

Cartoon Censorship

f you have been wandering around the hallways at main campus you have probably noticed all the seasonal artwork adorning the windows. The subject matter is primarily cartoon characters partaking in winter / seasonal activities. The cartoons are first outlined in black and later colored in. One of the cartoons depicts Calvin (of Calvin and Hobbes) scrunching up his nose and rubbing it with his mitten, the original caption read "Don't you hate it when your boogers freeze?", and yet when the cartoon was fully colored in the caption had been changed to "Don't you hate it when your nostrils freeze?"

When contacted regarding

the change the program head of Graphic Sign Arts, Susan Van De Voord, commented that the caption was changed after "concerns from individuals". She preferred not to name the individuals that had expressed the concerns. She did mention that because the project is done by students for students they try to avoid controversial topics. The fear being that if a project is too controversial it could be canceled, robbing the students of valuable experience. To avoid controversy they avoid scenes that have religious undertones, or are risqué, and instead try to keep the scenes "generic".

Susan went on to say that the main concern was the location of the cartoon and it probably would not have needed

to be changed had it been located elsewhere in the institution. The cartoon is located on a window between the Administrative Offices and Development & Community Relations at the south end of the hallway, and the staff dining room at the north end. Development & Community Relations handles the NAIT Foundation, community relations, and alumni relations, the Administrative Offices house, among other people, Nait president Stan Souch. Nostrils was deemed to be less potentially offensive to visitors than boogers, the fact that the cartoon had originally run unedited in family newspapers was not commented





Romanian Connection

s a refresher... earlier this year, NAITSA General Council decided to help sponsor Dan LaChambre and Scott Johnston in their endeavor to go to Romania and help the students there set up their own independent Students' Associations. Previously, with Romania under Communist rule, the student organizations had been under the control of the government. With the change in government, to democratic, Post-secondary student groups werehaving difficulty setting up autonomous groups, since they really had no expereince or guidance.

In their first fax, Dan and Scott mention a few things that they miss, including rye, interior heat, family and friends. They do mention that the Romanian women are beautiful, and the temperature is above 15 degrees.

On November 1st, the international rate of exchange doubled, and they write that they are finding that communication is very expensive. For many of the Romanians they are working with, this is their first contact with a person from the West, and both sides are finding it interesting, with Dan and Scott being treated excellently. Both of them are learning Romanian very fast. (Sort of an immersion setting!).

Also in the first fax, they mention that Student
Associations are forming, and that textbooks are in high demand. Both of them are very optimistic about the project, and are investigating ways to bring 2 Romanians back with them, for lecture/experience sharing with



Holiday Break For OOKs

he NAIT Ooks will not see their next action in the ACAC for over a month. However, the Ooks will be participating in a number of exhibition games. On Tuesday, December 28th, the Ooks will meet the Under 18 Czech National Team at the Beaumont Arena in a 7:00 p.m. match. The Ooks then travel to Calgary to participate in the SAIT Christmas Invitational. The Ooks will meet the SAIT Trojans on Wednesday, December 29th at 7:00 p.m., the University of Calgary Dinos on Thursday, December 30th at 4:00 p.m., and the Red Deer College Kings on Friday, December 31st at 1:00 p.m.

The Ooks closed out the first half of the regular season with a sweep of the Concordia College Thunder. Not including games against the defunct Grande Prairie Regional College Wolves, the Ooks now have a record of five wins, four losses and one tie.

On Friday, December 3rd, the Ooks shaded the Thunder 4-3 at the NAIT Arena.

In the first, the momentum moved from team to team. Shawn Reich capitalized on a Deryk Fersovich feed at 7:11 to give the Ooks a 1-0 advantage. Mike Tavaroli of the Thunder tied the contest with 12:56 elapsed in the frame. Trevor McCallion's wrist shot from the high slot gave the Ooks a 2-1 advantage 17:22.

In the second, Matt Tillapaugh of the Thunder bent the twine at 5:11 before McCallion reinstated the NAIT's advantage at 13:14 with a powerplay marker.

In the third, Mike Marshall netted the third Thunder goal with 29 seconds gone in the frame. Darren Hastman found the five hole at 13:44 to give NAIT the victory.

On Saturday, December 4th, the Ooks scored five powerplay goals en route to an 11-3 triumph over the Thunder at the NAIT Arena. Outshooting the Thunder 41-21, the Ooks held period leads of 2-1 and 6-2 before reaching double digits in the third.

Peter Kasowski, Stacey Rayan, and Trevor McCallion each tallied twice for the Ooks. Glenn McGillivray, Eric Morrissette, Darren Hastman, Deryk Fersovich and Darryl Romano rounded out the NAIT scoring. Brent Gitzel replied with a pair for Concordia while Trevor Thomas added a single.

Between the pipes, Mike Applegate picked up a pair of wins for the Ooks.

Underground with Nico. Intense, seductive vocals with a mesmerising background, this is music that is best appreciated in a prone position by candle light.




h, all those memories.

Record Review - Scoop This

ost compilation albums are packed with old tunes with proven hits (a la "Hits 93" etc.). Scoop This, an EMI release, is something a little different.
