

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# Students protesting early grad

Some of NAIT's graduating Business students are unhappy with the timing of this year's planned graduation ceremony - so unhappy, in fact, that they are circulating a petition within their technology which they plan to present to the Registrar's office.

According to graduating Business Accounting student, Fay Legere, the problem lies with the date of the graduation. The ceremony, scheduled to be held at the Jubilee Auditorium on Saturday, April 17, comes just two days prior to final exams which start on April 19 and continue until the 23rd. Legere says that due to the importance of

final exam week, many Business students who would like to go to their grad will be unable to attend. They simply cannot afford to give up valuable study time. "This is our crucial study time - Saturday and Sunday."

To raise Administration's awareness of the problem, Legere, along with fellow Business Accounting students Carmen Swarzes and Collette Lauer, are circulating a petition which expresses their discontent and plan to present it to the Registrar's office.

They have also proposed that Academic VP Brad Balkan raise the issue for discussion at the next Academic council meeting. Legere says that their aim is to establish commu-

nication between Administration and graduating techs to ensure that graduation dates can be negotiated to accommodate the students.

Ideally, says Legere, a post-exam graduation would be less stressful and more suitable.

In past years, however, post-exam graduation ceremonies have not been successful, according to Mark Dixon, Chairman of NAIT's Graduation Steering Committee. Dixon, who was not aware of the petition, says that in the past, when grad ceremonies were held after exams, many students were unable to attend because of job commitments. Attendance at ceremonies held before exams, however, has

been good.

Dixon says it is difficult to pick a date for grad ceremonies primarily because the Jubilee Auditorium must be booked four years in ad-

vance.

Last year, of 900 eligible Business students, 378 attended their graduation ceremony. Dixon says this is a standard number.

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
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# Mulroney cheats us again

He has done it again. With his resignation last week, Prime Minister Brian Mulroney has robbed Canadians one last time. Mulroney has rather adroitly avoided the electoral thrashing that so many Canadians (including myself) have been anxiously awaiting. While some celebrate Mulroney's premature departure, I feel cheated for missing the opportunity to vent my frustration on the man.

The Tories are already calling Mulroney the man that gave the country the "tough medicine" that we needed to compete globally. Yet, I am sure that history will judge Mulroney as not much more than a political opportunist. Under his leadership, Canada's taxation system has become regressive. Through the GST and the elimination of capital gains taxation, Canada's tax burden has shifted from the Conservatives most powerful constituency (the Canadian economic elite) to those less able to pay and less inclined to vote Conservative.

Furthermore, after accusing Joe Clark of being in bed with Quebec nationalists during the Conservative leadership race, Mulroney went on to

openly court the federal nationalist vote, promising to acquiesce to their demands. He attempted twice to force the nationalist vision of Quebec and Canada upon an unwilling Canadian public causing a division in this country to an extent never before seen.

Even Mulroney's resignation reeks of opportunism. By resigning at such a late date (a federal election must be called by November), the Conservatives, under a dynamic new leader, could be the party of "change" that the electorate is demanding. The NDP are still unable to expand upon their core support and the Liberals must now be painfully aware that the next election will not be won by default. Furthermore, the Liberals must be reconsidering their own leadership under Jean Chretien. Chretien has been in Parliament since 1963 and is still strongly identified with the Trudeau years; not an ideal pedigree in the present political landscape. Yet, because of Mulroney's last minute resignation, it is virtually impossible for the Liberals to remove Chretien in time for the next election.

Mulroney's successor will probably be another cabinet member and it may not be so easy to shrug off their responsibility for the unpopular policies of the Mulroney era. Yet, as witnessed by this week's celebration of Mulroney's departure, public distrust is generally pinned on the leader, not cabinet members or the party. During his own leadership campaign, Premier Ralph Klein was able to easily side step his responsibility for such failures as the Novatel debacle.

While Mulroney's resignation may be a relief for some and a boon to his party, it may also give Canadians the last thing we need; another term of divisive and ineffective Tory "tough medicine".


President's Corner with Dan Lachambre - NAITSA President

Should students be forced to pay GST on textbooks? Or how about being able to deduct all mandatory education expenses on your income taxes. Just recently I was in Ottawa for meetings and brought up these issues. The Association of Canadian community Colleges (ACCC) is now lobbying the Federal Government to give students concessions in these areas.

I proposed that students should be able to claim their students' association fees to reduce their taxable income (students' association fees are mandatory for full time students) as well as allowing students to claim auxillary fees (locker fees, lab fees, etc) as a tax credit.

Students are paying more each year and are receiving less in the way of funding. If the government follows these recommendations, they will at least display a little bit of loyalty to Canada's educational future.



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


At the start of the week there were 22 teams. But by the end of the week there were only 17 teams left in competition.

After a season of inconsistent hockey, the Ooks looked like they finally had their act together when they beat SAIT twice in the final weekend of the regular season.

Then the playoffs started.

Last Thursday the Ooks lost the first game of their best-of-five series with the Red Deer Kings by a 4-2 count. The story of the game?

"We beat ourselves," sighed rookie defenceman Curtis Nykaforuk.

He could have been referring to incidents like an early scramble in front of goalie Alec Shelfo in which one of the Ooks tried to slide the puck safely into Shelfo's pads. Instead, the puck ended up behind the line.

"Most of their goals were pretty easy," noted Ook forward Craig Hawryschuk who along with Sandro Pisani, accounted for NAIT's goals. "To win we needed to pressure their

defence more than we did."

The sentiment among a few of the veteran players after Thursday's game was that too many Ooks were taking shortcuts. Instances like giving the puck up in the corner to avoid a hit. Maybe that's why coach Perry Pearn called a team meeting after Friday's practice. His message was simple: NAIT has a proud winning tradition and now is not the time to break from tradition.

Pearn's words seemed to have an effect on his troops the next night. The Ooks threw a blanket over the Kings offence and poked holes in their defence, resulting in an impressive 6-2 win.

"It was old time playoff hockey," said veteran rearguard Shaun Hebert. "Our forecheck was aggressive and it showed in the final score."

The Ooks displayed everything a team needs to win in the playoffs: a hot powerplay (2 goals), aggressive penalty killing, and great goaltending. Shelfo turned away 21 of 23 shots, including a penalty shot with the score 4-1. That save shut the door on any hope of a Kings' comeback.

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

The rest of the questions ranged from the reality of living in a small market, to his relationship with the players of the Edmonton Oilers.



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
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# Coffee cigarettes and insanity



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

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
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
