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# The Axeman Cometh

Does the mythological, hypothetical creature known only as the "Axeman" ever remind you of the cute Energizer bunny (the one that keeps going and going and going)? Except, this "Axeman" keeps on cutting and cutting and cutting. What is he cutting this time? What else...Education. The Government of Alberta has pressured educational institutions across the province to reduce, re-use, and recycle. The Government wants schools to reduce their budgets, re-use old equipment, and recycle old teachers.

An Advanced Education Budget Round Table was held in Calgary last week. From Thursday to Saturday, students, staff, members of industry, and anyone concerned sat and listened to Mr. Jack Ady. Mr. Ady, the Minister of Advanced Education and Career Development, and his

staff went to the Round Table talks to listen to any concerns and comments.

Approximately 150 people attended the forum in Calgary to help make decisions for any reductions. Students leaders from CAUSE (Council of Alberta University Student Executives), and ACTISEC (Alberta College and Technical Institute Student Executive Council) were in attendance, including NAITSA's own president Susan Tedder. When asked what she thought of this Round Table she replied "This one was more productive than the Educational Round Tables that were held at the end of October here in Edmonton. Few people maintained their turf protection. Everyone was very open to the students."

Some of the suggestions under study deal with many different areas. For staff it could mean leaves without pay to attrition, early retirement, or lay off programs. A possible 5% salary

roll-back and hiring freeze could also be implemented.

For the administrative processes the cuts could come as a decrease in hospitality services by 20%, a decreased travel budget by 20%, or a reduction of management and staff.

Some big changes could occur within the programs themselves. Such as rationalizing courses within programs and between programs within NAIT. Another option is to amalgamate the boards of NAIT and SAIT.

The physical facilities may be heading for drastic changes. The programs at Westerra Campus could be relocated so that Westerra could be disposed of. Classrooms may be altered to accommodate larger classes to use space more effectively.

All these changes are possibilities and are currently under review. If you are interested in looking at this information, it can be "checked out" at the library.

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# Checkstop Blows Red

Recently two intoxicated people left a bar and got into a vehicle to drive home. On their way they were stopped by city police at a check-stop. The driver was asked to take a breathalyzer test and proceeded to blow yellow. His license was immediately suspended for a twenty-four hour period. The officer then asked the driver if his passenger had been drinking, and if they were able to drive. The driver stated that the passenger had been drinking but considerably less than what he had consumed. What happened next is simply unbelievable...the driver returned to the car and the passenger got behind the wheel and drove away from that check stop. The officer never asked the passenger if she'd been drinking, or checked to see if she was in any condition to drive. As fact would have it, the passenger was more intoxicated than the original driver.

There are approximately 450 fatalities due to auto collisions each year in Alberta. About 150 of those are due to the consumption of alcohol by a driver. In this province about 35% of deaths on the road are because of some drunk driver who figured he was 'okay' to drive. In Edmonton, the percentages is much closer to 60%!!! This means that every year in Alberta 150 people "go have a few" then kill themselves and/or someone else.

Over each year there are about 10 scheduled check-stops. They each run for about one week with the exception of the annual three week Christmas time stint. There are two different things that a driver can be charged with: 1. Impaired driving (by alcohol or drugs) and 2.

Driving while over the legal limit (of 80 mg percent). First time offenders face a \$300-\$2000 fine and/or up to 6 months in jail, and their license suspended for one year. This may sound harsh to some, but how do you deter people from acting in a manner that could cause the death of others? Just because you are not drunk does not mean that you are not *impaired*.

Back to the drivers who left the check-stop...they reached their destination with out another incident. No one was hurt but they did wonder about why the officer let them leave without at least speaking to the second driver. According to the Edmonton's police department this should have never happened and if there had been an accident with the second driver in control of the vehicle, the police would have been liable. Great. What if some was killed? I don't think knowing that the police were liable would have made anyone feel better.

I believe that it is important to mention that the average age of offenders is from 18-25 years old, with the average blood alcohol level of 160 mg percent...twice the legal limit. A large portion of NAIT students fall into this age category, and most of us do a lot of drinking. We don't usually think of killing someone when we decide that we have sobered up enough to drive. How often do you personally get into your car knowing that you really shouldn't be driving. Our minds tend to play games with us when we decide that we'll 'drive real slow' or 'we'll take the side streets'. Excuses don't save lives, they kill people.

