The end of the 1993 spring semester will bring with it the termination of a tech that has been offered at NAIT for 20 years. According to Dean of Business Sharon Kashuba, approval has been received from the department of Advanced Education to terminate Apparel Design and Development at the end of the current academic year.

One of the reasons underlying the decision was that Apparel Design does not fit in with the NAIT Board of Governor's long range de-

Poster campaigns trashed

NAITSA elections are coming up next month but don't expect to see any posters lining campus hallways advertising whom to vote for.

Academic VP Brad Balkan says that all NAITSA and Board of Governor student rep elections from '93 onwards will be "no paper campaigns." That means candidates will be prohibited from using posters or leaflets to promote themselves. In- have the opportunity to get to know

stead, says Balkan, "we really want to see some creativity out of candidates this year."

In previous elections, candidates have been permitted to distribute up to one hundred posters each as well as hand out an unlimited amount of pamphlets, as long as their total advertising budget did not exceed \$100.00 each. This method of advertising produced a tremendous amount of garbage however, and Balkan says that after last year's elections, 14 large green garbage bags full of posters had to be disposed of.

The reasons for the change in policy are twofold. The NAITSA executive feels that the environmental concerns on campus and in society must be addressed, and a no paper policy will reduce the amount of unnecessary waste at NAIT. Secondly, Balkan says, the new policy will force candidates to get out and meet the students of NAIT. In this way, potential student leaders will realize what the NAIT population expect of them and students will


the candidates.

Says Balkan, "what we're striving to do is make it a fair and equitable campaign for all nominees."

Candidates will be permitted to use other forms of advertising however, such as distributing hats, buttons, pencils, pens etc. In addition, candidates will have the opportunity to make their views known through The Nugget and at the three public forums which will be held at the Naitrium, the Dock, and at the Westwood campus.

Another anticipated benefit of the no paper policy is the elimination of disputes between candidates over advertising. In past elections at NAIT, problems with candidates defacing each others' posters or exceeding size and quantity regulations have been common. The no paper policy is seen as an effective solution to those problems.

Other institutions in Alberta have implemented similar policies. Red Deer College has had no paper campaigns for at least two elections and have found them to be success-

Euthanasia not for squeamish-

Two weeks ago, the Netherlands became the first industrialized country to decriminalize euthanasia.

Dutch doctors may now assist, after repeated requests, terminally ill patients mercifully end their lives without fear of prosecution.

The practice has long been tolerated in the Netherlands. Yet the legal distinction of the "right to die" remains important because other countries, particularly in North American, are tightening the loopholes that have tacitly accepted medically induced death.

In the United States, Dr. Jack Kevorkian will no longer be able to principle.

legally help terminal patients into a compassionate death after the assisted suicide ban comes into effect March 30.

Here in Canada, the courts have initially turned down terminally ill Sue Rodriquez's request for a legally sanctioned physician assisted suicide

The courts concerns are understandable, but misplaced. Everyone should pay attention when the lines between life and death become blurred. Yet, the fact is that it has been decades since this distinction has been categorical. Since life support machines were first used, it is commonly agreed that life is more than just breathing. Doctors commonly assess a patient's "quality of life". If a patient is terminally ill and makes repeated requests to die, why should society be so squeamish just because the person is conscious.

Surely, if doctors can prescribe medical overdoes or deny food to coma patients, it seems barbaric that doctors insist that terminal patients suffer unbearable pain because society is afraid of violating an outdated principle.

Gateway should compromise

And the saga continues. Folks over at the *Gateway* (the U of A student newspaper) are amazed that the cartoon controversy is still raging on and frankly, so am I, but for a different reason.

I am referring, of course, to the by now famous political cartoon that was published in the January 5 edition of the *Gateway*. If you haven't seen it already, it depicts an Israeli soldier pointing a gun at Mary and Christ and is titled "What if Jesus was born in 1992?"

The cartoonist, Ahmed Hussein, meant it as a political commentary on the inhumane actions of the Israeli government when the expelled 415 Palestinians from the occupied territories at Christmas. The reaction to his cartoon was more than he bargained for.

