking for employment. Finding a job can be hard today with Alberta's tough economic situation.

But don't despair, *The Nugget* talked to Pat Quilley, Placement Officer at the NAIT Placement Center who provided tips on how to be effective in finding a job.

The first question students should ask is how are they going to use their resume.

Quilley told *The Nugget* the response rate is only 3%

to an unsolicited general resume.

A resume should be job specific. "It should be tailor made to a certain job," says Quilley.

In order to do this, it is the students' responsibility to know what type of work they would like to do. Once this is done it is up to the students to locate what companies they are able to work for and what skills they can offer to the company.

By preparing a list of prospective employers, students can use their resume effectively.

Send your resume with an attached personalized cover letter to each chosen

company. Indicate in your cover letter that you will be contacting them to further discuss your qualifications.

When you place your follow-up call, Quilley stressed not to assume that they have read your resume. This is remedied by introducing yourself and briefly telling them about your qualifications.

This phone call is important because it makes you "become more than a piece of paper" says Quilley. It also gives you more control of the situation because you are not just sitting and waiting for a response; you are actively pursuing one.

It was also suggested by

Quilley to address all correspondence to the individual in charge of hiring.

"Another option for students" says Quilley "is to do informational interviews." This is when you, the student, talk to people in a chosen field and ask questions about the job. The purpose of these interviews is to learn more about an occupation, to introduce yourself to the people who do the hiring, and to obtain referrals for other potential employers.

There are many options available to students to find employment. These include the Canadian Placement Center, the Yellow Pages, employment agencies and NAIT's Placement Agency. Quilley urges students to

"use everything that is available to them."

Quilley also encourages students to remain active in their search. She realizes it can be a very trying time for students as being turned down by an employer is hard on the ego. However, Quilley recommends students to keep busy so they feel like they are getting something accomplished. This helps to keep a person feeling good about him or herself. This is important as Quilley stated, "how can you market yourself when you feel down."

The Placement Center is open to all students and it offers many services to students including reading over resumes, job opportunities, and mock interviews.

