NAITSA President heads for Romania

Big plans are in the works for outgoing NAITSA President Dan Lachambre.

Lachambre and Red Deer College Student Association President Scott Johnston, in a history-making endeavor, will be traveling to Romania in August to help Romanian post-secondary students set up student associations of their own.

The fall of communism in Romania has resulted in a student desire to set up democratic student associations. The Romanians have no experience in this area and their effort, up until this point, have been unsuccessful. In previous years, under the communist government, post-secondary students were required to be members of the "Association of Communist Students."

Lachambre and Johnston became involved in the Romanian situation when a former RDC instructor, Don Dixon, now in international trade, saw a proposal Romanian students had put together asking for Western industrialized countries' input on the overall education system; including student autonomy. Because of Lachambre and Johnston's exten-

sive experience with student provincial and national government, Dixon felt they would be well suited to assist Romanian students in organizing their own student associations. Reactions to Dixon's idea from both students and staff in Romania were extremely positive so Dixon traveled back to Canada and presented Lachambre and Johnston with the Romanian proposal.

Lachambre and Johnston, who are both graduating this year, were

enthusiastic and immediately set about constructing a proposal outlining their experience in government, descriptions of student associations related to post-secondary education. They also outlined how they could assist the Romanian students in achieving their goal.

Dixon then hand delivered the proposal to Romania and the response was enthusiastic. Lachambre said it was originally thought their

stay in Romania would last about

four months helping out one university. However, since their proposal was delivered, many universities have requested Lachambre and Johnston's assistance in setting up student associations. It is now expected their stay will last closer to a year.

Lachambre is looking forward

to the experience and although he will not receive a salary for his work, travel and living expenses will be covered.

Funding for the project will likely come from the Canadian Bureau of International Education and the Rotary Club. They also have the full support of NAIT President Dr. Souch, as well as the RDC President and ACCC (Association of Canadian Community Colleges.)

Lachambre is not worried about language barriers as every Romanian post-secondary student receives instruction in English. As well, Lachambre speaks French and Johnston speaks Russian.

Said Lachambre, "I'm glad for the opportunity to be able to bring over the experience that NAITSA has given me and bring that knowl-

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Risks of uranium featured at NAIT

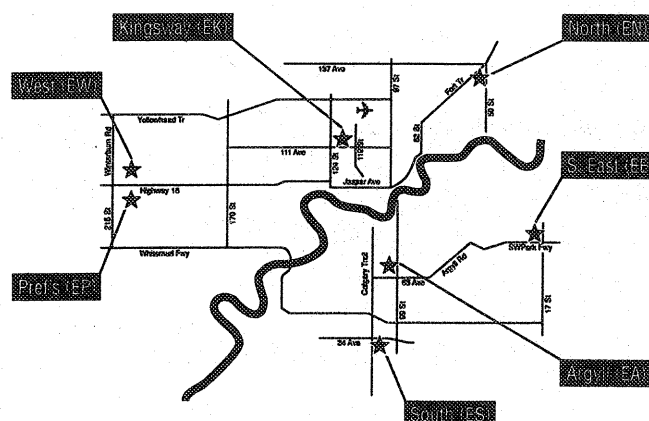
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NAIT student wins royal award

For most people, meeting a member of the Royal Family is not something that is likely to happen at any time during their lives. Jason Gosior, however, a first year Electrical Engineering student at NAIT, was one of a select few who had the honour of meeting with Prince Edward last Saturday, March 27th.

Gosior was one of 31 people from B.C., Alberta, and Saskatchewan to receive the prestigious Gold Duke of Edinburgh awards, presented to him by Prince Edward himself.

Gosior, who has been involved with Scouts of Canada for many years, says the award is related to his scouting activities. Fulfilling the requirements of the awards involved two years of effort on his part, including a 270 kilometer hike from Field, B.C., to Jasper.

The long distance hike began with nine participants, but at the halfway point, six of them abandoned the struggle and quit, leaving only Gosior and two others. The remaining two stuck it out and arrived in Jasper after 16 days of hik-

ing; eight of those in the rain.

In spite of the rain, Gosior says the trip was great.

The hike wasn't the only thing

that had to be done for the award however. Gosior spent two years helping out at Cub camps, assisting disabled cubs, and cleaning up scout camps. He also helped to raise \$4000 for Cub scouts by working bingos and the NAIT Children's Christmas Party (1991) among other things.

To receive the award, Gosior went to Government House, and formed a favorable opinion of Prince Edward. Says Gosior, "Prince Ed was a pretty cool guy."

If you are like most students at NAIT you probably have never heard of this important council. The council exists because it is required by "The Technical Institutes Act", to advise the NAIT Board of Governors on academic matters that they present to us, and to bring student concerns to the Board of Governors. These matters include programs of instruction, academic awards, stand-

ards and policy respecting the selection and admission of students, and other academic concerns that affect you the student.

