

AIT played host to an all candidates forum in the Naitrium on Thurs day, October 7. In front of a substantial crowd, the noon-hour forum covered topics of interest to students such as jobs and training programs.

Scheduled to appear were Judy Bethel of the Liberals, Kevin Kovacs of the PC's, Ross Harvey from the NDP, Linda Robertson of Reform, Ernst Eder of the Green party, and Jim Musson of the National party.

Controversy arose over the absence of Judy Bethel, the Liberal hopeful. After assuring organizers of her intent to appear at the forum, Bethel backed out at the last moment to attend instead a meeting at a Vietnamese Cultural Centre. Bethel's campaign co-ordinators claimed that an aide had double booked the Liberal candidate for the 7th, but the other candidates unanimously agreed that Bethel's

evasiveness had been a recurring event throughout the campaign. The Edmonton East Liberals, however, chose to attack the organizers of the forum for not allowing them to use a surrogate speaker from another riding.

One of the highlights of the forum was a heated exchange between incumbent M.P. Ross Harvey and PC challenger Kevin Kovacs. Kovacs, a local businessman, challenged the effectiveness of Harvey's platform manual, and the two candidates exchanged a few verbal jabs. A little later, National party candidate Jim Musson shot himself in the foot by referring to NAIT several times as the U of A. Considering that the forum was held at NAIT, these mistakes were not received well.

The forum itself proved to reinforce the fact that Edmonton East is a very important and hotly contested riding. Encompassing the downtown core, all eastern residential areas, and the industrial areas, there is as much bickering as there is campaigning. Ernst Eder







NAIT's Aboriginal Students Club had the pleasure of meeting with the president of Ooskipukwa, Clayton Blood, on Friday afternoon. Clayton Blood, a former CBC news broadcaster, spent the afternoon with the club discussing the infrastructure of his organization as well as student opportunities.

Ooskipukwa, a cree word for a new bud or new growth, is a native owned, nonprofit organization managed and supported by the First Nations Resource Council in Alberta. Its function is to review, restructure and develop business proposal submitted by native communities.

The projects range from management and community development, to legal research and technical assistance. strengths in real life situations.





The Dream Is Dead

This past week, the world was robbed of one of its heroes. Michael Jordan prematurely ended his spectacular career while still on the top of the heap, leaving all to wonder what might have been and to speculate on the many possible reasons he had to quit this early. This event will have a far greater impact than the considerable shock waves felt throughout professional basketball. In this week of practically no OOKS sports events, I hope you all can forgive me for running off at the mouth a bit on the end of an era in basketball. I think it will affect all of us, even those who are not die-hard hoop fans.

My life, as well as the lives of millions of people all over the world, have been influenced by the man from Wilmington, North Carolina with the unique ability to perform miracles on the hardwood. When Magic Johnson and Larry Bird were waging their wars in the first years of the 80's, I was not yet an NBA fan. The intricacies of pinpoint passing and deadly shooting that Bird & Magic epitomized were lost on me. It was not until 1983, when a highflying college sophomore on Dean Smith's North Carolina team caught my eye, that I became interested in basketball. I can still remember announcers like Dick Vitale just saying things like "how does he DO that ??" with puzzled looks on their faces as Jordan would sweep in and jam over two or three defenders.

I was not alone in my amazement. As MJ moved on to the NBA his amazing skills attracted the attention of millions. Fans like me all over the world watched his dunking duels with Dominique Wilkins, the Bulls' struggles with the Detroit Pistons, and finally Chicago's triumphant 1991 World Championship. Since '91, the Bulls have not let go on their hold on NBA power, and this is mostly due to Michael Jordan's least talked about trait: his incredible work ethic.

Jordan will never be remembered as a workmanlike player, but the truth of the matter is that Jordan is the best because he hustles and works harder than any player in history. Simply consider his improvement over his career. After already being the best player in the league, Jordan went out and worked on his defense until he was the best defender in the world. As soon as critics pointed at outside shooting as Jordan's achilles' heel, MJ turned himself into a deadly 3-point shooting machine. At the end of his career, Michael Jordan was still the best player in the world in almost every category, and that is the real tragedy here; that the greatest player in history is taking his curtain call when the show is only half over.

Imagine that Nolan Ryan had retired in 1977 - how many exciting performances, (not to mention nohitters) would the world have missed. What if Hank Aaron had retired after 500 home runs? How about Joe Montana? He could have retired after 2 Super Bowls straight into the hall of fame. These examples pale in comparison to Jordan's situation. Michael is in his prime, his team is extremely strong, and chances are he would collect several more championships before his skills eroded. Why then is the best player in the world calling it quits at the pinnacle of his career?

There is no doubt that the lion's share of Jordan's decision to retire is based largely on the unanswered questions surrounding his father's death. Still unknown is whether or not James Jordan's killers realized who they were robbing. Until that is known, the possibility that his father was killed because of Michael's fame must weigh heavily on MJ's mind. As well, because of the incredible fame, the Jordan family was closer than most. The father-son bond was especially strong. James was a regular at Bulls' games, and by Jordan's own admission the thought of a season without his father at courtside was a painful one.

I really don't think that the common reasons mentioned (1) that Jordan is leaving because of money and (2) he is leaving while he is on top, are valid ones. Jordan makes more money than he could ever spend, and he is so competitive that I find it hard to believe that he could just walk away voluntarily from a challenge.

Speculation, however, is useless. Jordan is gone, and I don't think he'll return. I can wish all I want, but Michael's mind is made up and I think he'll just disappear for awhile. Unfortunately, I believe this sets us up for some psychos believing they can control sports figures by going after their families. I hope it doesn't happen, but some nut is liable to try something stupid.

And so Michael Jordan goes off into history, his head hung in mourning, leaving behind him unprecedented accomplishments: a lock on the scoring championship, one of three 3-peat champions in history, the most dominant guard to ever play the game, and most of all, his MVP trophies.

Michael Jordan was, and is, an MVP in life as well as in basketball. He gave so much time and effort to charity that it may have contributed to the incredible stress he felt, yet he continued to give. Jordan changed our world in ways most of us do not even consider. Are you wearing Nike shoes right now? If not for Michael Jordan and Spike Lee's commercials and the millions of sales they generated, you might be wearing Reeboks or Converse shoes. Jordan changed the way products are marketed to you, simply by proving the viability of big-money sports endorsements based on personality. Also consider the fact that Jordan opened many doors by becoming the first black athlete to completely dominate the endorsement field. Bo Jackson, Deion Sanders, and Shaquille O'Neal all owe their big-The true tragedy of this whole series of events is that the greatest player of all time leaves the game he loves under a dark cloud of unhappiness.