Labeled as racist and anti-Semitic by some, the cartoon was news at the beginning of January when it was published. By mid-January, it had grown into an "issue," with students, MLA's, MPs, community groups, faculty, and the Board of Governors launching complaints against it. Now, in mid-February, the Canadian Council of Christians and Jews has filed a complaint with the Alberta Human Rights commission, and the cartoon controversy has become a monster.

The issues is now so big that the *Edmonton Journal* devoted a full page of Monday's paper to the cartoon controversy, printing four separate stories about it and reprinting the offending cartoon itself for all to see, and supposedly, to judge.

Amid all the furor, the *Gateway* staff are defending their decision to publish the cartoon. They offer no apology, but instead have said they regret causing any offense and that the Christ-killer idea was unintended. They claim that any racism allegations are simply misinterpretations of the cartoon's meaning.

The Gateway's stance on the issue could be considered appropriate but it hasn't done anything to calm the storm. And when you look at who the offended group is, it's understandable. Jewish people have been the victims of hate and discrimination for time out of mind. After centuries of prejudice one does tend to become quite touchy about these sorts of issues. Possibly even a little over sensitive. It's to be expected.

Although some critics are calling for the resignation of Hussein and the *Gateway's* editor, Karen Unland, I think that's going a bit far. But the *Gateway* staff, if they ever want to bury this issues, might do well to compromise by offering an apology to the offended groups. The "stickto-your-guns" principle sounds noble, but to be more realistic, fair compromises are what pave the way to peace.

The amazing thing isn't really that Jewish groups are still extremely upset. It's that the *Gateway* hasn't yet learned the art of compromise.







PRESIDENT:

- Preside over all meetings of NAITSA, General council, Executive Council;
- Be responsible to the Student Association membership in so far as the activities of the Student Association are concerned, and shall exercise supervision over all officers in the discharge of their duties;

It's been said unconvincingly of too many other rock groups, but this time it's true: Rockhead is like no other band. If the hellacious sound of the group's Rockhead debut isn't proof enough, check the group's unimpeachable credentials. Rockhead was founded by noted guitarist/in demand record producer and engineer Bob Rock whose musical know-how was embraced by a long list of fellow rockers who've trusted Rock's proven skills and well-tuned ear to help create such landmark rock albums as Metallica, Bon Jovi's Slippery When Wet, Motley Crue's Dr. Feelgood, The Cult's Sonic Temple and Aerosmith's Permanent Vacation.

When it came to developing a band of his own for heavy-duty recording and touring, Rock knew who to turn to: lead singer Steve Jack and his ozone-shattering vocals; bassist Jamey Kosh who bashed his way in and out of various Vancouver punk bands; and, of course, drummer

Chris Taylor who has nurtured his rhythm method over nearly 10 years as Rock's bandmate. With Rock as the initial impetus, Rockhead's four individual players took their time while becoming a single unit—and one of hard rock's best-kept-secrets—by spending the past four year-plus in constant rehearsal jams and exploratory recording sessions.


"It takes a good band four years to get anything of substance really going," Rock says from experience. "A band needs time to grow in order to develop a life of its own. The advantage for us is that we started recording right from the first day."

Ultimately, Rockhead is a simple rock band with no pretensions. "The Rockhead album really does get down to our roots," Rock says. "If you like Les Pauls played through Marshall amplifiers, a good bass player working with a real drummer, and a skinny guy who can sing real high, you'll like Rockhead." Icing on the cake is provided by a handful of special guests, including

pedal steel guitarist Ken Greer of Tom Cochrane and Red Rider, the Cult's Billy Duffy (on "Hell's Back Door") and Bon Jovi's Richie Sambora (on "House of Cards.")

The Rockhead album has its own natural symmetry, shifting smoothly between high-octane rockers and smooth-cruising ballads. hard tracks include "Chelsea Rose" "sleepwalk" and Rockhead's bluesbased "Bed Of Roses"; while reflective lyrics and soaring melodies are featured in "Death Do Us Part," the countrified "Angelfire," the luxurious "Warchild" and the epic rocker "Heartland" the albums' debut single.

"The songs that tagged along with us the longest were ultimately the songs we considered our best, and the songs that we recorded for Rockhead," Bob explains. "That's why I think we've got a good album. We could have put an album out two years ago, but it wouldn't have been right. Now, "he smiles confidently, "the time is right."