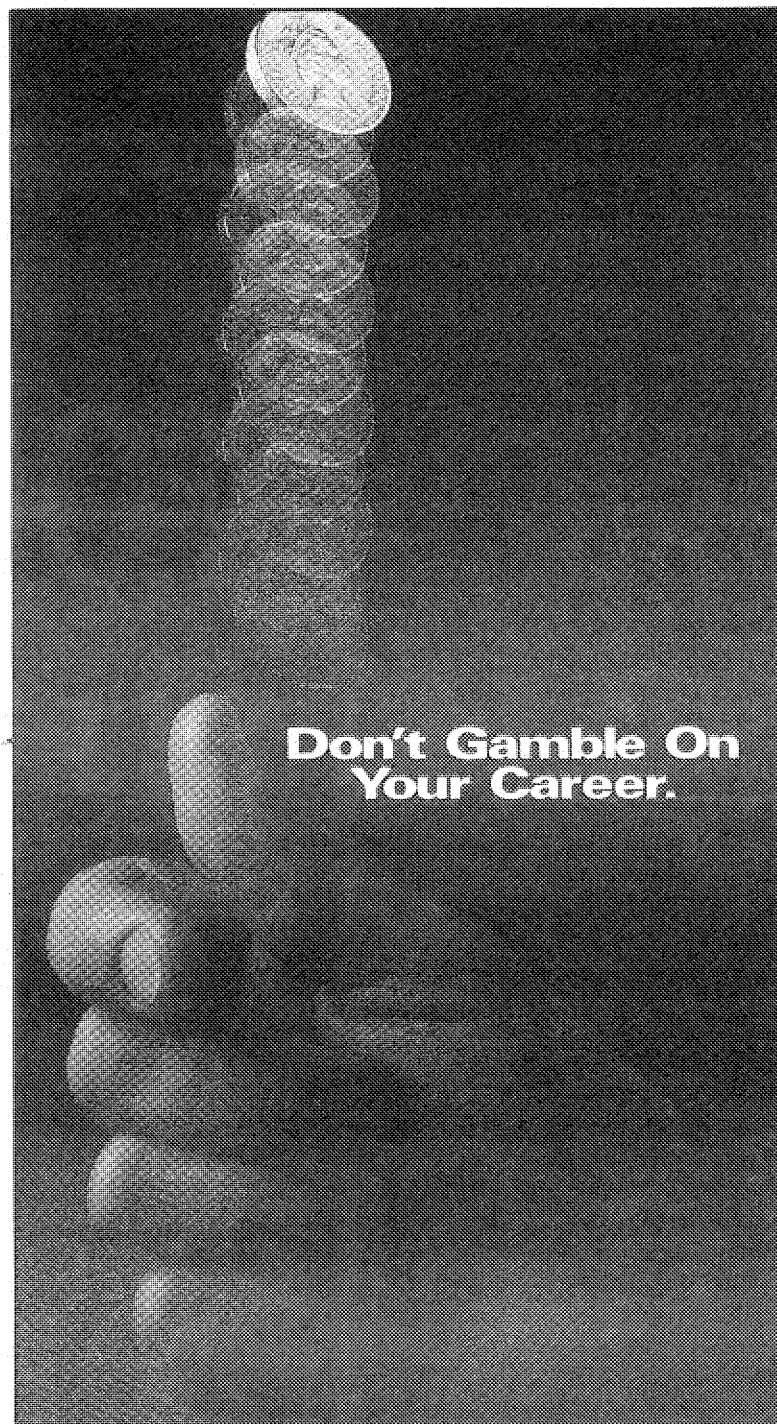

Government Funding "a Challenge"

Government funding, or lack thereof, to post-secondary educational institutions has been a hot topic on Canadian campuses this year. NAIT students are about to feel the crunch next year when tuitions increase by \$100. The NAIT Board of Governors recently passed a motion to increase tuitions, falling in line with the government's policy that, over time, students should pay 20% of their total education bill. figures) are being maintained. This obviously begs the question, "What effects, if any, are government cutbacks having on NAIT as a whole?"

"Cutbacks is a very poor choice of words when it comes to funding," exclaimed Williamson. In reality, the government has not cut funding at all, but rather increased it. The problem lies in that the funding increase is less than the rate of inflation. With this in mind, the answer to the funding crunch is to rely less on government funding and to increase private sector support. Thus, the NAIT Foundation was created.

The NAIT Foundation works to obtain private sector donations to the institute. This has proven to be a rather successful way to combat the decline of government funding.

As for the question of grants, Williamson remarked that most of the

attention is focused on the operating grants (monies targeted for instruction, maintenance, etc.) as opposed to capital grants (money allocated for new buildings, equipment purchases, etc.). The institute has been "very sharply hit" when it comes to capital grant money. In fact, "capital grants are now less than half than what they were five years ago." NAIT, being a technical school and requiring modern equipment to train its students, relies heavily on the capital grant monies in order to keep up the high standards of its graduates.

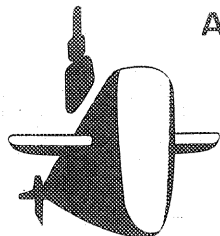
"It is a challenge," admits Williamson, "but we [the administration] feel that we are doing the best job we can with what we have available to us."

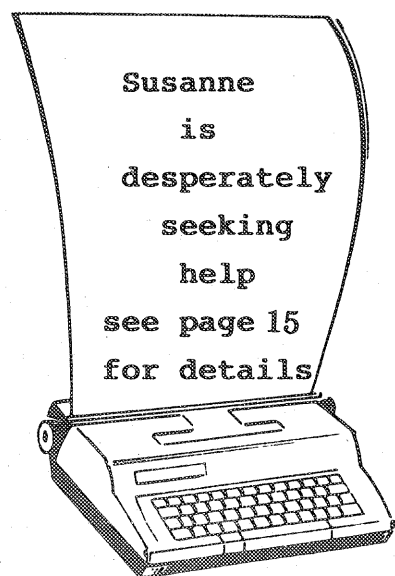

NAIT vs. SAIT

The SAIT Trojans used smoke and mirrors to force a final game in their best of five ACAC final with NAIT, but the Oaks systematically destroyed the Trojan's defence when it counted, winning 9-1 last Sunday.