The

Academic Council consists of: The NAIT President, three Chief Academic Officers, the Registrar, seven members of the Academic Staff, two additional members, and seven students. These students are elected by NAITSA General Council, with the exception of the Academic VP. Currently, there are only three student

members on the council for the '93-'94 academic year. They are: Dean Andres (NAITSA Academic VP), Denis Babin (Finance) and Brent Valentine (Pre-tech). There are still four positions to be filled.

For the Academic Council to be effective, the student representatives need constant feedback from all NAIT students. We want to hear your concerns, so that we can pass these concerns to the NAIT Board of Governors. Without any feed-

back from students, the Academic Council cannot work effectively.

How can you reach the stu-

dent representatives on Academic Council? You can leave messages in the NAITSA office (E133), ask a NAITSA representative to contact us for you or stop us in the hallways. We do want to hear your concerns, and we will make sure that your concerns are expressed to the Board of Governors.

The Lady Soccer Ooks made it to Nationals, (and a feeling of pride) while the Hockey Ooks were bumped (sorry guys).

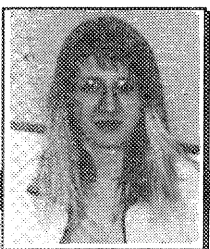
Finally, our tuition was increased, and we got a 0 percent increase in funding which resulted in a net deficit for student funding.

"Letters to the Editor" in the *Nugget* revealed some strong opinions within the student population not only about the Janice thing, but also about the role of NAITSA and the job they do.

Most memorable was a comment from one student who appeared to support Janice. This person felt that the NAITSA executive had not lived up to their responsibilities; namely providing more information to students about what NAITSA does. The letter, referring to NAITSA said, "Your ego trip has not allowed you to get off your lazy asses and talk to the different technologies."

My immediate reaction was "You've got to be kidding!" But upon reflection I wondered if that opinion, however ill-informed, represents a significant portion of the student population.

A scary thought, if it does. Now I haven't conducted a formal survey on this one, but it appears from the students I have talked with that most realize NAITSA works on their behalf and are as accessible as possible.

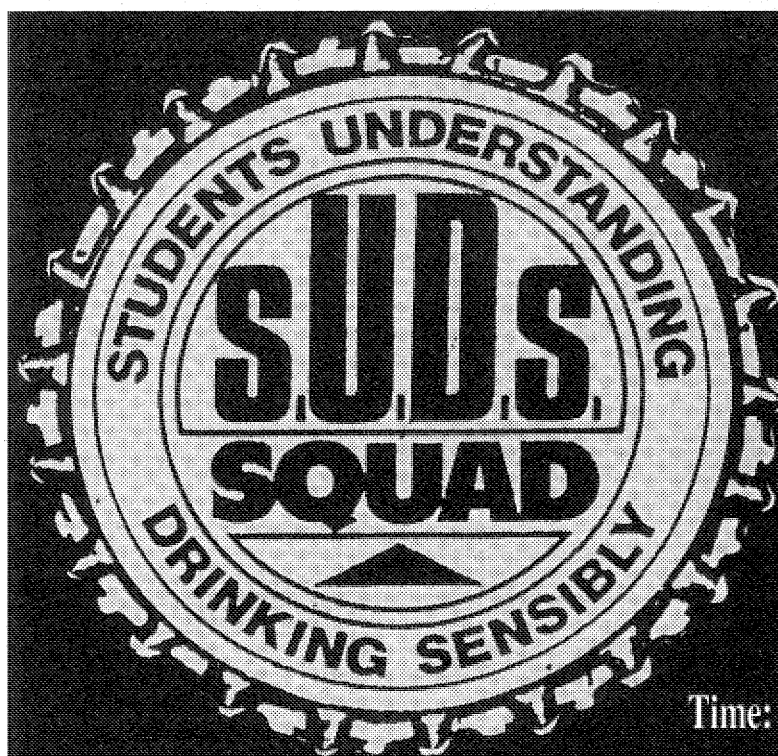
Dear Editor:

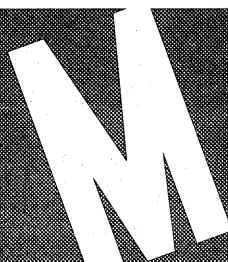

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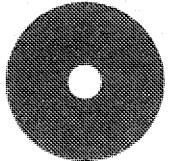
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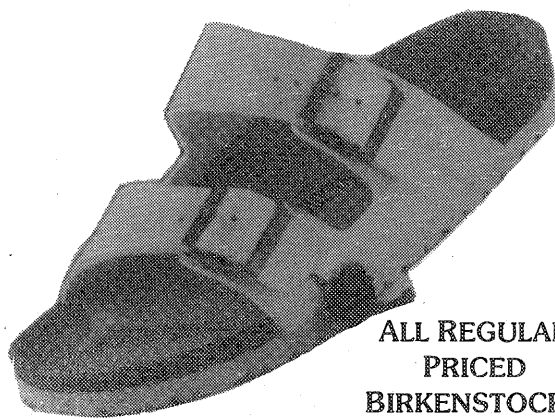
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Pens win dogfight

That man's name was Dave Harvey and that's the rest of the story.

