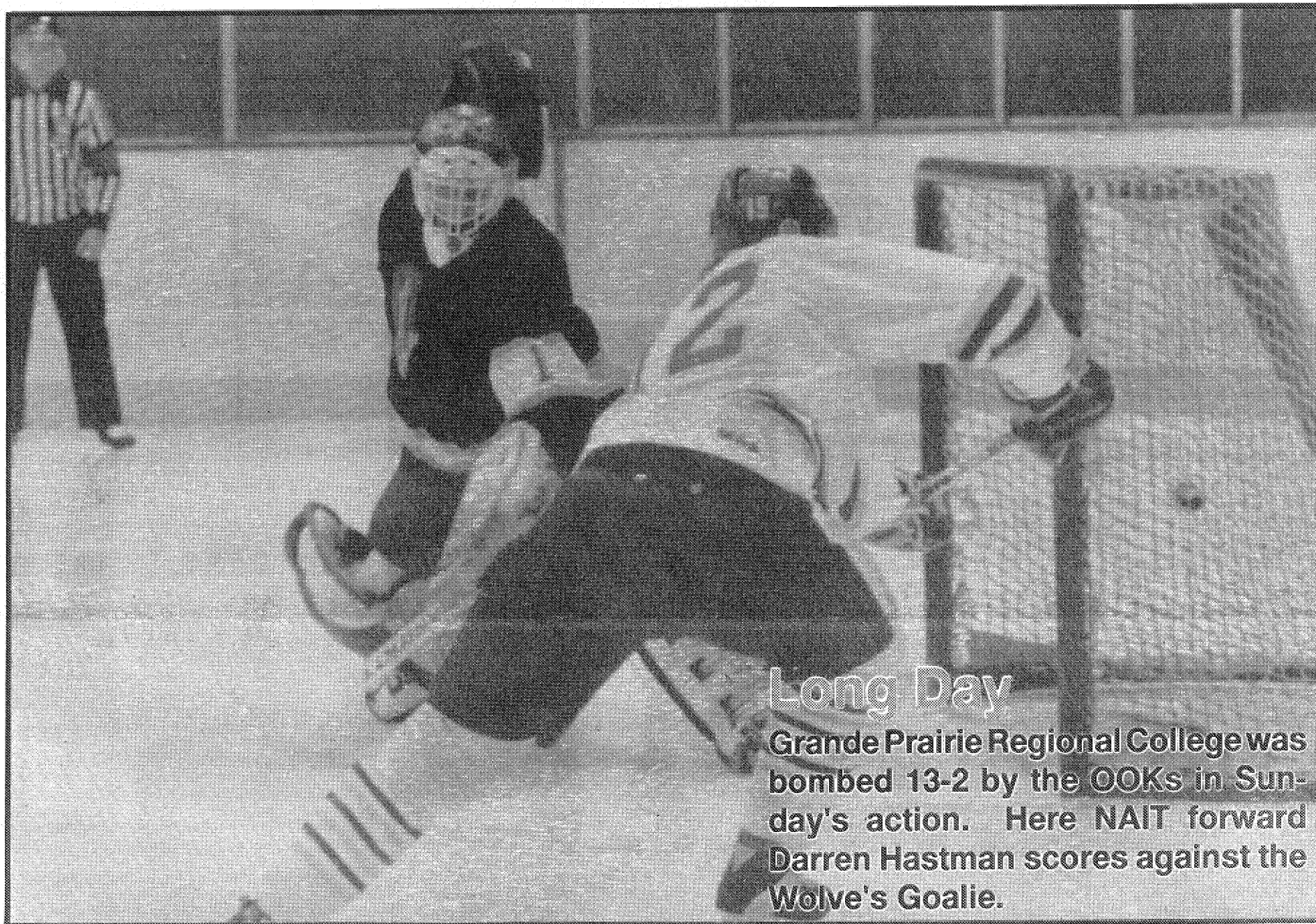

## General Council Meeting Notes

The tremors from the last general student council meeting are still being felt and will be felt for a long time here at NAIT. The big story of this meeting was the Romanian expedition and how much money that we should donate to them. A motion to rescind the previous motion to give Dan LaChambre and Scott Johnston \$2500 to go over to Romania and set up student councils there. The motion to rescind was made by a

Electronics Engineering Technology representative. A huge discussion took place over the amount and exactly what the students at NAIT were going to get out of this. A big part of that discussion was based on the fact that this would be a donation, not a business venture. It works out that everyone of the students attending NAIT this year (all 6700 of you) will pay into the \$2500 being given to Dan and Scott out of the \$97 given to the Student Association. It works out that each

student will be paying approximately 37 cents.