Mark Souch, notched four goals, two within 14 seconds of each other, to lead the NAIT squad to their third straight ACAC title and eighth in ten years.

"We had the jump in the first period tonight," explained Souch.

when Souch put on a show for the 675 plus fans in the stands. He cut in from the wing, driving hard for the net. Anticipating Badzgon's poke check, he shifted the puck to his backhand and went top shelf.

SAIT coach Ken Babey pulled Badzgon out of the game after Souch's goal, but the goaltender was not the reason the Trojans lost the series. He faced 201 shots in the first four games alone, letting in a paltry 15 goals. Badzgon was easily the best player on the ice for Games 1-4.

The Trojan players were obviously disappointed to lose the finals, but most felt a lot of positives could be drawn from the experience.

"I thought our effort was pretty good throughout the first four games," said SAIT forward Rylan Ferster. "We were hoping to put in the same effort tonight, but..."

Teammate Randy Keller expanded on Ferster's thoughts.

"We needed to protect our goalies and we didn't. Maybe our defensive game wasn't handled the way it should have been. All in all, I think everything just fell apart at once."

The entire series was highly entertaining with the exception of Game 5. The Trojans ran on pure emotions for the first four games and used the hot goaltending of Badzgon to push the literal gods' of college hockey to their limits.

"Look what NAIT did to Mount Royal (three game sweep)," added Keller. "I think maybe a lot of people thought they'd do that to us too. But during the first four games we showed them we're a serious hockey team. Today was just one of those days."

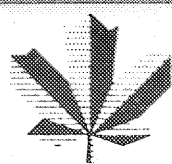
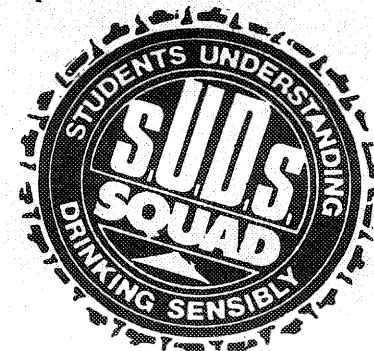
Kalvin Knibbs sent the game into overtime with a

Randy Wong, 3rd year D-man for the Oaks, was frustrated with the loss but confident going back to NAIT for the deciding game.

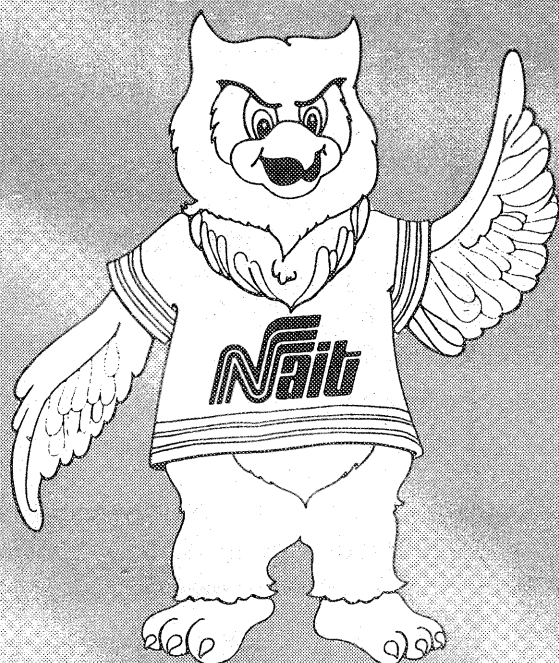

Women's ACAC Soccer Looks Hopeful

Women soccer players at NAIT may soon have a league to play in. The ACAC will be adding a women's soccer league to its list of provincial sports if everything goes as scheduled in the next few weeks.

NAIT instructor Bob Buchan has been leading the crusade to form an Alberta women's college soccer league. Buchan has solicited Lethbridge, SAIT, Mount Royal, Red Deer and Grant MacEwan Colleges to join the league for the 1992 - 93 season.

There must be consent from a minimum of four Alberta colleges to make women's soccer an officially sanctioned ACAC sport. And becoming a sanctioned sport enables all participating teams to be eligible for the Jimmy Condon Heritage Scholarships, worth \$1000 per player.

