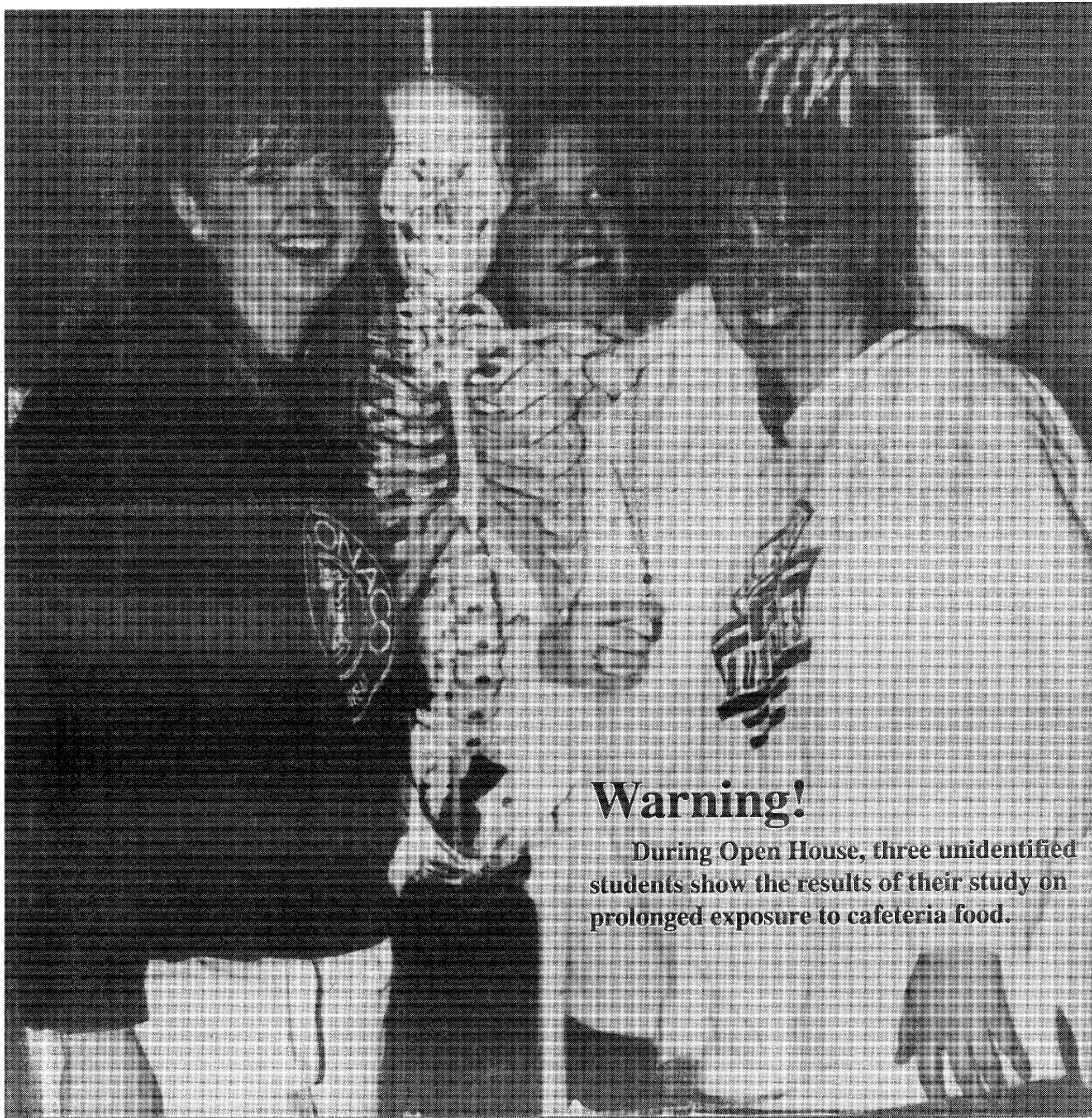

Presidential candidate disqualified

And then there were two.

Two NAITSA presidential candidates remain after the NAITSA Election Committee disqualified former candidate Janice Dmyterko early this week for campaigning before the time allowed by NAITSA rules.

After an hour deliberation last Thursday and after speaking with Dmyterko Sunday night, the Election Committee, consisting of: NAITSA President Dan Lachambre (chair), Chief Returning Officer (CRO) Brad Balkan (non-voting) and three students-at-large, met and ruled that a collection of events had forced them to disqualify Dmyterko.