As it stood from the last council meeting, the amount of money would be given to the two men and they could do whatever they wanted with it. There were no clauses to make sure they spent the money on their trip. It was brought up by the executive council several times that the student representatives should do something about that. However that did not happen, the vote came down to rescind the

motion and it came out to a tie of 22 to 22. To rescind a motion the council would have to have had a two-thirds majority win.

Right after this motion was put down, a new motion was passed to give 3 NAITSA staff and 3 NUGGET staff \$1076.25 for a computer training course. Last year a new computer system was put in at the Nugget and now with new staff, no-one knows how to use it properly.

Also included in this busy

meeting was the appointment of Chantal Saramaga and Tim Forest to the Academic Council. Several cabarets were discussed and the campaign for the United Way. As well as a couple of bachelor auctions were announced and the posters should be up already. National Aids Awareness Week begins on October 4th and runs through to the 8th. Environment Action Week follows from October 12-18. There was also a reminder that no exotic dancers or strippers are allowed at cabarets or other functions.

What a weekend!! This past weekend, Amanda (V.P. Activities), Kevin (V.P. Communications), and I attended the ACTISEC (Alberta College and Technical Institute Student Executive Council) weekend.

What is ACTISEC and why do so few students know about it? Every student should know *something* about the organization. So, I'm here to help. The purpose of ACTISEC is stated as:

- i) ACTISEC directors share the common belief that results are most effectively reached by cooperative communication. Issues requiring ACTISEC input will be dealt with in a mature, professional and diplomatic manner.
- ii) ACTISEC exists to serve as a focal point for colleges and technical institutes in which issues of mutual concern internally and externally, may be discussed and subsequent action taken.

Now you may ask yourself what we, as your representatives, do at these meetings. It is more than just meetings and it's more than just socializing. The conference enables the student executives from across the province to talk over different situations that have been going on in our institutes and how they are affecting the students. We also share our successes, issue challenges to create some competition and basically share information in order to serve the students we represent better.

As an institute we pay a membership fee. In order that ACTISEC get and maintain an office with a full time executive director/researcher, a policy was put in place to increase fees over three years until it reaches \$2/full-time equivalent student. It is now at \$1.33, thus we paid \$7298.64 for the 91/92 school year (somehow it was set up to pay for the year, two years back).

There are three sub committees: Issues Management, Growth and Development and Entertainment. As you can tell they are very concentrated groups. We are able to achieve quite a bit whether it is: lobbying the government in regards to accessibility and/or quality of Advanced Education, or if it is block booking entertainers, or if it is looking at the constitution and by-laws of ACTISEC. A lot of work goes on behind the scenes but the organization does look out and represent the students.

If you have any questions or comments on ACTISEC feel free to contact any of us. In January, NAIT will be hosting the conference so watch out for more info. closer to the event.

## In Search Of A Job

OK, you're in school now and you graduate from your program soon. You came here for an education in hopes of getting a job when you complete it. But will you get a job?

As a NAIT student, there are many facilities that you have access to. One of the first places you should check out is The NAIT Placement Centre, located in the south lobby, 0111. As you enter the office you will find numerous reference guides that will assist you in your job hunt or you can make an appointment with one of their qualified placement officers.

The placement officers act as liaisons between students and employers and will assist you in contacting potential employers. As a student, your job is to prepare a resume and be prepared to market yourself to these potential employers. If you are having problems with your resume or want to have a mock interview, the Placement centre also offers these services. The Placement Centre has many job posting boards throughout the campus listing full-time and part-time positions available which you can check out on your own.

Students should begin job hunting prior to their graduation. 1992 NAIT statistics show that 56% of graduates were working full-time in their field of study; 25% were actively seeking work; 13% were employed in non-training related fields; and 6% were employed part-time in their field. In 1993 The Advanced Education and Career Development issued statistics relating to employment requirements by skill level in Alberta. 51.7% employment required Certificate/Diploma from Colleges, Institutes, or Apprenticeship Trades; 22.3% required High School Graduation and/or work experience; 17% required University Degrees; and 9% had entry-level, no education requirements. While there may be no guarantees that NAIT education will get you a job, you will have a better chance of being employed with your education.