"That's a huge amount of money since NAIT will get \$16,000 in scholarships. With all the other teams in the province, that's a lot of money which will be going to athletes in Alberta. So, it's an economic battle as well as a battle to get the ladies a chance to play the sport they love," says Buchan.

As it stands, Alberta is the only province in Canada which doesn't compete in the

women's National Soccer Competition.

But Alberta Colleges have been working towards forming an ACAC league for the past few years. Five provincial teams have been competing against one another in exhibition play for two years and as Buchan points out it's now time to make the league 'official'.

"We're ready for the league. Everyone at NAIT has been very supportive."

NAIT's confident in its abilities to financially support a women's team. But, with recent government cutbacks, it's been a difficult road for many Alberta colleges.

"I have to be optimistic but it's hard to guess what's in the minds of other colleges and what their financial situations are like."

The NAIT Ooks and the SAIT Trojans have already committed to joining the league for the 1992-93 season. The rest of the colleges have until April 30th to submit their applications. Buchan is optimistic that the remaining colleges will be as enthusiastic as NAIT has been.

"NAIT has definitely been a leader in all of this. There are a lot of keen soccer players here who are very anxious to play the game and because we have so much support, we're trying to

speed the process up and get the league underway as quickly as possible," Buchan says.

Soccer is one of the most popular women's sports in Alberta and has been played in local high schools for over a decade. The university of Alberta Pandas Team has also established itself as a top-rated team.

"We're now very close to having a team at NAIT. The enthusiasm has been good throughout Alberta. Now, hopefully the remaining athletic directors will follow in NAIT's footsteps and join us in forming the first ACAC women's soccer league."

"Last time we were down in Toronto it was a tough

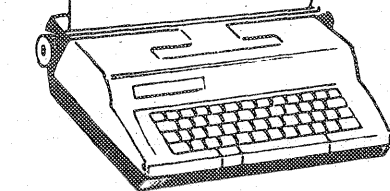
series," lamented Perkins, a veteran defenceman.

Mark Souch, a rookie this year, thinks that because of the format of the tournament the fans will be treated to great hockey.