# Academic Council

At the end of the last semester (April, 1993) a survey was taken to ask Business Administration students how they felt about Academic Dishonesty, and if they knew of anyone who committed any acts of Academic Dishonesty.

The results of the survey were presented at the last Academic Council meeting (November 10), and here are just some of the highlights. The survey showed that just over 38% of the students knew of other students who plagiarized/copied reports or written assignments, and about 26% knew of other students who plagiarized computer assignments. The survey also showed that an average of 23 - 24% of reports, written assignments, and computer assignments are plagiarized/copied.

There was some good news from the survey. It showed that students felt that Academic Honesty was very important to them, and that other students may not have a high standard of Academic Honesty.

What does this mean to you.

Well, while some students are working hard to get good marks, other students are taking the easy way out, not doing the required work and may get better grades. Do you think this is fair? Of course, NAIT is making every effort to catch the cheaters, and penalize them.

What happens when a student is caught/suspected of cheating, plagiarism. Currently the disciplinary actions are as follows:

- mark penalties in course
- reprimand
- suspension
- withholding of grades and certification
- termination/expulsion

These actions are currently under review, and may come in line to what other provincial technical schools, colleges, and universities have, which means tougher penalties. If a student is caught committing acts of dishonesty, this becomes a permanent mark on their school record. So, if the province passes its long awaited Freedom of Information Act, potential employers will have access to student files. And if you

were accused of cheating on an exam, the potential employer may decide not to hire you based on your previous academic record.

The Nait Administration, along with the Academic Council, is considering changes to the Academic Regulations, in regards to Academic Dishonesty. Considerations under review; to let students know what is considered academic dishonesty for each program, how to avoid any dishonesty, procedures to follow, penalties, and the appeal process. The new recommendations should be out sometime in the new year.

Any act of Academic Dishonesty reflects on the reputation of NAIT, the instructors, and of course the students. NAIT has developed an excellence, that employers expect of NAIT graduates, so if our high standards of academic achievement are lessened in any way, potential employers will look elsewhere for their future employees.

## President's Corner

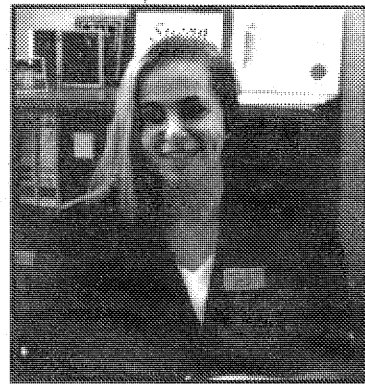

The Honorable Minister Jack Ady, of Advanced Education and Career Development, summed up the roundtables saying that he was encouraged with the level of participation, the potential saving/revenue generating ideas and the open-mindedness (lack of "turf protection") that existed. It was said that a full report would be out by the beginning of December, so keep your eyes open for news.

The answer to last week's question: As education has been in the forefront of the news for quite some time it is not surprising to learn that a rally is in the process of being organized for Tuesday, December 7. It started up at the University of Alberta and has grown to include MANY different groups concerned with education whether it is secondary or post-secondary. The NAITSA executive has decided not to vocally endorse it as an organization, but feels that students can decide if they would like to attend on their own. Do what you feel is best for you and if you want to hear our stance then come down to E133D and make it known, otherwise I won't know.



## Red Alert

On Sunday, November 21, 1993 the police and security at NAIT had to deal with a hostage taking. The "simulated" hostage taking was done in coordination with the Edmonton Police Services (EPS), NAIT security, and NTV. The Radio and Television Arts (RTA) department got the whole incident on film and even played the parts.

The test was to see how our security and the EPS worked together. The EPS brought out all the stops Sunday morning with 7 police cruisers, SWAT teams, dogs, hostage negotiators, and even the bomb squad with their robot disposer.

Jim Herron program head of RTA, was one of the seven hostages in the exercise. In total, there were 40 students from RTA, 10 of which were acting. The other 30 were "invisible" cameramen, as they walked through the action unharmed. Jim Herron said "the whole thing was very well done." A videocassette was made from this and will be used to help train NAIT security.

