

General Council Meeting

fter the last council meeting, a lot of stu dents were upset about the \$2500 donation given to Dan LaChambre and Scott Johnston. The Electronics Tech Rep tried to get a motion to rescind the amount, for a second time. However, due to time restraints for Dan and Scott, and the fact that the motion was passed, a cheque for \$2500 was already given to Dan. The trip to Romania was given the official goahead from the Canadian Government and they are leaving on October 24th. Since the cheque has been written, no more motions may be made on the subject.

Another money donation was approved by the student representatives to invest between \$1500-\$2000, for upgrading the Naitrium. The upgrading is in the form of satellite reception. At present, the televisions in the Naitrium pick up only 3 channels. The cost of getting cable installed is approximately

\$10,000.

October 20th is the annual general meeting in the Naitrium at 11:15 AM. This meeting is mandatory for all technology representatives, and all NAIT students are invited to attend. This meeting is to explain and determine what NAITSA is. It is very important that a quorum is met, and that means that at least 200 students must attend.

Gold Rush Company booklets are now available to technologies. These books contain many coupons for students. Also, on November 4th and 5th, the first Blood Donor Clinic of the year is being held. The clinic is hoping to raise 120 pints of blood each day. For each pint that your technology donates, \$15 will be given to their tech charity. For any technology that is interested in getting a pop can bin, smaller bins are now available for a \$5 deposit at the NAITSA office. Finally, for anyone who has won any intramurals, the T-shirts are available to be picked up in the NAITSA office.

COMMENCING NOVEMBER 1, MONDAY TO FRIDAY, 9:00 A.M. TO 4:00 P.M.

Fifty percent of current Bookstore price exclusive of GST will be offered for eligible books. Eligible books are determined from instructor's requisitions for the 1994 Winter Term. No purchase receipt is necessary.

For books that are not eligible at the time of the buyback an offer of about ten to twenty- five percent may be made depending on whether the book is active on our wholesale book list. These books will be sold to a wholesaler for shipment to another college. Generally, no offers are made for old editions, out of print books, or books containing disks.

Since only Winter Term books are being considered for the fifty percent buyback, students may want to take a chance and wait for the Spring buyback at the end of April before trying to sell their Fall Term books. There is no guarantee, however, that these books will be eligible at that time.

It is entirely up to the student to accept or not accept the price offered. It may be that a better deal can be made privately in January particularly if an adoption decision has not been made at the time of the buyback.

The buyback will continue through exam week in December.






To The Students From The Democratic Dissident

The NAIT Ooks finished fourth in the ACAC Preseason Tournament this past weekend and have a long hard road in front of them this season.

The defending ACAC champion Mount Royal College Cougars won the tournament with a 5-2 triumph over the Red Deer College Kings in Calgary on Sunday and will be the team that the rest of the league will be gunning for in 1993-94.

The Ooks had three tough games in the tournament and will be fighting for a playoff spot this season with the three clubs they faced in the tournament -Concordia, Red Deer and Augustana.

On Thursday, October 14th, the Ooks rallied with four third period goals en route to a 6-4 victory over the Concordia College Thunder at the NAIT

Brian Parker blocked 57 of 63 shots in the Concordia crease while Dean Intwert turned away 18 of 22 in the NAIT net. On Saturday, October 16th, the Red Deer College Kings skated to a 2-1 triumph over the Ooks in Calgary.







NAIT finished fourth i




n preseason action on the weekend, NAIT took a pair of disappointing losses to Grant McEwan before slamming Augustana on Saturday.

Augustana by the tune of 101-58. The 43 point victory left the OOKs on a high note for the weekend series.


The ladies had a similar (if a little closer) experience.