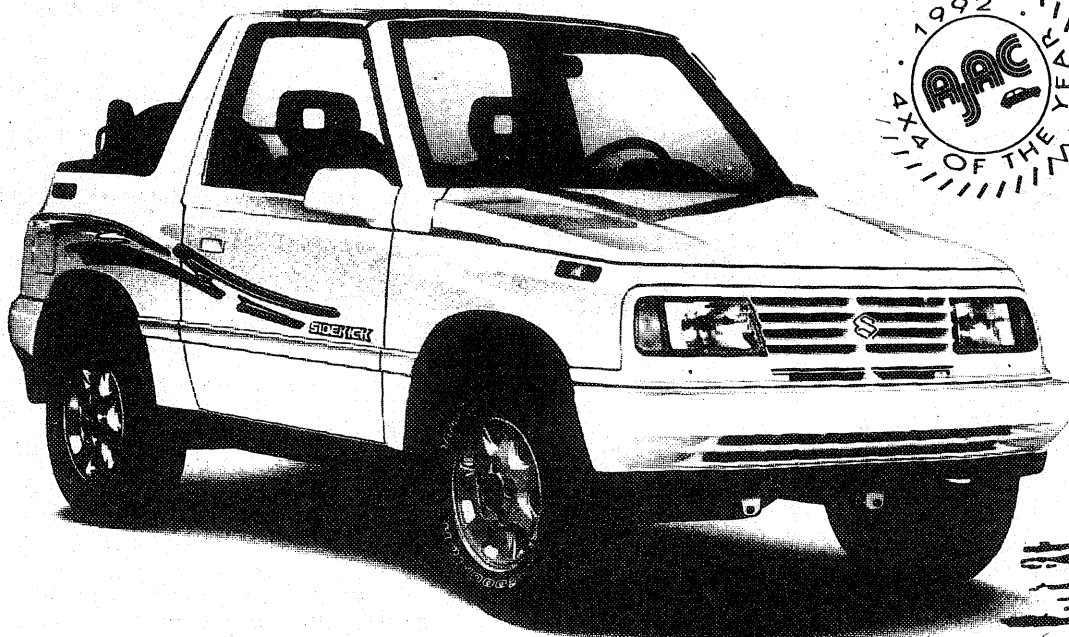

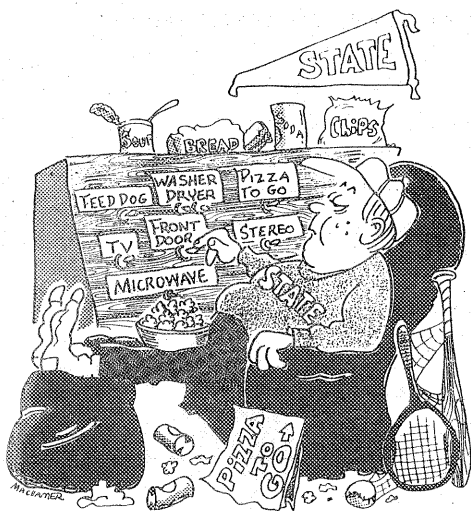


Health and Lifestyle

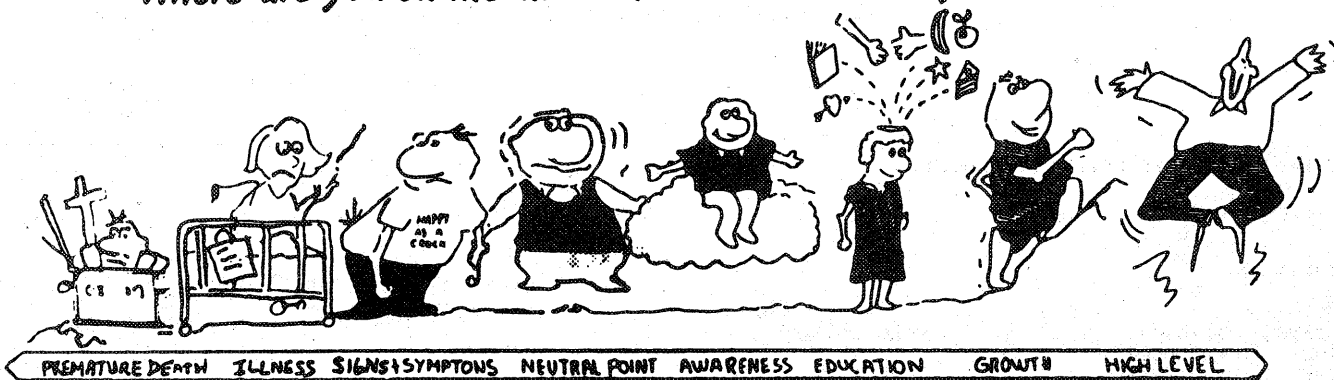

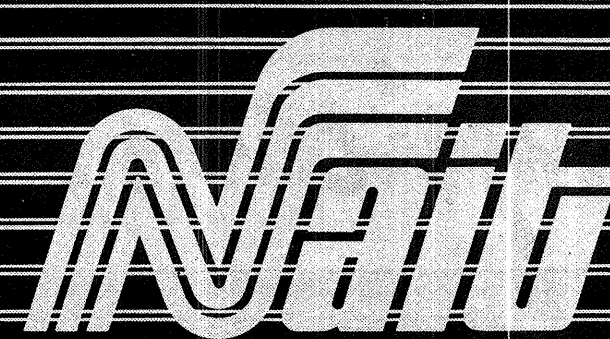
details in the Staff Inservice calendar.

- Be specific about the type of position being applied for. An answer like, "anything" or "whatever you have open" doesn't let the employer know what you can do.
- List past work experience from most to least recent employers. Include positive results achieved on the job.
- When listing educational information, include dates of attendance, names of schools, and certificates obtained. If significant to the job, include training courses taken, special awards obtained or offices and membership held.
- Past salaries and current salary expectations are sometimes requested. Stating you are open to negotiation increases your chance of obtaining an interview.
- If there is one, fill in the "Additional Comments" section. It's the one place on the form you can expand upon your personal skills, strengths, and reasons for being interested in the job.
- Don't provide copies of your marks, performance appraisals or letters of recommendation unless asked. But do take along samples of your work.
- Once completed, check the form over. Is all the information included, accurate, neatly presented, and in the right place?

