Peer Tutoring Program

Would you like to earn extra money, restudy material from previous years, add to your resume or get some teaching experience? Or are you having difficulty with one or more of your courses? In either case the Peer Tutoring Program may be for you!

If you want to be a peer tutor you must already have taken the course to be tutored, received a mark of at least 75% and registered at the NAIT Counseling Centre. Tutors may be 2nd semester, 2nd year or graduates of a NAIT program.

If you are requesting a tutor you will be asked if you have examined other options such as talking to instructors or, for some trade and

electrical subjects, going to the Tutor centre in Room A135. To request a peer tutor come to the Counseling Centre and fill in a Tu-

phone number of a potential tutor, it is that student's responsibility to phone the tutor and make arrangements for a place, time and fee for the tutoring. Fees range from \$5 to \$10 per hour.

Occasionally a request cannot be met. There are thousands of courses taught at NAIT each semester and there are not always graduates of those courses who want to tutor. However last year there were only 3 request that could not be filled.

U of M Coach to Succeed Perry Pearn

EDMONTON - Don Depoe becomes the 10th man to serve as the head coach of the NAIT Ooks Hockey Team. In 1992-93, Depoe coached the Milton Keynes Kings (Division One) in Great Britain. Prior to the overseas experience, the Winnipeg native spent seven seasons with the University

of Manitoba Bisons including two as head coach. The University of Winnipeg grad also served as head coach of Winnipeg's St. Paul High School. Depoe knows the job behind the Blue and Gold bench carries great expectations. "I am very excited to be coming to a program with

a great reputation. Perry Pearn has put the NAIT program on the map. I have big shoes to fill. I just want to continue the tradition of success." Depoe succeeds Perry Pearn who, in 13 seasons, guided the Ooks to six ACAC championships and six Canadian College Championships. Last season, the Ooks were eliminated in the ACAC semi finals after placing third in the regular season with a record of 16 wins, 7 losses, and one tie. After the completion of the 1992-93 season, Pearn announced that he would be coaching in Switzerland during the 1993-94 campaign.

The NAIT Ooks Hockey Team is the most successful in Canadian College history capturing six Canadian Colleges Athletic Association Championships and 12 Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference Championships.

Former Ook to Coach Men's BBALL

EDMONTON - Darren Aughtry has been named as the ninth head coach of the NAIT Ooks Men's Basketball Team. Aughtry, who has been an assistant coach with the Ooks for the past seven seasons, will be behind the Ooks bench for the 1993-94 season. In addition to his experience with the Blue and Gold, Aughtry has also been involved in high school coaching for three campaigns with Ross Sheppard and Jasper Place. The former Queen Elizabeth Knight is excited about the upcoming season. "I am looking forward to the challenge. It should be a good year." As a guard with the Ooks for two seasons in the mid-80's, Aughtry

was the recipient of the Ian W. Pinnell Trophy (Best Defensive Player) in 1984-85 and 1985-86 and the recipient of the Frank Ainsworth Memorial Trophy (Leadership and Sportsmanship) in 1985-86. Dave Hoy, who has coached the Ooks 14 of the last 15 seasons, will be working on NAIT's CQI Total Management Initiative for the 1993-94 academic year and will return as head coach for the 1994-95 season. Hoy guided the Ooks to their only Canadian Colleges Athletic Association Championship (1988-89) and their only Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference Championship (1988-89).

12th Coach of Men's Volleyball Named

EDMONTON - Mark Mahl has been named as the 12th coach of the NAIT Ooks Men's Volleyball Team. The newcomer to the college coaching ranks joins the Blue and Gold following four years as a high school coach with the Ross Sheppard Thunderbirds, the Stony Plain Memorial Composite High School Marauders, and the Pitt Meadow (B.C.) Rams. With the exception of the 1991-92 season, the teams coached by Mahl reached the Provincial Championships in their respective province.

As a player, Mahl played high school volleyball with the Kam One (B.C.) Rams and college volleyball with the Fraser Valley College Cascades of the British Columbia Colleges Athletic Association. The Edmonton native, who played goal with the Kamloops Oilers of

the Western Hockey League, turned to volleyball coaching after receiving tryouts with the Los Angeles Kings and the Boston Bruins. Mahl is optimistic about his initial season with the Ooks. "It's going to be a learning experience for me as well as the players. I want to take this team to the playoffs."

Mahl succeeds Mike Trent, who called the shots for four seasons and compiled a match record of 24 wins and 54 losses. The Ooks best finish under Trent was a fifth place finish in 1989-90 when the Ooks posted a mark of 8 wins and 10 losses.

The NAIT Ooks Men's Volleyball Team has won four Alberta Colleges Athletic Championships (1967-68, 1969-70, 1972-73, and 1976-77)

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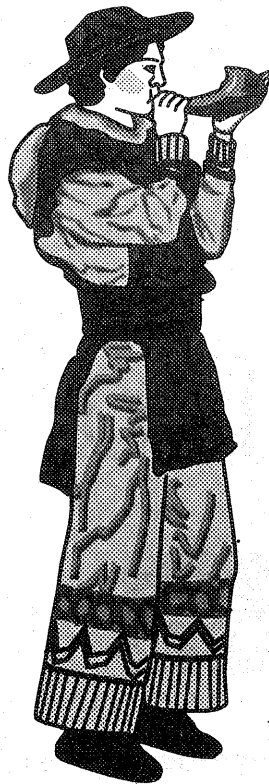