The EPS does these "scenarios" twice a year at various different locations throughout Edmonton. The event wound up around 12:30 PM, and then members of the EPS discussed the little improvement both teams could make in the future.

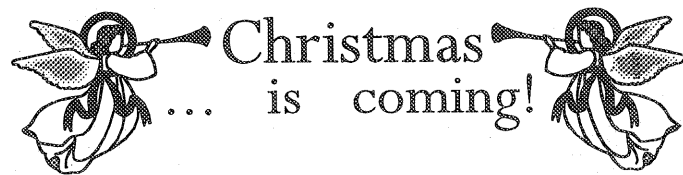

## Search for Innovators

The Ernest C. Manning Awards Foundation will continue in 1994 its program of Saluting Canadian Innovation through presentation of cash awards to Canada's outstanding innovators. Nominations of innovative Canadians for the 1994 competition from coast to coast.

The \$100,000 Principal Award, the \$25,000 Award of Distinction and two \$5,000 Innovation Awards will be presented to Canadians who have conceived and developed new concepts, procedures, processes or products of benefit to Canada.

Winners of the 1993 Awards were Dusanka Filipovic of Toronto, Ontario for her work in developing a process to prevent emissions of CFCs to the atmosphere from refrigeration and air conditioning equipment being repaired or abandoned; Dr. David Schindler of Edmonton, Alberta whose large-scale experiments are considered to be largely responsible for the banning of phosphates in detergents and have been influential in shaping legislation controlling sulphur dioxide emissions into the atmosphere; Frederick Dimmick of Parry Sound, Ontario who invented and

patented illuminated signs that are reliable, energy efficient and virtually maintenance free; and Yves Potvin of Vancouver, British Columbia who developed a very successful line of meatless hot dogs and burgers which contain no cholesterol, are low in saturated fat and have no preservatives.

Nominees for the Awards must be Canadian citizens resident in Canada. Nominations for the 1994 competition close on February 11, 1994.

