Valentine's deed was "a gracious and noble thing to do."

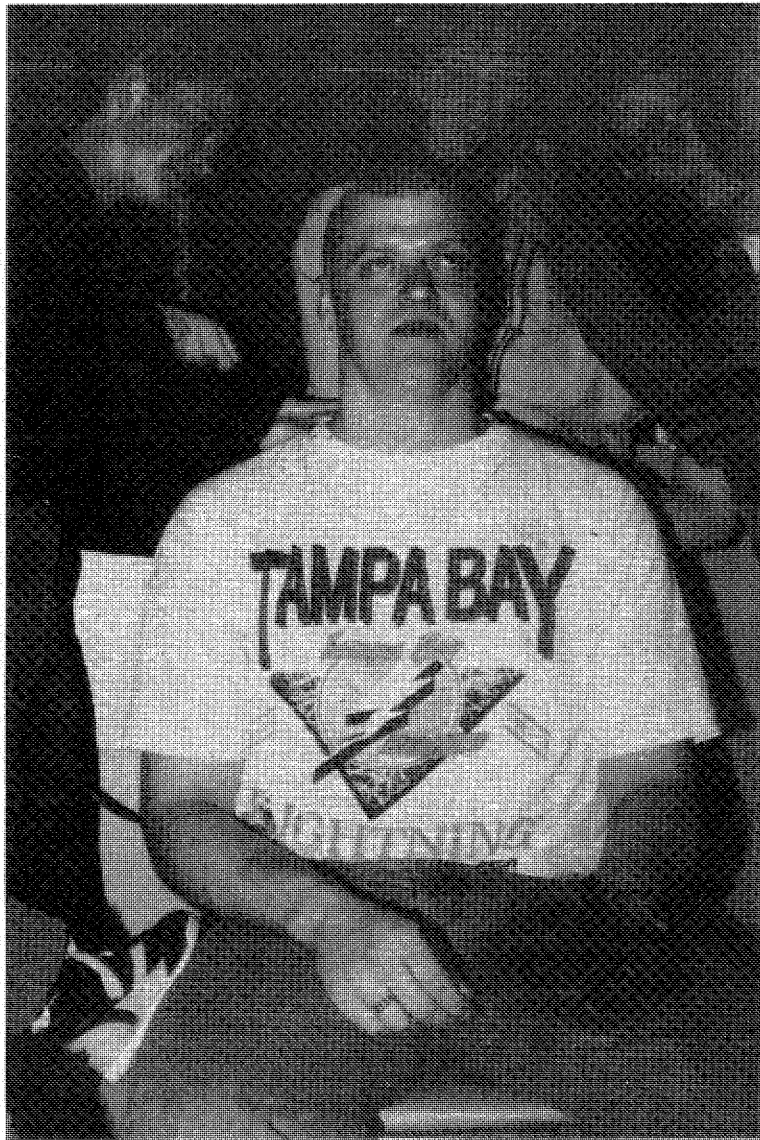
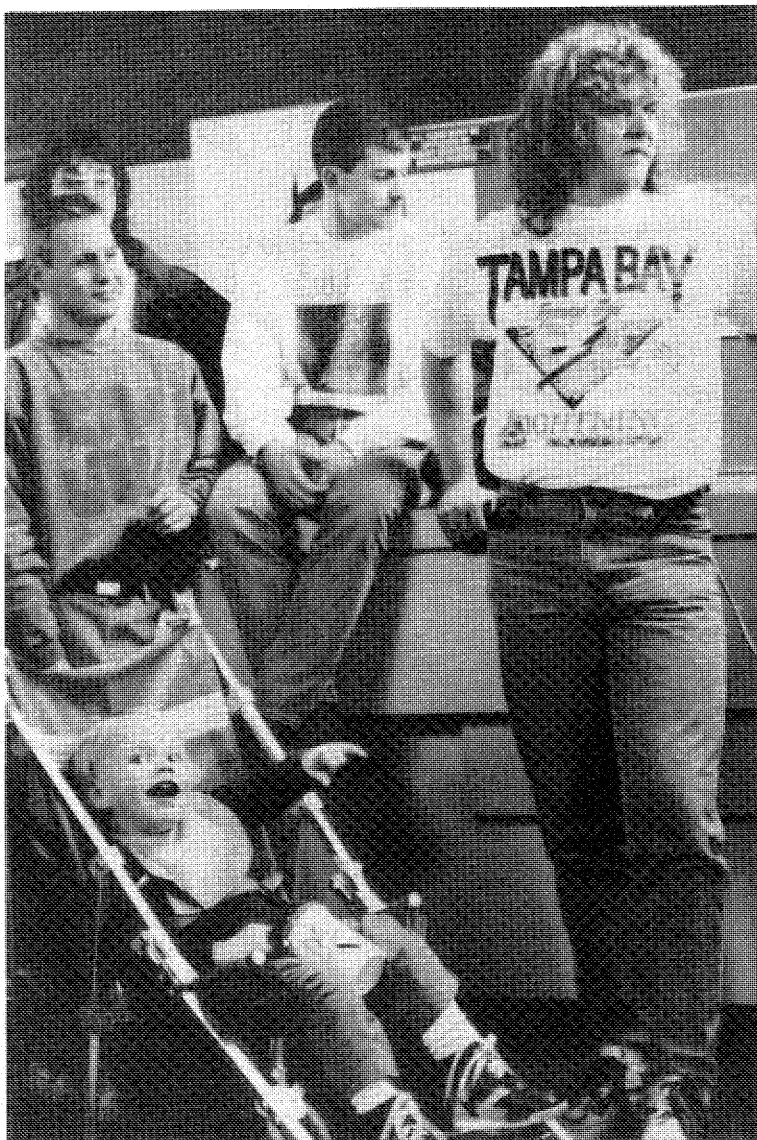