Pat Quilley, a placement officer, explained a pilot project concerning data sheets filled out by students which may be implemented within the year. While this is only a pilot project now, it may become yet another program that the Placement centre will offer.

Other options of job search that you can contact are The Casual Labour Office, The Canada Employment Centres, Temporary Agencies, Career Information Hot Line, and the classified advertisements.

The Placement Centre is organizing a Career Fair that will be held on November 16, 1993 from 9:00 AM till 3:00 pm located in the Gym. This fair will have employers from various fields willing to speak to students about market trends and interests in their field. This fair is not a hiring fair, but many of the firms register their employee needs with the Placement Centre.

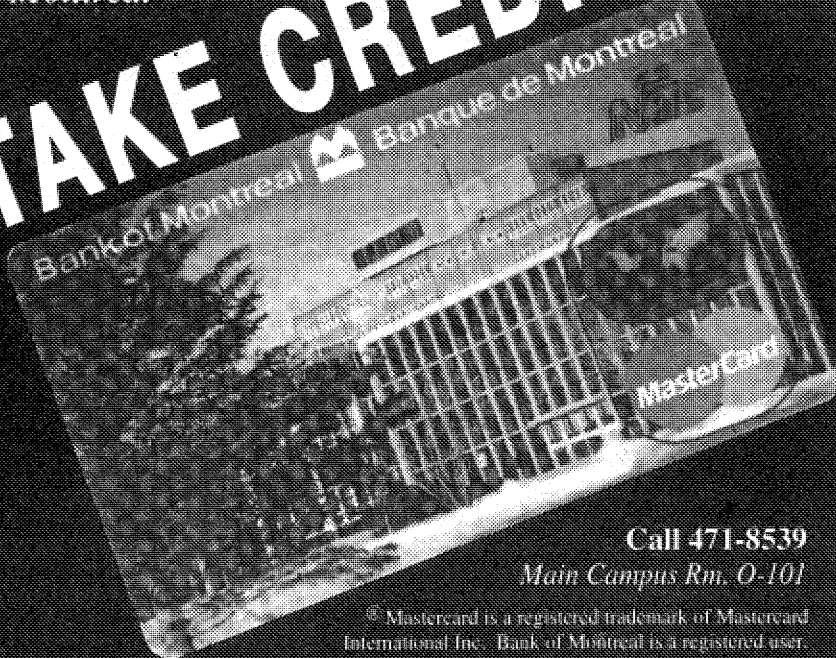

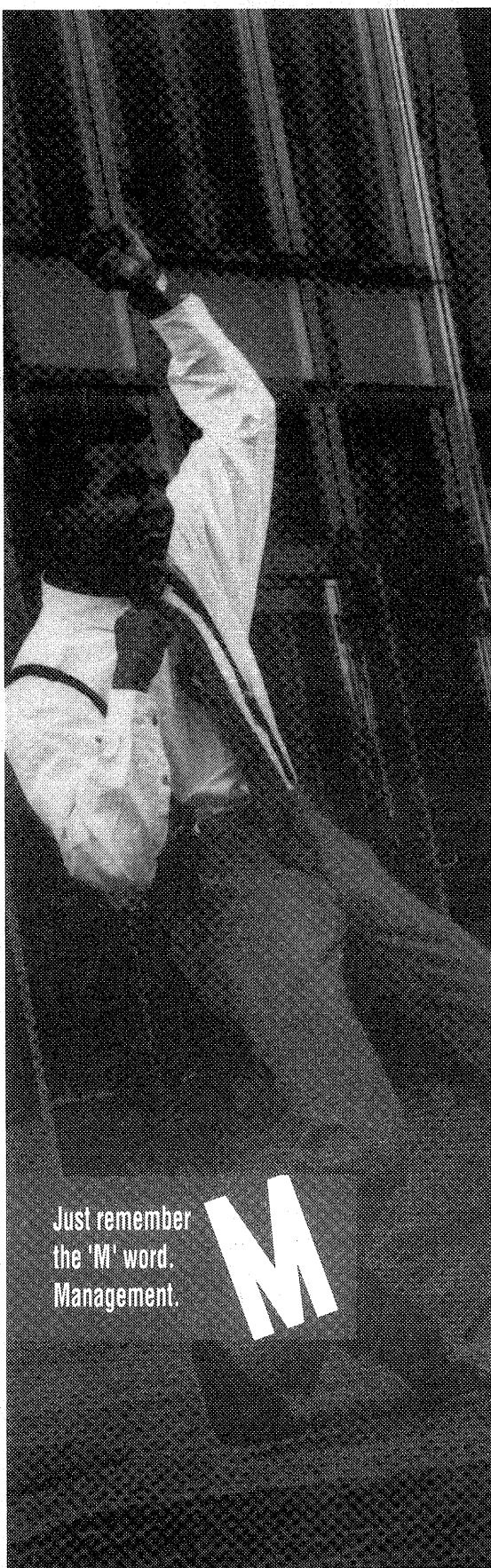

## Letter To The Editor

I would like to respond to the commentary (WHO ARE THESE GUYS ANYWAY?) by Carolyn Sitter in the September 30th edition of the NUGGET. As a new student to NAIT and having never been formally trained in the art of surviving and participating in a General Council meeting, I would have to say that the whole process was foreign to me at best and it will probably take a few more meetings under my belt before I have an adequate grasp on council procedure. I can only speculate as to how many other tech reps feel the same way. A page or two of Robert's Notes on Procedure couldn't possibly prepare someone to fully comprehend and feel comfortable with the procedural happenings of a General Council meeting. Time and a desire to learn are the only ways that one can gain the necessary experience to fully understand what goes on in these meetings.