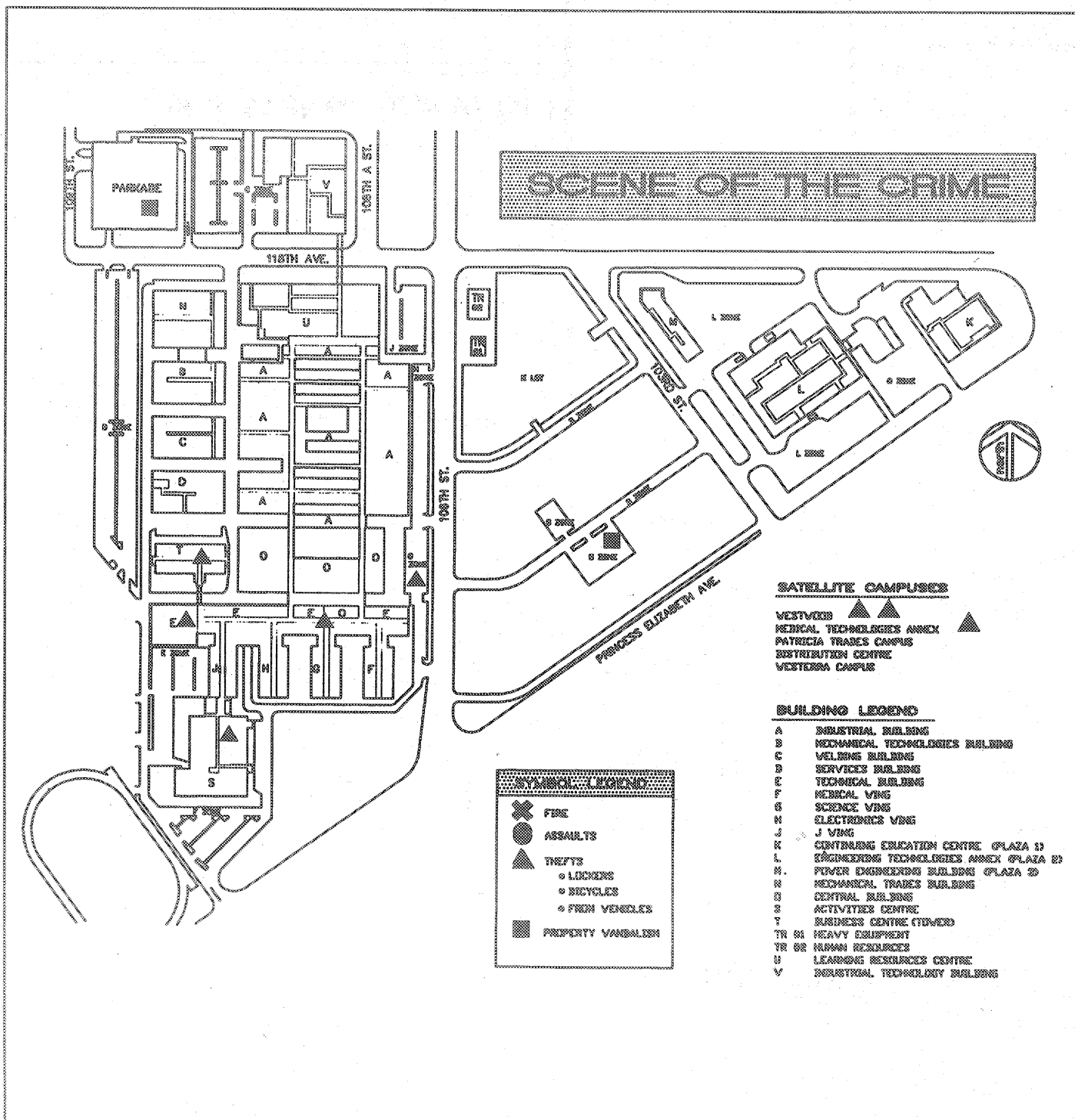
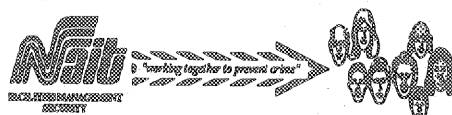

Each week a question will be formulated for students to view their opinion on. This week's question was: "Do you think that NAIT should become a non-smoking institute?"



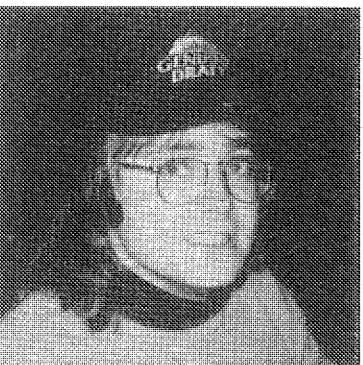

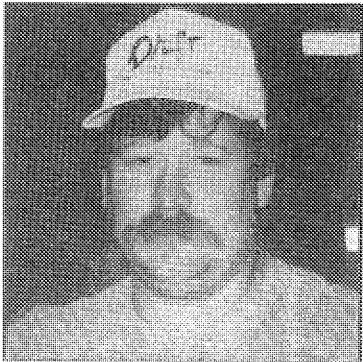

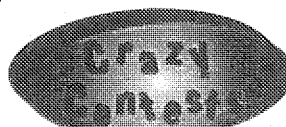

The principles you will learn are basic to any form of interpersonal communication, whether your audience consists of one person or one thousand.

In addition to presenting prepared speeches, you will participate in Table Topics - an impromptu speaking exercise that will develop your ability to "think on your feet" in such situations as interviews, seminars, business meetings and conversations. You will also serve in various key capacities at club meeting, including Toastmaster, Topicmaster, Evaluator, General Evaluator and others. Each of these functions has a specific educational purpose and will aid in your self-development. Another benefit of attending club meetings is the opportunity to watch other speakers and learn from them.

Most of the projects in this program call for talks of five to seven minutes in length. This is

not aimed at making you a master of the seven-minute address. Rather, it is designed to give you adequate time to develop your topic while still keeping club meetings within a reasonable time frame. By learning to effectively present a seven-minute talk, you'll also be able to deliver a 40-minute address or a two-minute statement of your views at a business meeting. And you'll be able to do so with confidence, clarity, persuasiveness and enthusiasm.

