


Library gets automated

Change has been the order of the day in the McNally Library during the summer. The Library is now automated! Catalogue information previously held in the card catalogue is now accessible on-line at terminals located on the second floor Audio-Visual and third floor Information Desk areas. At these terminals you will be able to find materials more quickly and will know immediately whether the material you want is checked out or on the shelf.

Α automated new circulation function speeds up the check-out process and does away with the need for you to fill in borrowing slips for every item borrowed. On your first visit to the Library you will need to have a barcode attached to your NAIT I.D. card to permit you to borrow materials. The Library encourages all students to come up to the 3rd floor circulation Desk to

be registered. It will take a few minutes to register you and apply the barcode. We will have two stations, one for registration only and one for checkout. We look forward to seeing you in the library.

Government's decreasing commitment

Program cuts, tuition increases, auxiliary fees and decreasing quality of education are just some of the results of the government's proposed two percent grant decrease to post-secondary institutions. Let me explain.

Each year, the provincial government helps pay your education through a grant

donations. This two percent cut would result in a shortfall in the neighborhood of \$5 million (including inflation) to NAIT.

Basically, what our government is saying is, on the one hand, Canada wants be competitive internationally technology and academics. On the other hand, they're not willing to pay for it.



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

Pearn named National Team coach

For the first time in history, a coach from the Canadian Colleges Athletic Association has been named head coach of Canada's National Junior Team. NAIT Ooks hockey coach Perry Pearn was elevated to the position in mid-July following Alain Vigneault's acceptance of an assistant coaching position with the Ottawa Senators. Prior to taking on the head role with the club, Pearn was an assistant coach on back to back world junior champions in 1990 and 1991.

Pearn, who has guided the Ooks to an unprecedented six



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This Week in Intramurals