NAITSA President and chair of the Committee, Dan Lachambre said that concerns over Dmyterko's activities first arose in early February when she was circulating questionnaires regarding the efficacy of NAITSA.

It was later ruled that the questionnaire did not violate any

NAITSA campaigning rules. Yet there were further complaints, initially from a current Presidential candidate, that she was disrupting classrooms with her questions.

At the end of February, Brad Balkan, Academic VP and CRO told Dmyterko to cease entering classrooms because, as Lachambre stated, it is disrupting and interfering with student's studies and is thus against the students responsibilities as outlined in the *Student Handbook*.

On March 1, Dymterko went to Westerra campus in Stony Plain to get signatures for her presidential nomination form. Here, Dmyterko claims that she was invited into a classroom to speak and solicit people to sign her nomination form.

When this came to light, the Election Committee met without Dmyterko via a conference call and disqualified her.

They met again last Sunday with Dmyterko yet they remained unanimous in their previous decision.

Lachambre offered a number

of reasons for the board's decision. He said that Dmyterko already had the 20 names required for the nomination yet continued to disrupt classes against the expressed instruction of the election CRO.

While admitting that Dmyterko's disqualification wasn't the result of any one thing, he said that it seems "a technicality, but it all added up."

Lachambre argued that it took the committee an hour to decide Dmyterko's fate and that she had,

"due process, twice." He said that by entering a classroom and "by not doing what the CRO says ... it's

pute that these events occurred, she argued that she was invited into the Westerra classroom and thus was not in breach of the rules. She further questioned the CRO's authority over someone who has not officially declared her candidacy.

Dmyterko said she was, "unfairly disqualified, very unfairly".

"I've taken more initiative to see what people want but I haven't been campaigning," argued Dmyterko.

While admitting that Dmyterko's disqualification wasn't the result of any one thing, Lachambre said that it seems "a technicality, but it all added up."

Business students drop petition

Business students who had been protesting the scheduling of their graduation ceremony have dropped their petition.

Graduating Business Accounting students Fay Legere, Carmen Zwartjes, and Collette Laver had been circulating a petition among their technology to express their discontent with the timing of the ceremony. The graduation is scheduled for April 17, just two days before final exams start. According to Legere, many students who wanted to attend would not be able to. They simply couldn't afford to give up valuable study time.

Since then however, Legere and Zwartjes have spoken with the Program Heads of Accounting and of Marketing Management as well as Lee Bradshaw, Executive Vice President of Academic Services and Stu Walline, SAS President. The meeting was set up by Academic VP Brad Balkan. Legere said she found everyone at the meeting to be open minded

and willing to listen to any possible solutions.

Although Bradshaw offered to rearrange exam dates to accommodate Business Accounting students, Legere and Zwartjes felt that re-scheduling exams could do more harm than good.

Instead it was decided that the exam from the lightest course would be scheduled for Monday, April 19 with heavier exams to come later in the week.

Legere says she is pleased with the outcome. "The show of concern and immediate response was really overwhelming. We feel satisfied that they did their best effort to find a solution and recognize in future years that they'll

have to pay attention to this sort of thing. We've dropped the petition as a result."

She also said she is impressed with the role NAITSA played in handling their situation.