The Tower Power Toastmasters club meets every Tuesday evening from 6 PM to 8 PM at NAIT in room 0120. 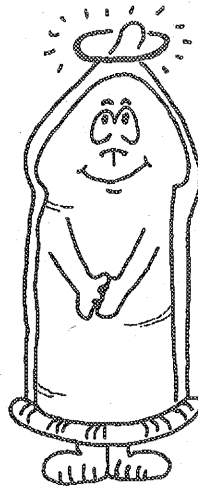
## Basketball Wins

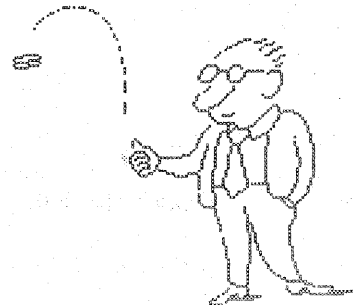

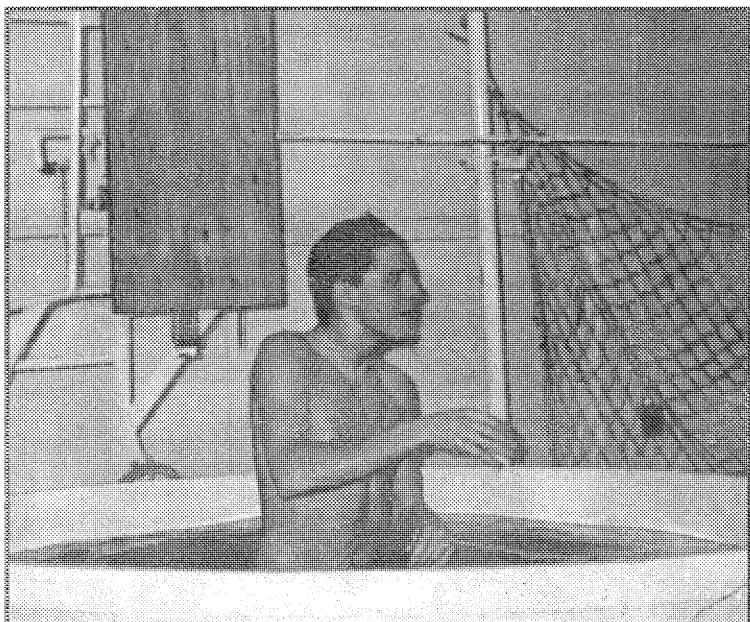

# Sports Update

Edmonton - The 1992-93 ACAC champion Mount Royal College Cougars host the NAIT OOKs in a two game set on Friday, November 26th, and Saturday, November 27th. Game time both nights is 7:30 PM.

The OOKs (4-3-1) enter the series with the league leaders as a team still trying to find the key to winning close hockey games. The OOKs have lost two over-time games so far this year and a third in which they trailed by one goal with less than two minutes remaining in regulation.

The OOKs split a home and home series with the Augustana University College Vikings this past week. On Friday, November 19th, the OOKs scored a 9-5 win at the NAIT arena. On Saturday, November 20th the OOKs lost 2-1 overtime at Camrose.

In Friday's contest, the OOKs - with a six point performance from Peter Kasowski - improved their home record to two wins, one tie, and one loss with a 9-5 triumph over the Vikings.

In the first, the OOKs gained control early and led 7-0 by the first intermission. Jamie Barnes completed the hat trick while Peter Kasowski, Deryk Fersovich, Trevor McCallion, and Sandro Pisani added singles in the first period barrage.

In the second, the OOKs gave the Vikings the opportunity to gain some confidence. Peder Lodoen and Bob Charchun

tallied for the Vikings at 2:58 and 7:51 respectively. Peter Kasowski then netted a shorthanded goal at 15:50 for NAIT before Dean Holoien pocketed power play goal at 16:42.

In the third, the OOKs were outscored by the Vikings for the second straight period. AUC's Dean Holoien capitalized on a power play opportunity at 8:50. The teams then exchanged even strength markers with Dan Flaherty scoring for NAIT at 14:21 and Jay Robertson countering for AUC at 17:18.

