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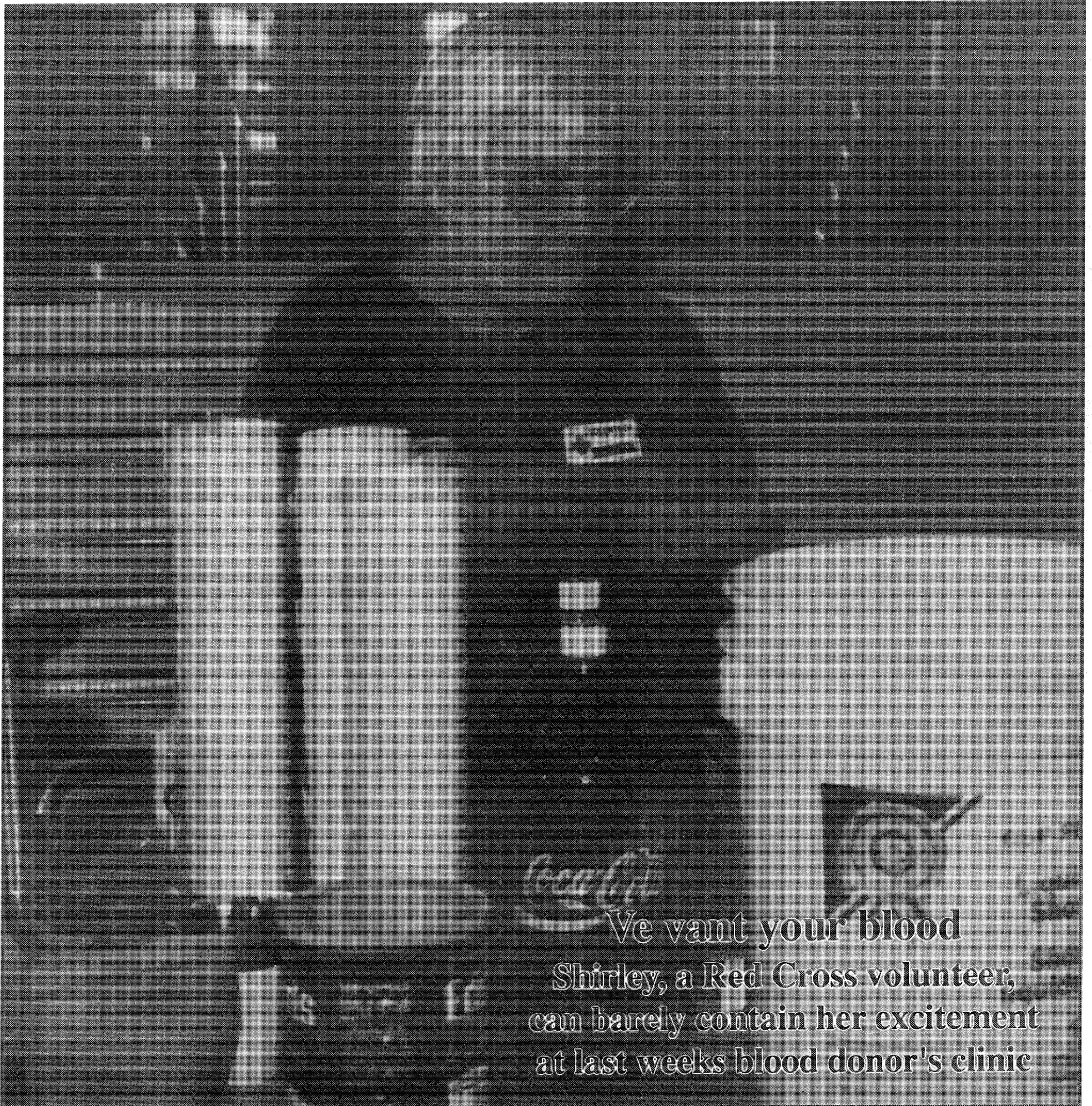

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Drafting for playoffs

They call it the world's richest Hockey Draft and for good reason. According to Brian Bahry, Hockey Draft Co-ordinator, the NAIT Foundation's 6th Annual Draft for Dollars gives away more cash than any other hockey draft, to the best of their knowledge.