After witnessing the confusion associated with this issue and with procedure at the meeting, I can understand why the question of accountability with respect to the \$2500 wasn't included in the original motion. Was the person who tendered this original motion aware that conditions could not be attached to this motion once it had been formally seconded? Chances are they didn't. Ditto for the person who seconded it. Ditto for the rest of the reps who voted in favour of the motion. The real issue here is not that the reps are squandering away the few precious dollars that we have or that they aren't interested in representing their respective technologies in a responsible manner. I believe that a general lack of procedural understanding by tech reps is the problem and that if most reps were aware that conditions (or accountability clauses) would have to be placed on a motion before it is voted on then we would have seen a different outcome.

I should also point out to the average reader who wasn't at the last meeting that the final deciding vote resulted in a deadlock. I am amazed that a mechanism is not available to re-address motions that end up in deadlock. Sure, there was a ruling in place to deal with the tie but I'm sure most tech reps weren't even remotely aware of it or its consequences. I certainly wasn't. Once again the unknown plays a factor. Like most students, tech reps have homework, exams and other commitments on top of their responsibilities to the General Council. Not all of us have the extra time or energy required to know the rules and procedures inside and out. I believe that this lack of experience was the core of the problem with respect to this money issue and will perhaps come into play again down the road when another hot topic hits the General Council agenda. Nonetheless, the bottom line is that your article may have conveyed a message to students that some (not all) tech reps weren't acting in the best interests of the technologies that they repre-

sent and I feel that this couldn't be farther from the truth. I mean, we volunteered ourselves as tech reps so that we could act in the best interests of our technologies. The fact that we're not fully versed in the art of debate and formal procedure shouldn't be hung over our heads. We volunteered, we're learning, we make mistakes... we're human.