## Stone Age ideals in new cabinet

To quote Mirosh: "A lot of people who are heterosexual feel uncomfortable about this... We shouldn't over react to small lobby groups."

Interesting comment. Personally, I am unable to see how legislating equality for gays and lesbians could be construed as "over reacting." And what's this noise about heterosexuals feeling uncomfortable? Well, of course they're uncomfortable. It's heterosexual discomfort that leads to discrimination against gays and lesbians, and discrimination is the sole reason legislation is needed.

Her comments are sadly reminiscent of Stone Age Doug Main ideals. If Mirosh's recent display of archaic ideas is any indication of things to come, the Provincial Human Rights Commission is in for a gloomy 1993.

# Assistants take Ooks to Red Deer and Fernie

While NAIT coach Perry Pearn plotted a gold medal triumph for Team Canada at the World Junior Championships in Gavle, Sweden, assistant coaches Randy Repchuk and Gord Galley took the Hockey Ooks to Fernie where a pair of non-conference matches against CIAU competition were scheduled and to Red Deer for a tournament hosted by Red Deer College where the Ooks went undefeated.

On Monday, December 28th, the University of Regina Cougars shaded the Ooks 5-3.

Brad Fallis, Dean Beattie, and Sandro Pisani tallied for the Ooks who trailed 2-0 after the first and 3-1 following the second. The Cougars outshot the Ooks 45-27.

On Tuesday, December 29th, the Ooks were ready to play but the University of Lethbridge Pronghorns were not. The Pronghorns could not make the trek over the Crowsnest due to the inclement weather and the

game was cancelled.

On Saturday, January 2nd, the Ooks skated to a 4-1 win over the Red Deer College Kings.

Dean Beattie, Tim Olson, Travis Kenyon and Paul Wozney tallied for the Ooks who led 1-0 at the first and second intermissions.

On Sunday, January 3rd, the Ooks netted five third period goals en route to a 5-3 triumph over the University of Calgary Dinosaurs.

Travis Kenyon, Tom Oloriz, Darren Smith, Brad Fallis, and Wayne MacDonald netted single markers for the Ooks who

faced disadvantages of 1-0 after the first and 2-0 following the second. NAIT was outshot 34-27, but the goaltending of Alec Sheflo kept the Ooks in the game.

10 goals and 14 assists, while NAIT's Don Davidge has the ACAC's best goals against average -- 2.72.