Draft for Dollars is a playoff hockey draft. First prize is \$50,000 and goes to the contestant whose selected players accumulate the most points in the NHL playoffs. Second prize is \$10,000, 3rd prize is \$5,000, fourth prize is \$4,000, and fifth prize is \$3,000. In addition, \$5000 will be awarded to the point leader after the first playoff round, and \$2000 goes to the point leader after the second

playoff round.

A limited number of entries are available and can be purchased for \$100.00 each at the NAIT Foundation offices. Contestants may select

any forty players involved in the playoffs. Contestant standing in the draft is determined by straight accumulated player points, and the top one hundred will receive a cash prize. Because only 2200 entries are available, contestants stand a one in 22

chance of winning.

People from all over Canada enter this particular hockey and according to Bahry, quite a few NAIT students enter as well. In past years, students who have found the \$100 price tag prohibitive, have pooled together and entered as a group. Entries this year are due in by Sunday, April 18 at 4:00 pm.

All funds raised from the Draft for Dollars go directly to the purchase of capital equipment for NAIT students.

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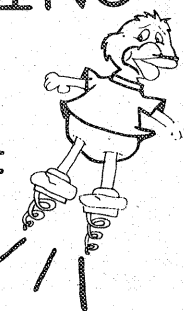

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Liberals promote technical education

Gagnon supports bursaries for technical education

Although the date of the upcoming provincial election has yet to be announced, the provincial Liberal Opposition are preparing. They have released their education policy paper entitled "Education For All", outlining their stance on education issues from the primary grades, up to and including the post-secondary level.

Education Critic Yolande Gagnon told the *Nugget* recently that access to post-secondary education is one of the Liberal party's major concerns. The policy paper stresses that "the Liberals are committed to the concept of life-long learning." They also believe that education should be a priority. Gagnon emphatically stated that the present government has not made

education a priority, citing funding decreases to colleges, universities and technical institutes as proof. Said Gagnon, "Operating grant cuts have meant institutions have had to turn away thousands and thousands of people."

programs would be provided. As it stands now, Gagnon feels that the present government has denied accessibility to numerous potential students.

The Liberal Opposition is convinced that an increase in student

find ways to create jobs. "One depends on the other. Creation of jobs depends on well-trained, well-educated people."

Another point in the policy paper is the Liberals' focus on "promoting technical education as a valuable alternative to universities."

Gagnon said that an attitudinal change toward technical education must take place in society. Ideally, the promotion of technical education should start ear-

lier in school such as during the junior high years. "Trades and apprenticeships are not second best. We suggest a series of scholarships and bursaries for technical institutes. We're putting our money where our mouth is."

As for the Student Finance System in its present state, Gagnon

called it "inadequate" and "antiquated." She feels it has not kept pace with current needs and that the needs of the diverse student population are not being addressed.

Gagnon said that a Liberal government would definitely make changes to the current financing system. "If we're elected, we need to take a very careful look at the system. [We would] look at indexing living and nutritional allowances [and] look at payback schedules. It has to be revamped."

Other points in the policy paper include a more sensible approach to Board of Governor appointments. According to Gagnon, this means "no more politics. You don't get in because you were someone's campaign manager. There should be no hint of partisanship in making appointments."

As well, the Liberal Party is proposing to establish a Provincial Task Force on Advanced Education "to develop a system wide plan for post-secondary education in Alberta."

Gagnon said that an attitudinal change toward technical education must take place in society.