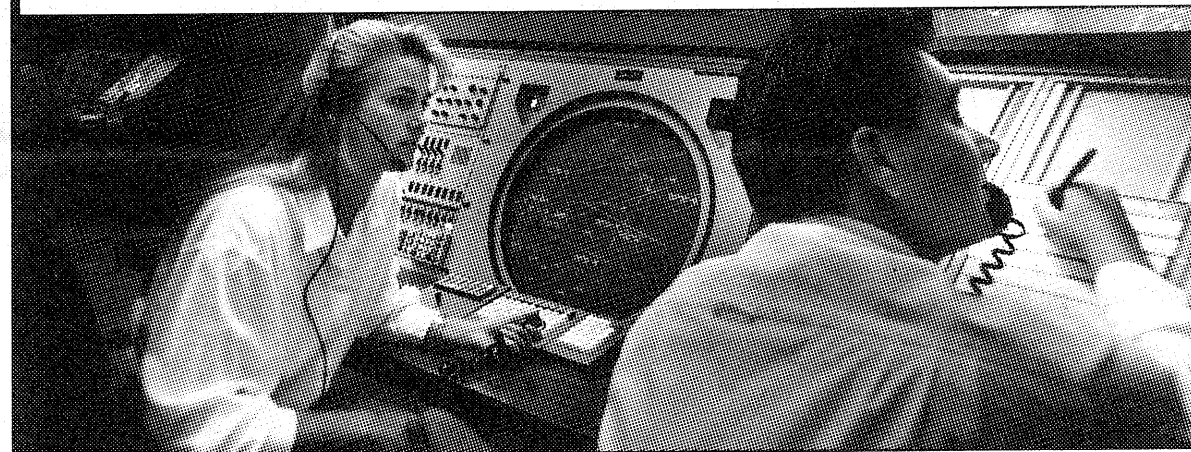

Congratulations to the "Best in Business".

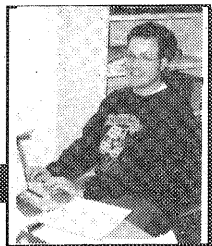

Dmyterko's disqualification inappropriate

Students will have one less choice for NAITSA President tomorrow because NAITSA's ad-hoc Election Committee felt it necessary to disqualify former presidential candidate Janice Dmyterko for breaking NAITSA election rules by campaigning before the official campaign

began Monday.

Basically, Dmyterko was disqualified for disregarding Academic VP and chief Returning Officer (CRO) Brad Balkan's instructions not to visit classrooms.

Yet, if someone is not a declared candidate, what authority does a CRO really have? Surely one is allowed to test the electoral waters to see if they are favorable before jumping in. The alternative would be to bar all potential candidates from publicly speaking about NAITSA.

Even the committee chair, Dan Lachambre admits that Dmyterko was disqualified on a seeming technicality. The committee was, perhaps, technically justified in disqualifying Dmyterko for giving herself an unfair advantage yet because the situation was so convoluted, the committee's disqualification of Dmyterko seems an unmeasured response.

Disqualification is such a drastic measure that it should only be used in clear cases of abuse. This, in my mind, was not one of these cases.

There's trouble on City Council. Judy Bethel and Patricia MacKenzie have decided to go for the glory and run for provincial politics, only five months after they were elected to serve a three year term on Edmonton's City Council.

MacKenzie says she feels she could "better serve her constituents in the legislature". If that's not glossing over the ugly truth then I don't know what is. It certainly won't serve Edmonton taxpayers any better if she gets elected and we're stuck paying \$200,000 to replace her.

Bethel and MacKenzie are obviously interested only in advancing their own political careers, and the hell with the constituents. There's nothing wrong with ambition, but these two power-hungry opportunists have forgotten what their priorities should be. Their unethical behavior only serves to increase voters' distrust of politicians.

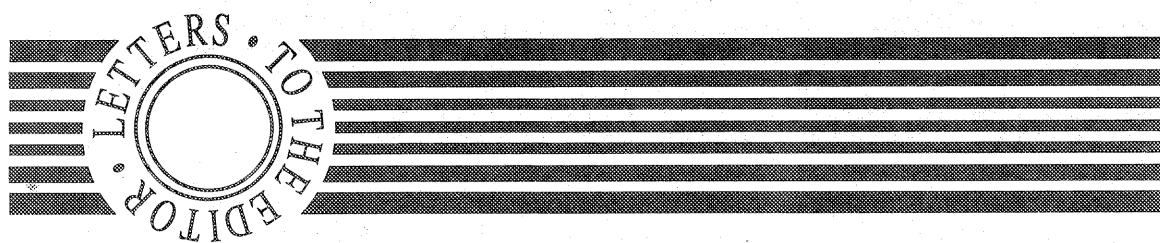

Ooks cap off dream season with mixed gold

Marner, Morse take Nationals by storm

Going up - Penthouse suite please. Such is the case for Ooks Karen Marner and Corey Morse, who won the National Mixed Doubles Badminton title last weekend in Grande Prairie. The duo cruised through the round robin portion of the tournament with a 4-1 record, then beat the British Columbia and Quebec teams to win the first CCAA gold medal in NAIT history.

"Karen and Corey played very intelligently," said the ACAC badminton Coach of the Year Mark Bosworth. "They played the perfect mixed doubles game."