After the interview, take time to assess your performance to help you learn from it. Ask yourself the following questions and be honest:

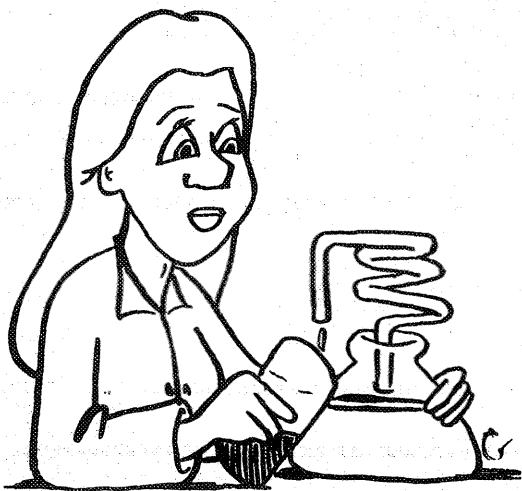
- Was I prepared? Did I know enough about the company and the job?

If you feel the interview was not successful, don't be discouraged. Keep trying to improve, learning with each new experience.

Follow-up

Depending upon the type of job you are applying for and the particular context of your interview, you should send a follow-up letter to the interviewer expressing your appreciation for the opportunity to meet with him/her and adding anything new that might reinforce your application.

Receiving your letter soon after the interview will further reinforce the memory of your meeting and may prompt the employer to take immediate action and to make a decision.

Time to Take a Step Ahead, Not Three Back

NAIT is playing host to the CCAA Hockey Cup '92 at the NAIT Arena this week. This tournament is of national caliber should spark interest across the nation, yet it does receive its deserved recognition.

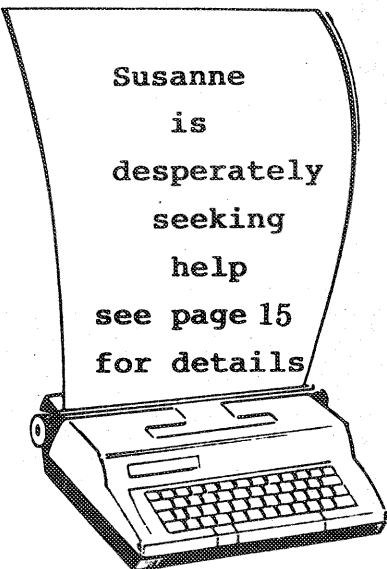
The CCAA has done little over the years to heighten the profile of its schools and has taken a back seat to the CIAU. The fault lies directly in the hands of executive director Clare Gillespie who has done nothing of consequence to encourage the continuation of national level competitions in hockey and curling among other sports.

In 1990-91, when TSN expressed interest in televising CCAA National Hockey Championships, Gillespie should have done whatever was possible to bring about a championship so that the profile of the CCAA could have been heightened. Instead, Gillespie, decided that riding the straight and narrow road to oblivion was better.

It is high time that the power brokers of post-secondary sport convince others that athletic competition can bring more

good publicity to the colleges and universities in Canada than virtually anything else and go out on a limb to work for the development of high profile athletic programs. Without a change in attitude, college sports will go the way of the Montreal Alouettes and become nothing more than a memory.

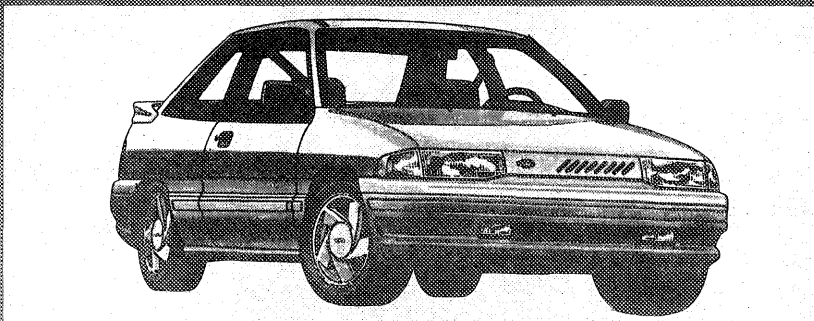