The Liberals, according to their policy paper, feel that student spaces at universities and colleges must be increased, so that more people desiring a post-secondary education would be able to access it. In order to do this, Gagnon said operating grants for existing programs would be increased and funding for new

spaces at post-secondary institutions would not end up saturating the job market. Gagnon said she thinks that the job market influences what programs people take. For example, if there is no market demand for teachers, fewer people will enroll in the Education Faculty at a university. She said that educated people will

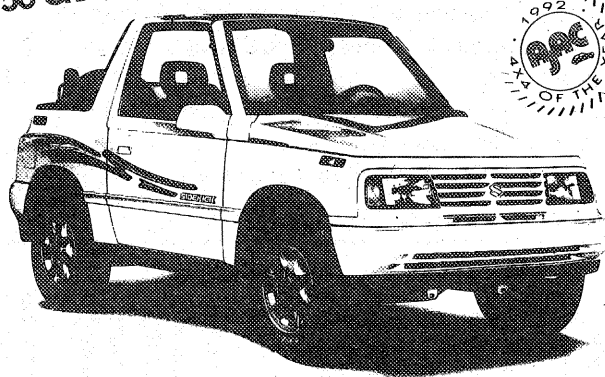

NDP in danger of extinction-

Alberta is in for a provincial election soon after this winter's snow melts and it seems a virtual certainty that the provincial New Democrats will be relegated from the official opposition to third party status.

The party's problems have been evident recently with two current NDP MPs openly fighting for the nomination in one of the few winnable NDP ridings and veteran NDP MP Pam Barrett announcing that she will not seek re-election, citing ill health.

The NDP have been on the decline since they won 16 seats in the last election. Clearly, the NDP have not been able to maintain this momentum. Recent polls have put the NDP at 13 percent. That's four points lower than Mulroney at his lowest point!

The rebirth of the Alberta Liberals certainly has much to do with the NDP decline. Yet, the most difficult problem for the NDP is finding an issue that is theirs.

It seems that the NDP still don't know that the overwhelming concern in Alberta is the provincial \$18 billion debt and the last party the public seems ready to trust with this problem is the democratic socialist NDP. Rival politicians simply point to the deficit running NDP in Ontario as an example of what would happen to Alberta if the NDP ever came to power, and Albertans almost instinctually run away in terror.

Yet, while it is due that the NDP in Ontario has run up a large deficit during the worst recession in its history, it has been the Liberals and Conservatives in Newfoundland and Saskatchewan that have run up the largest deficits per capita in Canada.

However, the Alberta NDP still refuses to take a firm stand on fiscal responsibility, leaving the electorate with their traditional spendthrift image. But this issue could be the NDP's. Only social democrats seem capable of understanding the partnership between government, labour and business in an economy. Other government tend to rely on coercion not consensus to govern and tend to cut only in areas that leave their own interests untouched.

Only a broadly based government made of labour and business interests can make the just cuts required across the board to get this province's finances in order.

Only when the Alberta NDP can take on this issue and show that social democrats can be fiscally responsible (as in Saskatchewan) can the NDP expect to continue to be a force in this province.

"Have nots" not lazy bums

When Mike Cardinal was appointed Minister of Social Services I felt hopeful. He seemed to have an understanding of how harsh the realities of life are for Alberta's poor. He appeared to be the type who would strive to find workable solutions to their problems. I should have known better. A compassionate Tory minister? What an absurd concept.

So much for hope. Last Saturday Cardinal showed us what he's really all about with his welfare "reforms".

Life on welfare has been a degrading prospect in the past, but Cardinal's "reforms" go beyond degrading; they're ruthlessly punishing.

Some of his new rules don't even seem to be designed to save the government money. One would think reducing expenditures would be the objective, but apparently oppression is the main goal here.

Some examples of the new welfare rules are:

- that the department of Social Services is no longer required to give clients 30 days notice before being cut off from benefits.
- that single mothers with children under two are no longer exempt from seeking employment.
- that clients will no longer be told of their right to appeal or of any extra benefits that may be available to them, unless they specifically ask.
- that social workers are to think of other ways for a client to get money before even assessing their eligibility for welfare.