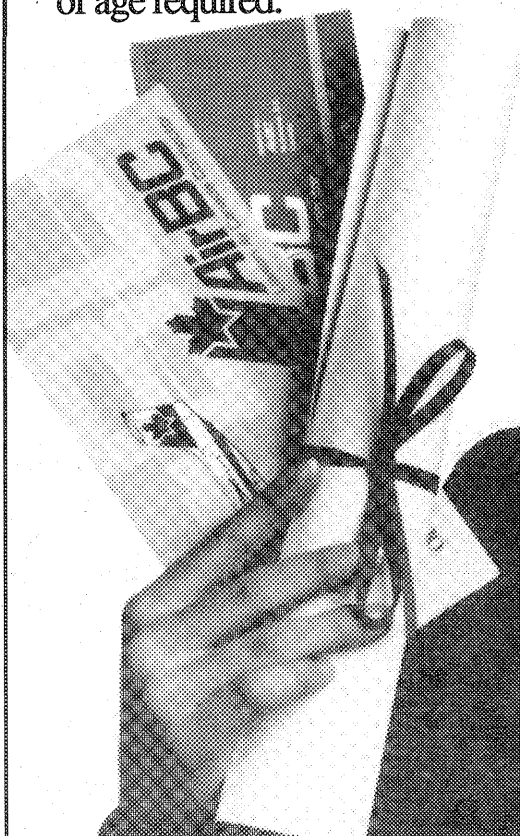

Are you aware of what goes on in General Council meetings? For example, did you know that on September 14th, 1993 General Council passed a motion to donate \$2500 to the Romanian Democracy Project. I would like to point out that no measures were taken to ensure the responsible use of this donation.

At the General Council meeting of September 28th, 1993 a new motion was made that was to rescind the motion made on September 14th, 1993. If the motion to rescind had passed, the \$2500 donation would have been squashed. At this point a new motion would

have been for a lower donation. It would also have ensured the responsible use of that donation. Unfortunately the motion to rescind was defeated by a vote of 22 in favour and 2 against.

Another item discussed at the September 28th meeting was a request by the Communications VP for funds to pay for training course on how to use the new computer equipment purchased for the Nugget last year. This was quite a reasonable request for just over \$1000. The money would be used to train six people in the proper use of the new equipment. A motion was quickly made to approve the funds, that motion was passed and everybody was happy.

I would like to state that giving \$2500 to a foreign cause is ridiculous, the amount is unreasonable and irresponsible. Particularly when supporting a cause that can produce no tangible, viable benefits for the students of NAIT. On the other hand, giving \$1000 to train NAITSA and Nugget staff in the use of new computer equipment that nobody knows how to use would be far more beneficial to the students of NAIT.

The opinions expressed in this letter are my own. Whether or not you agree or disagree with me doesn't matter. After all this is a DEMOCRACY.

Alright - I lied. While walking around their new campus I was consumed by jealousy! The building cost about 145 million and was built in 6-10 years.

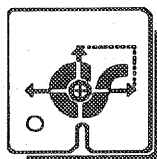

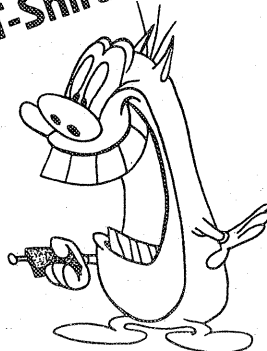

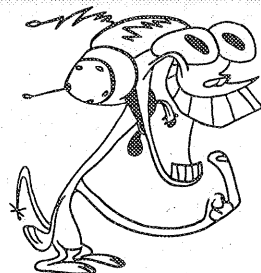

# Up and Down Weekend for Hockey OOKs

A roller coaster weekend ended as it began for the Ooks hockey team. A humbling defeat was sandwiched between a pair of convincing victories.

On Friday, Mike Applegate turned away 32 shots as the Ooks blanked the Augustana University College Vikings 6-0 at the NAIT Arena. Peter Kasowski paced the Ooks with a pair of goals while Stacey Rayan, Shawn Reich, Craig Samoil, and Darren Hastman added singles.

On Saturday, Augustana scored eight powerplay goals en route to an 8-6 victory over NAIT in Camrose. Three of the Viking goals came with a two man advantage while the remainder occurred with a one man advantage. Of the 34 penalties handed out by referee Larry Antoniuk, the Ooks received 19.

In the first, the teams exchanged goals. Peter Kasowski and Shawn

Reich scored for the Ooks. Jason Collins and Dean Holoien replied for the Vikings.

In the second, the Vikings gained a 6-4 lead. Jay Robertson netted a pair for Augustana while Keith MacKintosh and Kent Todd added singles. Trevor McCallion and Jamie Barnes answered for the Ooks.

In the third, both teams added two goals to their totals. Robertson completed the natural hat trick for the Vikings before Keith MacKintosh notched the eighth Camrose goal. Tom Oloriz and Jamie Barnes tallied for the Ooks. Dean Intwert blocked 33 of 41 shots in the NAIT net. Pat MacKintosh and Creedence Doi combined to turn away 30 of 36 drives in the Camrose crease.

On Sunday, the Ooks outshot the Grande Prairie Regional College Wolves 58 to 22 en route to a 13-2 victory at the NAIT Arena.