NAIT's Mike Applegate turned away 21 of 26 shots. AUC's Creedence Doi and Pat MacKintosh teamed up to turn away 26 of 35 shots.

In Saturday's match-up, Dean Holoien scored at 5:40 of overtime to lift the Augustana University College Vikings to a 2-1 victory over the OOKs.

Following a scoreless first period, Peter Jas of the Vikings capitalized on a power play opportunity at 6:49 of the second period. Stacey Rayan of the OOKs poked in a rebound at 5:38 of the third period to set the stage for the overtime.

Mike Applegate blocked 33 of 35 shots in the NAIT net. Creedence Doi turned away 42 of 43 drives in the Augustana crease. The OOKs outshot the Vikings 21 to 8 in the third period, but could only beat Doi once.

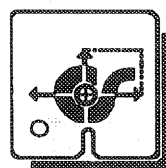

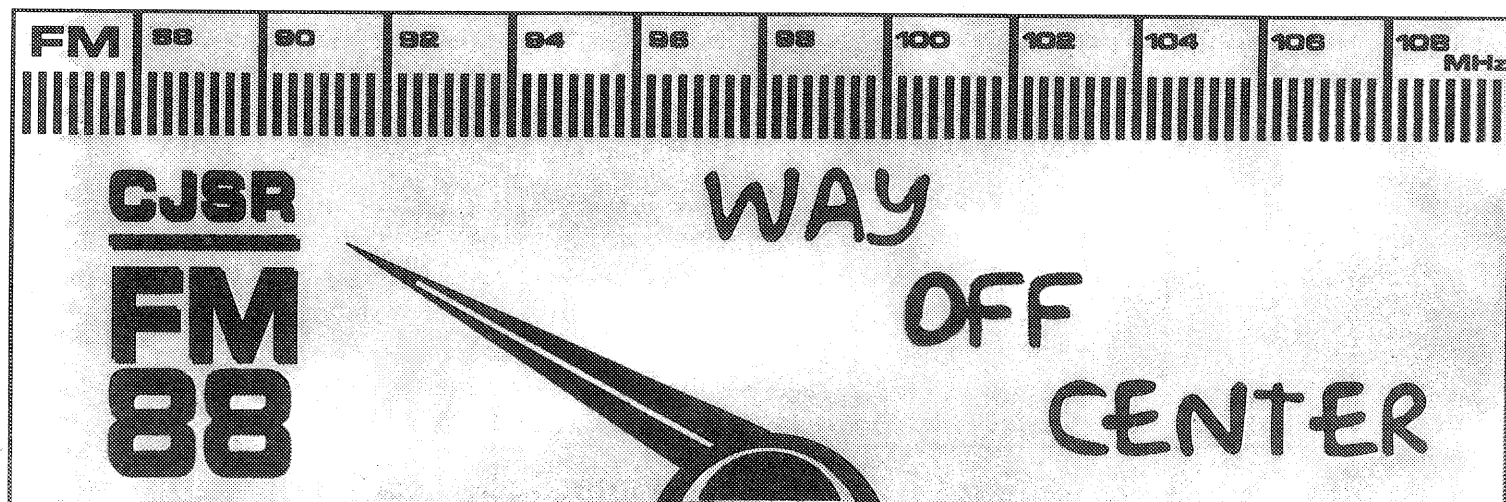
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# Elvis Sighted At NAIT