"Other ways" include getting money from family and friends, selling personal possessions, and turning to the Students Finance Board.

These are just a few of Cardinal's new rules, but you get the idea. University of Calgary professor Gayle Gilchrist-James calls the reforms "nothing more than a myopic ploy to satisfy the political right wing."

I couldn't have said it better myself.

Premier Klein of course, supports the moves, saying, "There is a public mood that we have to get really tough on those who abuse the system."

Maybe there is, but these "reforms" don't address the problem of welfare abuse. Which, by the way, only has a two to three percent abuse rate. Instead, they only serve to make the welfare clients' lives more desperate.

I am aware that there are those out there who lean so far to the right that they support these moves.

I can just hear them grumbling now - "god damn lazy bums - get a job!" These tend to be the folks who haven't yet experienced the financial disaster that forces people to seek welfare benefits. It's difficult to understand the plight of the "have-nots" if you've always been a "have."

But the fact is, the only way we'll ever see a reduction in the welfare rolls is if there is a substantial economic upturn. And with the economy in the dire straits that it is right now, fewer and fewer Albertans are immune to personal financial disaster.

That's why it's important to pay attention to developments (or regressions) in the world of welfare. And why it's important not to judge too harshly those on the receiving end. I thought Cardinal would have understood that. It seems I thought wrong.

"Where d'ya get it?"

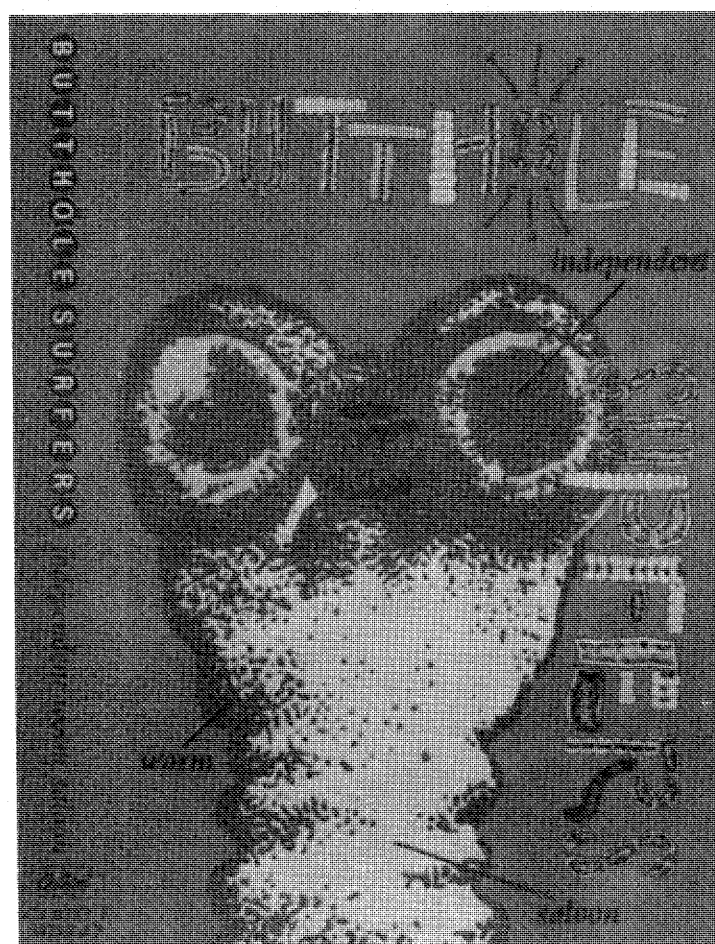
"It fell from a dog."