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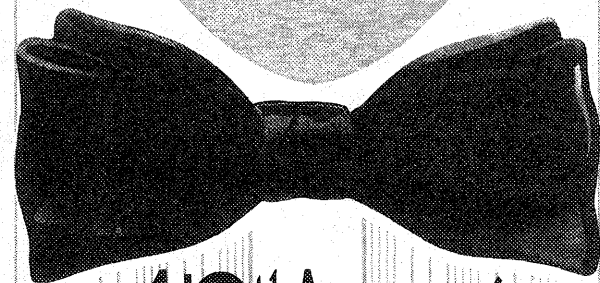
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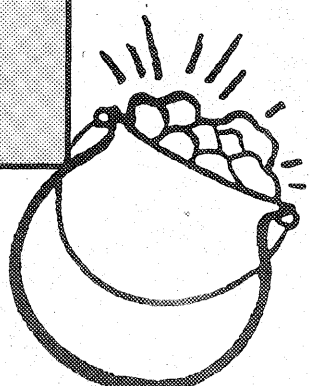

Thelonious Monster

It was during my second, self-destructive semester at U of C that I was first exposed to this "roiling juggernaut of punkish angst" called Thelonious Monster. Even in my overly inebriated state it was easy to tell this band had potential. However, while friends of the band have gone on to form successful groups like The Red Hot Chili Peppers, Jane's Addiction, and Fishbone, the Monster have gone through three different record labels in the last four years. They have earned a reputation of being one of the most unlucky bands in history.

Thelonious Monster grew out of the early 80's punk scene and has cut three albums since their inception - *Baby... You're Bumming My Life Out In A Supreme Fashion* (1986), *Next Saturday Afternoon* (1987), and *Stormy Weather* (1989). However, after the 1989 release the Monster started experiencing major problems (ie. fist fights on stage)

and broke up.

"I made a shitty solo record," explains Bob Forrest, lead singer and principal lyricist for the Monster.

Thelonious could do that. Now I do. I'm a lyricist singer who's not stupid enough to think that the whole things based on my lyrics and my singing. Bands are magical, man."

for *A Politically Correct Girl From The Valley* reflect their early punk influences, the album, as a whole, is well produced and surprisingly well disciplined. This is likely due to the

variety this album has to offer. It also makes Bob Forrest's voice sound good (which it isn't) in comparison to Tom Waits' gravelly Louis Armstrong - type voice.



guest musicians that helped out on the album: Dave Pirner and Dan Murphy (Soul Asylum), Benmont Tench (Tom Petty's Heartbreakers), Hardy and Peter Anderson (Dwight Yoakam's guitarist and producer) and Tom

Thelonious Monster is your typical LA rock band: Forrest - a somewhat rehabilitated drug and alcohol addict, Chris Handsome - psycho guitarist, Dix Denrey - former guitarist from *The Weirdos* and Peter Weiss - drummer (also played Jew's harp on the Chili Peppers last album). Also joining them this album is bassist Dan Burner, former member of 3-D Picnic.

My only criticism of this album is the production quality. A few of the songs sound like they were recorded in Bob Forrest's basement. However, this is easily overlooked when you consider the musical quality of the songs.

I think Forrest sums up the philosophy of this band and their music best when he says "We didn't quit because we got nothing better to do."

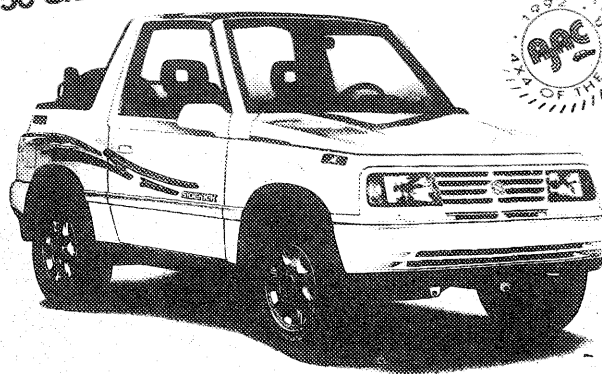

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