Darren Hastman, Tom Oloriz,

Jamie Barnes, and Stacey Rayan each netted a pair of goals for the Ooks. Craig Samoil, Peter Kasowski, Jody Menssa, Darren Glover, and Darryl Romano rounded out the NAIT scoring parade. Derek Crichton and Josh Ray responded with markers for the Wolves.

The Ooks controlled the play throughout as they led 5-0 after the first and 6-1 following the second. NAIT's Colin Cartwright and Grande Prairie's Rich Nichol went the distance between the pipes.

ON THE BENCH: NAIT's preseason record stands at six wins

and three losses. The Ooks now meet the Concordia College Thunder on Thursday, October 7th at the Agricom before hosting the Red Deer College Kings at the NAIT Arena on Friday, October 8th. Both games start at 7:30 p.m.

- Bo knows football. Bo knows baseball. Bo knows cross-training coming soon: Bo knows losing.

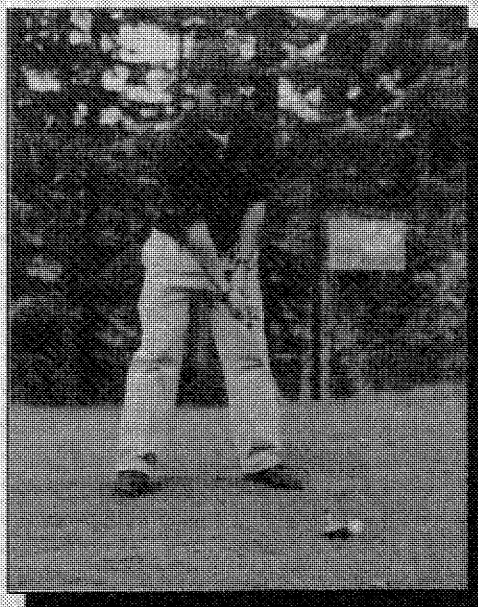
- The Jays will kick butt en route to their real test, the rematch with the Atlanta Braves.

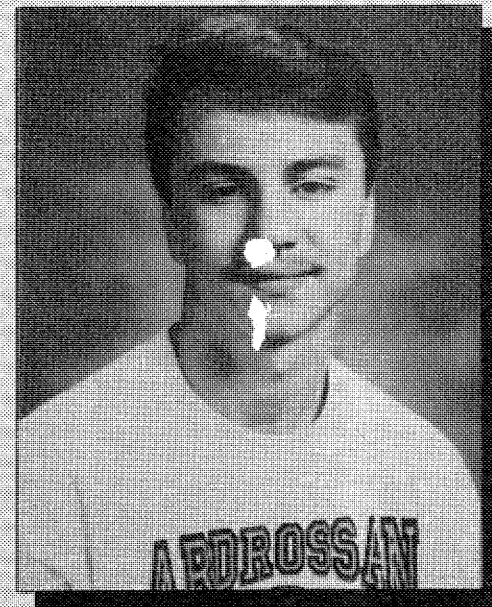

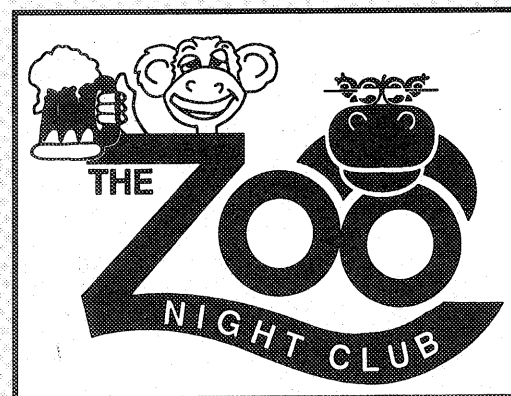


**Mario Dolanjski**



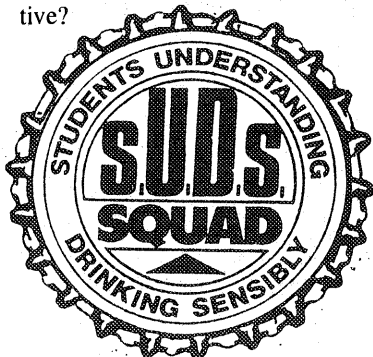
Do you know what it is like to be in love? from the woman's perspective, you glow on the inside.