On the first day of the tourna-

ment the Ooks pair beat the couple from Nova Scotia and lost to the Quebecers.

"We lost 18-17 and 15-8 to Quebec and I think that was a real wake up call," said Bosworth.

Marner and Morse came out smashing the next day, beating the Alberta host team (15-1, 15-3) B.C. (15-7, 15-8) and Ontario (15-4, 15-6). The finished the round robin in second place.

Lee Timar and Cindy Wotherspoon of B.C. were the opposition for Marner and Morse in the semi-final, but just like the round robin, the dynamic duo from NAIT was too strong. The Ooks won 15-1, 15-8.

In the finals Marner and Morse met the only team to beat them in the round robin - Patrick Gosselin and Claudia Dallaire of Quebec. NAIT won 15-10, 15-2.

Bosworth was not only pleased with the gold medal, but with the Ooks' season in general. The bad-

minton team piled up 115 match wins over the course of the year, losing only 21 times. Factor that in with the Ooks first place regular season finish and their team gold in the recent playoffs, and NAIT had a season to remember.

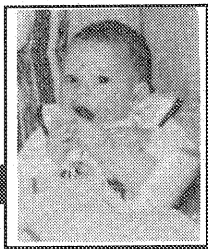
"It's nice to not have to rely on

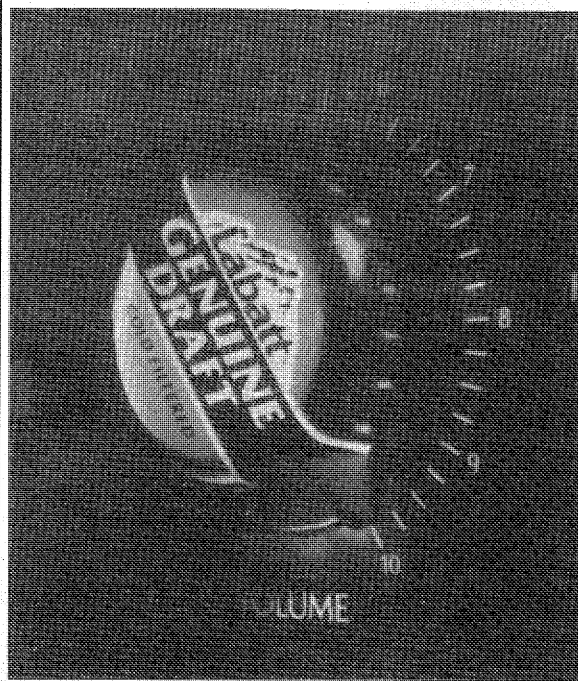
CCAA MIXED DOUBLES BADMINTON CHAMPIONS

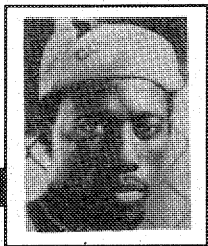

The cure for cancer is in your genes.

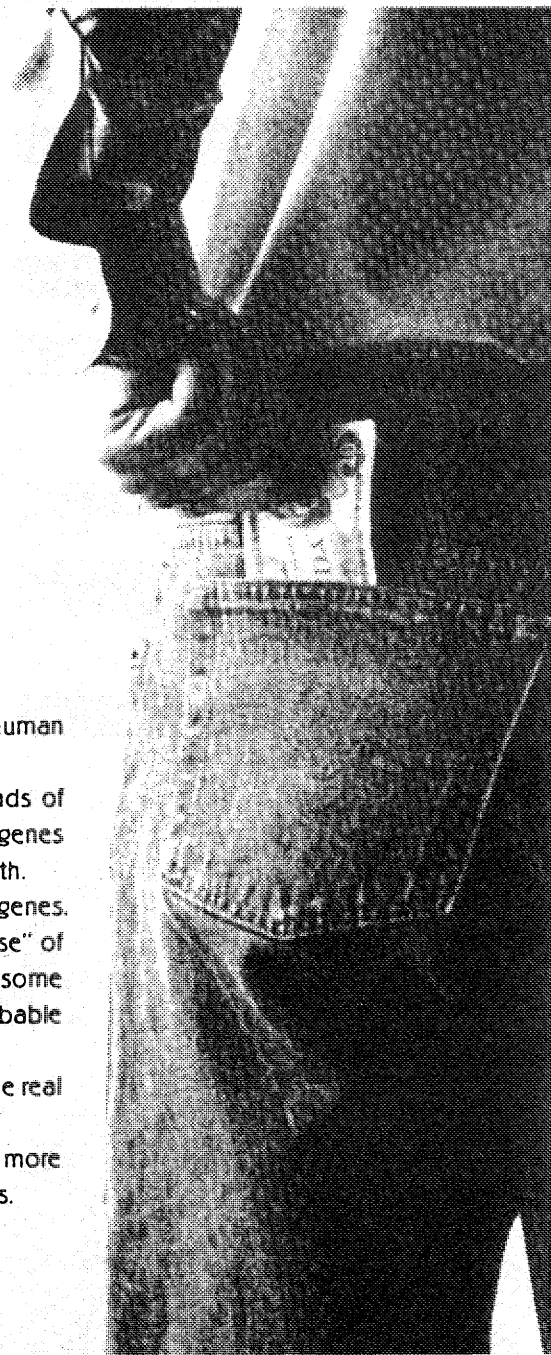
The uncontrolled growth of certain cells in the human body results in a disease called cancer.