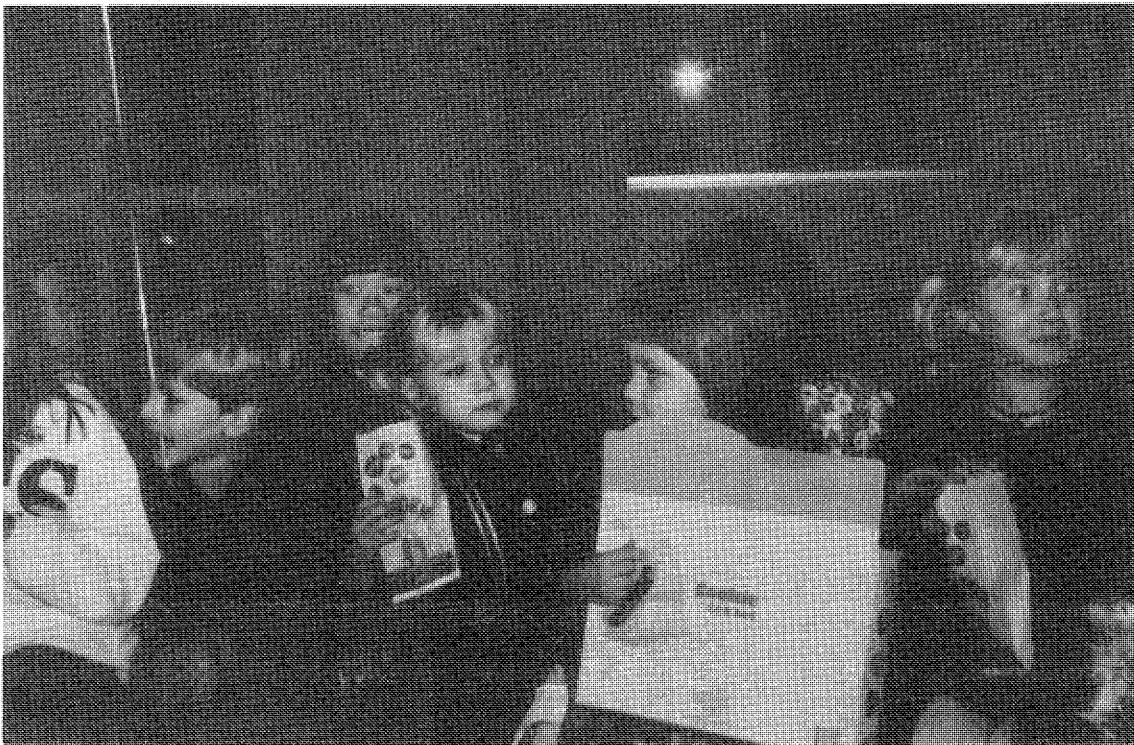

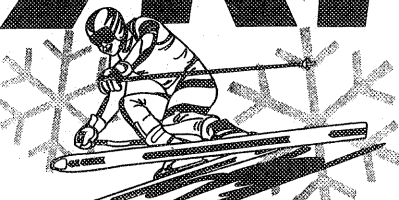
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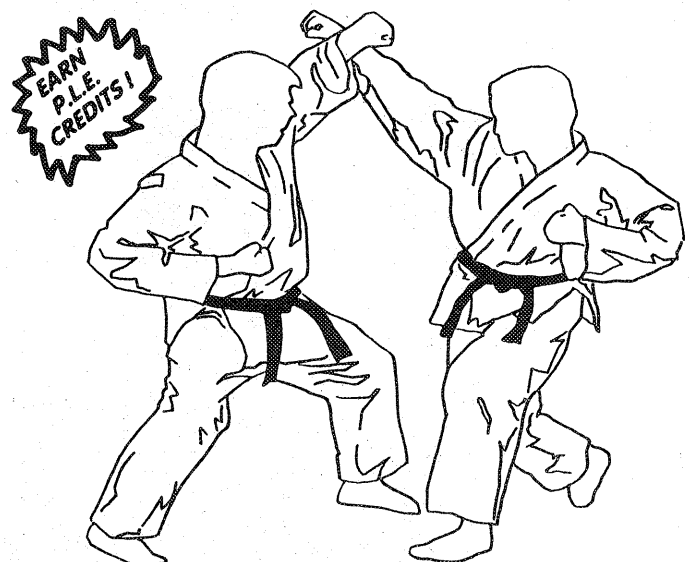

5. Be at your game before the stated time (check with your I-M Reps for rules on Defaults and Forfeits).

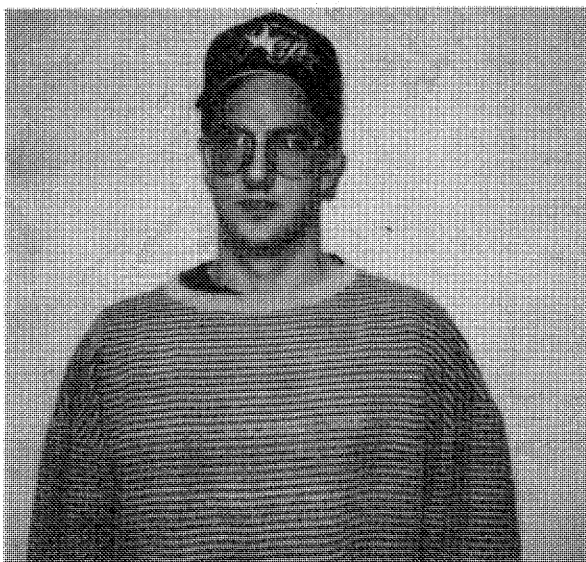
