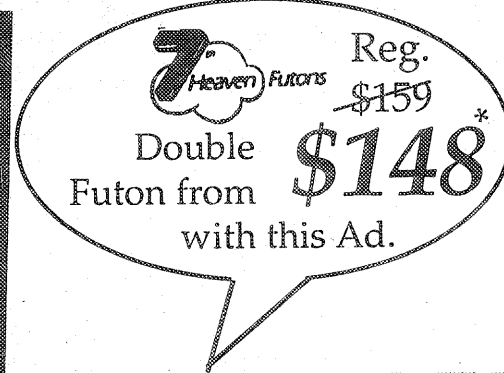
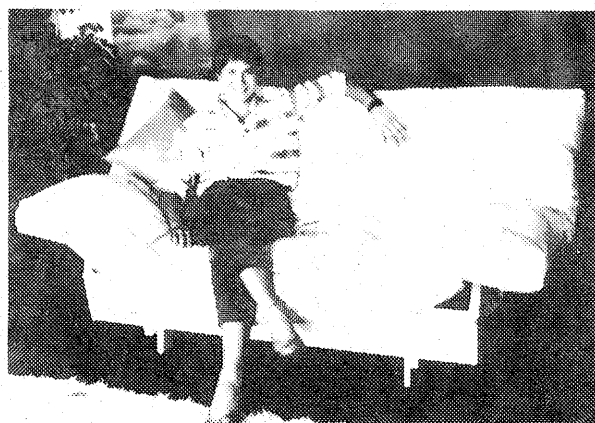
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American hockey mentality is out of touch

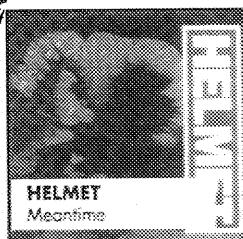
If you buy this album make sure you listen with the volume on "extremely neighbor angering."

5) Pull up a chair and join in the festivities.

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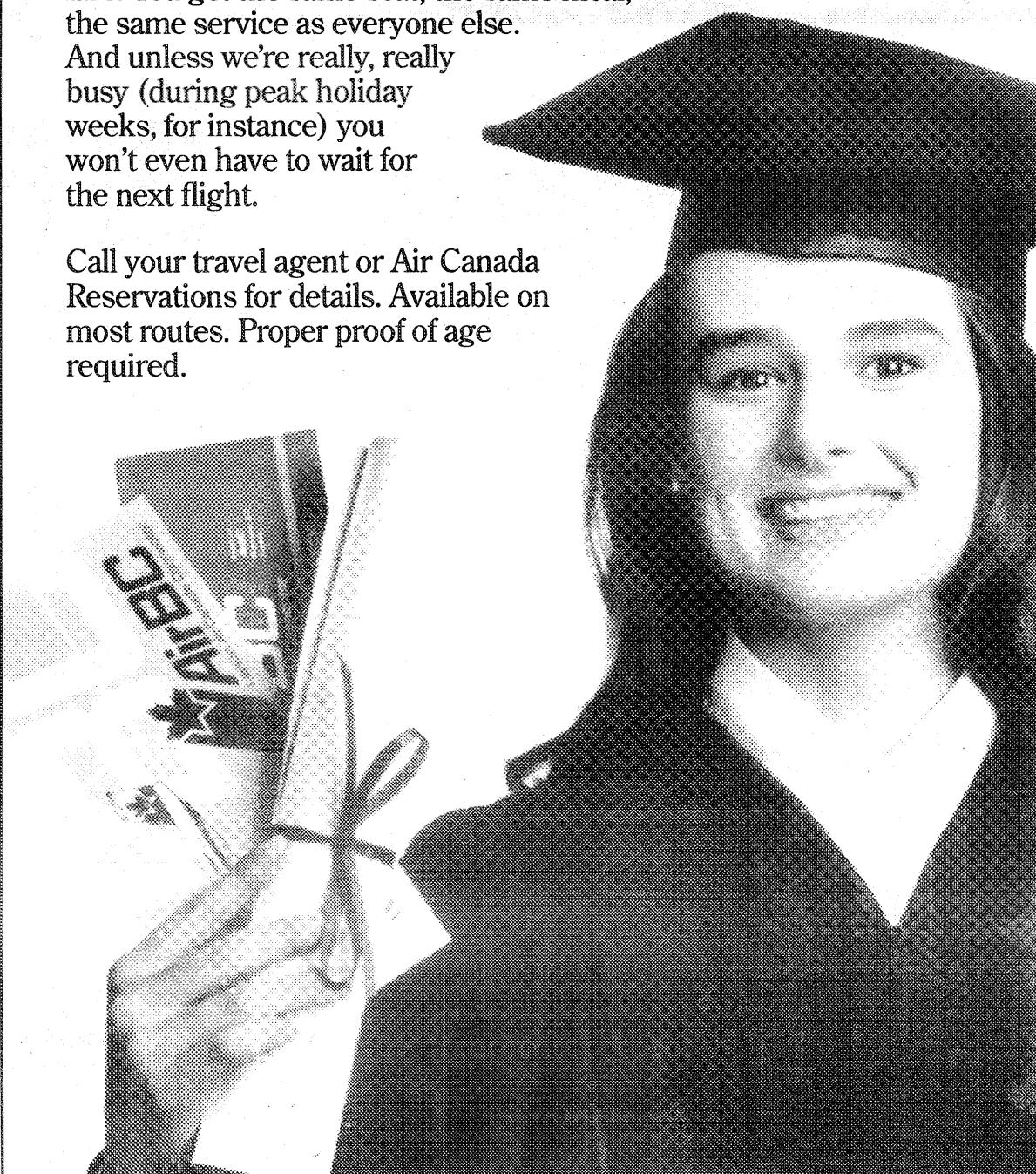
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