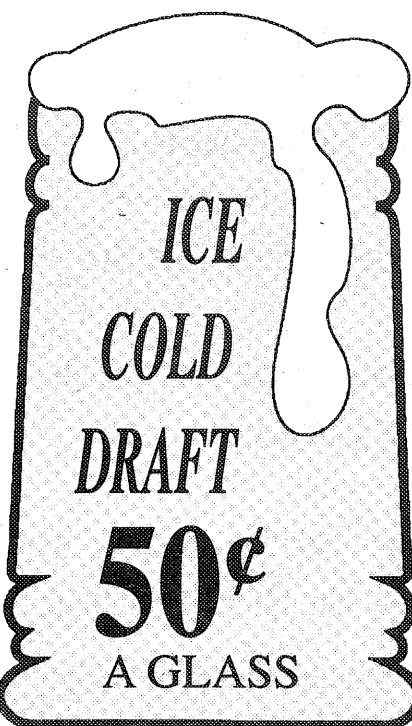

President

NAITSA President's duties include: supervising all NAITs officers in the discharge of their duties, acting as NAITSA's official representative to the Board of Governors and other organizations outside NAIT, chairing General Council meetings and is a voting member of the Activities Committee and Publications Board.

CHERRI BURDEYNY - MAR



What qualifications do you bring to the

office that you seek?

The NAITSA constitution stipulates thirteen formal duties and responsibilities of the president position, unfortunately due to restrictions in space I can not list them. I can tell you however, that the ideal person for this position must be versatile and possess a variety of qualifications to ensure these duties are fulfilled.

During the 1992/93 term I have held positions and had voting privileges on the NAITSA Activities committee, NAITSA Publications Board and the NAIT Athletic Board. With my positions on these boards I was required to work closely with key executive and administrative NAIT staff members. This allowed me to build successful and healthy relationships with various individuals who have tremendous impact on NAITSA operations. Should I be elected as NAITSA President, having these relationships already established would be highly advantageous to my position as it would be beneficial in

This is not to say the amount allowed to a student has necessarily dropped by that much, but rather has not increased in consideration to rising costs of living, rising costs of tuition, books and supplies and overall inflation. For example, the amount of funding from the Student Finance Board for a single student (without children) living away from home was eligible for in 1983 was \$610 per month. In 1992 that amount was \$615 per month. Responses to issues such as this have begun on an institutional and provincial level. To be successful, these responses MUST continue.

What changes would you like to bring to this position?

Over the past year, the NAIT Student Association has proven quite effective. It is

my desire to make the students at NAIT more AWARE of the Student Association and WHAT IT DOES FOR YOU. To do this, I aim to strengthen the relationship between the students and their elected executive members.

Other Comments?

On March 19 the students at NAIT have the opportunity to decide who will be chosen to represent them as their executive members. ALL full time students have a vote; it does not matter if you are first year or second year, or if you are returning to NAIT next year or not. I urge you to practice your right in deciding who those individuals are which will represent you. Listen to each candidate's platform, talk to them about their positions on issues that concern you and make an educated choice on election day. Please take a few minutes on Friday, March 19 between 10:00 and 3:00 to go out and vote.