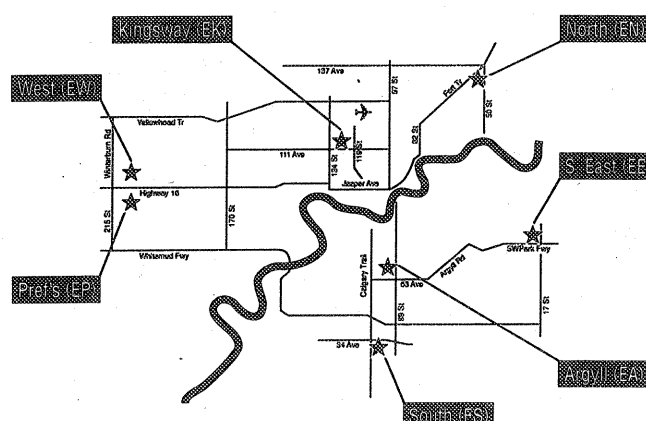


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The purloined penis

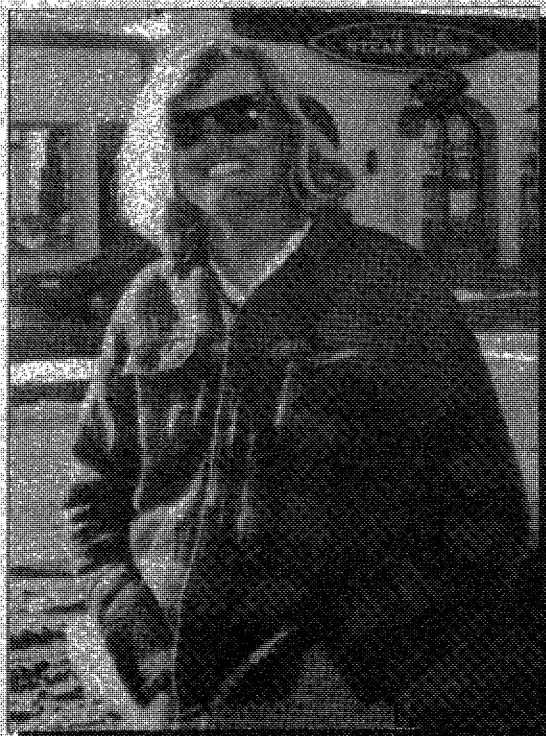
The city police were called and they thought they had a penis amputating serial killer on their hands for a few minutes.

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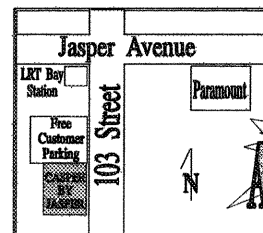
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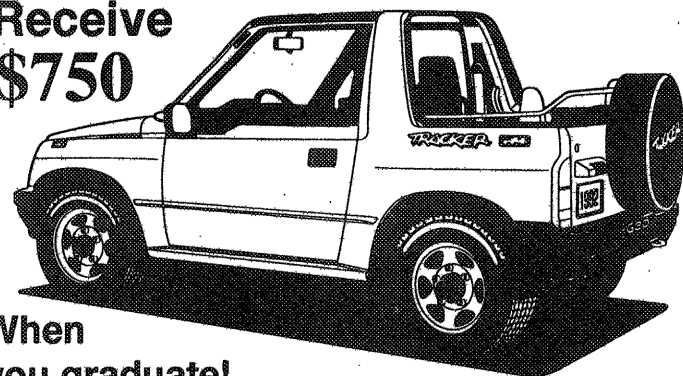
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Really short story

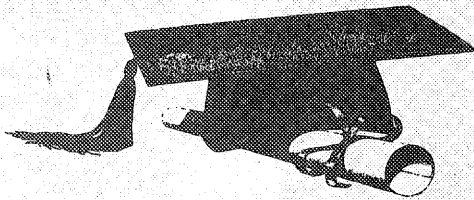
A couple of tunes from their previous tour that I missed were "Civil War" and "Bad Obsession", but I welcomed such new editions