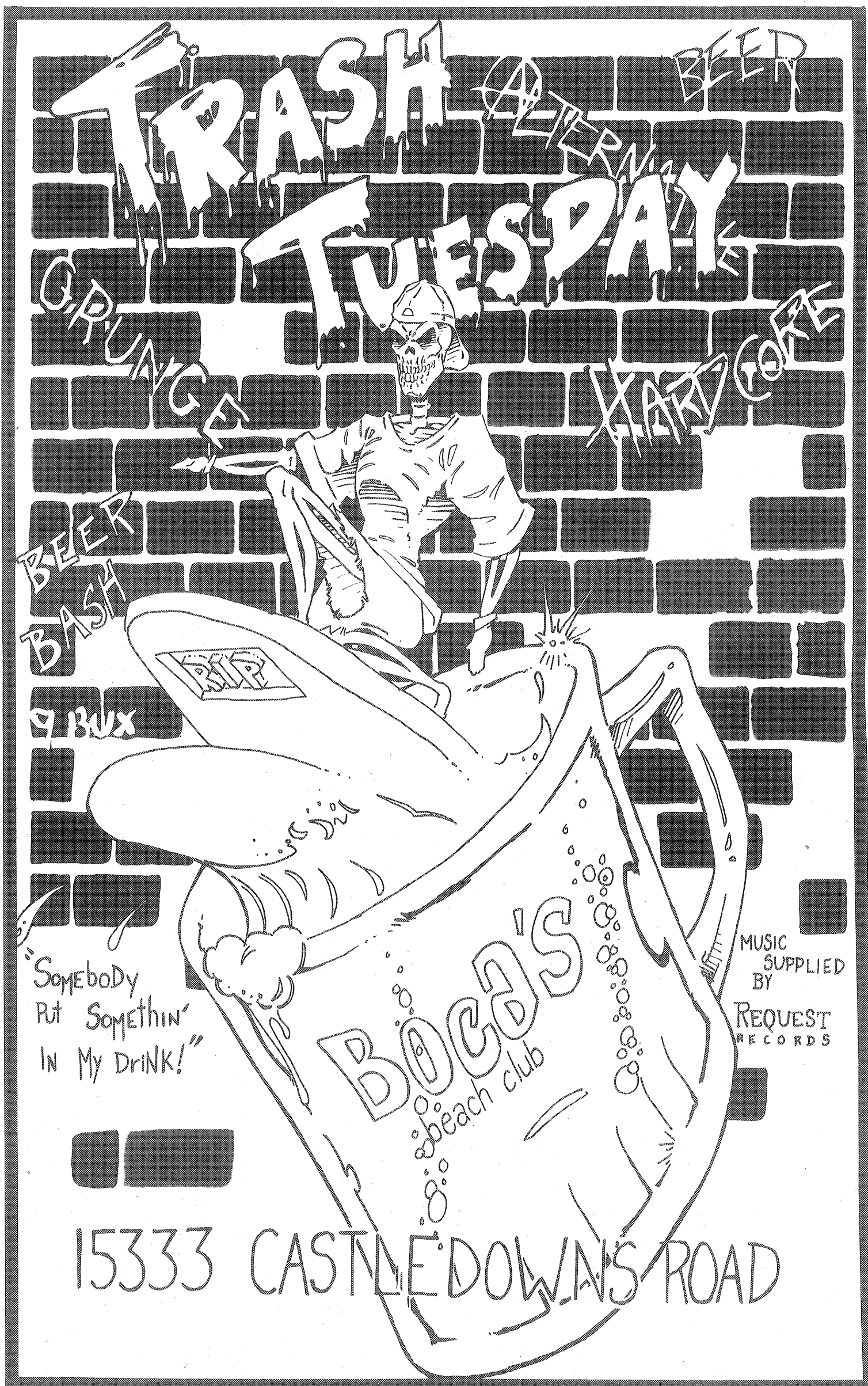

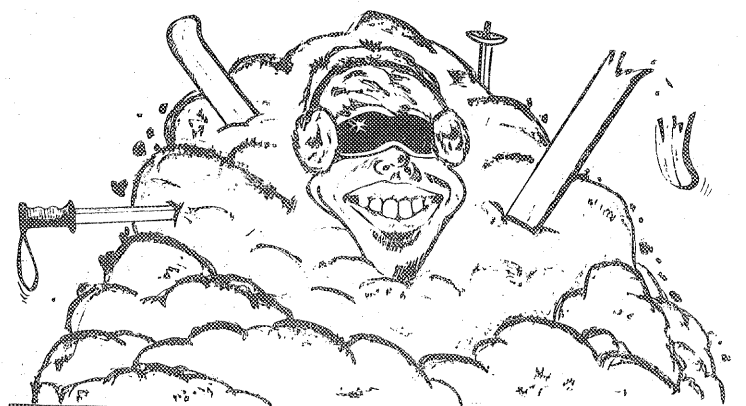