SUSAN TEDDER - MARKETING



What qualifications do you bring to the office you seek?

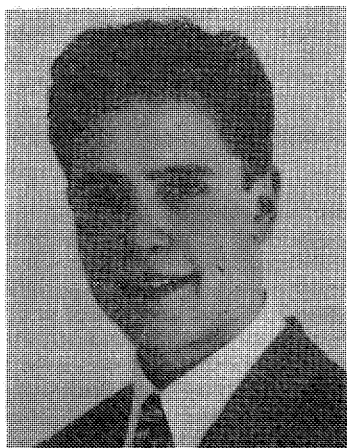

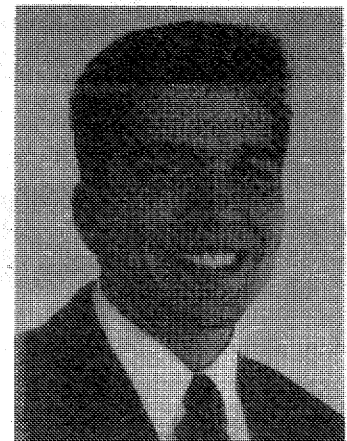
Other Comments

What changes would you like to bring to this position?

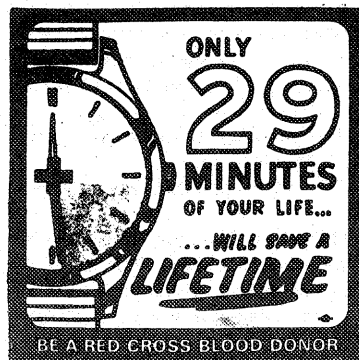

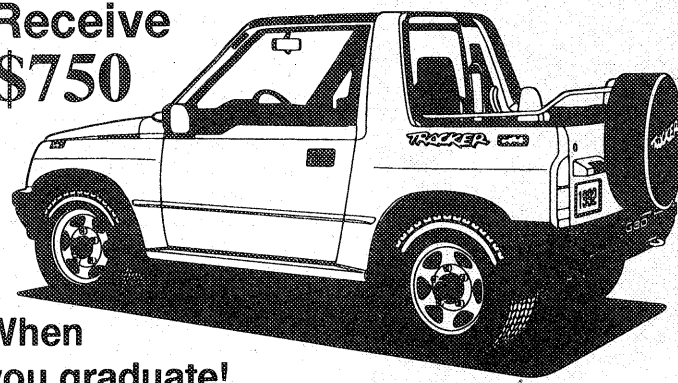

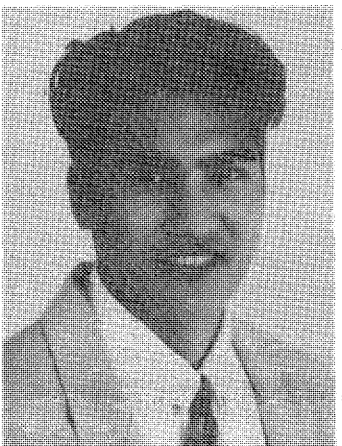
Other Comments?

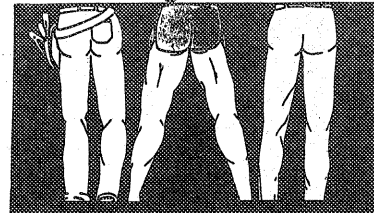

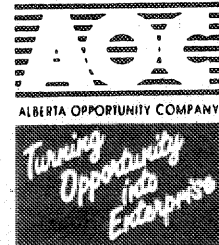

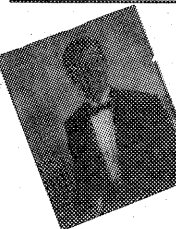

Board of Governors (2 seats)

JON BRENDA - MAR

What qualifications do you bring to the office you seek?

I could tell you about the two clubs that I am involved with at an executive level in the



hope that you would think that I am experienced with executive decision making processes. I could tell you the average marks that group projects I have been involved with have received, in the hope that you would notice that I am a hard working student, and

I work well with others. I could also tell you about my experience as a room representative or some other student involvement that probably 80% of the other candidates will be saying in this paragraph. But other than what I did just write, I won't tell you any more. Something tells me that you don't want to read that. This article is supposed to stimulate issues and get people thinking, and I don't think that giving statistics is the best way to go about it.

Why do you want to be a Board of Governor Rep.?

At the level of the Board of Governors, a lot is at stake: The human resources of NAIT (i.e., instructors, receptionists, custodians, you name it...); The finances of NAIT (i.e., the budget given by the provincial government, tuition, and how they will be allocated); Campus development (the proposed new Health Sciences Building, structural and cosmetic renovations); Open House, and the list goes on.

I feel that student representatives on the N.A.I.T. board of governors will require many qualities to properly handle these issues, but the single most important of these is responsibility. I also feel that I am qualified to meet this demand by being responsible to the students as well as the rest of the institute.

I will do this by listening to what you have to say about these issues and then bring that information to the board level. Of course the opposite is true too, as I would bring the information that the board has to offer to the students.

I want to represent the students of NAIT because I feel they need someone who will give them a strong voice on the Board. I also feel that I am getting a quality education at NAIT, and I want this to continue for the students of the future.

What do you think are the biggest problems facing students?

From talking to many students it is plain that no two are alike. Some are having problems with their home life or other social concerns, some are having trouble making ends meet, some are concerned that they can't find parking in the morning. There is such a variance that the concerns cannot be approached from a closed minded point of view. I could tell you my biggest problem, and that is an apparent lack of time for my studies, but the concerns of the individual student have to be considered individually.

From the Board's perspective, the most important areas that students may be concerned with are (in this order) quality of education and tuition.

TROY BREHAUT - ELECT. ENG.

What qualifications do you bring to the office you seek?

I believe that my work with the student press and my being a full time student who is directly affected by all actions of the Board of Governors qualifies me to seek the Board of Governors position.

Why do you want to be a Board of Governor Rep.?

The Board of Governors position is often overlooked during our school election because it is not a part of the student government.

Past student representation on the Board of Governors has reflected the student bodies lack of interest.

A representative who is able to voice student concerns over funding cuts and tuition increases while working with the B of G to look for alternative means of funding will be an asset to the board and the students.

What do you think are the biggest problems facing students?

Of the many problems students face, the biggest are: increasing costs of books and tuition due to lack of government interest in education, decreasing value of a post secondary diploma if funding decreases to such a point that the quality of education is affected.

Changes to the position?

If elected I will write a bi-monthly column for *The Nugget* to inform you of current issues and explain my position in respect to the issues.

Other Comments?

With further increases in tuition and book cost planned, it is in the best interest of the student body to elect (2) Board of Governors who will work aggressively to find alternative means of fund raising.

JENNIFER CADOR - RTA

What qualifications do you bring to the office that you seek?



Working as *Nugget* News Editor all year, I have talked with a considerable number of students and staff, as well as Administration, our present Board of Governors student rep, and NAITSA. I have also attended General Council meetings all year.

From all of this I have gained an understanding of what the issues are this year and what they'll be next year. In addition, I have service as a Board member in the past at the Daycare Society of Banff in 1988.

Why do you want to be B of G rep?

The Board of Governors make major decisions that affect NAIT students. Out of sixteen members, only five are elected and just two of those are students.

It's an absolute must that students have their concerns voiced at the Board level by someone who is informed and is not afraid to speak up.

There are some major issues coming up next year which demand student input such as the budget (this means tuition fees!), replying to the government discussion paper on the restructuring of the advanced education system, and the proposed Health Science Complex.

Students input on these and other issues is crucial. I intend to continue to speak with students, find out what they are concerned about, and then voice their concerns to the Board.

What are the biggest problems facing students?

Money. Tuition increases, textbook costs, and other mandatory fees in combination with a none-too-generous student financing system make life a daily struggle.

What changes would you like to bring to this position?

An increase in communication between the Board and the student population. Some students aren't aware that NAIT has a B of G. If they don't know about it, they can't voice their concerns. This is what I aim to change.

Other Comments?

The Board of Governors does not typically attract a lot of student attention, however it's important to realize decisions they make do affect you.

A budget issue involving user fees for things such as the library, computer labs, and Health Services will be examined next year. I believe NAIT should avoid a user fee policy because many students are already suffering financial hardship. It's an issue which demands effective student representation.

Be sure to get out and vote for Jennifer Cador on March 19.

LEN KOMAR - CST

NAIT elections. What qualifications do you bring to the office that you seek?
